



Amazing Grace Equine Sanctuary turns 10

Ten years ago, John Groth and his wife, Erin Kelley-Groth, officially took in a few unwanted horses at their farm in rural Elkhart Lake. Slowly at first, but stepping up the pace each year, the Amazing Grace Equine Sanctuary (AGES) has taken in close to 200 horses, 27 of those last year alone. With the help of donors and volunteers, AGES makes a commitment to each newcomer to find a forever home with a qualified adopter, or remain at AGES permanently. AGES provides a humane solution when owners can no longer keep their horses, and a lifeline for horses that are abused, neglected or slaughter-bound.

"We offer a safe place to land for unwanted and surrendered horses, providing for all their physical needs along with emotional support that allows horses to have a purpose and live in dignity. Most of the horses we take in do find their perfect adopters. If not, they have a forever home right here at AGES," said Kelley-Groth.

AGES has about 20 very committed volunteers who work regular shifts feeding and grooming the horses and cleaning stalls and paddocks, but many more would be welcomed. AGES also offer monthly visitors' days giving people in the community a chance to visit with the horses, usually held the first Sunday of each month from 2 to 4 p.m. Helping children learn

how to treat animals with kindness and respect is particularly important at AGES. This summer, the organization offered a "horse camp" so children could learn more about what it takes to care for a horse.

Horses eat a lot, and rescued horses can have large medical needs. Financial support for the herd comes from adoption fees, donations, and grants. Many people in the area and even around the country make regular donations each month for a chosen horse. AGES has more than 11,000 followers on its Facebook page: https://www.facebook.com/AGequine/.

The biggest fund-raiser each year is Hope for Hooves, held each August. This year was a special celebration for the organization's 10th anniversary, and drew a large crowd to the AGES facility. A chainsaw carving demo and wooden shoe carving were featured along with live music, food and a big silent auction. There were more than 25 horses to visit plus other animals from rescue exhibitors, including reptiles, ferrets, wildlife, birds and dogs. But the star was little Sawyer, a four-month old mini-horse. His mother, Blackberry, and a second mini-horse, were removed from their home in Sheboygan County in an alleged case of animal neglect. Blackberry gave birth to Sawyer at AGES and has been delighting visitors ever since.



Three historical displays to close after October 27

Wedding gowns, clowns, and a furniture tale for two towns, will soon all be coming down at the New Holstein Historical Society's Timm House and Pioneer Corner Museum.

Both locations will be closing their 2019 season on Sunday, October 27 and three exhibits will not be on display for the coming 2020 season when the historical sites reopen in May. All three remain on display from now thru October 27, 2019.

A popular feature for the 2019 season, at the Timm House, a display of eight wedding dresses from the NHHS's own collection, or on loan from friends of the NHHS, will remain thru the closing date.

The wedding dresses span a time slot from the late 1800's to 1961. They were displayed in various rooms throughout the restored Victorian home. Each dress is accompanied by a short history of "happenings in New Holstein" for the year the dress was worn. Where possible, a photo of the bride wearing the gown is also displayed.

At the Pioneer Corner Museum, two featured exhibits will be making their last appearance in the South Gallery when the 2019 season ends.

"Remembering Gramma Clown" offers a wonderful glimpse of former New Holstein resident Audrey Orth's career as a clown. Several of her costumes, some of her props, and photos of many of her appearances are part of the. For anyone who remembers the Gramma Clown troupe cavorting in any, or all, of the area parades, this exhibit is sure to evoke memories.


The third temporary exhibit about to close at the end of October is "Furniture Connection". This Pioneer Corner Museum display tells the story of the Rodenbaeck/Laun families' connection with the furniture and lumber businesses that ultimately became the A.A. Laun Company and the Erbe-Laun Furniture Store in New Holstein.


New exhibits will take the place of both "Gramma Clown" and "Furniture Connection" as the NHHS endeavors to display other facets of New Holstein's history.

Both the Timm House and Pioneer Corner Museum are open from 1 to 4 pm on Saturdays and Sundays thru the 27th of October. Admission to either the Timm House, or the PC Museum, is \$7 for adults and \$5 for children. A combo ticket for both venues is available at \$10 for adults and \$7 for children. Combo tickets need not be used for both venues on the same day.



Route 67 seeks to gain notoriety

Renovations spark interest in new Elkhart Lake establishment

Anyone who has not yet stepped into Route 67 Saloon in Elkhart Lake really ought to do so.

As a matter of fact, perhaps they can just walk through the double glass overhead doors which now constitute the south wall of the dining area.

The overhead doors feature is the most impressive of a long list of improvements already made to the establishment since the current ownership team purchased it in March. Curt Semph, Tommy Kostrivas, and managing partner Angela Girard are among the owners of the food and spirits business named for its location on STH 67 just south of the four-way stop signs in the village.

Asked how this group of people came to own Route 67, Girard said, "We're all living in the Elkhart Lake area and we wanted a fun, clean environment where locals hang out and visitors feel welcome."

Route 67 Saloon does that and much

Open seven days a week through the fall-starting at 4 p.m. on Mondays and Tuesdays and 11 a.m. every other day of the week—Route 67 is quickly becoming well known in the greater Elkhart Lake area for its somewhat unusual menu offerings. Devon Dedering became the head cook in mid summer and added several new items to the menu.

Dedering said he has been cooking for over 8 years and makes a "mean Alfredo", which is a new addition to the menu. He moved away from the area for awhile but Elkhart Lake keeps bringing him back. Other new menu items include Pesto Pasta, a tenderloin Steak Sandwich and several new salads. Also new is a Friday Fish Fry that starts at 5pm, featuring perch and cod dinner or as a sandwich.

Growth of the business has been very brisk. Girard said, "The success of the business is due to the great employees we have and the teamwork of everyone working hard and well together." The kitchen staff consists of Devon Dedering, Alex Schulze, Cole Rentmeester, Joe Wilfinger, Michael Johnson and Julian Kebshull. In the front of the house you will see manager, Angela Girard, along with Antionette Kebschull, Dano Nicholaus, Antonia Girard, Dayne Schirmer, Mia Rentmeester, Alix Cash and Tate Kleinhaus.

The menu still offers many of the original specialties including a BBLT (brisket, bacon, lettuce, and tomato), brisket noodle bowl, fish or pork tacos, a Hummus Sammy, Brisket Shawarma.

Diners can still get traditional offerings such as a burger, chicken and wings, but they also can try ribs, pulled pork, or a pizza with some unusual toppings including brisket, pulled pork, or shrimp. For tourists who have heard so much about Johnsonville brats, they can try a nine-inch brat on a hoagie bun (locals are welcome to try it, too).

Girard is being equally creative in the bar area where 12 tap beer selections are offered at any given time with new varieties regularly cycled into the mix. Route 67 also offers a good selection of wines.

With 22 years in the food and beverage industry, Girard said she feels she has a good idea on how to make Route 67 inviting for people of all ages. "I'm big on customer service," she said. "I want people to feel it's a welcoming place."

The ownership team has completely refinished the interior of Route 67, with the shape of the bar being about the only thing which has remained the same. 10 big

screen tv's feature sporting events and offer a perfect place to watch all Packer and Badger games while enjoying food and drink specials. Racing related photographs on the walls fit well with the overhead doors which lead out onto the brick patio overlooking STH 67. The doors come equipped with a fan system which blows continuously when the doors are open to keep bugs from entering the indoor dining area. Girard said the doors were open whenever weather permitted and were well received by customers stepping into Route 67. Wine pairing Tricks for Treats

Whether you can sneak some of your kids' Halloween candy or have leftovers from your trick-or-treater bowl, candy is a great thing to pair with wine! The variety of candy types opens up an endless possibility of wine pairings and enjoyment. From chocolate to confections, there are a few wine pairing tricks you can employ to make sure you're in for a

Pair sweet with sweet. This is the most popular and fail-proof pairing method. With any sweet food, whether it be candy or dessert, you'll find a good match if you pair a wine that is sweeter than the food. This will ensure that the wine doesn't taste bitter when combined with a sweet treat and the flavors will meld well together. Some of my favorites are Ruby Port with chocolate, Tawny Port with nutty sweets, Moscato with fruity confections like Skittles, and Brachetto with berry-flavored candies like red licorice or gummies.

Match the intensity. If the idea of all that sugar sounds like an overload, you can pair dry wines with candy. Instead of matching the sweetness, you will match the intensity. Dark chocolate is lightly bitter and full of rich flavors, which pair wonderfully with a lightly bitter (tannic) red wine that is also rich like a Malbec, Syrah, or Zinfandel. You should try to avoid wines that are too earthy, though, as those can end up tasting rather funky as the sugar in the candy will play up those notes. You can also look for overlapping flavors like cherry or raspberry in a wine with fruit-filled

treats. Some barrel-aged wines have a nutty note that pairs up magically with things like Snickers or Peanut M&Ms.

Match the mouthfeel. Pairing a silky red wine with a silky milk chocolate works nicely, as does pairing a bubbly Prosecco with a crunchy Rice Krispies bar or Butterfinger. In addition to the texture, you can match tannin and bitterness, acidity and tartness, spiciness and alcohol to achieve an adventuresome pairing. A warning, though avoid PopRocks with Champagne. It's definitely amusing, but too much of a good thing. The key to wine and food pairing is balance.

Whether you love dark or milk chocolate, gummies or hard candy; there are plenty of ways to enjoy them all with wine! So raid the candy jar, pop a cork and experiment to find your new favorite pairing!

The Village of Elkhart Lake has been working on a short-term rental ordinance. One reason we are working on this ordinance is due to some changes in WI State Statute that many of you may not be aware of. The State requires that all people who operate Tourist Rooming Houses (TRH), even if it is only for one night, to obtain a Tourist Rooming House license. More information can be found on the State's Tourist Room House license at https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/TouristRoomingHouses.aspx.

The Village has decided to create a short-term rental ordinance to ensure that the quality of short-term rentals operating within the Village is adequate to protect public health, safety and general welfare. The Village will be instituting a license to ensure that properties have obtained the tourism rooming house license from the state, are inspected by State inspectors and Village fire inspectors, and are turning in the required room tax. The Village's license will be required for all properties who rent for more than 10 nights a year.

We will be holding an open house on Thursday, October 3, 2019 from 3:30-5:30 pm in the Grashorn Civic Center located at 84 N. Lake Street. 

Comprehensive Planning Survey - Get in the Know Liquor Licensing

Alcohol beverage licensing in the State of Wisconsin is a complicated matter. There are many different classes of beer, liquor, and wine licenses. The State of Wisconsin set a quota for Class B Liquor Licenses for each municipality in Wisconsin based on the number of licenses that had been granted in that municipality as of December 1, 1997. The Village of Elkhart Lake has 11 regular Class B Liquor licenses and one reserve Class B Liquor license. The Village currently issues all 11 regular Class B Liquor licenses, thirteen-Class B Beer licenses, two-Class A Beer licenses, one-Class A Liquor license, and one Class C Wine license. The Village also issues many temporary Class B Beer and Liquor licenses for events throughout the Village. These events include: Downtown Night, Firemen's Picnic, Memorial Day Program, Night Market, Shop & Sip Event, the Fish Boil, etc.

The Village only has one Class B Reserve Liquor license available. Wisconsin Act 286 passed in 2015 allows neighboring municipalities to transfer licenses to each other. This means a permanent adjustment to the quotas, as in someone's Class B Liquor license quota goes up while another municipalities Class B Liquor license quota goes down. The Village approached neighboring municipalities about the potential transfer of a Reserve Class B Liquor License. The Town of Greenbush has agreed to transfer a license to the Village for a cost of \$17,000. The Village Board has approved this as well as raising the cost of the Reserve Class B Liquor Licenses to \$17,000. The Village will now have two Reserve Class B Liquor Licenses available for potential development.



the presence of calcium and magnesium dissolved in water. These minerals, if not removed from your water, may build up as scale on pipes and porcelain or metal fixtures. They coat water-heater elements. They may cause increased laundry detergent usage. This is way most people have water softeners.

The Problem

The chlorides discharged from the home water softeners end up at the wastewater treatment plant. The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) is asking the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) to reduce these chloride levels.

What can our customers do about our chloride problem?

You can have your water softening equipment inspected and adjusted to make them more efficient reducing the chlorides going to the wastewater treatment plant. When replacing or upgrading old water softeners use a high efficiency softener that is metered demand. Our

goal is to reduce the chlorides entering the environment by reducing the rate of salt used by our water softener, while still delivering continued quality water. This in turn, will simply help keep long-term sewer rates down. You may also see some reduction in your water and salt usage, thus saving you money!

Civil War returns to Wade House

The smell of gunpowder, the roar of cannon fire, and the rumble of a cavalry charge will fill the air at Wade House Historic Site as it hosts the 29th-annual Wade House Civil War Weekend from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 28, and 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., Sunday, Sept. 29.

Guests will experience the largest Civil War reenactment in the state of Wisconsin, including a hands-on look at 19thcentury battles, military drills, medical care situations, period music, food, demonstrations, educational presentations, and more.

In a scene reminiscent of what took place during the historic conflict, cavalry, artillery, and infantry representing both sides of the war will conduct demonstrations at 11:00 a.m. on both days, followed by a full-scale battle at 2:00 p.m.

"This event is a plunge right into America's history," Alli Karrels, Wade House site director, said. "Seeing these recreated battles up close is a powerful reminder of what life was like for these soldiers, and really all Americans, at a point in time where the future of our country was very much uncertain."

In between the action, visitors will be able to access the battlefield to get an upclose look at the men, horses, and equipment that brings the American Civil War to life, including a chance to listen to our nation's 16th president, brought to life by one of America's premier Abraham Lincoln presenters, Fritz Klein, as he shares his concerns about the ferocious fighting, the overall war effort, and the trials to come. Visitors will also be able to explore a soldier's life in the camp and learn about military life through hands-on activities in the family area.

On Saturday, H.H. Bennett Studio will be at Civil War Days doing Tintype Experience for guests and reenactors. Starting at 9:00 am there will be 30 minutes slots until 4:30 with a break in the middle of the day. Guests will receive a 4x6 tintype in a branded sleeve mailed to their address after the event as well as a digital copy. Cost is \$80 for the general public, \$60 for reenactors in costume and additional plates can be purchased for \$50 apiece. Please note that only cash or check is accepted for this experience. Tickets for the event are \$17.00 for adults (ages 13-64), \$15.00 for seniors (ages 65 and older), and \$8.50 for children (ages 5-12). Children under five are admitted free. About Wade House

The Wade House historic site is one of twelve Wisconsin Historical Society historic sites and museums. Located in Greenbush, Wade House is a 1850s stagecoach inn that was built to serve traffic along the plank road that connected Fond du Lac and Sheboygan. The site tells the story of frontier entrepreneur Sylvanus Wade and his family during the Civil War years. In addition to the inn, the historic

site includes the Herrling sawmill, one of the few working, water-powered sawmills of its kind in the nation. Wade House is also home to the Wesley Jung Carriage Museum, which houses the state's largest collection of antique carriages and working wagons. 


