For the first time in over century. Schuler's Restaurant & Pub is no longer owned by a member of the


Schuler family. On the other hand, the new owner is anything but a stranger to the family or the long running institution in Southwest Michigan. Early last month Hans Schuler announced that his longtime assistant Sue Damron has acquired full ownership of the restaurant and will now serve as the President & CEO of the last remaining Schuler's Restaurant in Marshall, which was also the first. The iconic Michigan restaurant in historic Marshall. has met the challenge to change with the times and still thrive, and now, they are beginning a new chapter in Schuler's storied history, which included a popular road house in Stevensville for years, and later a Schu's spin off in downtown St. Joe both of which were sold a number of years ago. Hans Schuler, the third-generation owner and Marshall civic mainstay says, "As one of our 'Schuler's Sayings' on the beams of the Centennial Room reads, 'You may delay, but time will not'," and adds, "I felt it was time to complete handing over the reins of our successful business to someone who has consistently shown herself to be a capable and innovative leader in our industry and in our community." Damron, who began her career at Schuler's more than 20 years ago, has learned from the best. Starting as Hans Schuler's Executive Assistant, she worked her way up the management chain, culminating in being named President and Managing Partner and acquiring a minority ownership share in 2014. Through periods of dynamic change and transition-including major upgrades to the restaurant, an evolving industry and guest demographics, and catering challenges like the 2010 Kalamazoo River oil spill crisis—she has proven to be up to the task. Hans Schuler and the entire Schuler's team has learned to count on her, and she has taken the lead role in managing and directing Schuler's continued success in the marketplace. A lifelong Calhoun County resident who grew up 20 miles northeast of Marshall at Duck Lake, Damron attended Kellogg Community College and Olivet College, studying business and accounting. Before joining Schuler's, she worked at Starr Commonwealth for nearly 10 years in Starr's Michigan community-based programs. As a result, she developed effective "people skills" and learned to promote teamwork and collab-

There is a place the Crystal Cave.

Halfway to Way WAY-Away

More tales from the trail westward, transporting No. 4 son to Way WAY-Away University.

When you drive from one side of the U.S.A. to the other, you spend quuuuuiiiiite a

bit of time in the not-so-great indoors of your vehicle. That's why we were so eager to reach the great outdoors of the first National Park on our itinerary.

We arrived at TRNP's Painted Canyon entrance at a pretty early hour, although not as early as I'd hoped. And wow!, we were immediately peeing-our-pants-excited at the welcoming committee there to greet us – a herd of probably 60 bison!!!!! It was a total "Chamber of Commerce Moment"! They were moseying their way past the sign at the entrance, making for a great photo op! I actually had to pause and let one cross the road in front of me! I think for the rest of my life, everything I ever say about this experience will require exclamation points!

Like so many things when it comes to untamed nature, it was just a stroke of luck. Had we arrived when I'd hoped, we would've been back on the road to the TRNP's main entrance, which is a little further west, before the bison got there. Plus a park employee told me that it's not very common for them to pass by the Painted Canyon visitor center. I must've been the only one in our party who pondered all this, because I never endured any razzing about how getting there earlier would've denied us this cool experi-

Unlike the bison we had glimpsed the day before at the National Buffalo Museum, the TRNP herd is the wild kind. That is, the kind that can behave in unexpected ways, thus making it exceedingly stupid for people to closely approach them. Which is naturally what a few tourists were doing. I came very close to chiding them in my best "Stern Father" voice, which I think sounds authoritative but which the kids tell me just comes out shrill.

I mentioned earlier that I had hoped to reach the park earlier than we did. I wanted the longest furlough possible from the confines of the car, because this was the first day of the trip that I would be able to meander freely and look for birds to add to my "Birds I Have Seen" list, creatures like the Frappulated Rufous Larkspur or the Portnoy's Variegated Limpkin.

Alas, I didn't see anything exotic or new to fatten my list, though I did note a Spotted Towhee, a Black-billed Magpie and a Mountain Bluebird, which you can tell from other bluebirds by their bushy, ZZ Top-like beards.

Fortunately, we did see scads, hordes and in all respects massive numbers of prairie dogs. No. 4 son fell in love with these little critters on our 2017 road trip to Way WAY-Away, and his ardor for them hasn't cooled. TRNP has numerous large PDTs (Prairie Dog Towns) and between No. 4, the wife and me, we established a new North American record for number of photos of prairie

We also saw quite a few feral mustangs. Observing these well-muscled animals - even from a respectable distance - led me to the firm conclusion that, if it came down to it, wild horses could, in fact, drag me away.

Lots of people across America stepped up to tables groaning under the weight of a substantive Thanksgiving dinner this year. Hopefully they remembered to thank the people who produced the food that was sitting on that table, as they might also be alarmed to learn how little of the actual cost ends up in the pockets of the farmers and ranchers who make it all possible. According to the National Farmers Union, farmers and ranchers take home just 12.1 cents from every dollar that consumers spent on their Thanksgiving dinner meals this year. The union shares an annual report called the National Farmers Union (NFU) Farmer's Share publication. The popular Thanksgiving Farmer's Share compares the retail food price of traditional holiday dinner items to the amount the farmer receives for each item they grow or raise. Just hours before America sat down to Thanksgiving dinner, NFU President Roger Johnson said, "As we gather around the Thanksgiving dinner table this year, we should take time to recognize and thank the family farmers and ranchers who provide our Thanksgiving meals," adding, "While consumer holiday food costs continue to decline, incomes for American farm and ranch families are have dropped dramatically over the past seven years. We're in the midst of the worst farm economic downturn in generations, and we're hopeful the Farmer's Share can help illustrate that fact to the general public." On average, farmers receive 14.6 cents of every food dollar consumers spend throughout the year, while more than 85-percent of food costs cover marketing, processing, wholesaling, distribution and retailing. As the Thanksgiving Farmer's Share illustrates, the farmer's share is even lower for Thanksgiving food

items. Wheat farmers averaged a meager \$0.03 on friends, fun and most of all the best music ever!" 12 dinner rolls that retail for \$2.69. Dairy producers received only \$1.66 from a \$4.59 gallon of milk. And turkey growers, who raise the staple Thanksgiving dish, received just \$0.06 per pound retailing at \$1.49. Johnson says that \$0.06 figure while striking on its own—is particularly egregious when considering the fact that poultry integrators received \$0.62 per pound. Johnson tells us, "The major integrators who control the poultry markets have used their extreme bargaining power to suppress the earnings of the men and women who raise our chickens and turkeys while simultaneously taking in record profits for themselves," noting, "While poultry growers take all the risk of production, they are receiving just 5- to 6-cents per pound for turkeys and chickens. The integrators take those same turkeys and chickens, process them, and then mark up the retail value tenfold." Thanksgiving presents an opportunity to raise awareness about food production, including misconceptions about food costs, Johnson explained, saying, "Farmers and ranchers play the most valuable role in actually producing the food that is served at holiday dinners, yet they make just pennies on the dollar for their products. The farmer's share of the retail food dollar continues its gradual decline from year-to-year as food companies take in record profits and family farmers sell their farms. This is certainly not what the consumer wants, but it is what is happening behind the scenes of their Thanksgiving holiday." Johnson urged consumers to take notice of what is happening in the food system and supporting policies that benefit family farmers and ranchers. Those interested can learn more at NFU.org. The Farmers' Share is based on calculations derived from the monthly Agriculture Prices report produced by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service and price points of common grocery food items at Safeway supermarket. The farmer's share of retail turkey sales is reported by the Contract Poultry Growers Association of the Virginias, as national data on farm prices for turkey does not reflect the amount turkey growers receive.





I know trying to live on the \$1,500 that's left is hard, especially with two babies in the house. But it doesn't sound like a lot of fat can be trimmed right now. One of you might consider taking on a part-time job nights or weekends for a while, or he could look into enhancing his education. Either one of these would help get your income up. Selling the house is an option, too. But I'm not a fan of that one except in the most extreme circumstances

Right now, I'm viewing this as a math problem with three components. The components are income, house payment, and lifestyle. You and your husband need to sit down, and have a serious heart-to-heart talk about things. There will have to be some sacrifices in order to make things better, but only the two of you together can determine exactly what's best for your family


