By ANN SCHWARTZ A little over two years ago, Lance Baumann was facing a large mountain. He had about \$30,000 raised to build a new horse barn at the Aitkin Fairgrounds, but he needed \$180,000 to build a barn with 50 stalls.

The old barn was removed in 2008 and the fundraising effort to replace it was lagging. Therefore, the 4-H Young Riders and Bit and Bridle Saddle Club didn't have a place to house their horses for the fair or horse shows. They had to tie them up or bring poor choice between poor security and inconvenience. An article was published

March 2017 in the NewsHopper, and that got the project moving, according to Baumann. Peggy Jones of

them home each night – a American Peat Technologies saw the article, got excited, and soon that local firm pledged a \$50,000 gift for the barn.
