

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



CREAMY PARMESAN

Ingredients

- 4 boneless pork chops (1 1/2lb), trimmed of fat
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 1 cup thinly sliced sweet onions
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 cups chicken broth
- 1/4 cup heavy whipping cream
- 1/2 cup shredded Parmesan cheese (2 oz)
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh Italian flat-leaf parsley
- 1 pouch (4.7 oz) Betty Crocker ™
 roasted garlic mashed potatoes,
 prepared as directed on pouch

Directions

- 1. Rub pork chops with salt and pepper. In 12-inch nonstick skillet, melt 2 tablespoons of the butter over medium-high heat. Add pork; cook 2 to 4 minutes or until browned on first side. Turn pork; reduce heat to medium; cook 1 to 2 minutes or until browned on second side. Transfer to plate; cover with foil to keep warm. Butter will be very dark.
- 2. Add remaining 2 tablespoons butter and the onions to skillet; cook 3 to 4 minutes or until onions soften and begin to brown. Stir in flour; cook and stir 30 to 60 seconds or until mixture thickens and begins to brown.



SKILLET PORK CHOPS

Stir in broth and whipping cream; heat to simmering over medium-high heat. Return pork to skillet; reduce heat to low. Cover and cook 4 to 6 minutes or until pork is no longer pink in center (at least 145°F).

3. Remove from heat; transfer pork to plates. Stir Parmesan cheese into sauce mixture in skillet. Spoon sauce over pork; top with parsley. Serve with potatoes.

Directions

Heat 1 teaspoon olive oil in a skillet over medium heat. Stir in mushrooms; cook and stir until mushrooms are tender, 5 to 7 minutes. Transfer the mushrooms to a bowl and set aside.

Heat the remaining 2 tablespoons olive oil in the skillet over medium heat. Add the pork chops, browning on both sides, 7 to 10 minutes. Place the pork chops on a plate, then drain all but 1 tablespoon of drippings from the skillet. Stir in the garlic and onion; cook and stir until the onion has softened and turned translucent, about 5 minutes.

Pour in the tomatoes, then season with basil, oregano, salt, and pepper. Transfer the pork chops back to the skillet; cover and simmer until the pork chops are tender and no longer pink in the center, about 45 minutes. Stir in some water if the mixture becomes too dry. Place the bell pepper on top of the pork, then add the reserved mushrooms. Continue to simmer until the bell pepper is tender, 5 to 10 minutes.

ONE SKILLET

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 4 pork loin chops (1/2 inch thick and 7 ounces each)
- 3 medium red potatoes, cut into small wedges
- 3 medium carrots, cut into 1/2-inch slices, or 2 cups fresh baby carrots
- 1 medium onion, cut into



- 1 can (10-3/4 ounces) condensed cream of mushroom soup, undiluted
- 1/4 cup water

Optional: cracked black pepper and chopped fresh parsley

Directions

- 1. In a large cast-iron or other heavy skillet, heat butter over medium heat. Brown pork chops on both sides; remove from pan, reserving drippings.
- 2. In same pan, saute vegetables in drippings until lightly browned. Whisk together soup and water; stir into vegetables. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, just until vegetables are tender, 15-20 minutes.
- 3. Add chops; cook, covered, until a thermometer inserted in pork reads 145°. Remove from heat; let stand 5 minutes. If desired, sprinkle with pepper and parsley.



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

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




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What Should I do When I am Offended

Claybank Master Gardeners

This summer's heat and drought has put you in a bind? Extension Agent Lucy Edwards recommends hand watering about two to three times a week. Save your veggie cooking water, if not laced with salt and fat, for your potted or garden plants. They will be most grateful.

For a future water-saving method, there will be a rain barrel workshop in Troy on Tuesday October 22nd, 2019 10-12pm at the Pike County Extension

Office, 306 Three Notch St., Troy, AL 36081. Please call the Extension Office at (334) 566-0985 to register for this workshop. We love our two very nice rain barrels we got through a workshop, screened at the top, with a hose connector spigot near the bottom, that have kept us in rain water through much of the drought..

If you use city tap water, and want to protect your plants from the chlorine, just let it the water sit in a bucket or watering can for 30 minutes or so. Any chlorine will evaporate.

Fall planting time is now, and the SOW app suggests: beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, Chinese cabbage, collards, kale, kohlrabi, lettuce, mustard greens, onions, radishes, snap beans, spinach, summer squash, turnips, white potatoes, and winter squash.
