





Okoboji Foundation Presents Check to Iowa Department of Natural Resources

The Okoboji Foundation board chair, Dr. Pat O'Brien presented a \$24,000 check to Kim Hawkins of the Iowa Department

of Natural Resources on October 31. This grant, awarded in 2018, was for the Spirit Lake Fish Hatchery discharge project which was recently completed.

"This project now allows fish feed and fish waste time to settle in the ponds, prior to the water entering the lake. The settling ponds will reduce the phosphorus load from the hatchery by up to 70%. By replacing all the 12inch discharge line from the hatchery to the lake,



this project also allowed us to replace outdated equipment that was starting to deteriorate, while also improving water quality.

Thanks so much to the Okoboji Foundation for assisting with the hatchery discharge project," said Hawkins.

Season of Close Calls for Hawks and Cyclones

I can't remember any season with so many close losses for both Iowa and Iowa State. After Saturday's close calls with Iowa losing at #13 Wisconsin 24-22 and Iowa State losing at #9 Oklahoma 42-41 both teams are really left wondering "what if" with their 2019 seasons. Iowa is currently 6-3 with their 3 losses all coming in B1G Conference play by a total of just 14 points. Iowa State is 5-4 with their four losses by a total of only 1 points, including the one-point loss to Iowa earlier this year that is the difference in their records. Both teams fought back from large second half deficits only to have their chances dashed on failed two-point conversions. It's easy to second guess the coaches after the games, as many Iowa fans probably didn't like seeing QB Nate Stanley with a designed QB run to try and tie the game; and some ISU fans probably wanted the Cyclones to kick the extra point and force overtime after rallying from 21 points down to cut the lead to one with :23 left. Being the Sunday Morning Coach is always much easier than having to make those decisions in the heat of the moment. As a Cyclone fan, I trust Matt Campbell 100% and love the job that he's done with the ISU program. If he felt like their best chance to win that game was to go for two, I am fully behind him and trust that was the right decision.

The disappointing thing for both Iowa and Iowa State is that they are so close to being not only at the top of their conferences, but also in the Top 10 nationally with a chance to make the College Football Playoffs. As Matt Campbell often says, the difference between winning and losing is normally in the details, and right now neither Iowa nor Iowa State are good enough to beat high quality opponents when they don't take care of those details for four quarters (penalties, turn overs, execution). Teams such as Baylor, who is 9-0 with two overtime wins and two other wins by a total of five points, and Minnesota, who is also 9-0 with three non-conference wins by one possession, are finding ways to win these close games and playing with the confidence to figure out how to win. Iowa and Iowa State are good enough to play with anyone in the nation, but until they start "winning in the margins" they will continue to lose these heart-breakers and wonder at the end of the season, "what if?"

Recently Iowa Senator Grassley got on the bandwagon to promote prison reform. Criminal justice reform is a term that has been tossed about for generations. If any progress is to be made it cannot be from the top down or the bottom up. It must be reformed horizontally. In most states distinct attorneys are elected by voters. A prosecutor who is soft on crime will not be re-elected. In some states district judges are also elected. Again, a judge soft on crime will have difficulty getting re-elected. No one will legislate themselves out of a job. The U.S. has the highest incarceration rate of any country. 2.1 million persons are behind bars. 8.3% of these prisoners are held in privately operated prisons. 85% of federal prisons are privately operated. Corrections Corporation of America, GEO group and Wackenhut Corporation provide these services. States are required by these corporations to guarantee 90% occupancy or make up the difference in cash to these private providers. The state of Florida where I reside most of the year has eight privately operated prisons. These prisons pay property taxes and the cities where they are located are allowed to count inmates as residents so any Federal Aid would be based on that prison population too. De-criminating non-violent offenders such as narcotic addiction and making the offense a health issue would eliminate much incarceration. A decade ago the Netherlands decriminalized most drug offenses. It created excess space in their prison that they can and do rent out to other countries. These reforms will take time, but the sooner we get started the better it will be for all concerned. Let's do it horizontally. J. Roger Carr Spirit Lake, Iowa
