Dangers of Indoor Tanning

Mount Morris, NY, December 2019 – During these cold winter months, some people choose to use tanning beds and booths. Once thought of as a "safe alternative" to natural sunlight, indoor tanning booths are just as dangerous as the sun to skin health.

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) publicizes the dangers of indoor tanning and busts these common myths. Did you know:

- A base tan is not a safe tan.
- Myth: A tan acts as the body's natural protection against sunburn. Truth: A tan is the body's response to injury from UV rays, showing that damage has been done. It does little to protect you from future UV exposure.
- Tanned skin is not healthy skin.
- Myth: Tanning gives people a "healthy glow."

Truth: Whether tanning or burning, you are exposing yourself to harmful UV rays that damage your skin. Every time you tan, you increase your risk of melanoma.

· Controlled tanning is not safe tanning.

Myth: Indoor tanning is safe because you can control your level of exposure to UV rays.

Truth: Indoor tanning exposes you to intense UV rays, increasing your risk of melanoma – the second most common cancer in women 20-29 years old.

Skin cancer is the most common of all cancer types, and the number of cases has been climbing over the past decade. Today, more than 3.5 million skin cancers are diagnosed each year in the United States. That's more than all other cancers combined. The best way to protect yourself from skin cancer is to limit your exposure to UV rays, whether they come from the sun or from man-made sources such as indoor tanning beds.

• Avoid tanning beds and sunlamps. Both can cause serious long-term skin damage and contribute to skin cancer.

• Cover up. When you are out in the sun, wear clothing and a widebrimmed hat to protect as much skin as possible. Protect your eyes with sunglasses that block at least 99 percent of UV light.

• Use sunscreen with "broad spectrum" protection and a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 30. Be sure to reapply at least every 2 hours, as well as after swimming or sweating. And always follow the directions on the label.

• Seek shade. Limit your direct exposure to the sun, especially between the hours of 10 am and 4 pm, when UV rays are strongest. Source: ACS

Toy Safety for Tots

Mount Morris, NY, December 2019 – As the holidays are quickly approaching, it is important to remember to buy toys that are safe, free of lead, and securely put together for your children's safety.

Please take time to teach children how to use their toys to prevent potential injuries. Knowing what to buy for your children is the best way to keep your children safe. The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) is offering these tips to help parents make safe consumer choices for their children:

- ••• Make sure the toy is specified for the age of your child. Government regulations on toy diameter and length will prevent your baby or toddler from choking. Never leave a baby unattended with toys and games containing small parts.
- Toys that plug into an electrical outlet are not recommended for children under 10. Prevent burns and electrical shocks by buying battery-operated toys for younger kids. Make sure that the battery is in a secured compartment that cannot be accessed by the child.
- Buttons, batteries, and magnets pose a serious health risk when swallowed, causing stomach and intestinal problems and possible death. Call your pediatrician or other health care provider immediately if your child swallows one of these items.
- Store toys in a designated location, such as on a shelf or in a toy chest, and keep older kids' toys away from young children.
- Read instructions carefully on a toy before allowing your child to play with it.
- Don't leave children unattended with balloons. Uninflated or broken balloons are a choking hazard for children under 8.
- Watch out for pull toys with strings more than 12 inches in length. They could be a strangulation hazard for babies.

UPDATE: Livingston County Veterans Monument

Geneseo, NY, December 6, 2019 – On November 11, 2019, the dedication ceremony for the Livingston County Veterans Monument - scheduled to coincide with the 100th anniversary of Veterans Day - was cancelled due to inclement weather.

Livingston County plans to reschedule the dedication ceremony once construction of the monument is fully complete. Remaining work includes: (i) the addition of a recycled rubber surface designed to emulate the American flag, (ii) the permanent installation of 250 Veteran-crafted metal poppies, and (iii) general landscaping.

At this time, there is no set date for a future dedication ceremony since completion of the openair monument is dependent on warm, dry weather conditions.

"We look forward to a future dedication ceremony that showcases the monument in all its glory - with all of its elements on full display" said Jason Skinner, Director of Livingston County Veteran Services.
