Volunteering has been a part of Lakes Regional Healthcare's (LRH) history since before the first patient received care, and is still an integral part of the organization. For over 60 years, LRH Volunteers have assisted patients and staff in various ways, such as escorting and transporting patients throughout the facility, providing companionship to patients, delivering patient meal trays to cancer patients as they receive chemotherapy, and assisting Gift Shop customers.

LRH Vice President of Marketing and Retail Services Jennifer Gustafson said, "We have a great group of men and women that volunteer their time and talents based on their availability and desires. Depending on the area, volunteer shifts are three or four hours long, and we have some volunteers that work every week and others that work once a month. We really appreciate the help each volunteer provides. They all do a great job – they are so important to our organization!"

LRH is in need of more volunteers. In particular, they need more Hospice Volunteers and Coffee Shop Volunteers. Hospice Volunteers see and feel the positive impact they make as they provide companionship to terminally ill patients. "This is a highly rewarding activity for our volunteers and we're looking forward to offering the opportunity to more volunteers," said LRH Hospice Social Worker

Jed Winkel. "There is some training that is needed to be a hospice volunteer, and we have training scheduled for the mornings of January 20 and 21."

Coffee Shop Volunteers get to know many hospital staff and visitors. They volunteer for three hours on weekday mornings selling specialty flavored coffees and baked goods from local favorites such as Lisa's Bake Shop and Spudnutz within the hospital's coffee shop, located by the cafeteria. Proceeds from the sales are given to the Volunteers as a fundraiser for their scholarships.

Several other volunteer opportunities are available as well:

Gift Shop Volunteers are the frontline staff that greet and assist customers, ring up their purchases, and straighten up and restock shelves. Shifts are weekdays between 9:00am and 1:00pm and 1:00pm and 5:00pm.

Outpatient Center Volunteers welcome patients to LRH's Outpatient Center and direct them to specific areas within the center, pick up and deliver hospital paperwork, food trays, lab work, and medications to and from appropriate hospital departments as requested, and transport patients via wheelchair and/or accompany patients and visitors to departments within the hospital. Shifts are weekdays from 8:00am until 11:30am.

Patient Reception Volunteers escort

and direct patients to various locations within the organization such as the Laboratory or Imaging, and transport patients via wheelchair. Shifts are weekdays from 8:00am until 12:00pm and 12:00pm until 4:00pm.


Visitor Reception Volunteers are the smiling faces patients, visitors, and staff first see when they walk into LRH's east atrium. They assist patients and inpatient visitors in getting where they need to be on the campus by telling them patient room numbers, communicating with registration and patient care staff. Shifts are weekdays from 8:00am until 12:00pm and 12:00pm until 4:00pm.

Volunteers can also donate their time and talents from their home by sewing teddy bears for pediatric patients in LRH's ER, knitting baby caps for newborns in LRH's Birth Center, and calling area residents that live alone and benefit from hearing a friendly voice every morning.



CCCVB Grant Applications

The Clay County Convention and Visitor's Bureau (CCCVB) Committee is currently accepting applications for their Spring 2020 Tourism Grant. With the support of the City of Spencer and Clay County, the CCCVB Tourism Grant will provide funding for those planning an event to be held in Clay County. These funds are accessible to any business, organization, and governmental entity or individual.

Eligible events include festivals, performances, sporting events/tournaments or exhibits that occur within Clay County and are designed to attract participants from both within and outside of Clay County. Ideally, the event will reinforce Clay County as a tourist destination and will serve a large segment of the population or contribute to the quality of life for those who attend. In 2019, 17 organizations were funded for tourism projects such as the Northwest Iowa Livestock Showdown, the NW Iowa Emerging Leaders Summit, and Spencer Community Theatre's 60th Anniversary advertising.

As an incentive to further support Clay County tourism, the CCCVB will also be accepting applications for "special projects" that do not fit within the normal requirements for grant funding but are tourism promoting. An example of this would include a tourism-focused brick and mortar project. If you have questions about a "special project" application, please contact the CCCVB at 712-580-8687.



Annie's Project Women in Agriculture Program in Milford

Six-session course designed to guide women in making farm business decisions begins January 23; Preregistration closes January 16

Iowa State University Extension and Outreach will host Annie's Project: Farm Business Management for six Thursdays beginning January 23 at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Milford. Preregistration for the course closes January 16.

Annie's Project is designed to guide women in making decisions for their farm or agribusiness and empowers farm and ranch women who want to be more knowledgeable about their agricultural enterprises.

"One of the foundations of Annie's Project is that women learn best with and from other women experts," said Amy Forrette, Clay County Ag Program Coordinator, who is co-hosting the event. "Clay County and Dickinson County are excited to team up and bring this program to our local farm and agribusiness women. Register soon, we'd love to have you join us."

Course participants can expect to learn and discuss effective strategies for making good decisions in five key management areas, including financial, human resources, legal, marketing and production topics. Other topics may also be discussed dependent on the needs that arise in class.

"Whether women are the sole operator of their agricultural enterprise or they are working in partnership with a spouse or other business partners, Annie's Project provides knowledge and resources that are needed in production agriculture and ag business management," said Gary Wright, farm business management specialist with ISU Extension and Outreach.

Each Annie's Project session will begin with a meal starting at 5:30pm followed by the program from 6:00pm to approximately 9:00pm. Session dates include January 23, January 30, February 6, February 13, February 20 and February 27 at St. Joseph Catholic Church, which is located at 1305 Okoboji Avenue in Milford. Tentative snow dates are also planned if weather causes a need for rescheduling certain nights.

Preregistration by January 16 is required to adequately plan for meals and materials. Registration is \$75 per person and includes all meals and course materials for all six sessions. 

Milford K of C Holding Youth Free Throw Championship Boys and girls ages 9 to 14 are invited to participate in the local level competition for the 2020 Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship. The local contest will be held at 1:00pm on Sunday, January 19, 2020, at the Okoboji Middle School gymnasium in Arnolds Park, Registration and practice begins at 12:30pm. Registration forms for this free competition are available at the Okoboji Middle School and High School, or email dough2169@ gmail.com. Forms are also available the day of the championship. Children of all faiths are welcome to enjoy a positive and healthy competition with other youth in the community. Each contestant is allowed 3 warm up shots followed by 15 free throw attempts for the Council Level Championship. Participants will compete in their respective age divisions. Last year, more than 130,000 sharpshooters participated in more than 3,000 local competitions. Since 1972, councils have sponsored the Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship for boys and girls between the ages of 9 and 14 to provide an athletic outlet and encourage the values of sportsmanship and healthy competition. Kids compete within their own gender and age and progress from local level to district, regional and state/province competitions. Milford Council 7284 is active in the community. Every year the Milford Council bakes 1500 apple pies as a fund raiser to help fund various organizations and community projects. Milford Council 7284 sponsors four \$500 scholarships for graduating high school seniors every year. In addition to the scholarships they contribute to Coats for Kids, Echo Plus, Haiti Relief Fund, UDMO, Grotto of the Redemption, Discovery House, Cherish House, and CASA. They also host bingo for the residents at the Hawkeye Care Center. The Milford Council also contributes and distributes Christmas food baskets for area families. In addition they engage youth with their creative talents in sponsoring a Christmas poster contest, free throw competition, hosting a local spelling bee as well as local family, community and parish needs. In the past year they contributed more than \$12,000 to local community needs. They also run the Tootsie Roll Drive for persons with intellectual disabilities Labor Day weekend, benefiting local organizations. The spelling bee will be Tuesday, February 4, 2020, at Okoboji Middle School, right after school at 3:25pm. Registration for grades 4, 5, 6 and 7 can be obtained from the Okoboji Schools offices and is open to area public, private, parochial and home schooled students. The Knights of Columbus is an international Catholic family fraternal service organization with 1.9 million members in more than 15,900 local councils. Our charitable activities encompass an almost infinite variety of local, national and international projects. Our own unique charities include the Christian Refugee Relief Fund, Disaster Relief, Ultrasound Initiative, and Coats for Kids. On November 17, 1973, four Sioux Falls teen age boys were shot to death at Gitchie Manitou State Park in Lyon County, Iowa. Twelve days later three brothers from South Dakota were arrested and charged with murder. The brothers were unable to afford an attorney. Spirit Lake attorney Jim Ladegaard was appointed by the District Court to represent David Fryer, age 25, the middle of the three brothers. The other brothers were represented by attorneys from Rock Rapids and Orange City. All were ultimately convicted largely through the testimony of the 13-year-old girl who was with the four victims but spared by the Fryers. They are serving life sentences in Iowa prisons. On January 12, Mr. Ladegaard, now retired, will discuss the cases at the Iowa Lakes UU Fellowship.

The Iowa Lakes UU Fellowship meets at the Arrowwood Resort and Conference center in Okoboji. Coffee is served at 10:30 and the service begins at 11:00. This week will also see Just 'Cause on the stage in the barn at the Little Swan Lake Winery, Sunday afternoon, from 4 - 6:00...

Research director RD thrives in seeking out the unusual. And you have to admit that if an author like Charles Addams, was writing about his family, his work would qualify. Addams was born in West New Jersey, on this day in 1912, and must have had a most unusual family. In addition to being a cartoonist for The New Yorker magazine, Addams is the creator of The Addams Family as seen in print and on the tube. The series aired on the ABC network from 1964, until 1966, starring John Astin, Carolyn Jones, and Jackie Coogan. Each show opened with a finger-snapping theme song composed by Vic Mizzy, who would have turned 104 on January 9th. Mizzy's other musical contributions included Uncle Fester's Blues, Hide and Go Shriek, and One Little, Two Little, Three Little Tombstones. Maybe Mizzy was part of the Addams clan?

Dean Martin's best-selling hit came on this day in 1956. Memories Are Made of This held the top position on the charts for more than a month, and was the biggest hit single of his career. The song was written by Terry Gilkyson, Richard Dehr, and Frank Miller. Fifty years later, Martin's daughter, Deana used it as the title track of the 2006 CD saluting her father's music...

Dame Shirley Veronica Bassey turns 82 on Wednesday. Born in Tiger Bay, Cardiff, Wales. Bassey's sixth studio album, Let's Face the Music, is often considered her "magnum opus" of her career, as it brought her together with arranger/conductor Nelson Riddle. Besides the title track, which was written by Irving Berlin, the highly acclaimed LP also includes standards such as Sammy Cahn - Jimmy Van Heusen's, The Second Time Around, and Rodgers and Hart's Spring is Here...

The television series, *Rawhide*, premiered on CBS-Television on January 9th, 1959, and continued until 1965. The popular western starred Eric Fleming as Gil Favor, and Clint Eastwood as Rowdy Yates. The show's theme song was written by Dimitri Tiomkin and Ned Washington, and performed by Frankie Laine. Years later it was used on the big screen in the *The Blues* Brothers film (1980), Shrek 2 (2004), and on the small screen in 2013 in a commercial for Google Chrome.

Editor's note: Back some 30 or more years ago, during a Minnesota fishing opener, Minneapolis pipe-maker extraordinaire Richard Lewis and a group of his beerdrinking, fishing buddies rewrote the 'Rawhide' lyrics into what has become the everpopular 'Walleye Song.' The late Joey Elbert played the parodied 'Hula Poppers' version each spring for many years on Campus Radio. In addition to Lewis, 'The Hula Poppers' included: Larry Hayes, Jan Stroup, Tom Bremer, James Klein, Danny Knowles, and Brian Hayes...

And it was on January 10, 1947 that Finian's Rainbow opened for 725 performances on the Big White Way. Old Devil Moon, one of the most popular songs from the show, was written by Yip Harburg and Burton Lane. Popular recordings include those by Tony Bennett, Bobby Troup, and Ella Fitzgerald – all in 1955 – as well as later efforts by Tierney Sutton (2001), Jamie Cullum (2003); and Laura Fygi, on her 2011 release, The Best is Yet to Come..

On that note we leave you with the reminder that there are only 73 more days until March 19th - the first day of Spring ...







Eco-Healthy Child Care Classes

Iowa State University Extension and Outreach is offering an online series for early childhood professionals interested in becoming endorsed as an Eco-Healthy Child Care® program. The three-session series begins Jan. 8, says Lori Hayungs, a human sciences specialist with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach.

Eco-Healthy Child Care® is a national program that seeks to improve the environmental health of children by partnering with child care professionals to eliminate or reduce environmental health hazards found in child care facilities.

"As Hester Paul, the program's national director, says, we must protect young children from exposure to common environmental health hazards found within child care facilities. Their bodies are growing and developing at a rapid rate, so they are especially vulnerable to the effects of toxicants," Hayungs said. "The EHCC program creates healthier environments in and around child care facilities, and in doing so, creates healthier kids."

Created by the Children's Environmental Health Network, the research-based course offers practical and feasible ways for family and center child care providers to provide a healthy and safe early childhood environment.

More than 2,800 child care facilities throughout the U.S. as well as a few in Australia, Canada, India and the United Kingdom have been EHCC endorsed, reaching more than 147,000 children.

The endorsement checklist consists of 30 items describing environmentally safe practices for center-based and family child care facilities. Topics include lead, mercury, pesticide use, treated playground equipment, art supplies, plastics, radon and more.

This year's Grape Escape will address the shortage of professionals in the healthcare industry by providing scholarships for people in northwest Iowa. According to Hamm, the United States is experiencing a shortage of healthcare professionals - physicians, nurses, and technologists - because a greater percentage of them are nearing retirement and fewer people are entering the health industry as a career. "We are working to increase the supply of healthcare professionals in northwest Iowa by focusing on people who have grown up here, in anticipation that they will come back in time and provide care to patients at Lakes Regional Healthcare and directly benefit people in our service area," said Hamm. "We want to help those interested in pursuing careers in healthcare by removing as many obstacles as possible. Our Scholarship Endowment Fund provides three types of annual scholarships - one per school for Dickinson County high school seniors, one for Dickinson County residents in an undergraduate program, and one for LRH employees. We currently give scholarships to up to eight people, and the dollar value of the scholarships totals up to \$7,000 annually. Our desire is to grow the fund to be able to increase both the number of scholarships we can award and the dollar amounts of those scholarships."

If the minor is denied the purchase, it is considered a successful check. SLPD has conducted these checks on a yearly basis and Spirit Lake retailers do very well as a whole.

The Spirit Lake Police Department will again be partnering

this winter with the Iowa ABD Division's I-PLEDGE program to

check for retail tobacco and vape product sales compliance. All

retail stores in Spirit Lake that sell tobacco, alternative nicotine

and vapor products will undergo a check. Under officer super-

vision, a minor under the age of 18 will be sent into the retail

location to attempt the purchase of a product that they can legally

not possess. If the minor is able to make that purchase without

being confronted about their age, it is considered a failed check.

I-PLEDGE Program

Retailer education is a big part of the I-PLEDGE program. Clerks who successfully complete an online training course and then pass an exam will become I-PLEDGE certified. This allows a retail establishment to use an affirmative defense against a civil penalty if the certified clerk makes an illegal sale, and helps ensure retailers maintain a compliant and responsible establishment.

This process is not intended in any way to trick or deceive the cashier. The minor who is sent in looks age appropriate, they use their real driver's license with their actual date of birth, and if asked their age by the cashier, they will give their actual age. The intent of this process is to ensure tobacco and vape retailers are taking the appropriate steps to help keep tobacco and vape products out of the hands of minors.

Since the program's inception in 2000, the statewide tobacco compliance rate has grown to 91%. Criminal penalties for selling tobacco, alternative nicotine and vapor products to a minor include a \$100 fine for a first offense, a \$250 fine for a second offense and a \$500 fine for third and subsequent offenses.




