

### **Scorpion Homecoming**

Also on Saturday, 173 Scorpion Snowmobiles were on display during the Scorpion Homecoming. Several hundred participants enjoyed mild temperatures and a strong showing of this year's feature machines, the Range Whip and all teardrop designs. Of the feature sleds, 26 of these beautiful original and restored machines were on display – the most ever.

Numerous unique and rare Scorpions were presented, including the legendary rac-

ing prototype, the "Odd Job" (highly regarded in the snowmobile racing community). As a result, the Scorpion Homecoming presented a wide range of local snowmobiling history, from the very earliest Scorpions to the sleek racing machines of the late 1970's, all designed and manufactured by fellow Rangers right here in the Cuyuna Lakes. ### Won't solve itself

As the highest taxed city in Crow Wing County, the Crosby council voted to raise the levy once again —when the city had a surplus of funds from last year.

The issues on streets, repairs, maintenance are on-going, all cities have the same issues. How they're managed is different. Most cities have a city administrator that is skilled, accessible, with a working knowledge of most of the departments or they listen to city employees with experience, not Crosby. They hire more administrators to listen for the city administrator — people who, by contract, can't touch a shovel, piece of equipment, plow the streets.

To be able to convince her



It is difficult to find a news feed, pick up a paper, or listen to a news cast that doesn't mention the global concern for rapidly spreading illnesses. 




