As part of the evening, the village will hold its annual tree lighting ceremony to kick off the holiday season in Elkhart Lake.


People of all ages are invited to take part in the grand celebration.

EL-G schools grade well on state ratings

The ELG School District Continues to Earn "Exceeds Expectations" ratings in state report card reviews on education.

On November 12, the Wisconsin Department of Instruction released report cards for all public school districts in the state. Copies of the report cards for each of our individual schools and the district as a whole are attached. As a district and as schools individually, ELG continues to perform extremely well.

A brief history of previous report cards:

For the first two years report cards were issued (2013, 2014), both the high school and elementary/middle school rated as schools that "Exceed Expectations" and as a District, ELG earned the same rating. Due to legislative action and changes in the state assessment, no report cards were issued in 2015. ELGS again did well in 2016. As a district, ELGS was rated as "Exceeds Expectations."

The elementary/middle school received the highest rating of "Significantly Ex-

ceeds Expectations" and the high school received the rating of "Met Expectations"—missing the level of "Exceeds Expectations" by .4%. In 2017, the elementary/middle school maintained the "Significantly Exceeds Expectations" rating and both the District and high school were rated at "Exceeds Expectations." For 2018, the District continued to receive the rating of "Exceeds Expectations"—missing "Significantly Exceeds" by 1 point! The high school ranked as "Meeting Expecta-

tions" and for the third year in a row, the elementary/middle school received the highest ranking of "Significantly Exceeds Expectations."

2019 Report Card Results: For 2019, the District continued to receive the rating of "Exceeds Expectations"—this time missing "Significantly Exceeds" by .5 points. We're getting closer each year! The high school ranked as "Exceeds Expectations" and for the fourth year in a row, the el-

ementary/middle school received the highest ranking of "Significantly Exceeds Expectations." All quite note-worthy achievements!

While the report cards reflect only a small component of ALL that happens in the ELGS District each day, there is pride in the ratings received and believe it reflects the efforts put forth by the students, staff, parents, and community in supporting the educational experience for the District's children.

Similar to the School Report Card, the District Report Card provides valuable information on how the district is performing—identifying what ELGS does well and where improvements can be made. It provides a broader, district-wide perspective that supplements and enriches the information found in each individual School Report Card. The School and District Report Cards are intended to help all districts get a better picture of how they prepare graduating students for college and careers. The District Report Cards are calculated for the district as a whole. In other words, these report cards treat the district as if it were "one big school" responsible for all students in the district. District Report Cards look very similar to the School Report Cards.

Included is a comparison ranking which shows ELGS comparables on the 2018-19 District level report cards. Included are nearby school districts and/or those in Sheboygan County. To see how comparisons at the school level, all report cards can be accessed at https://dpi.wi.gov/accountability/report-cards.

The top chart outlines the Scoring Scale used by the DPI to determine Ratings and Categories.

Here is how the report cards work. Each public school and district earns an overall accountability score from 0 to 100. This score is displayed in the top left corner of the School or District Report Cards. It is important to note that the 0 to 100 accountability score is not a "percent correct" measurement. The score is based on 2018-2019 student performance in the following four priority areas:

Student Achievement measures the level of knowledge and skills among students in the school/district, compared to state and national standards. It includes a composite of English language arts (ELA) and mathematics performance by all students in the Wisconsin Student Assessment System (WSAS) for all tested grades in the school/district.

School/District Growth describes how much student knowledge of ELA and mathematics in the school/district changes year to year. It uses a value-added score that compares the change in a student's scores to those of observationally similar students.

Closing Gaps provides a measure that reflects the statewide goal of having all students improve, while narrowing the achievement and graduation gaps between groups of students. This measure acknowledges districts that raise the performance between specific student groups (comparing English language learners, low-income students, students with disabilities, and members of a racial or ethnic group with their peers).

On-Track and Postsecondary Readiness indicates the success of students in the school in achieving educational mile-



stones that predict postsecondary success, such as graduation rate, attendance, and various achievement measures.

Schools and districts are also evaluated on their chronic absenteeism rates and dropout rates (when applicable). These are measures of student engagement. Based on their scores, districts and schools were placed into one of five categories, from Fails to Meet Expectations to Significantly Exceeds Expecta-

ELG District's 2018-19 overall score is 82.5 and rating is Exceeds Expecta-

ELG Elementary/Middle School's 2018-19 overall score is 86.8 and rating is Significantly Exceeds Expectations.

ELG High School's 2018-19 overall score is 74.6 and our rating is Exceeds Expectations.

As people might question the variation in ratings at ELG high school level as compared to the steady rating at the ELG elementary/middle school, the following provides some insight into the composition of the report cards. At the high school, due to its small size, in the past, the report card was based on only two data points: the graduation rates from the past four years and the performance of the last three Junior classes on the ACT test in the areas of ELA (English/Language Arts) and math. For example, for the past three years (2015-16 to 2017-18), the number of Junior students tested was 46, 29 and 34. Due to these low numbers, the high school achievement scores will show much more fluctuation than those of the elementary/middle school where the report card includes testing data from all students in grades 3-8. For example, in 2017-18, 34 high school students were included in report card data, while at the elementary/middle school, there were 182

students who participated in the testing.

It is important to note, for 2018-19, there was a change to students included in the "test scores" used for the high school report card across the state. For the first time, the report cards include ACT Aspire results for 9th and 10th grade students in the areas of ELA and mathematics, along with the 11th grade ACT scores. This increased the total student popula-

tion on which the high school report card score was based to 104-a more accurate reflection of student achievement. Due to the inclusion of 9th and 10th grade students' performance data, ELG high school is eligible to get growth data for the first time as they now have a sufficient "cell size" number

upon which to do the growth and closing gaps data calculations. However this is only about half the amount of students on which the elementary/middle school report card is based. For 2018-19, there were 183 students in grades 3-8.

The plans are for the School and District Report Cards to be issued every year. Individual student results on state assessments will continue to be reported separately. DPI has produced two versions of each Report Card: the "School Report Card" and a lengthier version, "School Report Card Detail," which includes extensive information about the data used. Both versions can be accessed online at https://dpi.wi.gov/accountability/reportcards.

The report cards are one part of a statewide accountability system for schools. The State Superintendent, Governor, legislative leaders, and DPI staff worked closely with parents, educators, and members of the business community to develop the system. The U.S. Department of Education has reviewed changes to the accountability system. Both the accountability system and the report cards will continue to improve and evolve in future years as more data becomes available. As a result, ELGS as a District, and the WI Department of Public Instruction, caution people from making comparisons from prior years or drawing too many conclusions from the overall results until there are more years

based upon the new calculations that were used for the 2018-19 report cards. Over the years, the DPI has changed how scores are weighted and has also used different methodology for calculating student growth. This is in addition to changing the assessments from which the data comparisons are made. Any of these changes could greatly impact a district, either positively or negatively.

The ultimate goal is for these report cards, as well as other changes being implemented throughout our state and the ELGS school system, is to help schools and districts identify their strengths and continue to address their challenges. However, this is only one piece of information, and as a small district, ELG's results are more subject to fluctuation due to their smaller student population. Report cards cannot, and do not, measure all the im-

portant work done. So while very pleased with these results, we believe at ELGS an equally valid measure of achievement of the schools and district is how we constantly strive to personalize our students' instruction to meet their learning needs so they can be successful both in and out of the classroom. This is where you can become involved. Please let the District know your thoughts and/or questions as they arise.



This is the event's eighth year and each one gets bigger and better. It all began with membersoftheSheboyganCountyRotaryclubs as a means to spread holiday cheer in combination with doing good for the community. While entrance to Making Sprits Bright is free, pantry item donations are requested. All donated items are delivered to the Sheboygan County Food Bank each night and their volunteers disburse to food pantries throughout the county. The donations come at a time when need is the greatest so the Making Spirits Bright event has been important for so many people. The grand total of pantry items donated over the past seven years is almost474,000pounds—thatisabout237tons.

While many of us immediately think of canned goods when we hear the words "food drive," please also consider donating personal care items which typically run low at the food pantries. These may include shampoo, soap, toothpaste, deodorant, tissue and toilet paper, diapers, and baby wipes. If you prefer to contribute food, here are some of the most requested items: canned tuna or chicken, peanut butter, rice, whole wheat pasta, oatmeal, breakfast cereal, pancake mix, and canned fruits. Please also watch expiration dates of donated items.

Visitors to Making Spirits Bright may also choose to contribute a monetary donation at the completion of the route. These funds supportthebuildingandrefurbishingofdisplays and other costs associated with this incredibleundertaking. A portion of monies collected is also donated to local not-tor-profits in exchange for service. Even if you are not inclined to offer a monetary donation, make sure to receive a complimentary copy of the eventbookletfromthevolunteersintheigloo.

What can you expect at Making Spirits Bright? When you drive the 1.1-mile route, you begin by tuning your radio to 89.1FM. The lights are choreographed to the music played on your radio. A sampling of some of the displays is Whoville, Magical Igloo, North Pole Post Office, Northern Lights, and Candyland. The perennial favorites are the Icicle Tunnel, Overhead Stars, and Racing Arches. In addition to the lights show, you may even catch a glimpse of the local wildlife that live in the park.

If you prefer someone else drive you through the park, or you have a large group that would like to be together, ride the trolley. Boarding begins across the street at Quarryview Center every Friday through Sunday night. The trolley leaves every 45 minutes (from 5:15 to 8:15 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays and 5:15 to 7:30 p.m. on Sundays) and is \$2 per person with children under 1 free. The trolley is fully enclosed and features oldfashioned style with modern conveniences. Decorative wooden bench seating and the wood and brass interior will make you feel like you are riding a street car of yesteryear. And don't worry about the weather outside; the trolley is heated to assure comfort.

While at Quarryview Center, consider purchasing raffle tickets to enter the drawing to win wreaths specially crafted by professional local designers. Enjoy complimentary entertainment from local musicians includinginstrumentalists, high school and college choirs, vocalists, and more. Here you will also find concessions for sale such as frosted cookies, brownies, popcorn, hot chocolate, cider, and coffee. Relaxing with some refreshment in the festive Quarryview setting is a great way to begin or end your Making Spirits Bright evening. The Memory Ornament tree is also found here and you can purchase a customized ornament for \$15.

One of the most popular attractions at Quarryview Center is Santa. He's in the ideal setting for capturing an annual holiday photo. Bring your own camera or phone though since the volunteers aren't able to take photos with Santa.

Quarryview Center is open every Friday through Sunday from Nov. 29 through Dec. 22, 5 to 9 p.m. So each Monday through Thursday, you can drive through Making SpiritsBrightbutwon'tbeabletoincludeastop at Quarryview too.

In the seven years that Making Spirits Bright has taken place it has grown in popularity with people from outside Sheboygan County as well. The event has added to the attractions that make Sheboygan County a tourist destination.

When you are ready to be a part of the behind-the-scene activities, there are many ways to volunteer. The success of the event hinges on hundreds of people who invest thousands of hours. The large scale of Making Spirits Bright means work goes on year-round and there are volunteer options for people of all skill levels and availability of time commitment. 





From December 1973 until July 1975 he served in the Republic of Korea in the Second Infantry Division as part of a maintenance and recovery crew. He returned to the United States as a Staff Sergeant E-6 at Fort Knox in the 7th Cavalry Regiment. He separated from the Army in April 1979.

In the end, though, Pippin finds that happiness lies not in extraordinary endeavors, but rather in the mundane moments that happen every day.



New This year!!! Parking is allowed overnight in the N. East Street parking lot overnight until 6 am, at that time your vehicle must be moved.

PARKING REGULATIONS All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 2 am. and 6 am, and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 6 am until 9 am commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

Snow Removal

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

Library hosts families for Spooky Stories Night


On Tuesday, October 15th families with students in grades JK-4 were invited to a special literacy event called "Spooky Stories Night."




