Renaissance Dinner/Concert presented

On Saturday evening December 14 and Sunday noon December 15 the Music Department at Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School presented a Renaissance Dinner/Concert.

Featured were performances by various small ensembles (flute choir, recorder, brass), selections from the choir including a Christmas Madrigal, the Boar's Head Carol and a performance by the High School Concert Band.

There was a working stockade and an "audience" with the King and Queen, both of which were photo opportunities for those attending. A Jester (High School Principal Ryan Faris) roamed the courtyard telling jokes.

Homage was paid to the legendary Boar's Head (you know, the pig with an apple in its mouth).

Wild boar used to populate the forests of England in great numbers. Hunting it was reckless if not downright dangerous. The presentation of a boar's head at Christmas came to symbolize the triumph of good over evil. The festival we know today originated at Queen's College, Oxford, England in 1340.

Fittingly, the Boar's Head Carol is the oldest carol ever printed, having been published in 1521.

Tonight the King hath proclaimed that we dine on yet another delicacy of the kingdom, peacock, which was often decorated with its own feathers after roasting or baking.

Of course, since peacock is not presently in season, a suitable replacement fowl was served, along with salad, plum pudding (more like a spice cake today

which is a derivative of the classic "figgy pudding") and yuletide Wassail (an old Saxon drinking pledge which meant "to your health"). The entire event was presided over by King Anders Waage and Queen Emma Mrozinsky and dinner was prepared and served by their minions, student members of the band and choir.

The event was under the direction of Miss Jodi Voss and Mrs. Holly Green of the ELGHS Music Department. The directors send a sincere Thank You to Siebken's Resort and to Off The Rail for donating their time and providing the dinner fare.

LTC connects with UWGB for business

Lakeshore Technical College (LTC) and the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay have signed transfer agreements effective September 1, 2019 that allow students earning associate degrees in business management or accounting at LTC to transfer their credits to UW-Green Bay when they major in those respective fields.

"With one in three LTC graduates furthering their education after graduating, we welcome students to choose us as an affordable and convenient start to their business management or accounting programs," said LTC Vice President of Instruction James Lemerond. "We appreciate having these agreements in place, showing tremendously close alignment between these programs at LTC and UW-Green Bay, as well as high-quality

The business management agreement requires students who earn an associate degree in business management at LTC to enroll in the bachelor's degree business administration major, with an emphasis in one of eight areas: business analysis, entrepreneurship, finance, general business, human resource management, management, marketing, and supply chain management.

The accounting agreement requires students who earn an associate degree in accounting at LTC to enroll in the bachelor's degree accounting major with a business administration minor. Students will also have the option to earn enough credits to become eligible to sit for the certified public accountant (CPA) license exam.

Students who choose to earn their business management or accounting degree at LTC and then transfer to UW-Green Bay can expect to save up to \$7,000 in tuition and fees alone. They will also minimize the time it takes to earn their bachelor's degree by avoiding retaking courses that would not transfer.

LTC students will be required to meet standard UW-Green Bay admission and graduation requirements.

About LTC

Each year more than 10,000 people enroll in courses at Lakeshore Technical College. They rely on LTC for job preparation, to earn a degree, upgrade a specialized





A public lecture at Wade House at 1 p.m. on Saturday, Jan. 25 will explore the history of these "Volga Deutsch" immigrants and their impact on the areas of the state in which they settled.

Between 1792 and the end of the 19th century, almost 2 million Germans migrated to Russia at the invitation of Catherine the Great, hoping to find a better life for their families. For many of them, their new home wasn't quite what they had hoped for, and by 1890 they were on the move again, this time for the United States. Jim Mohr, President of the Greater Sheboygan Chapter of the American Historical Society of Germans from Russia, will explore the conditions in Germany that led to the first migrations, the political climate in Russia that led Catherine to invite foreigners to settle in Russia, and why many of them eventually made another move to communities in the United States, including in Sheboygan, Wisconsin.

"Sheboygan is well known for its German heritage, but few people know the whole story," said Jim Willaert, Wade House curator. "This program will help us understand the hardships many German immigrants went through even before they came to America."

This presentation is part of the Natives & Newcomers series at Wade House. The series is sponsored by the Kohler Trust for Preservation.

The American Historical Society of Germans from Russia is an international organization whose mission is to discover, collect, preserve, and share the history, cultural heritage and genealogical legacy of German settlers in the Russian Empire.

This is a ticketed event. Tickets are \$7 for adults (ages 13-64), \$5 for seniors (65+), and \$3.50 for children (5-12). Wisconsin Historical Society Members are admit-

ted for free. Memberships start at \$55 and include free entry into the Society's 12 historic sites and museums, free guest passes, discounts on special events and merchandise, and subscriptions to special Society publications. About Wade House The Wade House historic site is one of 12 Wisconsin Historical Society historic sites and museums. Located in Greenbush, Wade House is an 1850s stagecoach inn that was built to serve traffic along the plank road that connected Fond du Lac and Sheboygan. The site tells the story of frontier entrepreneur Sylvanus Wade and his family during the Civil War years. In addition to the inn, the historic site includes the Herrling sawmill, one of the few working, water-powered sawmills of its kind in the nation. Wade House is also home to the Wesley Jung Carriage Museum, which houses the state's largest collection of antique carriages and working wagons. 

There will be a State Supreme Court Primary on February 18th. The ballot is set for the April 7, 2019, election. This will include the local elections, as well as the Presidential Primary.

Short-Term Rental Licensing Ordinance

Did you know that if you rent your house out for one night, the State of Wisconsin requires you to have a Tourist Rooming House Permit? More information on this process can be found on the State of Wisconsin DATCP website https:// datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/ TouristRoomingHouses.aspx. This means that if you are planning on renting your house for the Ryder Cup or Road America races you need to have the State's Tourist Rooming House Permit. Due to this requirement by the State and to help ensure properties that are being rented for short-term (less than a month) are meeting health and safety regulations, the Village Board approved a new ordinance for licensing short-term rentals. This ordinance requires all people who rent their property for more than 10 nights to be licensed by the Village. More information on this process, including an application, will be available in early February. If you have any questions, please contact Jessica Reilly at 920-876-2122.

Winter Rules began **November 15th**

Winter parking regulations went into effect on November 15th. As a reminder, here is the ordinance.

New This year!!! Parking is allowed overnight in the N. East Street parking lot overnight until 6 am. At that time your vehicle must be moved.

PARKING REGULATIONS All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 2 am and 6 am, and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 6 am until 9 am commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

Snow Removal

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period. Also, if you live at a corner intersection, remember you need to clear the sidewalk approaches to the streets.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

Snow Removal Warning

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the prescribed time, the Village will shovel your walk and bill the property owner. Also, the entire width of the sidewalk must be shoveled. A path is not sufficient, and you will be in violation.

Auto Pay Your Water Bill

The Village of Elkhart Lake accepts Automatic Clearing House (ACH) payments for your water/sewer bills. If you are interested in having your water/sewer bill automatically debited from your bank account, please contact the Village at 920-876-2122 or email clerk@elkhartlakewi. gov and we will work to set you up on the program.

Comprehensive Planning Survey - Get in the Know Railroad Right-of-Way

The railroad tracks running through the Village have become a popular location for family photos, graduation photos, and selfies. Taking photos on the railroad tracks or the right-of-way is both dangerous and illegal. In most areas, including within Village limits, the railroad owns 50 feet each way from the center of the tracks. The only places it is legal to access railroad property is at a designated pedestrian or roadway crossing. The Federal Railroad Administration reminds people to "Always Expect a Train!" and to keep these tips in mind when crossing tracks:

Trains do not follow a set schedule, so they can come at any time of day from either direction.

A train traveling at 55 MPH can take more than a mile to stop.

Trains overhang railroad tracks by three feet or more on either side. Even when you are not standing directly on the tracks, you risk being hit by a train by being on railroad property.

Despite their size, trains are relatively quiet and do not always sound warning horns when approaching a crossing.

Never attempt to walk under, around or between train cars, even when a train is at a complete stop.






