

Highway 47 closes north of Malmo on Aug. 19

Motorists to encounter delays on Highway 47 in Aitkin County as the road closes to replace a bridge near Malmo beginning Monday, Aug. 19

The work is part of two bridges to be replaced—first the Highway 47 bridge north of Malmo, then the Highway 18 bridge west of Malmo. Highway 47 Malmo Detour

closed at a time. The detour will use the same roads for each closure. Here's what to expect:

· Aug. 19 to mid-September: Highway 47 will close north of Malmo to replace the Morman Creek bridge with two box culverts be-



Only one bridge will be ginning Monday, Aug. 19. The detour uses Highway 18 between Malmo and Garrison along northern Mille Lacs Lake, Highway 169 to Aitkin County Road 28, and County Road 12 to Highway 47 in Glen.

· Mid-September to mid-October: Highway 18 will close west of Malmo along northern Mille Lacs Lake at Malmo Bay to replace the Morman Creek bridge with a new box culvert. The detour uses Highway 47 between Malmo and Glen, Aitkin County Road 12 to County Road 28, and Highway 169 to Highway 18 along northern Mille Lacs Lake to Malmo.

· Full duration of this project: Through traffic must use the detour, or find their

own route. All travelers will encounter a hard closure at the bridge work site. For your safety and ours, stay out of barricaded areas. Local access will be open outside the closed work site. Visitors traveling to destinations within the area may want to call ahead to know the best route to take.

MnDOT will send another notification when Highway 47 opens and Highway 18 closes in September.

When complete, the new bridges will improve drainage in the Malmo area.

Rep. Dale Lueck legislative update

Last week included a variety of activities. Thursday I attended the Shamrock Township meeting, where we discussed the township's recreational park that sits right next to the town hall. The park includes tennis courts, a ball field and other age appropriate recreational amenities.

There is interest in upgrading and expanding the park to better meet the needs of the community. Shamrock Township owns a portion of the property involved and has a lease on the adjoining 6.2 acres of State School Trust land that a portion of the park is situated on.

Past efforts to gain matching grant funds through Minnesota's Parks and Trails Legacy Grant Program to upgrade the facilities have been complicated by the mixed ownership of the property. The school trust lands lease allows for the existing recreational facilities, as well as parking and septic facilities.

Under the lease additional

recreational or facilities related construction would be possible with the concurrence of the DNR Division of Lands and Minerals acting as the agent for State School Trust Lands. The DNR Parks and Trails Grant Program requires that for matching funds, the grantee must have full ownership of all the property involved.

School Trust Lands are held in trust by the state for the benefit of and production of revenue to fund our K12 public education system. That requirement predates Minnesota's statehood when the federal government first dedicated school trust lands to the Territory of Minnesota. Today the revenue produced from trust lands comes from mining, forestry operations and leasing arrangements, such as the lease Shamrock Township holds.

The task at hand is to figure out how we can upgrade and expand the current park to meet the community's needs. That will require resolving what appears to be conflicting rules with respect to supporting both K12 public education and our local parks.

Friday found me at the Natural Resources Research Institute's (NRRI) Coleraine facility with a bipartisan group of House and Senate legislators for an update on their research efforts. What an impressive facility, we met with worldclass scientists, engineers and technicians that are working on cutting edge mineral and forestry related projects. NRRI works directly with natural resource based companies providing independent testing and research analysis on how best to turn Minnesota's abundant natural resources into useful products.

This week will include a trip to the Great Lakes Naval Training Center to attend our youngest grandson's graduation from Navy Recruit. Go, Navy!

Abuse needs to be brought to justice

[This letter is in response to the Crosby-Ironton Courier printing weekly the past charges against former Crosby Mayor James Hunter that were either dismissed or a jury found him not guilty.]

Mr. Hunter and I were pleased to see that the misdemeanor charge of Falsely Reporting a Crime was finally dismissed. But we were amazed that a charge so absurd was even filed.

In June, 2017, Mr. Hunter went to the Dairy Queen in Crosby. Several months earlier, he had obtained a restraining order against Thomas McCartan due to repeated harassment of him by Mr. McCartan. Mr. McCartan, who at the time lived a couple houses from the Dairy Queen, gave Mr. Hunter "the finger," as Mr. Hunter was pulling up to the Dairy Queen. Mr. Hunter went inside the Dairy Queen. While he was waiting at the counter, before he could order his food, Mr. McCartan walked in right behind him.

Clearly, Mr. McCartan saw Mr. Hunter going to the Dairy up behind Mr. Hunter, and remained behind him while Mr. Hunter ordered his food. Mr. Hunter then went to the seating area of the restaurant, and Mr. McCartan looked in that direction before leaving. Mr. Hunter had reason to fear Mr. McCartan, who had repeatedly harassed him, and had previously violated the restraining order Mr. Hunter had against him. Mr. Hunter reported the incident to law enforcement, saying that he thought Mr. McCartan may have violated the restraining order. Mr. Hunter also obtained a copy of the surveillance video from the Dairy Queen to document the incident.

To our surprise, the Crosby Police charged Mr. Hunter with a crime. At a hearing held in the case outside of the presence of a jury, the two officers involved testified that Mr. Hunter demonstrated what happened to the officers, and one of the officers believed Mr. Hunter made contact with him during the demonstration. Neither officer asked Mr. Hunter, if he meant to make contact with one of the Oueen, and decided to follow officers, or if by making contact, him. Mr. McCartan came right he meant to tell them that Mr. McCartan had made contact

with Mr. Hunter.

I have a written record of the hearing if anyone would like to review the testimony of the officers. The charge against Mr. Hunter claimed that Mr. Hunter said that Mr. McCartan touched him, when Mr. Hunter never said that. The officers said they assumed Mr. Hunter meant that, but they never actually asked him!

This is yet another example of the leadership of the Crosby Police Department filing false charges against Mr. Hunter, and the Crow Wing County Attorney's Office going along with them. Even though the case was dismissed prior to trial —likely to avoid further embarrassment after losing three separate jury trials against Mr. Hunter - it should never have even been filed, and dozens of hours of court and prosecutor time were wasted, not too mention Mr. Hunter's time and expense defending against it.

It remains our hope that those responsible for this abuse of the system are brought to justice.


