



November 6 Update from Children's Medical Center: Another night with no fever. Blood counts good, even better today than yesterday. Drs are pleased with progress.

Kaycee was given morphine pump yesterday for pain control...neck brace has been removed so she can communicate with us better now. Today, Kaycee has sat on the side of the bed and has sort of stood up (using her bed). Talking about a "fancy" bed! Her catheter has been removed and cast is coming off left wrist today. We're getting there, slowly. Thanks for praying for and loving us. Keep up the good work.

It's so good to be part of a caring community. We have "harvested " so much love in recent weeks! And, think of the youngsters who've grown up in Hopkins County thinking this is "normal" then carry this kind of 'benefit of love' with them to all the places they go in starting out their lives. Think of the potential force for change they already are! Keep encouraging one another and looking for the good in others. And by all means, count your blessings daily! 

America's #1 Baseball Fan

Ben Campbell of Palestine is a baseball fan. But there was a gentleman in his town who was a legendary baseball fan. Since Ben is a historian he looked into this man. His name was Hyman Pearlstone who owned a wholesale grocerv business in Palestine. He was a successful businessman and a civic leader. Somehow he was able to convince the Saint Louis Browns, an American League baseball team, to hold spring practice in Palestine in 1916 and 1917.

The players arrived by train and carried their own equipment and luggage to the Redlands Hotel that was near the railroad tracks. They walked to their ball field that was a mile and a quarter away from the hotel. After practice they walked back.

Mr. Pearlstone and his wife Mabel loved to travel. In October of 1905 they were in New Orleans staying at the Roosevelt Hotel. It just so happened that the Philadelphia Athletics baseball team was staying there, too. Hyman became acquainted with several of the players and one of them invited him to come to Marlin the following year to watch spring training. So he did and spent a week with the team. He met the team owner, Mr. Cornelius McGillicutty (otherwise known as Connie Mack). The two men hit it off beautifully and became close friends. Mr. Mack invited Mr., Pearlstone to spend his vacation in Philadelphia during baseball season. He could sit in the dugout with the team and travel with the players. So Mr. Pearlstone did just that for a solid month. He sat with the team every year for 45 years.

Connie Mack had given Hyman a Philadelphia Athletics uniform complete with cap, jersey, pants, shoes, even a glove. Mr. Pearlstone wore that uniform on his train trips to Philadelphia. Once during a slump the catcher tossed his glove to Mr. Pearlstone and asked him to warm up a pitcher in the bullpen. That seemed to turn things around for the team and Mr. Pearlstone continued to warm up pitchers.

Players considered him good luck. Between 1910 and 1931the Athletics were in 7 World Series and won 5 of them. During every world series game for 45 years, the Pearlstones were guests of Connie Mack, whether his team was playing or not. During off seasons Connie Mack went to Palestine and stayed with the Pearlstones for a month at a time. Some players even went to Palestine, opened businesses and lived out their lives there. Occasionally players would ask Mr. Pearlstone about which stocks to buy.

One of those players was Ty Cobb, whose home was in Georgia. After he retired a reporter asked him how he was going to make a living since he had spent his enormous salary every year (he was one of the highest paid players). He told the reporter "I got some advice to invest in a start up company in Atlanta called Coca Cola. That advice has made me a millionaire and I'll be able to live comfortable without my salary."

In 1909 the New York World Telegram newspaper recognized Mr. Pearlstone as America's #1 Baseball Fan. He died in 1966.


