## San Jose celebrates record-setting street paving program

he City of San Jose, Valley Transportation Authority, and the Silicon Valley Leadership Group celebrated San Jose's 2019 Pavement Maintenance Program on Monday, August 19.

San Jose will repave and repair nearly 300 miles of major and residential streets during the 2019 pavement maintenance season.

Since 2012, budget shortfalls forced the City to focus its pavement maintenance efforts only on major roadways. Local and residential streets were maintained only through pothole repair, rather than full repaying.

"San Joseans will start spotting road repaving crews throughout our city, as we pave nearly 300 miles of deteriorating streets - more than we've repaired in two See PAVING, page 3

## **Developer sues San Jose-Evergreen Community College District**

Article courtesy of San José Spotlight epublic Urban Property LLC is suing the San Jose-Evergreen Community College District for what it calls "bad faith negotiations" over a swath of South San Iose land.

Republic Urban's claim comes after the college district last month opted not to renew its exclusive negotiating agreement with the San Jose developer, instead deciding to reevaluate how the district could use the 27 acres of surplus land in South San Jose where its headquarters once sat

But Republic Urban says the decision, outlined in a July 11 letter from the district's Chancellor Byron Clift Breland, came suddenly after years of negotiations and investments by the developer. Republic Urban was aiming to build 175 units of

senior care housing and a medical office building on about 13 acres of the district's land.

"Chancellor Breland publicly referred to Republic as his partner two months before pulling the rug out from under the project," Republic Urban's attorney, Steven Ellenberg of Hopkins & Carley, said in a statement to this news organization Wednesday.

San Jose-Evergreen Community College District officials told San José Spotlight earlier this week that the district wanted more community engagement around plans for the land, but still aims to develop.

"Our efforts to involve more folks will continue as we determine next steps and move forward with de-

## San Jose lawmakers discuss Reid Hillview airport closure

Article courtesy of San José Spotlight or decades, local officials have wanted to shut down San Jose's Reid-Hillview Airport, serving local pilots, aviation students and educators as a hub for flight trainings and the local community as a resource for disaster relief.

But after hours of discussion, the San Jose City Council on Tuesday, August 20 reviewed how the nearly 60-year-old airport's closure could significantly affect the city in crucial ways, including causing inevitable congestion at the Mineta San Jose International Airport and reducing vital emergency services.

Still, local lawmakers want to assess potential land use opportunities that the airport's closure provides in the midst of the excruciating housing crisis.

In effect, the City Council unanimously voted in favor of a proposal drafted by Mayor Sam Liccardo and Councilmembers Sylvia Arenas, Johnny Khamis, Sergio Jimenez and Magdalena Carrasco to explore these issues. The lawmakers recommended conducting a study at the San Martin Airport to assess "traffic flow and safety improvements" and relocating aviation classes and emergency services such as the Civil Air Patrol and Cal Fire to suitable alternative sites.

Khamis also raised concerns about finding San Jose State aviation students an alternative site apart from San Martin that wasn't "30 miles away" for a student to attend a class.

Currently, the lawmakers are considering only San Martin and Hayward airports as possibilities.

The Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors last December voted 3-2 to reject funds to maintain the airport for another 20 years. The last grant the county received to maintain the airport was in 2011. County officials reported that the airport's costs and flights are increasing but revenue and staff decline, while poor maintenance continues to present a number of problems.

decades," said Mayor Liccardo. "Thanks to our collective efforts to pass 2016 Measure B and 2018 Measure T, and to defeat 2018 Prop 6, we have finally secured the stable funding we need to repave every local and neighborhood street over the next decade."

"The Silicon Valley Leadership Group and our members were proud to lead 2016's Yes on Measure B campaign and play a role in the statewide strategy to protect SB 1 funding. We are thrilled that right now voters can see positive transit changes and improvements that provide smoother commutes and safer travels for the residents of San Jose," said Carl Guardino, President, and CEO of the Silicon Valley Leadership Group.

With these new funds, San Jose's Department of Transportation has set an ambitious goal of repaving and repairing 200 miles of the smaller streets, while also improving 88 miles of major streets, in 2019. Over the next nine years, 1400 miles of local and neighborhood streets will receive upgrades. In less than a decade, the condition of San José's streets will be upgraded at least four points, to the highest end of the "fair" range, according to the pavement condition index (PCI).

"A pavement maintenance program of this scale is a long time coming for San Jose," said Transportation Director John Ristow. "Our team has been preparing for two years and is excited to get these local and neighborhood streets back into the kind of condition our residents expect and deserve."

But several opponents to the airport's closure voiced how the aviation facility serves as a crucial public asset.

"This is a critical transportation resource for the entire Silicon Valley. And the city and the airport and the other business organizations fought to save it," said John McGowan, a longtime resident of San Jose and aircraft owner. "Is it really viable to have the only portal and reliever airport for one of the 25 largest air carrier airports in the country to be a two hour drive to the south?"

McGowan was a part of an organization in 1996 that fought to save the airport after the Board of Supervisors then tried to de-fund it, adding that "everyone rallied" to keep the airport recognizing

port in all of Silicon Valley that can serve as a gateway to the community for small general aviation airplanes." But many also voiced concerns

there was "no other reliever air-

about the dire effects the airport has had on East Side residents in part because of the noise and severe airborne lead levels, including Councilmember Magdalena Carrasco who represents the district that the airport is in. She said she removed one of her daughters from a school neighboring the airport because children were being "sprayed with lead."

"I made that choice many families are unable to make," added Carrasco. "I understand that this is an inconvenience for those who enjoy the airport where it stands, but for the families that live there it becomes a health hazard for their children." Councilmember Maya Esparza agreed, saying that the fight to get rid of the airport has been going on for a "very long time," since she was a kid.

"I believe that what we're dealing with today is a direct result of a history of inequity within our city and county," added Esparza.

Despite the airport not closing for at least another decade — until 2031 — city and county leaders are working together to address the next steps in alleviating concerns of airborne lead levels and managing the potential increase in congestion at neighboring airports. But as many councilmembers pointed out, the San Jose City Council has no decision-making authority to decide on whether the airport stays or goes.

🗨 econd Street Studios, an affordable | housing project for 150 homeless in-Jdividuals in San Jose, had its grand opening on August 23. This is the first of 19 similar developments scheduled for San Iose.

Second Street Studios marks the first new construction of permanent, supportive housing in San Jose and reflects the unique partnerships that formed between nonprofits, local government and the tech sector to help address the homelessness crisis.

Located at the corner of South Second Street and Keyes Street, the four-floor Second Street Studios building features 135 energy-efficient studio and one-bedroom apartments. These new apartments have a community-centered wellness design that incorporates a landscaped podium courtyard with laundry facility, on-site property management, extensive social service coordination, full time nurse, computer lab, multipurpose room, and smaller group social spaces. Since its inception in 1986, First Community Housing has developed housing for over 1500 households, with another 800 units in the pipeline.

"The day I handed the keys to our first resident at Second Street Studios was one of the best days of my professional life," said Geoffrey Morgan, President and CEO at First Community Housing. "All of us at FCH are grateful to be able to serve over 150 formerly homeless in this historic first 100 percent permanent supportive housing project and the first modular construction affordable housing in San Jose. None of this would have been possible without the steadfast support of all our partners, including Silicon Valley Bank and Tech CU."

"Second Street Studios was a challenging project to finance and build, but all of us involved felt the urgency and responsibility to make sure that the project is successful," said Fiona Hsu, Managing Director of Community Development Finance at Silicon Valley Bank. "Improving the homelessness crisis in Silicon Valley requires a collective response by every stakeholder in this region. SVB will continue to do our part and support impactful projects like Second Street Studios. We look forward to partnering with Tech CU again on more transformative projects in the future."

# Blinded by the Light

n the past couple of years we have seen a trend of movies that have incorporated the music of classic artists including Queen (Bohemian Rhapsody), Elton John (Rocketman), and The Beatles (Yesterday).

Blinded by the Light, features the music of Bruce Springsteen and it is the latest in this trend. The story is generally enjoyable. It doesn't fly to cinematic heights; but is still compelling, heartfelt and a pleasure to watch.

Blinded by the Light is based off a true story and tells the story of teenaged Javad Khan, who is the son of Pakistani immigrants living in Britain in the 1980's. Javad has a passion for writing, but is discouraged by his father from pursuing his passion, who fears that writing is not a career that makes money and that he will never gain recognition as a writer in British society as a Pakistani. While a discouraged Khan is ready to give up his writing, he discovers the music of Bruce Springsteen, which motivates him to continue pursuing his dream and helps him navigate the hardships of life including the loss of his father's job and the rising racism perpetuated by the white nationalist group, The National Front.

What I liked most about Blinded by the Light was its portrayal of Thatcherite Britain during the 1980's. Everything from the fashion styles, music, and prevalence of portable cassette tapes seems to be meticulously crafted to capture the aesthetic in this era of Britain. The politics of the era also loom largely over the movie, with various references to the effects of Prime Minister Margret Thatcher's policies on Britain, the rise of white nationalist groups such as The National Front, and the devastating unemployment crisis. We experience the visceral and heartbreaking effects of this crisis through the eyes of our protagonist Javad, who is forced to take rare and odd jobs to support his family after his father loses his job as a factory worker.

Ironically, the part of this film that I least enjoyed was the incorporation of the Bruce Springsteen's music. I found Springsteen's music to be sloppily included in the film, sometimes to the point of sometimes seeming forced. And while the protagonist's love of Springsteen is a major plot point in the movie, I found the other aspects of the film such as the family relationships and political portrayals much more compelling and interesting.

Overall, Blinded by the Light is an enjoyable, but somewhat messy film. While it doesn't always succeed in the incorporation of Springsteen's music, it makes up for it with its period portrayal and its heartfelt family relationship dynamics.

## **Community leaders plan to bring little free libraries to East San Jose**

By Carina Woudenberg Article courtesy of San José Spotlight ittle Free Libraries — those birdhouse-like structures used for sharing free books — are cropping up everywhere in San Jose. Everywhere, that is, except for East San Jose and Evergreen neighborhoods, some of the city's most vulnerable communities.

The newly-formed Evergreen Valley Rotary Club is looking to change that and its Community Service Chair Jeannette Marsala is leading the efforts. Marsala says that after the Rotary Club came together in March its members brainstormed worthwhile projects for their area.

They had heard of another rotary club that had put in some free libraries. When Marsala looked into it she found a locator map online with red flags depicting the locations of all the registered Little Free Libraries. She saw that the flags were notably absent from East San Jose and Evergreen neighborhoods

 where large communities of minority families and low-income residents live and spotted an opportunity to make a difference.

"I'd like to kind of fill in that gap," Marsala said.

Marsala wants to go about distributing books to these underserved communities in two ways. First, through the Free Little Library model most people are familiar with but also by placing books in area laundromats where children and their caregivers are expected to have some down time.

The idea is adopted from the Laundromat Library League which operates on the premise that books should be available to everyone — regardless of their financial standing. It's a sentiment shared by Marsala.

Her goal is to get 50 libraries — whether they are Free Little Libraries or laundromat locations — installed in the next two years and hopes to get the first one up and running within the next month or so.

The Free Little Libraries aren't cheap. If purchased from the official online store, the box and post together could set the buyer back around \$500. To get the project going, Marsala is looking for cash donations from the public as well as volunteers to step in and be the stewards of each of the East Side libraries.



"It's a huge expense," said Marsala. "Which is one of the reasons you don't see it in lower-income areas. They don't have the disposable income to spend on Little Free Libraries."

At the moment there is at least one free library in East San Jose but Marsala says it's not officially registered with the Little Free Library site. Located at Sunset Avenue and Kammerer Avenue, the library was installed in April as an Eagle Scout project, according to the attached placard. Marsala has been visiting the site frequently and says she's been impressed with the traffic its received with neighbors both

taking and adding books.

Marsala is planning on partnering with lifelong East San Jose resident Justin Triano who is leading efforts to revitalize the Sunset Avenue corridor which stretches from Story Road to Alum Rock Avenue. After two murals were removed in the neighborhood, Triano says a piece of the community's identity has been lost.

By partnering with Marsala on the Free Little Libraries project he says he hopes to bring back that sense of vitality through public art and is interested in hearing from the community for ideas.

"What images do people want to see when they're going to school, going to church or going to the park?" Triano asked rhetorically. The pair says they would love to see some form of local history documented in the project as well.

# Sikh Peace Parade builds community connection

vergreen Residents are invited to join Sikhs from the Gurdwara on the Hill (a community center and religious place) in San Jose to celebrate their annual parade which starts this Sunday at 11 a.m. on Sept. 1. Everyone is invited!

The San Jose Sikhs of the Gurdwara invite all religions, all people, everyone to come as their guest many times a year at various events and September 1 is a special day. The word Sikh is derived from a Sanskrit word meaning 'disciple', or one who learns.

The Parade is about peace in our world and the celebration is placed upon their Holy Book which acts as a guide map for how to live a fulfilled life. The book is composed of the writings of the Ten Holy Gurus which founded the religion of Sikhism between the 15th to 18th centuries.

The Guru Granth Sahib (Holy Book) is considered one of the world's great scriptures for it enlightens and has information that helps people. It is their eternal and final Sikh Guru for it encompasses the writings of the Ten Holy Gurus which established Sikhism and also contains special writings of people from other faiths too. As stated from the website Sikhism.about.com, "Sikhism rejects idol worship, so the Guru Granth Sahib is not worshipped as an idol, but rather emphasis is placed on respect of the scripture for the writings which appear within. Guru Granth Sahib is a collection of devotional hymns and poetry which proclaims God, lays stress on meditation on the True Guru (God) and lays down moral and ethical rules for development of the soul, spiritual salvation and unity with God." This book is paramount to the entire Sikh religion.

Through the centuries great sacrifice

was experienced by the Sikhs in protecting the writings and ensuring they remain pure. Many a religion tried to stop the Sikhs from worship. Even today the Sikhs face challenges in the world.

The parade is a way for the Sikhs to bless the neighborhoods, city and world. They walk with their flower covered float and wish for all people of all religions to join them in celebration of honoring sacred beliefs of their book.

Sikhs do not try to change other people's religion and instead embrace the individual religious beliefs of others while encouraging everyone to follow religious pathways to delving deeper into each individual faith to be closer to the common truth of one creator.

There is great fanfare as the beautiful decorated float leaves the Gurdwara to travel the route (about 3 1/2 miles). It looks similar to a cable car with a white dome on top. All are encouraged to walk the journey and there are many stands along the way with complimentary snacks and rehydration refreshments. One can also go to Evergreen High School on Quimby Road where there is free parking and shuttle. The float will ride by at about 12:30 p.m. and you can supply yourself with complementary refreshments and either choose to walk or be shuttled the last 1/4 mile up the hill to one of the most beautiful Gurdwara's in the world.

A special guest speaker, Bhai Harjinder Singh, will speak with beautiful hymns while he rides in the float. He is revered in his ability to communicate in special ways to followers. The Kirtan as defined by Wikipedia is; (Sanskrit: कीर्तन; IAST: Kīrtana) is a Sanskrit word that means "narrating, reciting, telling, describing" of an idea or story. It also refers to a genre of religious performance arts, connoting a musical form of narration or shared recitation, particularly of spiritual or religious ideas. *See PEACE PARADE, page 16*

It is fun and so inspiring to see people from different religions visiting the large open field and sharing smiles and building friendships too. This is what the Holy Book is all about. It is all about a belief that reflects what one of the founders stated in the 15th century, "Before becoming a Sikh, a Muslim, a Hindu or a Christian, lets become Human first "

#### You are welcome at the Sikh Gurdwara

If you wish to learn more you can take a tour of the Gurdwara, which is open to the public 365 days of the year, there is also complimentary food in the Langar (kitchen) every day. It's good to know and understand all religions and people in our world.

### Some simple questions answered regarding the Sikhs

The Sikhs wear turbans as part of their Khalsa beliefs. They honor long hair. The Oxford Sikhs website states: "As everyone knows, male Sikhs are easily recognized by their turbans and beards. Over the centuries, they have acquired a reputation for be-

ing sturdy, hardworking and adventurous; they are a people who have earned the reputation for being extremely brave and loyal soldiers." In Sikhism, Kesh (sometimes called Kes) is the practice of allowing one's hair to grow naturally out of respect for the perfection of God's creation. The practice is one of The Five outward symbols as a means to profess the Sikh faith. You can learn more in the future if you choose by visiting the history room at the Gurdwara.

Sikh architecture is influenced from artful buildings created centuries ago and display exquisite intricacy. This style of architecture is also seen in non-religious buildings due to its beautiful flow of lines and use of space. The San Jose Gurdwara is the largest in the United States and considered an asset to the city. It is quite beautiful just to walk the grounds.

There is an estimated 27 million Sikhs in the world and about a half million Sikhs live in the United States. Sikhs were one of the very first peoples long ago to recognize that women must be treated with equality in all ways to that of men.

Beautiful memories of past parades

Last year, as the float traveled the streets of Evergreen on the hillside, little girls riding in the float sang joyfully with words that were more than 500 years old. It was so touching! The hymns are a form of poetry. As translated, one verse which was sung in Punjabi stated, "Keep praying to God, God is one, serving us all."

A devout man and woman walked slightly ahead of the float and sprinkled water in front of its path to offer purity in its journey. A woman fervently stated,

*Continued from page 1* planning of our surplus land."

But in the meantime, Republic Urban has filed a claim for damages that could exceed \$1 million. CEO Michael Van Every could not immediately be reached Wednesday.

Discussions around redeveloping the surplus land started in 2015, when the San Jose-Evergreen Community College District put out a call for developers to offer up bids to lease the land and build a mixed-use project in an effort to generate income for the college district.

Notably, Republic Urban already had a non-binding letter of intent to negotiate with the district at the time. But officials for the San Jose-Evergreen Community College District opted to test the waters for other developer interests, according to past reporting by the Silicon Valley Business Journal.

In 2017, Republic Urban submitted its first zoning application to the city of San Jose. The company submitted a new zoning application to the city in March this year after a slew of community meetings, scaling back the mixed-use project from 27 acres to 13 acres and dropping plans for housing amid concerns of traffic congestion in the Evergreen area.

Republic Urban entered into an exclusive agreement with the district in March 2018 by making a non-refundable payment of \$455,000, Ellenberg said. The developer also committed to a pre-payment of \$1 million in base rent to the district, as well as an annual minimum of \$500,000 and an amount equal to 50 percent of the project's net operating revenues.

But when the exclusive negotiating agreement between the developer and college district expired in July — after two previous extensions — leaders for San Jose-Evergreen Community College District took that as an opportunity to mull other options.

"Our district remains committed to utilizing our surplus land to generate revenue in support of student success programs and initiatives, like San Jose Promise, throughout our district," Brown said last week.

But Ellenberg maintains that "nothing changed on Republic's end," while district officials began to pull away from the developer this year. The company is pushing ahead with the suit, which was filed Wednesday.

The attorney claims that district leaders, including Chancellor Breland, assured Republic Urban that they intended to pursue the development as recently as April, prompting the developer to keep pouring money into the project. "We look forward to revealing why the district made this bad faith decision," Ellenberg added.
