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
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# The rugged beauty of Rock Island State Park

West of the Appalachian Mountains, on the Cumberland Plateau just a few miles out of McMinnville, water pours out of rocky limestone gorge walls and creates a spectacular display of nature. Twin Falls, located in Rock Island State Park, begins 80 feet above the Caney Fork River and builds into a powerful force of falling water that cumulates into a pool of tumbling white-water waves. A short distance upstream, Great Falls, a 30-foot horseshoe cascading waterfall allows for yet another awe-inspiring waterfall view.

Established in 1969. Rock Island State Park is an 883-acre park located on the headwaters of Center Hill Lake at the confluence of the Caney Fork, Collins, and Rocky Rivers. Even if you don't have a lot of time, taking a short detour through Rock Island State Park is well worth the effort. Although the park is known for its rugged and rocky terrain, many of its natural and historic features are easily accessible. From parking lot areas and overlooks, visitors of all ages will enjoy seeing a 19th-century cotton textile mill and a spring house built to look like a tiny castle, along with fantastic views of the waterfalls. Damon Graham, Rock Island State Park Manager, says, "A lot of our parks have waterfalls, but it's very rare that you can access them without having to walk."

For those who want to do some hiking, the park has seven trails that lead through lush forests, along riverbeds and pools, above and below waterfalls and to rocky bluffs where you can see for miles. The trails range in difficulty from moderate to strenuous and may involve a bit of rock-hopping. "If I get out on the trail, the Downstream Trail is probably my favorite," Damon says. For a trail map and more inside information stop by the park office. Know that many sections of the park are incredibly rugged with bluffs, slick rocks, and swift water. Therefore, good hiking shoes are essential and don't forget to pack along some drinking water.


#### **Under the Stars**

Of course, when it comes to experiencing the great outdoors in all its fullness, there is nothing like camping. The smell of a campfire wafting through the air, the sound of children laughing, the sticky, gooey goodness of the perfect s'more, and fireflies flickering outside the tent make for memories that last a lifetime. Rock Island State Park offers two campgrounds, a tent-only campground with ten sites, and the main campground with 50 sites--all equipped with electric and water hookups, grill, fire ring, and picnic table. There are also three modern

bathhouses with hot water showers, lavatories, and commodes located throughout the two campgrounds. For those who do not care to rough it quite so much, there are ten very nice cabins available to rent. The identical cabins are open year round and feature three bedrooms, two baths. "I've stayed in about every cabin in the Tennessee State Park system, and I may be a little biased, but these are some of the nicest in the state," Damon says. Be sure to check availability on cabins and campsites during the busy summer months. Reservations are always recommended and taken up to one year in advance. To make a reservation go to tnstateparks.com. If you just want to


make a day of it, there are several picnic areas as well as two large covered pavilions which are available to rent for special occasions. A natural sand beach provides hours of fun whether you enjoy swimming, treading water, floating in the water or just playing in the sand.

#### **Learn Something New**

Throughout the year, Rock Island State Park hosts a variety of ranger-led programs where you can learn to build a campfire, make cobbler in a dutch oven, learn about bees, snakes, and pollinators, or participate in dozens of other fun activities. The park also offers guided kayak trips and the opportunity to snorkel in the gorge.

#### The Fish are Calling

And then there is the fishing. "We're known as a great fishing destination. At one time we had the world record walleye," Damon says. A picture of the former world champion fish along with a mounted replica hangs on the wall at the park office for all to admire. Rock Island State Park is also the host site for the Pan Am Kayak Bass Fishing Championship that draws anglers from all over the world. Along with the walleye, there are many other fish swimming in the waters, including muskellunge, bluegill, crappie, and catfish. A valid Tennessee fishing license is required for anyone over 13 years of age.



Rock Island State Park is a fun, accessible place to get some exercise, relax, and enjoy the company of friends and family. It also provides an opportunity for us to get back to nature and experience a world that we don't often think about—a world that is beautiful, full of life, and just outside the door.

Great Falls Dam or Powerhouse operated by the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) are always a possibility. In a matter of seconds, dangerous fast-rising water can make the river unsafe. To check the TVA daily water release schedules visit TVA. gov online, get the app on your mobile device, or call (800) 238-2264. The information is under Great Falls on the Lake Levels link. Also, know that TVA release schedules are subject to change and may be made without warning. "There is always a chance of water release. If there are sirens that means they are going to release water," Damon says. Always have a quick exit planned and head for higher ground if you hear the warnings, see flashing lights, or notice the water beginning to rise.

# Something good is brewing at Depot Bottom Brewery

For Chris Weitzel, one of the founders of Depot Bottom Brewery, it all started with a home brewing kit. It was a Christmas present from his wife, Becky. But even before that, Chris was acquiring a taste for craft beer. "It's actually my wife's fault. She's the one who got me into drinking craft beer," Chris says with a smile. Becky convinced him that there was more to a great tasting beer than what was on sale at the local convenience store. Of course, at the time, neither Becky nor Chris had any idea how that simple gift would take them on a craft beer adventure that continues to gain momentum. Along with business partner Jacob Bozarth, Chris and Becky opened the doors of Depot Bottom Brewery in 2018. And apparently, the timing was perfect, because McMinnville's first brewery is rapidly gaining a loyal following.

All three partners have full-time day jobs and tag-team evenings and weekends at the brewery located in downtown McMinnville. They measure and mix, check sugar, yeast, and fermentation readings, taste-test and painstakingly craft their brew in small batches in a one-barrel system. So far they have brewed over 30 different beers, each a unique recipe formulated to bring out specific attributes and flavors. Where do they dream up the recipes for these

new, inventive beers? According to Chris, the ideas come from out of the blue. Their customers also have some great ideas as well. Earlier this year they were approached by the organizers of the Hardly Strictly Musky fishing tournament to create a Kölsch-the German version of a pilsner. It's a light, refreshing beer that's great on a hot day and even better when you're on the river. "If we're going to commission a beer we ask for two months, especially if it's a beer we've never done before," Chris says. Some things can't be rushed and when it comes to fermentation, "well, you've just got to let mother nature do her thing," he adds.

Depot Bottom Brewery pays homage to its McMinnville roots by naming their brews named after the people, places, and events of the area. "Most of our names are drawn from things in McMinnville and Warren County," Chris says. Depot Bottom came from an area close to downtown that was an industrial hub after the Civil War, and home to a train depot. High Rock Red and Hickory Mountain Nut Brown are named after natural features. The Triple Hanging is named after the last public execution in McMinnville, and the 1810 Amber is a toast to the year McMinnville was founded.

If you are new to craft beer, no worries, Chris has a few suggestions for an easy introduction in the world of craft beer. "We try to get a feel for what you like—IPA, Stout, Porter. We don't do flights, but we let you try all six beers if you want, to make sure you are getting what you want," he says.

Several times a month, the brewery frequently has a food truck on Fridays and Saturdays. You can also have a pizza delivered, or you can bring food from home. Smooth Rapids also makes deliveries. Future plans include an outdoor patio area. As for Chris's favorite brew? "For me, it changes, depending on the weather, I don't necessarily

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




















## Ale TLager?

It's all about the yeast. Ales are brewed at a warm temperature using a strain of yeast that stays at the top of the fermenting vessel. Lagers are brewed at a much cooler temperature with a different strain of yeast that falls to the bottom. Ales tend to be fruity, while lagers are cleantasting and frequently described as "crisp."

Ales include Belgian style, brown ales, India pale ales, pale ales, porters, stouts, and wheat beers.

Lager styles have German and Bavarian roots and include Oktoberfest and pilsners.





# Something tasty 8 different

Gather together at these fun and unique downtown eateries, and you'll know why they are quickly becoming destinations.

A red pinstriped awning shades the large glass windows of the Cumberland Biscuit Company, adding a splash of color to downtown McMinnville. Inside, diners sit at a counter behind the windows enjoying their coffee, watching cars pass by and taking in the view of the historic Park Theater across the street. While upbeat Americana music plays in the background, friends and families congregate around wooden tables. It's a warm and inviting atmosphere, one that makes you want to pull up a chair and stay awhile.

A little later in the day, a few doors down, under a black and white striped awning, it's a similar scenario. At Metro Deli, 70s rock music has customers humming along as they dine. In the adjacent room, at Topz Frozen Yogurt, wide-eyed adults and kids fill cups to the brim with soft-serve frozen yogurt, piling spoonfuls of berries, chocolate candies & nuts on top. All three eateries are part of a business venture that began over five years ago by Matt and Anna Sands, and Anna's brother Josh. Although opening a food establishment wasn't something any of them had on their minds, sometimes an opportunity presents itself, and so goes the story that began with Topz Frozen Yogurt and now includes Cumberland Biscuit Company and Metro Deli. "Our goal was and still is to create a family-friendly, fun environment that people want to come to," Anna says.

All three eateries have one thing in common, atmosphere. It's something that can make or break a dining experience, and it begins when you walk in the door. The atmosphere was a key ingredient when the trio started their trek into the business of food. However, it didn't come easy. Each business began by gutting the historic space, uncovering old walls and floors, and refurbishing the salvaged materials. From the lighting and artwork (several pieces which came from their homes) to the table spacing and the music, every detail was carefully thought out and put into place. Here is a quick overview of the delicious offerings waiting behind the doors of these three establishments.

#### **Dessert First**

Topz Frozen Yogurt is a self-serve frozen yogurt buffet with flavors such as Strawberry Cupcake, Pomegranate Raspberry, French Vanilla, Sweet Pickle Italian Ice, Wild Blackberry,

White Chocolate Cherry, Dreamsicle, & Tangy Orange Sorbet. The toppings include candy sprinkles in all colors, gummy worms, blueberries, strawberries, and just about anything you could imagine. It's fun, it's easy, and it's a delicious treat. They also host a karaoke night monthly.

#### Craving a slice of pizza or a sandwich?

Metro Deli is the perfect place to grab a freshly prepared meal. "Many of our sandwiches are named after people in the family," Anna says. "The Big Jerry is named after my dad, and the Mama Louisa is named after my husband's Cuban grandmother." The deli also has a great selection of signature salads, brick oven pizza, soups, and salads. And don't forget the pickle. Both Metro Deli and Topz Frozen Yogurt are in the same building and are open seven days a week from 11 am to 8 pm, and until 9 pm on Fridays and Saturdays.

#### But what about breakfast?


Both Anna and her brother are breakfast eaters, so when additional space opened up, it was time for breakfast. Continuing in the vein of offering something different, they enlisted the help of a family friend who is a chef. Together they decided to highlight the menu with Benedicts and

handmade crab cakes along with their spin on a good ole' southern favorite, biscuits and gravy. Cumberland Biscuit Company is open for breakfast, brunch, and lunch, Thursday through Sunday 7:00 am to 1:30 pm.

As word-of-mouth travels, all three eateries are finding a place on the itineraries of travelers, and into the hearts of the locals. "We see a lot of tourists on the holidays," Anna says. "I have also learned that certain shows at Cumberland Caverns pull different crowds." So she keeps a close eye on the show schedule, knowing that some return guests will be in for breakfast and will bring a few friends along,—quite a few. Also, keep an eye out for the Metro Food Wagon, the deli shop on wheels, at Main Street Live on Fridays and also at the Del Monaco Winery in August. Food, glorious food, and the best part? According to Anna, "I love the quests and the employees."








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The Hardly Strictly Musky fishing tournament brings anglers from all across the nation in search of the elusive Musky and gives back to the local community in a big way.




Founded in 2012 by McMinnville's Todd Gregory, the Hardly Strictly Musky fishing tournament is the event of the year for a dedicated group of fishing enthusiasts. They come from Minnesota, Wisconsin, New York, Montana, and other faraway places, on the 2nd weekend of May and gather on the banks of the Collins River for a long weekend of fishing, food, craft beer, art, and music. They share a common bond, the challenge of catching a giant finicky fish with a fly rod. The long, slender fish with a mouth full of teeth is similar in appearance to the Northern Pike and can grow to be 50 inches or more in length. The natural range of the Musky, short for Muskellunge, stretches up through Ontario, New York, and Minnesota. In Tennessee, they are only found in certain bodies of water.

Hardly Strictly Musky isn't your ordinary fishing tournament, as Sam Bailey, one of the event organizers explains, "It's a group of likeminded individuals who love to punish ourselves by trying to catch a fish that doesn't want to eat." Repeatedly casting an oversized fly rod, much like the ones used in surf fishing, is a workout, and then, if you are lucky enough to catch one, real it in, snap a few photos for proof, and release it back into the water, you have definitely put in a day's work. However, in between casts and at the end of the day, there's always enough time and energy to tell a good fish story—and there are plenty, especially the ones about the Musky that got away and the look in its eyes as it snubbed the deer hair fly.

In 2018, Hardly Strictly Musky organizers decided to gain official nonprofit status to help steer the efforts of the growing organization for the greater good. The change also opens up the doors for significant sponsors to participate in an even bigger way. In 2019, the event saw an increase in support from national and local sponsors. The Vice President of

Patagonia, a long-time sponsor, even came out to attend the event. Hardly Strictly Musky is also very conservation oriented. The tournament allows only 100 registrants, and although they want to grow the overall benefits the festival has on local charities, they also want to keep it small and manageable with minimal impact on the fish and rivers. In reality, the festival is much more than catching the biggest fish. It's about bringing people together for a good time and a good cause. "We get together, raise some money for local charities, and have a great time doing it. We try to do good things," Sam says.

What is the secret to catching a Musky? "Persistence," Sam laughs. "Fishing for Musky is like baseball. It's a game of failures. You've got to have a good sense of humor, you've got to like to see your flies swim, and you've got to like to spend time with your friends."
