Initiatives introduced to build backyard cottages

Abodu Corp. will rapidly install a backyard home in two weeks

he mayor recently unveiled a series of initiatives that he says would shorten the time and lower the cost to build a backyard home (Axillary Dwelling Units - ADU) by streamlining San Jose's application process.

"We all know that we are in a housing crisis," Liccardo said. "We are struggling mightily to get more rent restricted apartments built. We are not going to solve this crisis \$650,000 at a time—that's the cost to build a single apartment. We have to find ways to bend the cost curve."

San Jose lawmakers hope that as a result

of the initiatives, more people will build backyard cottages. The city's goal is to add 25,000 units—10,000 of them below-market-rate—to the city's housing units by 2022. ADU construction has been prioritized largely because it's a potentially cheaper, faster way to boost the number of housing units.

To make the process as easy as possible, the city has created an online portal and a checklist to educate homeowners about ADUs and the regulatory requirements to build them. Liccardo said a full-time employee, Sarah Shull, will help homeowners applying for an ADU permit. Officials estimate that there's room to build as many as 160,000 such backyard homes in San Jose.

Almaden Valley residents mull the future of downtown San Jose

espite its distance from the city's downtown core, Almaden Valley and its residents will experience far-reaching impacts from massive plans for downtown redevelopment – both in quality of life and tax dollars.

A panel of local nonprofit and development leaders met with about 50 residents of Almaden Valley on Monday to discuss the future of downtown San Jose during a meeting hosted by the Almaden Valley Community Association.

The speakers included Gary Dillabough, founder of Urban Community, which has purchased 21 parcels of downtown land, Teresa Alvarado, the San Jose Director of local urban planning research organization SPUR, and Josh Burroughs, the COO and SVP of development for real estate development fund Urban Catalyst.

Hosted by the Almaden Valley Community Association, the two-hour discussion led by the association's planning and zoning chair Matt Mahan started broadly: what can be expected

in a decade?

Burroughs answered by focusing on pure density, saying that he wants an additional 100,000 people within the downtown core daily at that point in time. "That's 100,000 people to frequent our small businesses, restaurants, the-

aters, museums or farmers markets," Burroughs said. "When you have that, people change everything."

Alvarado agreed that more people living in downtown can create a dynamic atmosphere, See DOWNTOWN, page 10

Former Leland High Student sues SJUSD for allegedly mishandling her sexual assault claim

Plaintiff says the boy who assaulted her went on to attack another student

an Jose Unified School District is being sued by a former Leland High School student for allegedly mishandling her sexual assault claim.

The anonymous plaintiff, "Jane L.C. Doe," who attended Leland and Pioneer high schools in 2017 filed the civil case in Santa Clara County Superior Court. The lawsuit accuses district officials of negligence and intentionally inflicting emotional distress after she reported being sexually assaulted by a classmate.

According to the lawsuit, in September 2017, Doe was molested by a classmate at a mutual friend's house. The following month, Doe says she became the "target of ongoing harassment, bullying and intimidation by the assailant and his friends."

Assistant Principal Mary Ann Dougherty called Doe into her office after being alerted to the incident. Dougherty allegedly refused to let

Doe bring a parent. There was a police officer present, but no attorney was present. According to the lawsuit, "Dougherty allegedly demanded that the plaintiff discuss the sexual assault with her and the police officer, at which time Dougherty allegedly refused to allow plaintiff's mother to be present, despite plaintiff allegedly requesting her presence, and allegedly proceeded to ask accusatory questions and infer that plaintiff was not remembering things accurately, that she was not sexually assaulted and/or that she had brought the sexual assault upon herself."

Doe subsequently told the vice principal that the alleged assailant took photographs and video of her naked body without her permission. When the victim told that part to Dougherty, according to the lawsuit, the vice principal allegedly responded by admonishing the girl.

After that meeting, Doe says the assistant principal did nothing to prevent the accused assailant and his friends from continuing to harass her.

"The assailant and his friends remained in plaintiff's classes, continued to attend classes without repercussions, and were allowed access to their phones and the school's Wi-Fi networks all while continuing to sexually harass, bully and intimidate plaintiff at school," according to the lawsuit, "and any actions that Dougherty did take only resulted in additional harassment, bullying and intimidation."

Male student arrested

The male student accused of attacking Doe allegedly sexually assaulted yet another Leland High classmate in November 2017. The lawsuit says the boy was arrested on campus on Feb. 14, 2018, for both assaults.

One of the lawyers representing Doe said that the school district allegedly did not enforce policies and procedures in place to protect its students who report sexual assaults, sexual harassment and/or bullying.

Lili Smith, spokesperson for the school district said, "I can assure the entire community that we take any allegations of employee misconduct very seriously and we vigorously protect the safety and wellbeing of our students."

The parties are scheduled for further case management in December.

but emphasized that having that investment in the city's urban core does not mean the end of suburban neighborhoods like Almaden Valley.

"I think it's about giving a compliment to the city and giving options for residents," Alvarado said. "Downtown San Jose is the downtown for the entire city. How do we create a space that invites us all to be part of it, makes us feel safe and makes us feel like we're doing something fun and exciting?"

This is a concept of development that Dillabough said is not new around the world, but it's "just something that we missed here."

Undoubtedly, Dillabough said Google's proposed plans for a megacampus in the heart of downtown plays a major role in that dialogue. Dillabough said he lives near Stanford in Menlo Park, and the large presence of residents there has spurred growth in areas like medical care and roads.

"You don't have to be afraid of these bigger companies, we just have to hold them accountable with milestones that we can track," Dillabough said, adding that he thinks Google has learned from its experience in Mountain View.

Alvarado agreed, citing her time

with the city's community engagement task force which studied development plans around Diridon Station, where Google plans to set up shop.

"Google has been so engaged and really has been part of co-creating a vision for their downtown developments," she said. "They understand the scale and the impact that they're going to make it downtown. I've been really impressed at how they come to the conversation. It isn't just for them."

Attendees also received updates about ongoing efforts to improve public transit systems in downtown San Jose, financially support the growth of arts and culture amenities, "build up" to accommodate more residents, create sustainable, environmentally responsible buildings and engage the communities that are already down-

town, such as San Jose State University.

One resident asked how any of these changes could benefit the Almaden Valley community.

Citing her own time living in and out of the Valley, Alvarado said cities change every day and that's how services are brought to all.

"Everyone wants to have increased services, whether it's garbage pickup, no potholes, or safer neighborhoods," Alvarado added. "The money to pay for those increased services has to come from somewhere else, outside of just taxing yourself. It comes from new taxes from new real estate projects, the money those new employees bring to the city and sales taxes. We all create change in this city."

NTSB: California should fix highway safety barriers faster

Federal safety regulators are recommending that California transportation officials move faster to repair highway safety barriers damaged by vehicles.

The recommendation was promoted by the fatal crash of a Tesla in Autopilot mode in March 2018. The National Transportation Safety Board report says California officials failed to fix a safety barrier on Highway 101

before the fatal collision that killed Apple engineer Walter Huang.

The barrier had been damaged 11 days earlier by a 2010 Toyota Prius traveling in excess of 75 mph that crashed against the attenuator, a cushion that protects vehicles from hitting the end of concrete lane dividers. The 31-year-old driver survived the crash and was treated for relatively minor injuries.

"The safety benefits of a functioning crash attenuator were demonstrated by the differences between the level of driver injuries in the two March 2018 crashes that took place at this location," the NTSB said.

'Brittany Runs a Marathon'

n the first Sunday of every November, 50,000 runners from all fifty states and more than 139 countries will gather in New York City to run in the largest marathon in the world.

Lined across the streets of New York City are even more spectators, who for one day of the year will take a break from rudely ignoring each other to cheering on the runners as they trek the 26.219 mile course.

As its title suggests, Brittany Runs a Marathon is ostensibly about our protagonist Brittany who trains to run the NYC Marathon, but this only acts as a frame, as there is actual very little running in the film. Instead the film devotes much of its run to exploring themes such as the struggles of mediocrity, self-worth, and failure.

Brittany Runs a Marathon is a well-crafted film that transcends its seemingly simple plot and will make you laugh, cry, and cheer.

The film begins by introducing to Brittany (Jillian Bell), who is a 27 year old usher liv-

ing in New York City. Brittany is barely able to make a living and emotionally struggles as she sees everyone around her succeed while is stuck in a dead end job instead of pursuing her dream of working in advertising. Amidst these struggles, Brittany learns from her doctor that she is dangerously unhealthy and is advised to exercise and lose weight. This is when Brittany decides to turn her life around and decides to train for the New York City Marathon.

The film portrays Brittany's journey from being unhealthy and struggling to run one mile to becoming a better version of herself in a manner that is many times hilarious, but also sometimes emotionally devastating. The film also takes some twists and turns from the conventionally expected story that were pleasant and refreshing, which I very much appreciated

Overall, I highly recommend Brittany Runs a Marathon. While the film is ostensibly about training for a marathon, I think that the film will connect and empower all audiences who struggle with feelings of mediocrity and failure. Brittany Runs a Marathon is currently in limited release but will expand to more theatres soon.



The Symphony Silicon Valley season opens with a richly exotic, song-filled work by Zoltán Kodály. Based on a Hungarian folk tune, its variations set a festive mood. That mood shifts in the second half with Tchaikovsky's deeply emotional final symphony. The composer heard only its first, poorly received performance; but its second was a triumph, and this symphony remains one of his most celebrated and beloved.

Additionally, Swan is consistently among the Top 100 Agents in the SF Bay Area.
