





Sewanee Summer Music Festival

he Sewanee Summer Music Festival (SSMF) is one of the venerable summer music institutes in the nation. Preceded by the Cumberland Forest Festival, The Sewanee Summer Music Center was revived by Vice-Chancellor Edward McCrady in 1957. Julius Hegyi was an early leader, and a notable student during this era was nine-year-old child prodigy, Lorin Maazel, who became one of the most important musical leaders of the 20th and 21st centuries and served as music director of The Pittsburgh Symphony, Cleveland Orchestra, and the New York Philharmon-

ic, among others. In 1963, an extraordinary young cellist took the helm of the Center. Her name was Martha McCrory, and for more than 30 years, she led SSMF to become one of the nation's premier orchestral training programs, greatly expanding its reputation at home and abroad. Ms. McCrory established many of the traditions and high standards that our festival follows to this day.

Since 2018, the festival has been under the direction of John Kilkenny, Artistic Director, and Hilary Dow Ward, Managing Director.

SSMF Today

Boasting an acclaimed faculty and international student population from more than 30 states and seven foreign countries, Sewanee has become a training ground for the next generation of classical musicians. Hosted on the bucolic campus of the University of the South, SSMF offers more than 30 concerts in a four-week season, including a renowned Faculty Artist Series, an eclectic student chamber music series, and "Symphonic Sundays," a weekly grand finale that offers the chance to hear world-class conductors perform with the Sewanee Symphony and Cumberland Orchestra. Recent guests have included Gemma New, Robert Moody, Janna Hymes, Gene Moon, Kayoko Dan, and JoAnn Falletta.

Special additions to the festival include a July 4th celebration and concerts in the town of Monteagle, St. Andrew's-Sewanee School, and the Cowan Arts Center. One annual highlight is the Jacqueline Avent Concerto Competition winner's concert. Thanks to a generous gift by

Dr. Walter and Mayna Nance, the concert features up to six of Sewanee's finest young musicians, selected through competitive audition as soloists with the Festival Orchestra. A festival for listeners of all ages, SSMF produces a children's concert for the whole family to enjoy. We also partner with regional summer programs, such as Mountain T.O.P., to bring music education to children on the Cumberland Plateau.

The SSMF staff is grateful for community and regional support, the Friends of the Festival, and our National Advisory Board. In 2019, we received a gift from the McCrory Foundation to establish the Martha McCrory Fund for the Sewanee Summer Music Festival, solidifying and strengthening our capacity to advance musical excellence and artistic exploration in the South.

Whether you are a classical music connoisseur or attending your first concert, we hope you will join us for our 64th season of music on the Mountain!





CLAYTON'S SHOE STORE

For 120 years, Clayton's Shoe Store has been keeping feet happy and healthy in Tullahoma with quality shoes that fit.







"I LOVE THE HERITAGE AND I LOVE MY JOB"

On a winter day in 1900, James (Zippy) Clayton unlocked the doors, turned on the lights, and hung the open sign in the front window of the shoe store on West Lincoln Street in Downtown Tullahoma. It was a dream come true for the young shoemaker, a dream that began with his father James Clayton, Sr., who immigrated from England. Following the death of his wife James, Sr., set out to establish a new life with four small children in tow. He eventually settled in Tullahoma in 1882 and set up shop. His son, Zippy, followed in the shoemaker's footsteps, learning the trade and taking the family business one step further. In 1900, after working for W. H. Anthony's, a local shoe store, Zippy purchased the store and Clayton and Company was born.

For five generations, Clayton's Shoe Store has served the Tullahoma community. Today, James Clayton, Sr.'s great-great-granddaughter Florence Hull continues the family legacy. Florence grew up in the store along with her two older sisters. Her cousin, Clayton Hart, who worked at the store for over 65 years, taught her how to run the adding machine and how to keep track of business in the old ledger books. Most of all, he taught her how to measure a person's foot to ensure a proper fit. Helping people find the right shoe is gratifying

work and a way of life for Florence. "I truly believe there are spiritual gifts, and mine is helping people," Florence says. She has a soft spot in her heart for the many people who experience foot pain and is eager to find a shoe that provides some relief. "I love the heritage and I love my job," she says.

Clayton's Shoe Store is far from the self-service shoe stores of modern times. When newcomers walk into the store for the first time, it's not uncommon for them to stop and look up in awe at the old photographs, memorabilia and hundreds of museum-quality artifacts displayed above tall stacks of shoeboxes—items that tell the story of Tullahoma. Portraits of all five store owners hang prominently on the wall, overlooking the day-to-day happenings. One of the oldest items in the store is a Penny Farthing,

an early bicycle that features a very large front wheel and a small rear wheel. Next to it is a picture of Florence's Uncle John wearing a top hat and suit jacket with tails, riding the bike in the Tullahoma parade in 1961. Most of the relics on display are family heirlooms including her dad's WWII uniform and medals. However, first and foremost, Clayton's is a shoe store. But don't worry, there will be plenty of time to take in the vintage decor while you are trying on some shoes.

Every person who comes into the store is welcomed with a warm friendly greeting. Beautiful displays showcase shoes of various makes and styles including top brands such as SAS, Dansko, Merrell, Rockport, New Balance, and more. There are shoes for hiking, running, walking, clogging, tap dancing, and ballet as well as dress shoes for every member of the family from the smallest feet to the largest. Florence is quick to sing the praises of the wonderful employees she has had through the years, and it's

easy to see why. Longtime employee, Annie Osborne, was 19 years old when she first worked at Clayton's, and she knows a thing or two about shoes. Florence's father, Robert Ratcliffe, hired her in 1952. She later moved away and had other jobs, but over 25 years ago, she came back to work at Clayton's and has worked two days a week ever since.

Once you find a few styles you like, it's time for the most important part of shoe shopping. "Let's get you measured," Florence says, as she takes a seat on the same stool her father and great-grandfather sat on before her. "There are three things that never stop growing," she says with a smile, "your nose, your ears, and your feet." From under the bench, she pulls out a well-worn metal foot measuring tool known as a Brannock Device. Florence explains that over time our feet change, they become wider, longer, and flatter. An accurate foot measurement helps determine whether you need to go up half a size or a full size and whether you need a narrow or wide width. It makes perfect sense, after all our feet have been supporting our weight and taking us places our entire lives.

And if the shoe fits, why not wear it out the door? "You know what Jeff Foxworthy says?" Florence asks, "You might just be a redneck." It's a favorite joke among the employees and regular customers. Like their mother, Florence's three children also grew up in the store and now her grandchildren are learning the business of shoes as well—counting change in the antique cash register and watching their grandmother's every move. Yes, shopping

at Clayton's Shoes feels like spending time with friends and family, telling stories and sharing a few laughs. When you've found the perfect shoes and are ready to settle up at the antique cash register, there's something else you should know. There's a discount for people just like you—seniors, firemen, policemen, teachers, doctors, South Jackson Civic Center members, past and present-day military, and even cowboys. On the day I shopped, there was a discount for people from Colorado, who would have thought? The biggest discount offered is for twins— a generous and thoughtful 20% discount for those families who have to buy two of everything. When you walk out the doors of Clayton's with a shoebox in your hands, you feel special, like someone really cares about you and your feet.

Whether you're walking, running, hiking, standing, or dancing, quality footwear that fits matters. And although shoes have changed a lot in the last century, James Clayton, Sr., would no doubt be pleased by the well-made shoes that sit on the shelves today and his great-granddaughter who has done the family name proud.


Clayton's Shoe Store will celebrate its 120th Anniversary with popcorn, giveaways, games, and special guests the last Wednesday of every month throughout 2020. "You don't hear of many small businesses that have been here 120 years," Florence says. "My goal in this business is to do what my mother always said, 'Keep on keeping on.' The only way I can compete or stay alive is to offer what we've always had, and that's service, quality, and fit."


That's what Motlow State is about. That is who we are.

The legislature funded \$100,000 annually to study the feasibility of establishing community colleges in our state.

In February 1965, the State Board of Education adopted a committee recommendation to establish two-year colleges in Tennessee. That same month, Tullahoma-Manchester Chamber of Commerce President Morris L. Simon brought the idea of a community college in the Tullahoma economic hub to the Chamber directors.

The project grew into an area undertaking when officials of the Upper Duck River Development Association and the Elk River Development Association invited Simon to discuss the project with both groups. The result was adoption of a resolution to begin joint efforts for locating a community college in the area served by the two associations.

Why Moore County?

When a preliminary study revealed Moore County to be the center of the then seven-county region, a meeting in March 1965 produced a plan to notify state Board Of Education Commissioner J. Howard Warf of an official request to locate a community college approximately four miles from Tullahoma in Moore County.

Why Motlow?

On Tuesday, June 13, 1967, Tullahoma Mayor Pro Temp O.B. Carroll, along with Simon, took a check for \$250,000 to the State Board of Education meeting in Nashville. Included in the delegation were Nelson Forrester, Representative Pat Lynch, Senator Reagor Motlow and Senator Ernest Crouch. Joining Senator Motlow in the gift of land for the college site were his wife Jeannie; his brothers, Connor, Robert, and D.E. Motlow; his mother, Mrs. Lem Motlow; his sister, Mrs. James Boyd; and his uncle, Tom Motlow.

Because of the generous gift of 187 acres, and because of all of Senator Motlow's contributions to education in Tennessee, Governor Buford Ellington and Commissioner Warf recommended the college be named Motlow State Community College. Partnerships.

Breaking Ground

Groundbreaking ceremonies were held November 26, 1967, with Governor Ellington, Commissioner Warf, and approximately 250 persons from surrounding counties in attendance.

In December 1968, Dr. Sam H. Ingram, dean of the school of education at Middle Tennessee State University, was named president of Motlow effective Feb. 1, 1969. The College



opened temporary offices at First Baptist Church in Tullahoma Feb. 3. On Sept. 22, 1969, after almost five years of planning and work by a group of dedicated citizens, Motlow opened its doors. Formal dedication ceremonies were held April 19, 1970.

The End of the Beginning

Motlow's first graduating class was presented at commencement ceremonies June 4, 1971, as 79 students were granted associate degrees. A milestone came in December 1971 when Motlow received full accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

In the 50 years since that first graduating class, Motlow State has grown at a phenomenal rate, surpassing the 1,800-enrollment mark in 1976, the 2,300 mark in 1978, and by 1999 enrollment was 3,300. Ten years ago, enrollment had surpassed 5,000 and fall 2019, for the fifth year in a row, Motlow set a new all-time enrollment record of approximately 7,000 students.

Then to Now

Motlow has grown from five buildings on a single site in Moore County to 14 buildings at four different locations. Those numbers do not include an 80,000 square-foot beautiful structure that opened in December on the Smyrna campus.

Motlow is a story of the power of public-private partnerships. The pattern of public-private partnerships is the common thread that weaves through the history of this college. Public-private partnerships that have begun in living rooms, over lunch, at the lake, and on the golf course. Public-private partnerships between philanthropists, business owners, community leaders, elected officials and entrepreneurial educators. Partnerships that invested in doing the right thing at the right time.




SPACE INSTITUTE at Tullahoma

Hadfield flew four missions from 1995 to 2012 and is an honored pilot. Barry E. Butch Wilmore has flown two missions from 2000 to 2015 and is a captain in the US Navy. Henry W. Hartsfield Jr. has flown three missions from 1982 to 1985 and is an honored pilot. Randolph Bresnik flew three missions from 2009 to 2017 and also flew combat missions

in support of Operations Iraqi freedom. William A. Oefelein has flown one mission from 1998 to 2006 and was a Navy Pilot and an instructor in the Naval Test Pilot school. Jeffery S. Ashby flew three missions from 1999 to 2002 and is also an honored pilot.

The View dining hall is situated on a peninsula overlooking the beautiful Woods Reservoir. Business hours are Monday through Friday from 7:30 am to 10:00 am for breakfast and 11:00 am to 1:30 pm for lunch and open to the public. They offer a wide variety of breakfast and lunch items and cater special events held at UTSI during business hours.






Award. Students may use the scholarship at any of the state's 13 community colleges, 27 colleges of applied technology, or other eligible institution offering an associate degree program. While removing the financial burden is key, a critical component of Tennessee Promise is the individual guidance each participant will receive from a mentor who will assist the student as he or she navigates the college admission process.

This is accomplished primarily via mandatory meetings that students must attend in order to remain eligible for the program. In addition, Tennessee Promise participants must complete and submit eight (8) hours of community service per term enrolled, as well as maintain satisfactory academic progress (2.0 GPA) at their respective institution.

TENNESSEE RECONNECT ACT

Completing the Path for All Tennesseans to Access Higher Education The Tennessee Reconnect Act gives adults the opportunity to enter or reenter public higher education with no tuition expenses. The extension of the Drive to 55, establishes a last-dollar scholarship, which is equal to the difference between tuition and fees and any gift aid (grants and scholarships) that a student receives. In 2013, Governor Haslam launched the Drive to 55 to increase the number of Tennesseans with a postsecondary degree or certificate to 55 percent by 2025.

Why Tennessee Reconnect?

Tennessee needs 871,000 degrees to reach the Drive to 55 goal, but only 645,000 high school students are expected to graduate between 2014 and 2022. At every public higher education institution in Tennessee, adults earn a higher share of credentials, often because they return to education more focused on the challenge. Today, the state has a tremendous opportunity to attract more adults to higher education, with more than 900,000 Tennesseans having earned some college credit but no degree. Tennessee Reconnect provides an immediate payoff for Tennessee's

workforce and an investment in the state's economy that will provide dividends for decades to come. Employers will get the skills and credentials they are seeking from the workforce, and employees will have new opportunities for career growth.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for Tennessee Reconnect, the student must:

- Not already have an associate or bachelor degree;
- Have been a Tennessee resident for at least one year preceding the date of application for the grant;
- Complete the FAFSA and be deemed an independent student;
- Be admitted to an eligible institution and enroll in a degree or certificate program at least part-time (6 semester hours); and

• Participate in an advising program approved by the Tennessee Higher Education Commission.

To maintain the Tennessee Reconnect grant, the student must enroll in classes leading to an associate's degree or certificate, maintain a 2.0 GPA, and maintain continuous enrollment

The Tennessee Reconnect Programs

Tennessee Reconnect is one major initiative of the Drive to 55. The programs of Tennessee Reconnect directly focus on the fourth strategy of Drive to 55, which is to create opportunities for adults to finish a degree or credential that they have started.

Below are the descriptions of the Tennessee Reconnect programs:

- The TCAT(Tennessee College of Applied Technology) **Reconnect Grant** pays the remaining balance of tuition after state, and Pell grants have been applied. This grant is available for adults who are Tennessee residents and enroll full-time at a TCAT institution in pursuit of a certificate or diploma.
- The Community College Reconnect Grant is a scholarship program that began in 2016. Tennessee residents who have earned at least 30 credit hours toward an associate degree, enroll in at least 9 credit hours per semester, and have not been enrolled in a postsecondary institution at least one year prior to application are eligible.
- TN Reconnect Communities & the TN Reconnect Community Network focuses on supporting local communities with centers that provide a variety of services including advising, career counseling, and scholarship resources. These centers will also act as a connecting point for local employers, local institutions of higher education, and prospective adult learners. In January of 2016, a new web portal was launched to help adults navigate learning opportunities available at Tennessee institutions (www.TNReconnect.gov). The portal also

- allows former community college and university students to enter transcript information and receive back a list of academic pathway options and institutions offering those options.
- Tennessee Reconnect + Complete program reaches out to Tennessee adults aged 25-64 who have earned at least 50 percent of credits toward an associate or bachelor's degree but have never finished college. The purpose of the program is to provide resources for Tennessee institutions to reach out to these adults and encourage them to complete their degree.
- Ready to Reconnect Institutional Grants program supports mini-grants to fund institutional initiatives that support adult learning. Many of the funded programs plan to engage adult learners by connecting them with adult learner peers, increasing access to technology for academic purposes, and supporting connections between their academic pursuits and career ambitions.
- TimewiseTN: Turn Your Years of Knowledge into **College Credit** is a program that aims to develop a common language that will be clear to students and allow them to find Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) resources on campus.



WHAT IS C.E.O.?

Creating Educational Opportunities (C.E.O.) is a voluntary partnership-in-education program between local businesses and Tullahoma City Schools, for the support and enrichment of the educational process. The Road to Tullahoma

Before settling in Tullahoma, the Martins lived in Atlanta where Georges was the executive chef at East Lake Golf Club. With two young children who would soon be entering school and a 61-mile drive to work each day, the couple began to look for other options—plus they had a burning desire to open their own restaurant. Tammy's parents had retired in Tullahoma and the idea of opening a restaurant in the small town had some appeal. In July of 2001, they gave up two really good jobs, packed up their things and headed for Tullahoma. They purchased a small home and began looking for property to open a restaurant. Then September 11 happened, and their future was suddenly very uncertain. "Neither one of us had a job," Georges says. "We just stuck to our guns. We bought the property on September 29th and opened up on December 8th, 2001." Georges' previous experience in Atlanta proved to be a valuable asset. "I had the advantage of opening a big kitchen from the ground up with someone else's money, and when it came time to open my own, I knew better what to do," Georges says. Originally, they thought they would name the restaurant

Chézy after the small village in central France where Georges' family is from. "It's spelled Chezy but people here would call it Cheesy and that didn't work," Georges says. Emil is a family name. It is the middle name of Georges' French grandfather and Tammy's German grandfather as well. It is also the middle name of one of Georges' dear cousins who passed away in 1994. Their son is Adam Emile and their daughter is Emilie—and so it was decided—the restaurant would be called Emil's.

Secrets to Success

"The reason we are still in business is because I am here all the time," Georges says. "When you own your own business, you have to see everything and make sure that it gets done the way

you want it done." In the first 17 years, there were only two times that the restaurant was open that Georges wasn't there. Since the great addition of Mason Heath almost two years ago, Georges is finding more time and confidence to step away. An accomplished chef himself, Mason has brought his own personality and experience to Emil's to help Georges create a truly unique experience for diners. Together with Mason and the staff of Emil's, Georges attributes success to quality and consistency.

With almost twenty years behind them, what makes it all worthwhile? "You create memories for people. That's the kind of stuff you really cherish, and the friendships," Georges says.

Catherine Murray, also known as Cat, started McMurr's in 1997 as a DJ service. Since that time the business has grown to encompass a diverse range of products and services. The tagline below McMurr's sign reads, "We Make Copies," and they do. The core of the business is copying and printing, but there is a laundry list of other services McMurr's provides.

Cat loves helping others and McMurr's is a testament to just how far she will go. What started with a computer and a desktop printer now includes a building full of equipment. In addition to printers and scanners, there are machines for binding booklets, laminating, shrink wrapping, folding, and cutting as well as machines that will transfer recordings from an album or tape to CD and VHS to DVD. McMurr's even still offers floppy disk transfers and faxing. FEELS LIKE HOME

Since they were first married, Rod and Karen Todaro have never lived in one place longer than two years, until they came to Tullahoma.

The Todaro Family is putting down some roots. For most of us, that may not seem like a big deal. However, for a family that has moved every two years, it means something. For 26 years, Rod Todaro served in the United States Air Force and like clockwork, received a new permanent change of station (PCS) every two years. From Edwards Air Force Base in California to Patterson Air Force Base in Ohio, as well as San Antonio, Washington D.C and a few others in between, the family crisscrossed the country, each time packing up all their belongings, attending new schools, meeting new friends and leaving old ones behind.

When it was over, he and Karen both agreed they liked Tullahoma, and since they didn't have to move this time, they decided to stay. "There was nothing really luring us away," Karen says. "We wanted our daughter to be able to stay in the same school for four years, which she had never done," Rod adds. Both Rod and Karen have high regard for the school system in Tullahoma. Their oldest daughter Natalie, who is now a freshman at Notre Dame is well-prepared thanks to the education she received at Tullahoma High School. Their youngest daughter Audrey is active in sports and is developing some deep roots of her own. "We've been here four and a half years, and it turned out to be a great decision," Karen says.

As a navigator in the Air Force, Rod spent a lot of time up in the air and when it came time to retire, he still wanted to keep flying. To build the required time as a commercial pilot, he spent the next two years teaching at a flight school in Smyrna. Today, Rod is a pilot for American Eagle, a feeder airline for American Airlines. He commutes to work from Tullahoma to Nashville to the airline's hub in Washington D.C.

Karen works as a physical therapist at Star Physical Therapy. It was a profession she discovered through a friendship on one of their previous assignments. It also proved to be a very portable profession where she could easily find work wherever they lived. Karen is a pilot as well. Her dad and grandfather were pilots, and like them, she developed a love for flying. Today, Rod and Karen keep their own airplane, which Rod built, in a hangar at the Tullahoma Airport. "It's the closest I've ever lived to the airplane—it's just ten minutes away," Rod says. The family frequently flies together on vacations and to visit family in Sarasota, Florida or Buffalo, New York.

As for Tullahoma, they have grown to love living in a small community. "I loved D.C., but I never realized how stressful it was until I got here," Karen says. "I feel like I live in the 70s-80s when I grew up in California. It's a nice lifestyle, and I love the outdoors." Rod adds, "There are four seasons, but the winter doesn't get too wintery."



TOO MUCH FUN FOR ONE DAY

From Music and Art to Whiskey and Waterfalls, Tullahoma has a lot of great reasons to make it a two-day stay.

Two days in Tullahoma, it sounds like a great song title and why not? After all, Tennessee is recognized as the Soundtrack of America, and Tullahoma has made more than a few contributions to the state's legacy of music, one of which is country music singer Dustin Lynch. His new album is titled Tullahoma and it's all about his experiences growing up in the area, a tribute to his small-town roots. So, while you're out exploring the area, add the new album to your playlist and get a backstage tour of Tullahoma.

Tennessee Music Pathways

With more musicians per capita than anywhere in the world, music is a vein of gold that pulses through all 95 counties in the state. Tennessee Department of Tourism is on a mission to make the state the global music destination of choice. Through an initiative launched in September of 2018, Tennessee Music Pathways is mapping the way for a whole new travel experience, one for music lovers of all kinds. Encompassing a 1200-mile state-wide system, the Pathways lead travelers to sights that have played a significant part in the story of Tennessee's musical pioneers and legends. Statues, murals, festivals, birthplaces, gravesites, hometowns, high schools, and churches are a few of the locations where markers will be placed. A few notable music festivals in Tullahoma and the surrounding area include Bonnaroo Music and Arts Festival, Lynchburg Music Festival, and 41A Music & Arts Festival. Music and art go hand in hand and in addition to the beautiful displays of art at the music festivals, Tullahoma has several installations of public art worthy of your time. Spending a few hours on a mural treasure hunt will not only help familiarize you with the area but will also provide wonderful photo opportunities. Read "Tullahoma's Blooming Art Scene" in this issue for detailed information about where to find the murals.

The Jack Trail

Tullahoma is located in the heart of whiskey country. A short drive will take you to several distilleries where you can learn about Tennessee's history in whiskey. What's more, the scenic drive to these distilleries is breathtaking. Start your whiskey tour in Tullahoma at the Cascade Hollow Distillery. Since 1870, the distillery has been faithful to the recipe George A. Dickel created. Today it is crafted just as it was then — Handmade the Hard Way. Take a one-hour tour through the fully operational distillery and barrelhouse where you'll see the process of whiskey making from start to finish. Then head over to Lynchburg to the oldest registered distillery in the United States, Jack Daniel Distillery. Make time for the 1.5-hour Angel's Share Distillery Tour where you'll hear stories about the history and sample some of their limited-edition single barrel whiskeys. If you like moonshine, Southern Pride Distillery is the place for you. Using an old family recipe, they mill locally grown corn on-site, to produce

their premium distilled spirits. On a beautiful farm outside of Fayetteville, the distillery produces seven flavors of distilled spirits and two Double Barrel Charred Shines.

Prichard's Distillery in Kelso, Tennessee is in an old schoolhouse where the basketball hoops still hang on the wall. Their quality rums and whiskeys are distilled in copper pots and stored in 15-gallon to 53-gallon charred white oak barrels to allow for the best possible flavor. The newest distillery in the area is the Nearest Green Distillery at Sand Creek Farms in Shelbyville. Nathan "Nearest" Green, fondly known as Uncle Nearest, was the slave who taught Jack Daniel the craft of distilling. He is the first African American master distiller on record in the United States and his legacy is being honored with a distillery in his name.



The Great Outdoors


Tennessee's abundant waterfalls are one of the state's most significant natural resources, and Tullahoma is lucky enough to have several just a few minutes out of town. Launch your waterfall adventure at Rutledge Falls. Although these falls are located on private property, the owners offer public access to the falls from dawn to dusk. At the top of the falls, you will be greeted by a stately female statue known as the Lady of the Falls, who was saved from destruction during a renovation project at the Tennessee State Capitol in Nashville. The rocky trail leading down to the swimming hole is steep, so be sure to wear good walking or hiking shoes. This waterfall also made its big-screen debut in "Hannah Montana: The Movie." Rutledge Falls is located at 1289 Rutledge Falls Rd., Tullahoma, TN. A few miles down the road at Short Springs Natural Area is one of the tallest falls in the state. Machine Falls drops more than 60 feet and is almost as wide. Watch for the signs when you get to the creek. The falls are hidden from the trail and to get there you have to walk up the creek about 100 yards. You won't be disappointed, seeing Machine Falls up close is well worth getting your feet a little wet. Parking and a map of the area can be found beneath the large water tower at 2250 Short Springs Road in Tullahoma. While you are there, take the Bobo Creek Trail loop for a glimpse of Lower and Upper Busby Falls. Short Springs is also known as one of the best spring wildflower locations in the state.

The area surrounding Tullahoma is an outdoor lover's paradise. Tim's Ford Lake is considered one of the most picturesque lakes in Tennessee and is regarded as one of the top bass fishing and recreational lakes in the Southeast. Other amenities include a swimming pool, playground, trails with suspension bridges, campgrounds, and a marina where you can rent boats and canoes. You can even play a round of golf or two at Bear Trace Golf Course. If you are looking for an adrenaline-pumping adventure, there's always skydiving at the Tullahoma airport with Skydive Tennessee. And a visit to the nearby Beechcraft Heritage Museum is sure to provide hours of fun for the whole family. For a beautiful view of the sunset, the Tullahoma Airport is hard to beat.

There are lots of fantastic reasons to stay in Tullahoma for a night or two, and the list keeps getting longer. But don't worry, whatever you don't get to this time makes for a great reason to come back.

Montana Drive-In Theater offers after-dark entertainment for the whole family.

For many of us, drive-in theaters conjure up images of high school letter jackets, classic cars, and John Travolta singing the heart-wrenching ballad "Stranded at the Drive-in" from the movie Grease. Although those are some great memories, packing up the car and heading to the drive-in is still a wonderful opportunity to make new memories. Sure a few things have changed since the glory days of drive-in theaters back in the 1950s, but one thing remains true, good family-friendly entertainment never goes out of style.

The Montana Drive-In Theater in Estill Springs opened in 2004 and offers three-screens which show double features. It is one of seventeen drive-in theaters that operate in Tennessee. Considering that there are fewer than 350 drive-in theaters in the entire United States, that's an impressive number. Of course, Tennessee's sweet southern nights make for optimal movie viewing weather during most of the year.

Today's drive-in theaters still offer a nostalgic experience for those who "remember when," but for younger generations, it's a whole new experience where the pre-show fun is as exciting as the main feature. Digital projection provides a quality picture on the massive outdoor screens. And, instead of listening to the movie through a squawk-box hanging in the window, you can listen on your car stereo by tuning in to the theater's AM or FM station. If you want to sit out under the stars amidst flickering fireflies, while reclining in lawn chairs set up on the ground or in the back of a pickup bed, a portable radio is a must. And if you do happen to miss a line, you can just ask the person sitting next to you without getting shushed.

The concession stand offers a full restaurant menu including fresh hamburgers, hand-dipped chicken tenders, pizza, funnel cakes, and fried Oreos, as well as popcorn, candy, and ice cream. They also have a pager system to let you know when your order is complete. The best part is that you don't have to disturb the entire row to make your way to the concession stand. A night at the Montana Drive-in Theater is an affordable night of entertainment, with two movies for the price of one. Admission Prices are \$8 for adults and \$7 for children 11 and under.




















TULLAHOMA CHAMBER

SOUTH JACKSON CIVIC CENTER

A historic venue for all citizens to enjoy

South Jackson Civic Center is a jewel in the crown of Tullahoma. Located at 404 South Jackson Street, the original building was constructed in 1886 and housed Tullahoma's first public school. This year, we are celebrating our 40th anniversary as a performing arts venue. During this time, the building has expanded to provide more classrooms and an auditorium with great acoustics and a (preeminent) proscenium stage. In 1972, the student body moved back to Jack T. Farrar Elementary School. By the end of the decade, the building had fallen into disrepair, and plans were made to tear it down. Aware of its potential and historical significance, concerned citizens, led by the late Alice

Harton Ratcliffe, launched a successful campaign to "Save South Jackson." Thousands of volunteer hours were invested in the restoration of the building making it ready for occupancy again.

Looking back at its history, hundreds of performances by professionals and amateurs alike have been enjoyed in the Warren Auditorium. Classes on every facet of performing arts continue to be taught to aspiring lighting and sound technicians as well as those singing, dancing, and acting on stage. The building grounds have seen weddings, funerals, class reunions, corporate training, music festivals, and living history. Also, the Mitchell Museum, which is housed on the first floor, is a wonderful source of local history and receives many visitors every year.

Today, we continue to grow our programming for the Performing Arts Series. The Association's operations are guided by volunteer board directors who have a passion for the performing arts and the desire to maintain the historic venue for all citizens to enjoy. We are expanding our venue options with the addition of an outdoor stage and Black Box theatre.


DANCING IN THE STREETS

The 41A Music Festival turns up the music for a good cause

What's not to love about watching live music? Especially when it's outdoors on a warm September evening in downtown Tullahoma. Music has a long history of bringing people together and celebrating some of the good things in life like family, friends, and community. The 41A Music and Arts Festival does all that and more—and the best part, it's free!

Established in 2009 by the Highland Rim Kiwanis Club, the two-day Music Festival was created to raise money for local children's charities. Staying true to the focus of Kiwanis International which is "improving the world one child and one community at a time," the local chapter is doing just that through music. 100% of the proceeds from the festival go to local children's charities, which to date, is over \$115,000. The funds are raised through a silent auction, and donations as well as food and beverage sales. Past recipients include Tullahoma Day Care, 5Loaves4Kids, Haven of Hope and Coffee County Imagination Library.

It's no surprise the 41A Music Festival has been voted the Favorite Community Event several years in a row. Cascade Hollow Distillery

Turning Water into Whisky Since 1878

When it comes to making whiskey, a pure water source is essential. It's so important that many great distilleries are named after the water source. Cascade Hollow Distillery gets its name from Cascade Springs, where the water comes up from the ground through layers of limestone that act as a natural filter. It's the same water source George Dickel used in the 1800s and is exclusively used by the distillery today.

At Cascade Hollow Distillery the traditional production process is not run by a computer. The George Dickel whisky is "Handmade the Hard Way" by people who still take temperatures by hand and weigh grains on an old weigh scale. They also make charcoal onsite from 2" x 2" x 4' pieces of sugar maple wood perfectly stacked in ricks and then set on fire. After the wood burns down to a certain point, workers douse it with water, lay the wood out to dry, and then break it down into piles of charcoal. Later, they scoop up the charcoal into burlap bags, load it in the back of a truck and then carry the bags up the stairs of the distillery to the filtering vats. If it sounds like a lot of hard work, it is, but making fine whiskey has never been easy and Cascade Hollow Distilling Co. is keeping the process true to tradition. Today, General Manager and Distiller Nicole Austin oversees the brand's 148-year legacy of making Tennessee's award-winning craft whiskey.

Whether you are a whiskey drinker or not, Cascade Hollow Distillery is a wonderful place to experience a unique part of Tennessee history. Sit in one of the rocking chairs on the porch of the visitor's center and take in the beautiful view of the lush meadows and forested rolling hills where water turns to whisky, one drop at a time.

LOCAL BANKERS. LOCAL DECISIONS.

When FB Financial Corporation Executive Chairman Jim Ayers bought Farmers State Bank in 1984, it had been serving the small West Tennessee town of Scotts Hill since 1906, providing loans to farmers and merchants, keeping hard-earned deposits safe, and playing a pivotal role in the life of the community. After moving the charter to Lexington, Tennessee, and changing its name to FirstBank, Ayers began expanding the Bank across Tennessee, establishing the franchise in metropolitan areas while continuing to serve smaller community markets. We continue to operate from the Bank's roots and operating philosophy of growing the Bank one relationship at a time.

Today's world of banking is much more complex than it was in 1906, but FirstBank keeps it simple - A TRADITION CONTINUES.
