### **DOT Grant of** of \$15 Million in Lauderdale

WASHINGTON, DC – U.S. Senator Richard Shelby (R-Ala.) today announced that the U.S. Department of

Transportation (DOT) has awarded a grant totaling \$14,880,000 in funding for highway infrastructure improvements in Lauderdale County, Alabama. The grant is made available as part of the DOT Better Utilizing Investment to Leverage Development (BUILD) Grant Program, which focuses on economic development and infrastructure upgrades.

The decision by the DOT to award Lauderdale County with \$14.9 million in funding is a testament to the economic development taking place in the Florence area," said

Senator Shelby. This \$14.9 million BUILD grant will expand a stretch of U.S. Highway 72 also known as Florence Boulevard. The four-lane divided highway will be expanded to a sixlane divided highway with concrete curb and gutters. These improvements will alleviate traffic congestion and provide easier commutes for those traveling to and from the

### Grants for Two Projects

MONTGOMERY – Gov. Kay Ivey recently awarded \$18.7 million in grants for improvements in 58 Alabama communities. The funds from the Community Development Block Grant program will enable communities to provide water, improve roads and sewage systems, construct public community buildings, and remove blight.

The competitive grants are awarded annually in several categories including county, large city, small city and community enhancement. ### **Lopez Closes Fine Career**

CHARLOTTE, NC --University of North Alabama senior quarterback, Christian Lopez, of Henderson, Nevada has been named Big South Conference Football Co-Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Lions' season-ending 34-30 win on the road at Gardner-Webb November 16.

Lopez threw for a career high 446 yards and four touchdowns and led a game-winning, 72-yard touchdown drive in the final minutes of the game.

It was Lopez's second game-winning fourth quarter drive this season and the sixth in his two seasons at UNA. Lopez completed 28-of-44 passes with no interceptions and hit three different receivers with touchdown passes in Andre Little, Dexter Boykin (2) and Jakobi Byrd.

Lopez shared the award with Monmouth's Pete Guerriero who set a school record for all-purpose yards with 303 on a career-high 237 rushing yards and four total touchdowns.

Lopez finished his career at UNA in the Top 10 in many of the Lions' career passing categories. He finished sixth in career passing yards (4,883), seventh in career completions (331), eighth in career pass attempts (592), tied for seventh in career touchdown passes (32) and 10th in career total yards (5,177). Lopez accomplished those marks in just 21 career games.







### \$60,000 in **Area Grants**

FLORENCE-The Muscle Shoals National Heritage Area has \$60,000 in federal money available as grant awards for planning historic preservation and recreational projects in Colbert, Franklin, Lauderdale, Lawrence, Limestone and Morgan counties.

Public and private non-profit agencies located within the MSNHA are eligible. Proposals and a non-refundable \$250 application fee are due by 5pm on Monday, January 6.

"While there is a quick turn-around for project completion with this grant round, we know that these funds can be put to good use in our six counties, said MSNHA director Carrie Barske Crawford. "Applicants may be cities, counties, or non-profit entities. We can't wait to see what projects you come up with."

Project examples can include developing city/ county preservation plans, surveying for potential historic districts, updating National Registry designations, surveying historic cemeteries, designing interpretive panels for parks, developing a master recreational plan, and creating construction documents for a public park or trail.

According to **Emily Rhodes**, MSNHA grants coordinator, funding requests cannot exceed \$20,000 and must include a match of at least equal value from cash sources. Contracts will be signed at the end of January and projects must be completed and invoiced to MSNHA by Aug. 1. Awards will be made as reimbursable grants. Projects will be

evaluated on their connection to the MSNHA management plan, feasibility, and community impact, Rhodes added. Applicants are encouraged to contact MSNHA prior to proposing activities with any potential environmental impacts.



A sub-\$500-dollar laptop uses yesterday's technology, will give you the performance and reliability of a sub-\$500 laptop, be outdated quickly and more likely to need replacement in 2 or 3 years. More expensive laptops will have newer, faster processors and other cutting

edge technology that will still be "current" in 2 or 3 years.

Extremely nice laptops go for \$1,500 and up. Very nice ones for \$800 and up. Inexpensive but word processing or designing "will do the job" for less than \$500. That is an awfully wide gap so it only makes sense to start with a budget, then find as much laptop as you can get for that budget. Here the things you need to consider:

Weight -- Will you be carrying this through airports or across campus? If so, the difference between a 3lb system and a 12lb is immense. Laptops that

are very lightweight yet very powerful fetch a premium.

Size matters! Do you want something you can easily whip out of a briefcase while in cramped Business Class or do you want a big whopper display that would work for presentations, gaming, or over-40 eyesight?

**Performance** -- What is the primary use of the laptop? Internet surfing and simple skyscrapers and gaming? Mo' power? Mo' money.

Battery life -- A low-end system will deliver 3 or 4 hours of continuous use. High-end laptops can deliver up to 12 hours. More battery, more

Ruggedness -- If you are buying for a youngster or a teenager going off to college, I promise they will not treat it

nearly as well as you would. This age group is a great revenue generator for my business. So do you purchase a cheap plastic one knowing that it might be damaged or a more expensive metal laptop that will take a little more of a beating? It's hard to help you with that one but this is one area where the accidental insurance coverage might actually save you some money.

### **Use Less Gas with These Simple Tricks of Efficient Drivers**

Did you know you can save considerably at the gas pump just by modifying your driving habits? Regardless of the type of car you drive, good driving habits contribute to better fuel economy, which saves money and helps the planet, too.

### Perform routine maintenance

Your car needs the right proportions of air and fuel to run efficiently. A well-maintained vehicle will run at its best.

### Keep tires inflated to ideal pressure

Under-inflated tires tend to decrease mileage. (They're dangerous, too.) Check manufacturers' recommendations and make sure your tires are inflated to the maximum PSI, measured when cold.

### Combine short trips

Warm engines run more efficiently than cold ones. Combining short errands (such as visiting the grocery store, dry cleaner, and bank) into one trip is an efficient way to save time, as well as gas.

### Drive at moderate speeds

While every vehicle is different, mileage decreases quite rapidly over 50 MPH in most cases. To save gas, stay at or under the speed limit, and drive at a consistent rate of speed. Use cruise control on long trips.

### Drive friendly

Aggressive driving habits such as gunning the engine, speeding, screeching around corners, and jamming on the gas pedal are major fuel wasters. Avoid jackrabbit starts, and generally drive in a measured and moderate fashion for top fuel savings.

### Travel light

Extra weight in the car creates a drag on the engine and consumes extra gas. Don't haul around heavy loads if you don't have to. Check the trunk and back of the vehicle for unnecessary items that may be safely stored elsewhere.

### Keep your car aerodynamic

Good aerodynamics affect your car's fuel efficiency by reducing drag, especially at high speeds. Keep windows and moon roof closed on the freeway. Even keeping the car's exterior clean can make a difference.

### Use the highest feasible gear

Driving at high speeds in lower gears burns excessive fuel. On a manual transmission, pay attention to RPMs as you accelerate and shift into high gear as soon as you reasonably can.

### Avoid excessive idling



### Fun Facts Learned in Law School

You're not a lawyer until you pass the bar. The "bar" can refer to the entire legal profession, a formal portion of it, or the bar exam itself. Each state court system, federal court, and the U.S. Supreme Court is a separate bar with its own standards of admission and practice.

You can't pass the bar until you're a lawyer. A courtroom is divided into two parts by a railing or similar barrier called the bar. Only lawyers, their clients, and witnesses who are called to testify may traverse it. The use of "bar" to refer to the legal profession

as a whole derives from the tradition of barring nonparticipants from the trial area of the courtroom.

<u>Law school doesn't teach laws.</u> One attends law school to learn how to think like a lawyer, not to memorize laws. Laws change; how they are properly analyzed does not.

Most of what happens in a civil trial happened before the trial. In civil cases, litigants are required to exchange information before trial. Through the discovery process, each party may depose (question under oath) the opposition and any other individuals who may provide relevant information. Consequently,

each side knows the other's case well before the trial begins.

A judge is also involved well before trial. A judge reads pretrial pleadings and motion from the two sides, researches relevant issues, settles disputes that arise during discovery, issues warrants and summonses, and supervises jury selection. Most cases settle before trial, making pretrial work the court's main work.

Not guilty doesn't always mean innocent. In issuing a verdict of guilty, a jury asserts its belief that a criminal defendant is responsible for a crime beyond a reasonable doubt. A jury that believes a defendant is "probably guilty" must vote to acquit. A reasonable doubt must be derived rationally from the evidence, or from a lack of evidence presented by the prosecution. It cannot on sympathy for the accused, unfounded theorizing, or fanciful conjecture.

<u>Useful evidence isn't necessarily admissible</u>

**Relevance:** Is the evidence connected to the issues at trial? Will it make an important alleged fact in the case more or less probable?

**Authentication:** Can the evidence be shown to be what its proponent says it is? Can a proper chain of custody be shown, for example, by bringing to court police officer who found it?

Hearsay: If the source of the evidence cannot appear in court, came the evidence be admitted under a hearsay exception?

**Privileges:** Will any privileges (spousal, attorney-client, etc.) prevent the evidence from being admitted?

# **Another Perspective On Thanksgiving**

In just a few days, a lot of us will be getting together with family and friends to celebrate the wonderful national holiday we know as Thanksgiving. Just the mention of the word is about all we need to make our mouths start watering. I hope that we will appreciate the rich blessing of the food as much as we appreciate the rich taste.

The very idea of "thanksgiving" usually suggests that we have a grateful heart for the good things that have come (and continue to come) our way - as well we should (cf. James 1:17). However, you may feel that not a lot of good

has come your way lately. Hence, there is another way of looking at "thanksgiving" that I want us to take a moment to consider.

Recorded in Acts chapter five is an account of the apostles getting in trouble with the Jewish authorities for teaching about Christ. Verse forty informs us they were "beaten and commanded that they should not speak in the name of Jesus."

I have never known of any beating to be pleasurable and the kind of thrashing they received would have been worse than most of us have ever experienced. But note that the very next verse tells us that the apostles found it an occasion to give thanks! Why? The text says because "they were counted worthy to suffer shame for His name" (Acts 5:41).

The principle that we learn here is that thanksgiving often involves "perspective." The apostles could not give thanks (at the moment) for what they had received, but they were thankful for what they were able to give; namely, the giving of themselves to the glory to God.

Not everything in life will bring you and me the greatest pleasure, but if our lives still magnify God, then we can be thankful. The apostle Paul made that very point when he spoke of his own sufferings. He told the Corinthians, "It is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God" (2 Corinthians 4:15).

God has promised that He will eventually reward us for any sacrifice that we might make for His cause. As He told the apostles, "Everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands, for My name's sake, shall receive a hundredfold, and inherit eternal life" (Matthew 19:29).

Therefore, everyday can be a day of thanksgiving – regardless of what happens – as long as we hold the right perspective.





diverse perspective may be one reason why it is considered by historians to be among the preeminent works of 17th century American historical literature.

Bradford explained in chapter 6 that he wrote the manuscript so that the descending generations would know and appreciate the hardships of their ancestors. Interestingly, Bradford never attempted to publish the manuscript. He instead gave it to his son William, who later passed it on to his own son Major John Bradford.

What is not widely known is that the first form of government established by the colonists in New England was not a form of capitalism which would help catapult the economy; it was a two-year failed Socialist government.

Following what was popular among the aristocratic class in the early 1600's, the charter was a seven-year contract signed July 1, 1620 before leaving Plymouth England which called for farmland to be worked communally and for the harvests to be shared. It stipulated that the Pilgrims were to pool for common benefit all profits and benefits that are got by trade, traffic, trucking, working, fishing, or any other means of any person or persons. It also stated that colonists would obtain their meat, drink, apparel, and all provisions out of the common stock

and goods of the colony.
The first few years were going to be hard anyway, but shortages and starvation were exacerbated by policy.

Half the colonists died, incentive and neutralized by continued unrest.

'The contract was found to breed much confusion and discontent and retard much employment that would have been to the benefit and comfort. For the young men, that were most able and fit for labour and service, did repine that they should spend their time and strength to work for other men's wives and children without any recompense. The strong, or man of parts, had no more in division of victuals and clothes than he that was weak and not able to do a quarter the other could; this was thought injustice...'

After two years the colonists scrapped the failed contract and as Bradford recorded.

"So they began to think how they might raise as much corn as they could, and obtain a better crop than they had done, that they might not still thus languish in misery. At of colonial America.

length, after much debate of things, the Governor (with the advice of the chiefest amongst them) gave way that they should set corn every man for his own particular, and in that regard trust to themselves; in all other things to go on in the general way as before. And so assigned to every family a parcel of land, according to the proportion of their number, for that end, only for present use (but made no division for inheritance) and ranged all boys and youth under some family. This had very good success, for it made all hands very industrious, so as much more corn was planted than otherwise would have been by any means the Governor or any other could use, and saved him a great deal of trouble, and gave far better content..."

Early 1600's life was infinitely more difficult in this new land of opportunity than at any time since.

time that Medicare has set aside to make changes to your Prescription Drug Plan (PDP) or Medicare Advantage Plan (MA) if you want. Whether you have a Medicare supplement and a stand-alone drug plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan with prescription drug coverage now is the time to review your drug plan for 2020. Like MA plans, drug plans have certain things you want to look at when considering which PDP is best for you. Those things are premium, deductibles, copays, coinsurance and the plan's provider network.

Although the things listed above are most important so are the tiers that drugs are place into. So before we discuss the cost of the plans let's look at drug plan tiers. Normally there are five tiers to a drug plan. Tier 1 and Tier 2 drugs are usually your most common generic drugs. Tier 3 drugs are preferred brand, Tier 4 drugs are non-preferred brand and Tier 5 drugs are specialty drugs. One of the most misunderstood parts of a drug plan is the tier a person's

Many people we meet with think that if their drug is listed in a certain tier under their current PDP it's the same on all plans. This is not always true. Sometimes, for example, a drug may be listed a Tier 2 under one plan but may be a Tier 3 under another plan. Why is this important? Because in most drug plans the copays are higher for Tier 3 than Tier 2.

You can check the tiers of your drugs by looking at the plan's formulary. The formulary is a list of the drugs that are covered by the plan. You can get the formulary of the plan you are considering by going to the plan's website, going online to Medicare.gov or you can visit our office and we can help.



# **Great Tasting and Well Digested**

The USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Service (www. fsis.usda.gov) is the public health regulatory agency in the USDA responsible for ensuring that meat, poultry, and processed egg products are safe, wholesome and accurately labeled.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates that foodborne illness results in roughly 128,000 hospitalizations and 3,000 deaths in the United States annually.

This Thanksgiving Americans will consume more than 40 million turkeys. Holiday hosts must be especially careful not to serve up food poisoning.

**Four Steps to Food Safety** CLEAN: Clean hands,

surfaces, and utensils with soap and warm water before cooking. Wash hands for 20 seconds before and after handling raw meat and poultry. After cleaning surfaces raw poultry has touched, also apply a sanitizer.

• SEPARATE: Use separate cutting boards, plates, and utensils to avoid cross-contamination between raw meat or poultry and foods that are ready to eat.

• COOK: Confirm foods are cooked to a safe internal temperature by using a food thermometer. Turkey should be cooked to 165°F'and measured at the thickest part of the breast, the innermost part of the thigh, and the innermost part of

the wing.
• CHILL: Chill foods promptly if not consuming immediately after cooking. Don't leave food at room temperature for longer than two hours.

Recent USDA research conducted in a test kitchen some startling insights about how bacteria may be spread around the kitchen when individuals are preparing raw poultry, especially when the raw poultry is washed or rinsed.

#### **Poultry Washing and** Cross-Contamination:

analyzed Researchers the spread of bacteria from chicken thighs that had been spiked with harmless tracer bacteria. The microbiological data identified both direct and indirect cross-contamination that occurred during the meal preparation experiment.

The mosŧ frequently contaminated surface was the kitchen sink, even for the participants that did not wash or rinse the poultry.

This could explain where cross-contamination may have occurred especially if produce (i.e., the salad ingredients) was washed or rinsed in the sink. You should take extreme precautions when washing or rinsing a turkey (or any eggs, meat, or poultry products for that matter) before cooking. Juices can transfer bacteria onto kitchen surfaces, other foods, and utensils. Be sure to thoroughly clean and then sanitize all kitchen surfaces to eliminate the risk of crosscontamination.

Salad preparation should never take place in the sink anyway as that is a breeding area for germs.

Handwashing:

Inadequate handwashing has been identified as a contributing factor foodborne illness, especially when preparing raw meat and poultry. Hands can become vectors that move potential pathogens found in raw meat and poultry around the kitchen, which can contribute to foodborne illnesses.

Researchers observed 1,145 cases in which handwashing was required to prevent cross-contamination during meal preparation.

Of these, handwashing was not attempted 74% of the time, and 99% of the attempts did not contain all the steps of

correct handwashing.
Proper hand washing after handling raw meat, poultry and eggs can greatly reduce the risk of bacterial crosscontamination. Hand washing should always include five simple steps:

Wet your hands with clean, running water (warm or cold), turn off the tap, and

apply soap.

Lather your hands by rubbing them together with the soap. Be sure to lather the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your

3. Scrub your hands for at least 20 seconds. Need a timer? Hum the "Happy Birthday" song from beginning to end twice.

Řinse your hands well under clean, running water. Dry your hands using a clean towel.

#### **Food Thermometer Use:**

You can't see, smell or feel bacteria on meat and poultry, so you should always use a food thermometer to make sure you have destroyed any illness causing bacteria, such as Salmonella or Campylobacter.

• 44% of participants in the study used a food thermometer on at least one chicken thigh. 20% of participants only used visual cues, 11% only used time and 9% only used touch.

**Preparing Your Turkey** 

Fresh turkeys should not be purchased until one or two days before Thanksgiving,

unless the manufacturer's tag has a "Best By" or "Use-by" date that indicates the turkey will be safe until Thanksgiving. Fresh turkey: The "fresh" label means the turkey has never been chilled below 26°F. If you bring home a fresh turkey before Tuesday, it should be frozen before cooking.

A "frozen" turkey is a turkey that has been cooled to 0°F or lower. When purchasing a frozen turkey make sure to leave enough time for it to

 You should thaw a turkey in the refrigerator, in cold water or in a microwave oven according to the directions on the packaging.

• For instructions on microwave defrosting, refer to the owner's manual for your microwave. Cook the turkey immediately after defrosting

using this method.

• Do not stuff a turkey the night before cooking it. Harmful bacteria can multiply in the stuffing and cause food poisoning when a stuffed bird is refrigerated

**Cooking Your Turkey** 

 To cook a large turkey, use the timetables for turkey roasting for an unstuffed turkey, which can be found in the Turkey Basics: Safe Cooking section of the FSIS website. Add 10 minutes per pound for turkeys over 24 pounds. FSIS does not recommend stuffing a turkey over 24 pounds.

• It is safe to cook a frozen turkey. The cooking time will take at least 50% longer than recommended for a fully

thawed turkey.

 After cooking meat and poultry, keep it hot at 140°F or warmer, until served. The cooked meat can be kept hot in an oven set at approximately 200°F, in a chafing dish, slow cooker, or warming tray.

**Thanksgiving Leftovers** Leftovers should be stored within two hours of cooking.

Dividing leftovers into smaller portions and refrigerating or freezing them in covered shallow containers helps cool leftovers more quickly than storing them in large containers.

Thanksgiving leftovers are safe in the refrigerator for up to four days. If you store leftovers in the freezer, they will be of best quality within 2-6 months.

Reheat leftovers thoroughly to an internal temperature of



But right now, I think you're trying to rationalize a phone upgrade based on the emotion of a new baby. As an exercise of your value system, that's a tendency you need to break. This is a test, Jamie. What you're talking about here is a luxury, not a necessity. Rationalization is one of the prime causes of overspending.

Please understand, I'm not picking on you and I don't mean to be harsh. We've all flunked this test at times. But this is an important moment where your judgment and values are concerned. It's your call, but you really don't need to blow \$350 on a new

phone right now. —Dave


