Crosby-Ironton school district voters approve \$29.56 million

Voters in the Crosby-Ironton school district overwhelming approved a \$29.56 million referendum on November 5.

Unofficial totals at press time on Wednesday, showed voters cast 1,209 ballots (74.91 percent) in favor of the referendum and 405 against (25.09 percent.)

"We are thankful to voters," said Mike Domin, chair of the Crosby-Ironton School Board. "I want to thank people for making an effort to learn more about the issues behind the referendum and for making informed votes. Our students will benefit from this investment by community members for years to come."

Accourding to a press release from the school, funds provided to the district will be devoted to district priorities. Revenue generated by the bond levy will enable the district to provide long-term facility maintenance, such as roofs, flooring, lighting and restrooms. Student locker areas, library, and cafeteria commons spaces will be remodeled. Also importantly, learning areas will be modernized; elementary classrooms will be enclosed and flexible collaboration spaces, as well as modernizing the industrial tech. wing at the high school - important to contemporary learning approaches - will be created.

The district will use bond levy funds to improve outside areas, too, such as the elementary school bus loop, stadium bleachers and baseball fields.

Revenue from the capital projects levy will allow Crosby-Ironton to maintain its current technology programs and, over 10 years, upgrade technology infrastructure.

Most property owners will not see a change in their school bond levy property tax.

Debt from the construction of the new junior high school will be paid off in 2023. Revenue from the bonds that voters approved Tuesday will replace the revenue stream that ends with the paying off of the previous bond. Therefore, taxes for homes under \$350,000

will not increase and those for homes valued at \$350,000 or more will increase by only \$1 per year.

"The community's approval of these levies is so important to maintaining the Crosby-Ironton community's investment in its school facilities and to making sure that Crosby-Ironton remains competitive with other districts in the area," said Jamie Skjeveland, Superintendent. "We want to assure community members that we will invest these dollars wisely and

Union member Smith wins job back

A union member who was fired wins back job with a year and a half of back pay.

Tami Smith, a 17-year member of SEIU Healthcare Minnesota employed by Cuyuna Regional Medical Center (CRMC), recently won back her job at Heartwood Assisted Living after being unjustly fired in 2018, according to a press release issued by the union.

Smith had been terminated by CRMC on May 31, 2018, but worked with the union to file a grievance alleging her employer violated the Collective Bargaining Agreement and did not have just cause for discharge. Prior to her termination, she had never been formally disciplined in her 17-plus years with CRMC. In response to the ruling, Smith stated she was happy to have her job back and her name cleared.

"I'm very pleased with the outcome and look forward to returning to work. This was a complete victory for the Union

and my name," said Smith.

The case was heard by independent Arbitrator Laura Cooper in Minneapolis, who ruled the Union's grievance had been sustained because the employer did not have just cause for discharge. The Arbitrator subsequently ordered the termination be reduced to a written warning, Smith to be reinstated to her position with CRMC and that the employer make her whole for all losses sustained over the past year and a half.

As of Memorial Day, 2019, there are 58,276 names on the national Vietnam Veteran's memorial, the Wall of

Faces, honoring service members of the U.S. Armed Forces who fought in Vietnam, those who died in service in Vietnam/South East Asia, and those service members who went unaccounted for during the war.

A 1973 fire in St. Louis, MO, destroyed their military records, leaving no photos behind. In 2013, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund set out to find the pictures to preserve their legacies and sacrifices. As of October 2019, 405 names are still missing pictures.

School Finance Working Group to review funding for systemic change

Governor Tim Walz, a former high school teacher, issued the following statement on Wednesday in response to Minnesotans across the state voting in favor of school referendums, "By voting overwhelmingly in support of local referendums last night, Minnesotans demonstrated our shared value that every child deserves a quality education. I am proud that Minnesotans step up when they

see a need—but this simply isn't the way it should work. The quality of our children's education shouldn't hinge on a question on a ballot. Schools shouldn't be forced to rely on referendums to fix a leaky roof, move a classroom out of a converted storage room, or keep classes small. And when school districts across Minnesota call out for help, the state needs to listen. That is why my Administra-

tion formed a School Finance Working Group to explore how we can reform the way we fund schools in Minnesota, reduce our dependence on referendums, and ensure students receive the support they deserve."

Minnesota Department of Education Commissioner Mary Cathryn Ricker convened the School Finance Working Group in September 2019 with a broad membership that includes Minnesotans who work in schools every day and ensures all perspectives are represented. According to a press re-

lease, the group's work will address education-funding issues facing the state. The School Finance Working Group will review key funding streams, identify options for school finance reform, and seek consensus on recommendations for systemic change.

Making things more transparent
