

2019 Regional Economic Development Council Awards

Geneseo, NY, December 20, 2019: Governor Andrew M. Cuomo announced yesterday that over \$761 million in economic and community development funding has been awarded through Round IX of the Regional Economic Development Council (REDC) initiative.


As part of the Finger Lakes REDC, multiple applicants from Livingston County were awarded over \$2,000,000 to fund 11 projects. The funded projects include:

- 1. \$1 million to develop a Livingston County Public Market;
- 2. \$574,999 for restoration of the historic Opera Block building in Avon;
- 3. \$45,000 for two projects in Lima a food retail feasibility study and a building reuse analysis for the American Hotel; and
- 4. \$25,000 to develop a Downtown Marketing Plan promoting the 9 downtown districts of the county.

The REDC initiative was launched by Governor Cuomo in 2011. As part of the plan, 10 Regional Economic Development Councils were developed across the state, with the goal of developing long-term strategic economic growth within each region. Each REDC is made up of public and private organization leaders in each region and headed by co-chairs. The co-chairs of the Finger Lakes REDC are Robert Duffy and Anne Kress. The law mandates that the expense of mailing such notice shall be an additional two dollars (\$2) against the parcel.







Open House Scheduled to Gather Public Input on Geneseo Active Transportation Plan

Geneseo, NY, December 18, 2019 — On January 7, 2020, representatives from the Town and Village of Geneseo will host an informal open house to gather input on the Geneseo Active Transportation Plan. The event will be held from 5:00-7:00 pm in the Geneseo School District cafeteria at 4050 Avon Road, Geneseo, NY 14454.

The Geneseo Active Transportation Plan builds upon previous planning efforts to propose enhancements to the pedestrian, bicycling, and public transportation networks throughout the Town and Village of Geneseo.

The open house will provide an opportunity for the public to provide feedback on conceptual recommendations, which include on-road bicycle facilities, intersection enhancements, additional sidewalks and crosswalks, and an improved connection to the Genesee Valley Greenway. Public input gathered will help to determine and prioritize recommendations included in the final report, which will serve as a blueprint to guide future infrastructure and policy improvements in Geneseo.




Livingston County Reproductive Health Center Location Update

Free Keyboard & Guitar Lessons For Children

From July 10 through August 12, 2019, the 19th Annual Keyboard Kamp was hosted at the Firehouse Youth Center on Murray Street in Mount Morris. Fourteen children took part and enjoyed five weeks of learning and growing in their musical abilities. Students would meet weekly for guitar lessons with Steve West and piano lessons with Geoff Clough.

During that same time, from July 9 through August 13, Geneseo also hosted their Annual Keyboard Kamp at the Good Will Store Community Room at 4119 Lakeville Road. Nineteen students also took part in the annual camp, enjoying guitar and piano lessons with Mr. West and Mr. Clough as well.



At the end of the five week Kamp, students from both kamps jointly participated in the **Annual Eight to Eighty Concert Recital.** This year, the event was held on Tuesday, August 13th at Saint Timothy's Lutheran Church in Geneseo with more than 90 people in attendance.

At the recital, each student was able to perform one song on their chosen instrument, discuss why he or she chose that instrument, offer some tips for practicing and then speak about the joy they have in expressing themselves through their music.

Following the student portion, guest musician Miriam Shepard from Geneseo shared her musical history and abilities with the students on the ukelele.

While the recital location began at Morgan Estates, it now has moved to Saint Timothy's Church, providing more room. Our highest attendance to date was 150+ so this year saw a very good turnout.

A serendipity to Keyboard Kamp is that it continues throughout the school year with one-on-one mentoring with a SUNY college student and a child from kamp. Student volunteers are asked to give one 30 minute lesson once per week while they are on campus and according to their availability.

This aspect has produced amazing results, especially for the children who take the instruction to heart and apply themselves to learning by putting forth their effort in practicing. Along with this benefit, the families eventually feel like they have welcomed a new member to the family and the college student may feel like they have a home away from home. Volunteers are found each semester through the SUNY Volunteer Fair. We have had student teachers from all over...even Japan!

Mr. Clough follows up monthly with both parents and teachers to check on the progress of the students.

This year was the first year sponsorship donations were needed. The Kamp received overwhelming support from Geneseo and Mount Morris businesses, organizations and individuals. With next year being their 20th year, a few surprises are in store for the Keyboard Kampers. Kamps will continue in both Mount Morris and Geneseo and they would love to see your child at Kamp.



Sickle Cell Disease Awarenes

What You Need To Know


Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) is the most common hereditary disorder that affects over 70,000 Americans, predominantly people of African, Middle Eastern, Grecian, Indian, and Latin American descent. Sickle Cell Disease causes red blood cells to become hard and sticky and look like a C-shaped farm tool called a "sickle." Sickle cells die early, which causes a constant shortage of red blood cells. Also, when the cells travel through small blood vessels, they get stuck and clog blood flow. This can cause pain and other serious problems. SCD is inherited and is present at birth when a child receives two sickle cell genes—one from each parent. Therefore, a child can only have SCD when both of his/her parents have at least one abnormal gene.

People with SCD start to have signs of the disease during the first year of life (usually around 5 months of age). Complications of SCD can include:

- Swelling in the hands and feet
 Pain Episodes that range from very mild to severe
 - · Anemia caused by not having enough red blood cells to carry oxygen
 - Infections
 Vision Loss
 Leg Ulcers
 Stroke

The only cure for SCD is a bone marrow or stem cell transplant. These transplants take healthy cells from the blood of one person (a donor who is usually a relative) and puts them into someone whose cells are not working properly. Other treatments can include maintaining adequate water consumption, medications for pain and often times blood transfusions. Blood transfusions can relieve the pain and complications that can occur during a sickle cell episode.
