

During the first week of August the Livingston Highway Department has been grading the side of Creek Road in the towns of Perry and Nunda.

It is my opinion that they have trashed the side of the road and have done a lot of damage to the lawns of landowners on the side of the road. I have no problem with grading the top of the shoulder, but then they removed all the vegetation of the side of the ditch. This looks like crap, is impossible to mow and will erode into the ditch. 

# Need Help Paying for Medicare?

The Medicare Savings Programs can help with Medicare costs, like your monthly Part B premiums and sometimes also Part A and Part B coinsurance and deductibles.

The Extra Help Program helps pay some of your Medicare Part D drug plan costs.

If your gross monthly income is less than \$1,581 for an individual or \$2,134 for a couple, you may be eligible for one or both of these programs. These figures are based on the 2019 federal poverty limits and are subject to change.

#### **2019 General Election**

For the 2019 November 5th General Election, you can vote in person before Election Day.

#### What is Early Voting?

For the first time in New York State, voters can vote in-person before Election Day at one or more sites in their county.

#### Who can vote early?

All registered voters can vote early.

#### Where can I vote early?

#### How will I vote during early voting?

Voting during early voting is the same as voting on Election Day. When you get to the early voting center, you will check in to vote, receive your ballot and vote as any other election. **Once you vote early you will not be eligible to vote on Election Day, your vote will already have been cast.** 

#### When will early voting results be posted?

Early voting votes will be canvassed and reported after 9pm on Tuesday, November 5, 2019.

#### Can I still vote by absentee ballot?

Yes, If you are out of your home county, or if you are permanently or temporarily disabled, ill or are the primary care giver for one or more people who are ill or physically disabled, or a resident of a Veterans Hospital, or detained in jail awaiting Grand Jury action or incarcerated for an offense other than a felony you may apply for an absentee ballot.







# **Veterans Monument is Taking Shape**

Livingston County's Hampton Corners complex in Groveland will soon be home to an open-air monument honoring local military veterans. Development of the monument site located on county-owned land near the intersection of Gypsy Lane and Groveland Station Road – is being undertaken by the Livingston County Highway Department. The monument is slated for completion by this November.

Jason Skinner, Director of Veteran Services for Livingston County and an Army veteran, said, "It has been so exciting to watch the progression of the monument site. I commend the Highway Department for its dedication to this project and its determination to finish it in time to coincide with Veteran's Day on November 11th."



The Highway Department has been intermittently – between rain drops and infrastructure projects – advancing site preparation for the monument since the beginning of the year. To date, the site has been cleared and graded with over 5,000 tons of gravel and crusher run material spread and compacted as a foundation for the monument. Extensive drainage systems have been installed to ensure the integrity of the site over time. A 6-inch-thick concrete pad will serve as the 125.5 ft. x 65 ft. flag-shaped monument. Installation of the monument itself, as well as any hard and soft landscaping, will also be handled by the Highway Department. In order to provide visitors with convenient access to the monument, an adjacent parking lot has been constructed to accommodate vehicular traffic.

The monument, once installed, will display hundreds of swiveling, metal poppies to emulate a waving American flag. The bright red poppies, ranging in height from 1 ft. to 3 ft., have been individually handcrafted by veterans – as well as friends and families of veterans – with help from Olie Olsen, the Metal Trades instructor at the Genesee Valley Educational Partnership in Mount Morris. In addition to the poppy display, the monument will feature multiple flag poles representing military service branches.

"This county project has been wildly popular with our veteran community. It has brought many veterans together and has strengthened their bonds in an already resilient community," said Skinner, who originally pitched the project to the Livingston County Board of Supervisors last November. "In fact, the footprint for the monument had to be expanded as veteran participation continued to grow. Our initial goal was to fill the monument with 100 poppies, and now we have close to 250."

Livingston County's Highway Superintendent Don Higgins, who is a Marine veteran and a leader of the Patriot Guard Riders, is proud to be a part of the monument's development, and said, "This monument has been garnering attention from across the state because of its uniqueness, symbolism, partnerships and public involvement."



Higgins attributes the success of this project to extensive collaboration among Livingston County's leadership, the Highway Department, Veteran Services, Genesee Valley Educational Partnership, the veteran community, and all those who have donated time and materials. "I would especially like to thank County Administrator Ian Coyle and the Board of Supervisors for believing in this project from the very beginning," Higgins said. "Their unwavering support signifies a genuine appreciation for all Livingston County veterans who have served our country."

### September as Hunger Action Month

At its meeting on September 11, 2019, the Board of Supervisors proclaimed September as Hunger Action Month and recognized Foodlink for its service to the community. 



□ Watch the free S.A.V.E. training video to equip yourself to respond with care and compassion if someone you know indicates they are having thoughts of suicide.

□ Check out VA's Social Media Safety Toolkit to learn how to recognize and respond to social media posts that may indicate emotional distress, feelings of crisis or thoughts of suicide.

□ Contact VA's Coaching Into Care program if you are worried about a Veteran loved one. A licensed psychologist or social worker will provide guidance on motivating your loved one to seek support.
