PIEDMONT PETS

From social media, we see far too many videos of animals that are being abused. What has gone wrong with society today? Actually, there has been a cycle of violence involving humans and animals from the beginning.

Years ago, I was flying to visit my sister and her family. I sat next to a woman who looked and acted completely broken. She told the story about how family and friends had packed her clothes in a hurry to get her away from her husband. She had to leave her small dog there and hoped that the friends would go back to the house in time to remove the dog before her husband came home for lunch. She told details about how he had tortured the dog. Even though this was in the mid-1970s, I never forgot the story. When I started employment at the animal shelter, I knew we had to help the animals who belonged to human victims of domestic violence.

The problem of cruelty to animals is not just a problem for people who respect and care for animals. People learn how to abuse, torture, and then ultimately kill humans by practicing on animals.

We received a telephone call several years ago from a woman who had witnessed a man harshly beat two puppies. When we went to his house to speak with him about it, his response was an arrogant and chilling, "I don't beat my puppies any harder than I beat my children."

Research and data support what is actually a matter of common sense; that is, if someone hurts an animal, they will also hurt a human.

In one case, we took two dogs from a man because he had just cut off

their ears with box cutters. His girlfriend came to court and testified about how he was such a kind pet owner. Within a month, he had stabbed her to death.

In another case, a young man was accused of putting a small kitten in a mail drop box. His mother defended him and told us what a sweet, gentle person he was. Several months later, the son killed his mother.

Victims of domestic violence can be reluctant to leave an abusive situation because they do not want to put a pet at the mercy of the one who abused them. Because of my experience on that plane so many years ago, the City animal shelter is pleased to offer a safe haven for pets at risk when the owners leave home to enter a protection program. It is entirely confidential and free.

If you know of an animal or a human at risk of domestic violence, please let them know we will help relieve their worry for the animals. 
The final winner in the print advertising category was, "At DCC, dreams are coming true every day."

Here's No. 1 Reason to Remove Gallbladder

DEAR DR. ROACH: My husband's doctor is telling him to have his gallbladder removed because sometimes he has pain in his right side. They did all kind of tests, but he has pain when he drives long hours or when he eats salads, not fried or fatty foods. Can you tell me more about the surgery, and what it might be like for him after the surgery? -- A.M.

ANSWER: Almost every time a gallbladder needs to be removed, it is because of gallstones. Gallstones are common. Six percent of men and 9% of women have them, but most of the time, people have no symptoms. It isn't always clear whether the symptoms people have are due to the gallstones that are found on imaging studies, such as CT or ultrasound, but there are some clues to help decide whether a gallbladder that contains stones needs to be removed.

The classic symptoms are pain in the right upper abdomen, especially after eating a fatty meal, such as fried food (some people eat salads with lots of fatty dressing). Sometimes gallbladder pain is not foodassociated. Symptoms at nighttime are not uncommon. Nausea, bloating, lower chest pain, belching

and burning pain all are well-described with gallbladder disease, and the proof comes when surgery relieves the symptoms.

Sometimes, the imaging test can give clues. Thickening of the gallbladder wall or pain with pressure on the gallbladder (Murphy's sign) are suggestive of acute gallbladder inflammation.

Unfortunately, doctors aren't always right. Occasionally a person's gallbladder is removed, and it doesn't help the symptoms at all. Then, a new search needs to be done to discover the true cause of the symptoms.

Most people do very well after gallbladder surgery. The liver itself takes over the job of storing bile, in the ducts of the liver, and bile is released into the intestines appropriately after eating. However, it takes time for the system to get adjusted to not having a gallbladder, and only 60% of people are completely back to normal after three months. A few people have persistent symptoms for years. Thus, it's wise to be as sure as possible that symptoms are due to gallbladder disease before undergoing surgery.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I have been unable to complete a yawn for a couple of years. You know, that final "aaah" feeling. My doctor just smiled and offered no explanation; I'm sure she had never heard of this before. I am a 70-year-old woman who is retired. Any ideas, suggestions or recommendations to end this unsatisfied feeling? -- M.G.

ANSWER: Nobody knows for sure why we yawn. It can be related to low oxygen, fatigue or boredom, but there is a "yawn center" of the brain (in the hypothalamus) and even fetuses have been shown to yawn.

I have read two possible explanations why some people have incomplete or unsatisfying yawns: The first is that in some people, anxiety is the impetus to yawn, and that type of yawn just isn't satisfying. The second is that stretching of the muscles of the face and jaw are necessary for the yawn to be complete. For some people, repeated stretching (from a "forced" yawn) and breathing in very deeply can lead to a satisfying yawn.





Little-Known Medicaid Concern: If You're Hiring A Caregiver, A Proper Contract Is A <u>Must!</u>

As an Elder Law Attorney, "Tell me about your mother (or father)" is a question I ask someone every day. When they reply, "Well, we have had sitters come in to be with her (or him) for the last few years" I cringe every time. Because I know that in many cases, the family has been paying the sitter or caregiver in cash, with no written contract in place. Then, when we try to make the parent eligible for Medicaid, there is a problem, a big problem.

Let me tell you a story: A former client came to me for advice. Years earlier she had liquidated all of her father's real estate for close to \$250,000. Over the next four to five years she used every dime of that money to pay for caregivers for her father. She had seven ladies that she used to care for her father from week to week. Yet, when I asked the question, "did you have a contract with the caregivers?" her reply was "No, I paid them all in cash." My heart sank as I told her, "I'm sorry, your father probably will never qualify for Medicaid." She was shocked! She had done all the right things to care for her father, what went wrong???

A few years ago the Medicaid Manual was amended and it tightened the rules on how Medicaid would consider payments for caregivers. If you do not use a written contract, or if you did use one and that contract does not meet all of the requirements listed under the Manual, that money will absolutely be considered a gift and Medicaid will penalize you. The penalty results in a period of time that your loved one will not be eligible for Medicaid.

Reasons a PROPER Caregiver Contract is Essential!

If you regularly provide paid care to a family member, such as a parent or grandparent, it's very important to have an experienced Elder Law Attorney (preferably a Certified Elder Law Attorney) prepare a proper caregiver contract (also known by many other names, such as a personal-care contract or a family-care contract) setting out the terms of your arrangement. And to avoid a situation such as the case described above, the terms of the agreement must be supported in advance by a proper specialist in geriatrics, typically a Geriatric Care Manager. And, you must be sure to adhere to the terms set forth in the agreement.

The following are excellent reasons to have a proper caregiver agreement:

§ It is important for Medicaid eligibility: The money a parent pays to a caregiver, absent an agreement in writing, will simply be deemed a gift by Medicaid, causing a period of ineligibility during which the parent will not qualify for the Medicaid benefit. How? At the time of a parent's Medicaid application, Medicaid will total all the payments made to a caregiver in the past 60 months and divide that total by the state's "penalty divisor." As an example of how this works, let's say a parent pays a family caregiver \$60,000 over the course of three years and then applies for Medicaid. Without a proper caregiver contract in place, Medicaid would deem those payments as gifts, causing a penalty period of over 10 months!

§ It sets boundaries: A detailed caregiver agreement makes clear the extent of the services being provided by a caregiver and the amount of money the caregiver is getting paid. A caregiver contrast each the understanding about the requirements and limits of the relationship

Staying Safe and Warm

Like it or not, here it comes again: winter, along with snow and ice in many parts of the country. As seniors we need to take extra steps to stay safe, warm and healthy during cold weather.

Investigate now whether your grocery store delivers. Groceries brought to your door can be a wonderful help when you can't get out. Also keep on hand a few days' worth of extra canned goods such as beans, fruits and vegetables, as well as cereals.

Start now to find indoor walking locations, especially if you get lots of snow and ice. Enclosed malls often open early to allow walkers. Look for local indoor tracks, perhaps as part of the parks and rec department. As incentive to keep to a routine, corral a few friends who also want to walk on a regular basis. If nothing else, use the aisles of the big box stores or ask about senior fees at the YMCA. Remember to get out among people. It's healthier for us to have social connections so we don't feel isolated, which can lead to depression. Look for an interesting weekly group to join. Call others to check in on days you can't get out. Check your supply of warm winter clothing. A hat, coat and gloves are a good place to start, followed by socks and a scarf. Remember to dress in loose layers that trap body heat. Hypothermia and frostbite can affect us faster than when we were younger. Put a thermometer outside your door or window so you know what to expect. Be sure you have enough batteries and flashlights in case of a power outages. Contact the National Energy Assistance Referral service at 1-866-674-6327 if you have trouble paying your heating bill, or think you will. Call them sooner rather than later, as many organizations have a set budget amount each year.





Most senior citizens would rather not give up their homes as they grow older, says ΑΜΑ

It's one reason many of them continue working

WASHINGTON, DC, Oct 18 -- The labor participation rate of older Americans is increasing for a variety of reasons. The National Council on Aging [NCOA] reports that one in five seniors are still working.

In fact, says Dan Weber, president of the Association of Mature American Citizens [AMAC]: "The term, 'retirement age,' may become irrelevant in the 21st century. For one thing, modern medicine is giving seniors a second wind, making them healthy enough to continue working. Technology is making it easier for them to stay on the job. But, perhaps the biggest reason for not retiring, is the fact that the rising cost of living makes it more difficult to live on a fixed income,"

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, more than a third of men and women between the ages of 65 and 69 and at least 19% of those 70 to 74 years of age are still on the job. And, the NCOA reports that 69 percent of senior citizens say they continue to work for economic reasons.

And, among those reasons, perhaps, is that they have a strong desire to continue living in their current homes as they grow old. In fact, as AMAC reported earlier this year, the Family Caregiver Alliance estimates that "the vast majority of elderly people receiving assistance (80%) live in private homes in the community, not institutions. It turns out that most seniors want to age in place their own place to be exact."



How to Choose a Walk-in **Bathtub**

Dear Savvy Senior,

Because of my mobility problems, I'm thinking about getting a walk-in bathtub that's easy to get into and out of but could use some help selecting one. What can you tell me about walk-in tubs, and can you recommend some good companies that make and install them?

Bubble Bath Betty

Dear Betty,

Walk-in tubs are a good option for mobility challenged seniors because they're much easier to get into and out of than a standard tub, and will help prevent slips, trips and falls too. Here's what you should know.

The Basics

Walk-in bathtubs are uniquely designed tubs that have a watertight, hinged door built into the side of the tub that provides a much lower threshold to step over (usually 2.5 to 7 inches) versus a standard tub that's around 15 inches.

In addition to the low threshold, most walk-in tubs also have a built-in seat, grab bars, anti-slip floors, anti-scald valves and a handheld showerhead. And many higher-end models offer therapeutic spalike features that are great for seniors with arthritis and other ailments.

The kind of tub you choose will depend on your needs, preferences and budget, and the size and layout of your bathroom. The cost of a walk-in tub today with professional installation ranges anywhere from \$3,000 to \$10,000. Here are some other things you'll need to consider, to help you make a good choice.

Tub size: Walk-in bathtubs vary in size. Most models have high walls between three and four feet high, and are between 28 and 32 inches wide, but will fit into the same 60-inch long space as your standard tub without having to reconfigure the room. There are also bariatric walk-in tubs that have wider door openings and larger seats to accommodate people over 300 pounds. programs that provide financial aid too.

Tub options: The most basic and least expensive type of walk-in tub you can get is a simple soaker tub. But depending on your preferences, you have many other options like an aerotherapy (air jets) tub, hydrotherapy (whirlpool water jets) tub, aromatherapy tub that mixes fragrant essential oils with the water, or a combination tub that has multiple features. Also, look for tubs that have an in-line heating system to keep your bathwater warm while you soak.

Fast fill and drain: One drawback to using a walk-in bathtub is that the bather must sit in the tub as it fills and drains, which can make for a chilly experience. To help with this, consider a tub that has fast-filling faucets and pump-assisted drainage systems, which significantly speed up the process. But these options may require some plumbing modifications to your bathroom.

Easy cleaning: Keeping the tub clean should be a priority, especially if you get a therapy tub because of the bacteria that can grow in it. So, look for tubs with self-cleaning systems.

Warranty: The best walk-in bathtubs on the market today are made in the USA. Also make sure the company you choose has a lifetime "leak-proof" door seal warranty and lengthy warranties on both the tub and the operating system.

Where to shop: While there are many companies that make, sell and install walk-in bathtubs, some of the best in the industry are American Standard (AmericanStandard-us.com), Safe Step (SafeStepTub.com) and Kohler (KohlerWalkinBath.com). Most companies offer financing with monthly payment plans.

Unfortunately, original Medicare does not cover walk-in bathtubs nor do Medicare supplemental (Medigap) policies, but some Medicare Advantage plans may help pay. There are also many states that offer Medicaid waivers that will help pay for the purchase and installation of a walk-in tub to those that qualify, and the VA offers some

But, if you are a senior who fears that the cost of remodeling in order to make your home safe and accessible may be out of reach, you may be surprised to learn that a makeover can be guite reasonable. The RetirementLiving.Com says that the 'price tag on most remodeling projects is under \$10,000,' a bargain compared with the cost of assisted living, which can run as high as about \$7,700 a month or more than \$92,000 a year."

The actual cost of fixing the impediments for senior citizens that may exist in your home will vary based on what your physical needs are and what they might be in the future. If it is just a matter of installing a walk-in tub and entry ramps and widening a few doorways the cost can be quite reasonable.

Wheelchair-accessible: Most walk-in tubs have an inward opening door, but if you use a wheelchair, an outward opening door may be a better option because they're easier to access.




