New Hope UMC is steeped in tradition

An area church with a history of ministry dating back to 1851 has become one of the newest members of the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce.

Situated across the street from the Wade House, a Wisconsin historical treasure, New Hope United Methodist Church is also steeped in tradition.

Deeply connected in the community, New Hope United Methodist Church is served by Rev. Ric Olson, who took on pastoral duties this past July.

Olson took over the pastoral reins for Henry Verfuert, who retired this past year. Olson, a retired pastor himself, serves New Hope United Methodist on a part time basis. Prior to coming to Greenbush, he served St. Luke's United Methodist Church in Sheboygan, then Wesley UMC.

Olson's wife, Kathy Reid is also a pastor, and has been appointed to serve at Faith UMC in Sheboygan Falls and Bethel UMC in Kiel.

They recently moved to Plymouth to be closer to their new churches.

Great traditions

Pastor Olson has learned what the community has known for a long time. New Hope UMC has a lot of great cooks. And, they love to share their talents with the community.

Each Tuesday in August, New Hope UMC hosts a summer social brat fry and hymn sing.

On the third Wednesday of October, the chefs get to show their talents again, as the church hosts a chicken pie supper. "They have been doing these fund raisers for decades and they are always well supported by the community," Pastor Olson said.

Historic imprint


New Hope UMC has had a ministry impact on the community since 1851. After being served by circuit rider style pastors, the church officially formed in 1851. After holding the early services in the homes of congregational members, the church decided it was time for a home of its own. In 1856, the first church building was constructed.

In 1979, the Greenbush and Glenbeulah United Methodist churches merged to form New Hope United Methodist Church. A new addition in 2002 expanded the sanctuary and fellowship areas. The church was also made more accessible with the addition of an elevator.

Worship traditions

Sunday morning worship is held each week at 9:30. A church organist accompanies the worship on the first Sunday of the month, while tablets and CD music from the hymnal grace the services on succeeding weeks.

"Our members are getting used to doing it both ways. They love to sing, and we have some really good singers in our church," Pastor Olson said.

The New Hope pastor also sees some great ministry advantages for his small town congregation. "We have a very caring congregation. Our members do a great job of getting out and visiting our shut-ins and nursing care folks. They really know their neighbors and they reach out to them," he said.

Mid-week services

As part of the New Hope UMC tradition, mid week services are offered on Wednesday nights during Advent and Lent.

On the third Wednesday in advent, the church goes out into the community, singing carols along the streets of Greenbush.

Members of New Hope UMC participate in mission by pooling their resources with other UMC churches to assist relief efforts. Each worship service, loose change in the offering plate is committed to the wider relief effort. Currently, the church is supporting a UMC-backed mission in the Bahamas for hurricane relief.

Helping to connect

Pastor Olson said that New Hope UMC is dedicated to helping people connect to Christ. The churches mission statement says that New Hope UMC is a community of faith that exists for the glory of God, called to reach out and welcome people, to serve others and to equip them with a faith that works in every day life.

"We also focus on being very ecumenical. We have more that we share with other churches than we have different," Pastor Olson said. "Ours is a church that puts an emphasis on grace, not law or condemnation, with God's love being at the center."



LTC opens new location in heart of Sheboygan

Lakeshore Technical College officially opened its new Sheboygan location in the heart of the city, at 1320 Niagara Ave.

The former Central Tool House building, and most recently Boat Doctors Warehouse, was completely restored to maintain its unique character while providing a modern, high-tech learning environment.

The 8,600 square foot facility includes six classrooms, a dedicated computer lab, an online testing center, and a conference room in addition to college advising and faculty office spaces. Technology is integrated throughout the satellite college location with video conferencing technology and convertible desks where students can opt between a flat workspace and a personal computer workstation.

LTC officials say the new location is significantly more convenient than its previous location. "At this campus, we are right in the heart of our community, on the second most traveled street in Sheboygan. We are within walking distance, or a very quick bike ride, to the majority of students we serve in Sheboygan," said LTC President Dr. Paul Carlsen. According to Carlsen, enrollment has also increased 20 percent since classes started at the new location in September. The site is serving a wide variety of community learning needs ranging from credit-bearing general education courses to community education classes for personal or professional enrichment.

Students are able to meet with college career coaches in Sheboygan to consider their strengths, goals, and career aspirations before pursuing a specific degree or shorter-term certificate program. In addition, general education courses are offered and students are welcome to start with just a single course. Individuals seeking their Certificate of General Education Development (GED) or High School Equivalency Diploma (HSED), or wanting to learn English can also take advantage of services in Sheboygan.

LTC places significant emphasis on adult education, and was recently ranked the No. 2 two-year college in the nation for adult learners out of nearly 1,100 colleges by Washington Monthly.

Located adjacent to Crystal Lake, Rumors Sports Bar has embraced some significant changes to better serve its clientele.

What started as a small supper club has blossomed into a full fledged sports bar as a result of a shift in focus.

This fall, Rumors converted is small dining room into additional bar space, giving more room for cocktail seating. With a bar lengthy that grew two-fold, and the addition of both hunting and racing decor, Rumors has taken a new path to both food and cocktail service. Seating for bar customers expanded from 17 to 40, making the Rumors bar one of the largest in the area.

Customers now have the opportunity to enjoy a front row seat, or enjoy one of the perimeter tables that dot the outer portions of the former dining room.

Extra lighting has also served to brighten up the bar area.

Menu adjustments

Food service options continue to be wide-ranging, but the menu has been altered to reflect more bar type food. Instead of serving on dining room plates, food is now prepared and served in bar-style baskets.

A wide variety of nightly specials and activities are offered to appeal to many tastes.

On Sundays, opposite Packer games karaoke is offered.

Monday is a Rumors Choice night. Tuesdays are Pizza Nights, with Rumors offering a special buy-one-get-one-free

offer. On Wednesdays, Rumors offers another Rumors Choice special with open mic.

Thursdays feature \$1 wings. Karaoke is available starting at 7:30 p.m.

Fridays are fish fry nights, with bluegill, perch an cod offered either breaded or baked.

The popular fisherman's plate of scallops, shrimp, clam strips and a cod fillet isn't just available on Fridays, but all days of the week.

Saturday night is for meat lovers, with specials of hickory smoked ribs or beef tenderloin tips.

Wide menu options

With menu selections categorized by racing terms, Rumors offers many options from its grill, which remains open each evening until the bar closes.

The Pizza Pit Stop allows patrons to choose a 12 or 16 inch think crust, or a 10 inch cauliflower gluten free crust. In addition to the menu selections, customers can "build their own pizza."

Signature sandwiches include choices like the big cod sandwich, or the Daytona, and include fries or tots.

Turn 1 on the High Side is a steak, burger and chicken strip sandwich builder, giving the patron freedom to choose the meat, toppings, sauce and cheese on their hard roll or sourdough bread.

Turn 2 Tots offers in-house seasoned tater tots, piled high with loads of topping choices.

Starting Lineups offers appetizer choices, including traditions like cheese curds, nachos, onion rings, avocado wedges, mini corn dogs, mozzarella sticks, mini tacos and more. Chili is available by the cup or bowl. Combine a grilled cheese with your chili for a few bucks more.

In addition to its well known penchant for mixing cocktails, Rumors offers a great selection of local beers, always keeping eight taps available. A wide range of domestic bottled beer is also available along with a complete line of Corona products.

Rumors is open seven days a week from 11 a.m. to close.


Entertainment includes weekly karaoke on Sundays and Thursday with periodic live bands also being posted on Facebook.

Small village tax increases

The Elkhart Lake Village Tax Rate has increased only \$0.19 per \$1,000 over the last 10 years

The Village's taxes decreased by \$.01 per \$1,000 from 2018 to 2019. The Village continues to do more with less. Over the have not shoveled in the prescribed time, last 10 years, the Village has continued the Village will shovel your walk and bill

to hold its portion of the property taxes steady. There has only been a 4% increase in taxes over the last 10 years. This translates to a \$0.19 per \$1,000 increase in taxes in 10 years (from \$4.63 per \$1,000 in 2009 to \$4.82 per \$1,000 in 2019). The Village continues to operate on a lean budget. As the cost of doing business increases, the Village has not been able to raise the taxes to the same level as cost of living adjustments. Over the next year, the Village will be looking at its departments and potential expenses and revenues over the next 2, 5, and 10 years to ensure the Village continues to be fiscally responsible with Village tax dollars.

Winter Rules began **November 15th**

Winter parking regulations go into effect on November 15th. As a reminder, here is the ordinance.

New This year!!! Parking is allowed overnight in the N. East Street parking lot overnight until 6 am. At that time your vehicle must be moved.

PARKING REGULATIONS

All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 2 am and 6 am, and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 6 am until 9 am commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

Snow Removal

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period. Also, if you live at a corner intersection, remember you need to clear the sidewalk approaches to the streets.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

Snow Removal Warning

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you

Seniors often say they don't want volunteers to go out of their way to bring them meals. Volunteers are not only willing to bring meals to people; they really enjoy it! They often say they get more out of it than the clients. Having someone else worry about lunch, gives the adult children of seniors who get Fresh Meals On Wheels more time to help in other ways, or to just spend time with their parents.

Most clients pay for their meals.

Many people assume that Fresh Meals On Wheels provides meals to anyone who asks at no cost. This is not true. We charge \$6.50 per day for a hot meal, and \$9.45 a day for both a hot meal and a cold meal. About 70 percent of our clients pay for their meals themselves. The other 30 percent get help from the Aging and Disability Resource Center, the Cancer Fund or the Fresh Meals On Wheels Love Account - resources that exist because everyone deserves to eat.

Since 1970, Fresh Meals On Wheels of Sheboygan County has been sending friendly, responsible volunteers out five days a week to deliver hot meals to homebound, elderly and disabled residents throughout Sheboygan County. In 2012, the organization went from contracting with a catering service to serving meals that are made in-house using fresh ingredients grown in the Meals On Wheels gardens and donated by local farmers and growers.

Fresh Meals On Wheels of Sheboygan County has no waiting list or income restrictions.

Open shop nights offered for district residents, parents

Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School will be hosting "community nights" in its technical education/industrial arts "shop" area for District residents & parents of ELGS students during the months of January and February. The "Open Shop Community Nights" will be supervised by Roy Spatz.

Details follow:

"Community Open Shop" Nights will take place on Wednesdays, starting on Jan. 8 and running through Feb. 26, 2020 from 6:00-8:00 p.m.

The first four weeks will focus on the wood shop (Jan. 8 – Jan. 29). The last four weeks will focus on the Metal Shop (Feb. 5-26). However, depending on the amount of interest, participant's skill level, and project complexity, overlap of the wood and metal shops may be allowed.

The amount of dates the "Community Open Shop" will be hosted could increase depending on the level of interest/involvement.

Before any equipment can be used, safety tests and demonstration of proper equipment use is required for all participants. A signed waiver of liability will also be required.

There is no cost for use of the equipment. Participants are responsible for bringing in materials/supplies needed to complete their "projects."

This is a "trial program" from which we hope to get a better understanding of the type of work people may want to complete using the District's technical education/industrial arts equipment. Adjustments will be made going forward. Examples of the type of available equipment include the following: Woodworking: Miter Saw, Planer, Jointer, Table Saw, Router, CNC Router, and Laser Engraver

Metalworking: Metal Cutting Tools - Metal Cut-Off Saw, Horizontal Band Saw; Sheet Metal Tools - Squaring Shear, Bar Folder, Box and Pan Brake, Slip roll former; Welding Equipment: Stick, Wire, TIG Welders; CNC Mill; CNC Plasma Table

These initial "Community Open Shops" are for adults only. Pre-registration is required. To allow for participants to have access to equipment, the "Open Shops" are limited to the first 10 registrants-others will be put on a waiting list. District residents/parents of students should call the high school office at 876-3381 to register for the "Open Shop." The office is open 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. or a voice message may be left giving name and phone number if calling after hours. Participants do not need to attend all sessions, but will be asked to indicate dates of attendance to identify if there would be any possible dates with openings for others on the "waiting list" to attend.
