Tornado Damage At First Light

Joy Wilson, Editors note:

My thoughts from a very terrifing experience this past Sunday in Sachse at my son's house.

Enola Gay's first report on KSST radio on Monday morning:

Jay Porterfield, Hopkins County native, sustained extensive damage at his home in Sachse. The first storm at about 9:30 pm Sunday October 20, 2019 broke out windows and started a leak in the roof, so as a more destructive second wave brought additional damage to the home and property, the family took refuge in a safe area under the stairs. His 5-bay shop, where 2 of the family's vehicles were placed for safety, had it's roof and overhead doors buckled from wind and the cars could not be removed. At 1am Monday, the family was escorted from their home by emergency workers and guided around hot electrical wires on the ground, and they spent the night in a Wylie hotel. On Monday morning at first light, Jay reported that their large horse trailer was nowhere in sight at first, but when located, "it looked like it had been rolled then thrown back to the ground". Other homes in his neighborhood were flattened, but it appears that everyone has been accounted for.

Sunday morning, I had gone to Sachse to my son's home for Noelle's dance performance. All grandparents but one were in attendance so we had a very enjoyable time watching

the dancing and eating a nice supper together.

You would never think that you would say that you had rather be in a tornado than to be safe miles away in your own home. But, yes, that is the way that I felt on Sunday night when the tornado hit in Sachse and things started flying, cracking and glass breaking. I was in the "safe" room with my son, daughter-in-law, my three grandchildren and two granddogs, Jay, Amber, Castleton, McCleary, Noelle, Sarge and Scout Porterfield. (You want to be with your children so you can see that they are okay and not just hear it from a cell phone.) Daisy, poor kitty, was in the garage the last time that we saw her but she is fine. Thank God that we all survived including the horses. The last time that we saw them, they were in the barn that was damaged and some of the roof torn off. Evidently, they felt the presssure and ran for safer ground. We could hear the windows breaking and things hitting the roof but it was much quieter than I would have imagined. The room had thick walls which helped with the sounds. As soon as it was safe to get outdoors, my son found the horses in the farthest part of the pasture, all three right together. Of course, it was dark so it took a little while searching 16 acres with a flashlight!

At 1 a.m. in a driving rain, we were escorted from the house to an awaiting Uber vehicle that took us to a dry hotel in Wylie. Since there was a "hot" downed wire in front of the house and we had no electricity, we were told we needed to leave for the night.

This entire episode has been trememdous for our family and all we lost was the shop, one car, horse trailer, utility trailer, barn, some windows in the house, garage door, and roof damage. Probably all things in the media room will have to be replaced as a large piece of wood came through the window. Two other families just in the neighborhood lost their entire homes and all their possessions. Thankfully, no lives were lost in the

entire area and all animals were accounted for in our immediate neighbor.

That is the real miracle.



PAT NEFF AND THE WHITE ROSE

Pat Neff was governor of Texas from 1921 to 1925. His accomplishments include establishing Texas Tech and the Texas State Parks System (the first park is Mother Neff State Park). "He was followed by Ma Ferguson as governor," says David Scott of Gatesville, who spent 15 years doing research and writing a biography of Pat Neff. "Pat Neff started a tradition that still carries on today. When a governor leaves office, he places a Bible open on the desk

with a verse underlined for the incoming governor. So he left this with Ma Ferguson and put a white rose on top of the open Bible. So when Ma and Pa Ferguson walked into the office, Pa Ferguson picked up the rose, threw it in the trash, slammed the Bible shut and said 'Sunday School's over.'"

The title of David's biography of Pat Neff is titled THE LAND, THE LAW AND THE LORD. Pat Neff was president of Baylor University from 1932 to 1947. He attended Baylor and graduated with a BA in 1894.

"While a student at Baylor," says David, "Pat met a young girl named Myrtle Mainer and they fell in love and he proposed to her. But he told her 'I can't get married to you until after I'm established as an attorney.' So Myrtle left Baylor and went back home to Lovelady, Texas where she began a very long wait. It was years later, in 1901 when he finally married her."

In the years leading up to his marriage Pat had obtained a law degree from the University of Texas in 1897 and established a law practice in Waco. Being a gifted orator, he was elected to the state legislature in 1899 and served until 1905, the last 2 years as speaker of the house.

David said Pat was a very outgoing person, never met a stranger. "His wife on the other hand was very shy and retiring. She didn't like the limelight. In fact when they moved into the governor's mansion she didn't even become the official hostess. That was left up to their daughter Hallie Maude. Myrtle was sick a lot and went to hotels with mineral spas where you drink the water to get healthy. She always signed the hotel register with an assumed name because she didn't want to be known as the governor's wife. When she traveled to Lovelady by train she dressed in old clothes, a big hat and glasses so she wouldn't be recognized."

Being the youngest of several children, Pat was very close to his mother. "When he became governor he moved his mother to live with them in the governor's mansion. And that's where she died." In 1923 Pat had the opportunity to be president of UT. In 1924 he was urged to run for president of the US. He turned down both offers. Pat was born on the family ranch at Eagle Springs near Gatesville in 1871. He died in 1952 and is buried in Waco's Oakwood cemetery.
