Q: What is the Annual Open Enrollment

Mary: The Medicare Annual Open Enrollment runs every year between October 15th and

December 7th. This is the time of the year that you can change your Medicare Advantage Plan or your Part D plan to another plan of your choosing. I certainly would recommend that you call your agent to make an appointment to discuss your current plan and if that plan will continue to meet all your needs.

Q: My employer just reduced my hours from full to part time and I will be losing my medical plan. I am 68 years old and am unsure what to do.

Mary: You are entitled to a Special Election Period to purchase a Medicare Plan. You will need both your Part A & B to apply for a plan

Q: What is the Extra Help Program?

Mary: Extra Help is a Medicare program designed to assist individuals with income and asset limits to help pay for prescription drug costs. If you qualify, you can

Geauga County Public Library introduces the Mobile Memory Lab

Lab allows patrons to preserve their memories with state-of-the-art equipment

Geauga County – September 9, 2019 – Geauga County Public Library is pleased to introduce the Mobile Memory Lab, a traveling collection of equipment that will allow patrons to capture, record, and preserve important parts of their personal history.

The GCPL Mobile Memory Lab consists of a Desktop PC loaded with various image, audio, and video editing software, including, but not limited to, Adobe Creative Cloud, Audacity, and GIMP. Along with the software, there are a host of peripherals for scanning and digitizing your photos, negatives, slides, 8mm/Super 8 film, VHS tapes, vinyl records, and cassettes. It also has a converter tape that will allow you to digitize Super VHS tapes, a high-quality USB microphone to capture digital audio/oral histories, and a high-speed photo/document scanner for bulk digitization of photos and documents.

The Lab will be housed at different Branches on a rotating schedule, beginning with Chardon, Geauga West, and the Administrative Center Branch this fall, and continuing through all GCPL locations next year.

In order to use the Mobile Memory Lab, patrons must first attend an orientation session at any of the dates and locations listed below:



get help to pay your Part D monthly premium, the yearly deductible, coinsurance and copays. The gap or donut home phase will also be covered and there will never be a concern regarding any late enrollment penalties. If you are enrolled in the Medicare program and think you may qualify, you can call Social Security to apply or go online to Social Security.gov/extrahelp to apply online.

Q: My husband has already received his new Medicare card and I am concerned that I have not received mine yet.

Mary: Do not be concerned or panic. And,

you do not need to call Medicare. The mail out of the cards will continue to be sent out until next April of 2019. As husband and wife you will not necessarily receive your cards at the same time.
