

## Stunning Figure Shows Impact of Kidsville News!





School Share drive culminated recently with a financial impact to north Alabama communities of \$50,187. School supplies were accepted at all 28 Bank Independent sales offices and at the oneday collection events at Office Depot in Florence and Walmart locations in Florence and Huntsville. Thanks to the generous response from local citizens, 20,667 items were collected and distributed to partner organizations along with the Bank Independent Smart Swipe pledge-match totaling \$9,421.65.

The school supplies and cash donations will be distributed through local organizations in each market. These include the Committee on Church Cooperation in Decatur, Sidney's Safe! Foundation and New Beginnings Church in the Shoals, and the Department of Human Resources in Madison, Limestone, Franklin and Lawrence counties.

#### Lady Lions '19 -20 Schedule

FLORENCE – The upcoming 2019-20

University of North Alabama women's basketball schedule features 12 home games, two neutral-site venues, and road games against a pair of Power 5 opponents. "We are extremely

excited about the season," said UNA head coach Missy Tiber. "The schedule we put together will be competitive and should prepare us well for ASUN play."

The Lions will open the season at home on Thursday, Nov. 7 against the University of Virginia-Lynchburg. Tip-off time is still undecided. UNA will host Mississippi Valley State at Flowers Hall the following Saturday. The North Alabama

women will then play their first-ever Big 10 opponent on Nov. 14 when the Lions take on Iowa on the road.

"It's always exciting to open up in Flowers Hall," added Tiber. "We were able to secure two consecutive home games to begin the year. We will also have a big test early in November visiting Big 10 power University of Iowa. We will also play at Iowa State in December. Both programs are perennial powers in NCAA Division I women's basketball."

The showdown against the Cyclones is scheduled for Monday, Dec. 30 in Ames, Iowa. It will also feature UNA's first Big 12

opponent. Prior to opening ASUN Conference play, the Lions will play twogame tournaments at the University of Denver Classic (Nov. 29-30) and the Georgia State Classic (Dec. 21-22). The Lions

also have four games against in-state teams this

year. "It's always good to have a few in-state games on the schedule," Tiber said. "This year, we return to Alabama State after they came to our place last season. We will also host Samford.'

North Alabama will open its 16-game ASUN home-and-home slate at home on Saturday, Jan. 4 against North Florida. Tip-off time is set for 1pm at Flowers Hall. The 2020 ASUN Tournament will begin on March 7 with the higher seed hosting each round of the eight-team field.





by the graph on page 37 showing how the Shoals MSA is far and away the state leader in the work and career readiness of high school seniors. The disproportion between the Shoals and the rest of the pack is glaring and seems to imply a charting

Tom Spencer, Senior Research Associate at PARCA, confirmed the graph's accuracy noting that the Shoals' 82.7% figure rated a staggering 6.7% higher than Baldwin County which came in at 76%. Baldwin is east of Mobile in the coast and includes Daphne, Spanish Fairhope, Fort, and Bay Minette. Several other MSA's clustered with Baldwin in the low-mid 70's. The state average for workforce or college readiness was 71%, almost twelve percentage points below the Shoals.

That impressive figure for the Shoals is strong validation of our success in many areas.

One glaring difference in our community and all the others is that Colbert and

Lauderdale counties are the only counties in Alabama that have the reading and learning resource of Kidsville News!





## Medicare Minute "Medicare Part A - Part 2"

Last week we discussed how Medicare Part A will cover you if you are admitted into the hospital. A hospital, under Medicare, can be acute care hospitals, critical care hospitals, inpatient rehabilitation facilities, long term care hospitals or mental health care.

The one aspect of Medicare Part A we get the most questions about is coverage at a skilled nursing facility (SNF). To be covered by Medicare at a SNF certain criteria has to be met. First, of course, is you must have Medicare Part A. Next your doctor has determined that you need daily skilled care given by, or under the supervision of, skilled nursing or therapy personnel. Your skilled nursing care will have to be in a SNF that is certified by Medicare.

What a lot of people don't know is that you must have a "qualifying" hospital stay to be covered at a SNF. Under Medicare a "qualifying" hospital stay is at least a 3-day inpatient stay prior to being admitted to the SNF. If you go to the ER and are held one day for observation and are admitted into the hospital for two days this does not constitute a "qualifying" hospital stay. If you are admitted on a Monday and discharged the following Wednesday this is not a "qualifying" hospital stay. In the two examples above those are 2-day inpatient stays. A good rule of thumb is you must be admitted as inpatient for at least three midnights.

You also need to know that Medicare Part A will only cover you for 100 days at a SNF and only 20 of those days are at 100%. In other words days 1-20 are covered at 100%. Days 21-100 you will pay the first \$170.50 per day and Medicare pays the rest of the cost. Starting with day 101 you will pay 100% of the bill.

## $\mathbf{ASK}$ the ATTORNEY



I purchased a 2011 Ford F150 pickup truck from a local used car dealer. The truck looked very nice and the questions that I asked about the truck were answered to my satisfaction and it only had 24,000 miles on it and seemed to be well taken care of. A little over a week after I bought it the transmission began to fail and it would cost about \$4000 to fix or replace. The place where I bought the truck said they would see if they

could help me find a transmission at wholesale and that's all they were willing to do. I obviously bought a lemon and I think Alabama has a lemon law. Does it apply in this - Charles, Florence, AL case?

Unfortunately, you only get the warranty that you agree upon when you purchase a

used vehicle unless it is still under the manufacturer's original warranty. A car bought "as is" has no warranty. Alabama does have a lemon law and it is found at

Alabama Code §8-20A-2 but it only applies to new vehicles. For the lemon law to apply the motor vehicle has

to be out of service and in the care of the dealer for a cumulative total of 30 calendar days due to repair attempts. The dealer gets three repair attempts plus one additional attempt by the manufacturer to fix the car.

If, after reasonable attempts to fix the car have been made, either by repairing or correcting the condition of the motor vehicle which occurred within 24 months or 24,000 miles whichever first occurs, the manufacturer shall, at the option of the consumer, replace the motor vehicle with a comparable new motor vehicle or shall accept return of the vehicle from the consumer and refund the following: full contract price, sales tax, license and registration fees and all finance charges incurred by the consumer after he first reported the nonconformity.

When buying a used car, you do have the option of having a pre-purchase inspection by a reputable mechanic. You also have the opportunity to ask for a period of time in which you can return the car. You could also ask for a 30 day warranty.

I have dealt with cases years ago where people would buy commercially available warranties for used cars. The limited experience that I can share is that, at least for the ones I saw, they were completely useless. That's not to say that there may be some commercially available warranty for used cars that may be reputable and give good service if needed.

Remember that Alabama's Lemon Law only applies to new vehicles. If your bill of sale indicates that you bought the car with the agreement and understanding that it was purchased "as is" there is no warranty.

Dear Dave,

When it comes to buying life insurance, should the coverage amount be based solely on current earnings? I have good reason to believe my income is going to increase significantly soon. Wesley

Dear Wesley,

The purpose of life insurance is to take care of your family if something unexpected happens to you. You don't want to buy too much, but you should have enough to ensure that they're well taken care of when you're not here any longer.

I usually recommend people have 10 to 12

## **Back to School**

"Which school can my kids attend?" This is a topic that comes up often and REALTORS are often asked by buyers who are either new to our area or moving to a different part of our area. When choosing a new home, most people with school-age children give great consideration to which school their children will attend. Although the Shoals is blessed with many incredible school choices, most people still have a preference. It's an important part of the home-buying decision, and I have always recommended that my clients doublecheck with the school system to be certain.

A few years ago, I decided to look into it a little further to see if I could be more helpful. We caught up with and had a conversation with Mike Stamps, who was the Assistant Superintendent of Lauderdale County Schools at the time. He shared with me how Lauderdale County handled school selection.

This being back-to-school season, and with all of the administrators being unbelievably busy, I thought this would be a great opportunity to re-visit the topic and share what we found out.

According to Stamps, most of their students lived in Lauderdale County but outside the city limits of Florence. Lauderdale County Schools will, however, accept out-of-district students "on a case-by-case basis." He said that the parents must initiate a request through the particular school they are interested in. If the student is accepted, there is no out of-district tuition.

Transportation is not provided for students who live outside the district, and that brings about a really important point: bus zones. The Lauderdale County school system is divided into several bus zones, which dictate the school to which a student living at a certain address will be transported. Here's the kicker: bus zone also dictates athletic eligibility. Stamps pointed out that the zones sometimes meet in the middle of a county road. Literally, one house might have players at Rogers High School, while their neighbors across the road play for Brooks. This was surprising news to me, and Stamps said that I'm not alone. He said that many people assume that because a bus runs by their house, they could put their kids on it. "If anyone has a question, we encourage them to call that individual school to ask what zone the address is in", Stamps said.

Each school district has its own rules. We've only discussed the policy of one district here, but Mr. Stamps' advice is good for everyone. Wherever you're looking to buy, check with the school first.

#### How to Help an Aging Parent with a Hoarding Problem

#### Dear Savvy Senior,

My 70-year-old mother has become somewhat of a hoarder. Since my father died a few years ago, her house is so disorganized and messy with stuff that it's becoming a hazard. What should I do to help her?

#### Troubled Son

Dear Troubled, Clutter addiction is a problem that effects up to five percent of Americans, many of whom are seniors. The problems can range anywhere from moderate messiness to hoarding so severe it may be related to a mental health disorder like obsessive-compulsive disorder. Here's what you should know, along with some tips and resources that can help your mom.

#### Why People Hoard

The reasons most people hoard is because they have an extreme sentimental attachment to their possessions, or they believe they might need their items at a later date. Hoarding can also be a sign that an older person is depressed or showing early symptoms of dementia.

Common problems for seniors who live in excessive clutter are tripping, falling and breaking a bone; overlooking bills and missing medications that are hidden in the clutter; and suffering from the environmental effects of mold, mildew and dust, and even living among insects and rodents.

#### What to Do

To get a handle on your mom's problem, the Institute for Challenging Disorganization offers a free "Clutter Hoarding Scale" that you can download off their website at *ChallengingDisorganization.org*.

If you find that your mom has a moderate cluttering problem, there are a number of things you can do to help.

Start by having a talk with her, respectfully expressing your concern for her health and safety, and offering your assistance to help her declutter.

If she takes you up on it, most professional organizers recommend decluttering in small steps. Take one room at a time or even a portion of a room at a time. This will help prevent your mom from getting overwhelmed.

Before you start, designate three piles or boxes for your mom's stuff – one pile is for items she wants to keep-andput-away, another is the donate pile and the last is the throwaway pile.

You and your mom will need to determine which pile her things belong in as you work. If your mom struggles with sentimental items that she doesn't use, like her husband's old tools or mother's china for example, suggest she keep only one item for memory sake and donate the rest to family members who will use them.

You will also need to help her set up a system for organizing the kept items and new possessions. **Find Help** 

If you need some help with the decluttering and organizing, consider hiring a professional organizer who can come to your mom's home to help you prioritize, organize and remove the clutter. The nonprofit group National Association of Productivity and Organizing Professionals has a directory on the website at *NAPO.net* to help you locate a professional in your area.

If your mom has a bigger, more serious hoarding problem (if her daily functioning is impaired, or if she is having financial difficulties, health problems, or other issues because of her hoarding) you'll need to seek professional help. Antidepressants and/or talk therapy can help address control issues, anxiety, depression, and other feelings that may underline hoarding tendencies, and make it easier for her to confront her disorder. To learn more and find professional help see the International OCD Foundation which provides a hoarding center on their website (*Hoarding.iocdf.org*) that offers information, resources, treatments, self-help groups, and more. Also see *HoardingCleanup.com*, a site that has a national database of qualified resources including cleaning companies and therapists that can help.
