# **Chamber fetes award winners**

Celebrating its 70th anniversary, the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce gathered in February to honor achievements of its membership this past year.

Chamber Executive Director Missy Koehler recalled a bit the history of the chamber, dating back to October 1950 when the name was officially changed to its current name from what once was known as the Businessman's Association. The location of the annual awards banquet held great meaning, since Siebkens was once owned by Ollie Siebken Moeller, one of the prime movers who advocated change back in the 50's.

Koehler reviewed the year past, noting that 2019 was a strong year for the chamber, which has grown to 150 members.

Although weather played a limiting factor in some of the traditional chamber events, the year held many highlights:

- The chamber launched a new website in February, with many online functions to help chamber members and Farmers Market vendors.
- A brand new event "Night Market Elkhart Lake" was rolled out this year, with attendance estimated at more than 1,000 people.
- The tree lighting was expanded to a larger event called Christmas in the Square, partnering with ElkhartCares.
- The chamber's newspaper, Depot Dispatch, had its best year from a revenue standpoint.

# Looking ahead to 2020

Koehler also took time to point to some major milestones looming in the year ahead.

The Depot Dispatch will turn 40 years old on May 22. "The First Issue" as it was called bore the headline "Paper stresses community resources." The aim of the Depot Dispatch was to pull together and to become aware of the character and services of the community. The May edition of the Depot Dispatch will contain special information on the paper's history.

Downtown Night, still one of the Chamber's most popular events, will celebrate 25 years this August. "It's hard to believe that an idea sprung from a work lunch on a picnic table would turn into the event it has become today," Koehler said.

Koehler introduced Dick Strong of the Van Horn Automotive Group to share information about his the Pay it Forward Initiative. The names of all attendees was put in a bowl and the name of the person drawn was able to select a local charity for a \$1,000 contribution from the Van

# Packer Hall of Famer named eSports coach

Ahman Green might be best known in Wisconsin for his Hall of Fame career with the Green Bay Packers, but for esports enthusiasts, he has also built quite a positive reputation.

On Feb. 5, Green, an eSports entrepreneur and longtime player, was named the first coach of Lakeland University's new eSports program.

The Packers' all-time leading rusher has always been a gamer, dating back to playing ColecoVision when he was a kid. While growing up in Nebraska and becoming a decorated player for the University of Nebraska Cornhuskers, Tecmo Super Bowl and Madden NFL '97 were two of the games that kept Green rooted in eSports.

"This has been a lifelong passion for me, and I am excited to get the opportunity to come to Lakeland in this new role and grow the university's program from the ground up," said Green, a broadcast personality for the professional eSports team Tempo Storm.

"It is amazing how quickly eSports is growing, and how much it has evolved over the years I have been playing. I'm looking forward to talking to gamers about Lakeland and all the university has to offer as we build this program."

During his 12-year NFL career, Green was a four-time Pro Bowler and two-time All-Pro player. He has been inducted into both the Nebraska and Green Bay Halls of Fame.

After retiring from pro football in 2009, Green's interest in gaming and the eSports industry grew, and his personality in the industry grew as he hosted a weekly eSports talk show, True Game Fans Network.

Lakeland's co-ed team will debut this fall and be a member of the National Association of Collegiate Esports (NACE), which serves as the governing body to more than 150 colleges and universities and sets standards for eligibility and conduct for collegiate eSports.

ESports are multiplayer video games played online competing against other NACE colleges across the country in both a fall and spring season. Lakeland's team will compete in games such as League of Legends, Overwatch, Paladins, Rocket League, Smite, Fortnite, CSGO and Super Smash Brothers Ultimate. Additional games will be added in the future based on student interest and additions made by NACE.

Lakeland is renovating an existing 3,000-square foot space on the southwest portion of its campus where its eSports team will practice and compete. The space will feature 18 gaming stations, six consoles, a lounge area and space for spectators to enjoy the action.

The space will also be open to all Lakeland students during designated hours for intramural programs and individual student use. Lakeland currently has an eSports club and more than 30 students are involved, and that interest helped fuel Lakeland's decision to create a varsity team.

# Lakeland launches student-run venture

Lakeland University is launching a new and innovative experiential learning opportunity that will better position students for post-graduation employment.

Lakeland's new student-run business enterprise will allow students to create, develop, manage and lead business ventures while developing the next generation of emerging leaders.

Students will be hired this spring into executive roles that will shape the studentrun enterprise moving forward. Positions include chief executive officer, chief financial officer, chief marketing officer, chief talent officer and president of the Develop U division."

This new venture will put students in positions to make real-world business decisions, lead teams of their peers and be responsible for all aspects of the businesses from financial success to marketing strategies," said Scott Niederjohn, Lakeland's senior vice president for cooperative education and economic development. "These powerful experiences will provide students with an opportunity to develop an entrepreneurial mind set that is applicable in any field of study."

Initially the program will create four

- The Non-Profit Division will provide local non-profit agencies with temporary and/or long-term staff at little to no cost. The goal is to increase the effectiveness of local non-profit organizations by providing students to fill administrative and professional roles or customized projects
- The Hospitality Division will run existing campus businesses such as Lakeland's The Daily Grind (coffee shop), The

Muskie Mart (grocery and convenience store), athletic department concessions and facility rental and event planning (internal and external).

- The Merchandising Division will provide goods to elevate the Lakeland brand through the design and production of targeted consumer goods.
- Develop U Division will provide customized professional growth opportunities and continued training to improve useful skills and enhance competencies for internal and external constituents. These paid positions are open to undergraduate students in any academic major. The positions will start this summer."

This first group of student executives will make important decisions that will shape this enterprise for future growth," Niederjohn said. "It will be an amazing opportunity to students to learn how to strategize and innovate for long-term success.'

Lakeland is modeling its program after colleges with successful and proven student-run businesses.

The university is creating a Board of Directors that will be filled with local business leaders to help guide the students in

The board will work directly with the student executives, overseeing high-level direction, policy and strategy of the student-run business ventures.

# A helping hand for schools

# Education has a strong Foundation in Elkhart Lake - Glenbeulah

Everyone values the role of a strong partner. Local education has such a partner in the form of the Elkhart Lake - Glenbeulah Education Foundation.

Named the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce Non-Profit Organization of the Year ELGEF has pumped lifeblood into the Elkhart Lake - Glenbeulah system in its 17-year history.

Vital financial contributions and accompanying support for the community's education system have strengthened a great community resource.

ELGEF Board member Bobbie Stroessner emphasized the importance of the partnering arrangement.

"A lot of people don't really know what we do, what our school needs and how valuable the work is in keeping our school system competitive," she noted.

Last year alone, the ELGEF contributed over \$30,000 to support school programming and learning experience initiatives beyond limits of the school budget.

"We are fortunate to have the Elkhart Lake Glenbeulah School District. The value of the school remaining in Elkhart Lake is enormous, and keeping the school competitive to draw in and retain students is so important," Stroessner said.

The foundation helps bridge some of the shortcomings of being a small district.

### **Grants for programs**

Elkhart Lake School district only receives 27 percent of its budget in state aid. ELGEF funds grant requests from teachers for a variety of educational programming needs beyond the normal operating budget.

Among the grants approved and given out this past year were the following:

- purchase of a plasma cutter and two 3-D printers for the technology education department
- supported district emergency funds for families in need
- helped purchase a retractable baseball/ softball batting cage
- purchased tone chimes and handbells for the district's music program
- purchased a baritone saxophone for the Middle School Band program
- funded upgrades for the newly renovated consumer science classroom
- supported electronic field trips for elementary and middle school students
- funded author visits through the Sheboygan County Children's Book Fair
- provided funding for the ELG District marketing efforts
- contributed additional funding for the purchase of uniforms for the high school girls basketball team

"The District has been fortunate to pass referendums which allow our schools to continue to grow, but we still have our wish lists and wants for our schools to remain competitive," Stroessner said.

Last year, 24 percent (109 students) of the enrollees in the district qualified for free and reduced lunches. Yet, the property rich status of the district prevents it from qualifying for additional outside financial assistance for those programs.

"We always have an emergency fund to fill the needs of families who are experi-

encing financial hardships. The funds help cover the costs of school supplies, lunch fees, band fees, athletic fees and other needs, which can result in an impartial education experience for our students," Stroessner added.

### Hitching up fundraising boots

As a result of these needs, ELGEF maintains an attitude of strapping on its fundraising boots and marching forward to support the school system. Julia Loo-Sutcliffe, current ELGEF Board President pointed to several fundraising efforts that support the ELGEF efforts to back the school system. Annually, the foundation reaches out to the community with an appeal for contributions. Donations can be made monetarily, through planned giving or stock donations. "We feel very fortunate to live in a community where the businesses and individuals are so incredibly supportive of our fundraising efforts. Each year we see an increase in dollars raised from the community," Loo-Sutliffe added.

Other fundraising efforts include a Fall Golf Outing, a Spring event, a holiday ornament sale and intermittent smaller events held at local restaurants. Donors are acknowledged with an engraved apple on the ELGEF Giving Tree located in the high school. See elgef.org for more information.

### **Boss of Education event**

A new fundraiser is in place for 2020. A 1920 themed Bootleggers Ball will be held at the Paddock Club on April 18 from 7-11pm. Five-six teams of people will be competing to raise funds to become the "Boss of Education." Each team will decide how they will raise funds. There is no limit to the number of fundraising activities a team can do. In the final month of fundraising teams will be given Elk Heads to sell to the public to boost their final fundraising efforts. Watch for announcements of ways the public can contribute to each team and help make the event a big success. Tickets are available at the ELG school offices or on line at elgef.org/ball.










# Spotlight - Stephanie Weill Center

History of the Carol Burnett Show: In 1967, CBS offered to put Carol Burnett in a weekly comedy series called Here's Agnes. However, Burnett had a stipulation in her ten-year contract with CBS that said she had five years from the date The Garry

Moore Show ended to "push the button" on hosting 30 one-hour episodes of a music/comedy variety show. As a result, the hour-long Carol Burnett Show was born and debuted in September 1967, garnering 23 Emmy Awards and winning or being nominated for multiple Emmy and Golden Globe Awards every season it was on the air. Its ensemble cast included Tim Conway (who was a guest player until the ninth season,) Harvey Korman, Lyle Waggoner, and the teenaged Vicki Lawrence, whom Burnett herself discovered and mentored.

A true variety show, The Carol Burnett Show struck a chord with viewers. Among other things, it parodied films (Gone With the Breeze for Gone With the Wind,) television (As the Stomach Turns for the soap opera As the World Turns) and commercials. Musical numbers were also a frequent feature.

Burnett and her team struck gold with the original sketch "The Family," which eventually was spun off into its own television show called Mama's Family, starring Vicki Lawrence. Burnett opened most shows with an impromptu question-andanswer session with the audience, lasting a few minutes, during which she often demonstrated her ability to humorously ad lib.

On numerous occasions, she obliged when asked to perform her trademark Tarzan yell. Burnett ended each show by tugging on her left ear, which was a message to her grandmother who raised her.

This was done to let her know that she was doing well and that she loved her.





# Housing rental permit required

# **Short-Term Rental Licensing Ordinance**

Did you know that if you rent your house out for one night, the State of Wisconsin requires you to have a Tourist Rooming House Permit? More information on this process can be found on the State of Wisconsin DATCP website https:// datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs\_Services/ TouristRoomingHouses.aspx. This means that if you are planning on renting your house for the Ryder Cup or Road America races you need to have the State's Tourist Rooming House Permit. Due to this requirement by the State and to help ensure properties that are being rented for short-term (less than a month) are meeting health and safety regulations, the Village Board approved a new ordinance for licensing short-term rentals. This ordinance requires all people who rent their property for more than 10 nights to be licensed by the Village. More information on this process, including an application, will be available by March 1st. If you have any questions, please contact Jessica Reilly at 920-876-2122.

### **Dog Licenses**

Please stop in at the Village Hall to license your dog by March 31st. You need to provide a proof of rabies vaccination and pay the fee (\$7.00 per spayed or neutered dog and \$14.00 per dog if not spayed or neutered). A late charge will be assessed to all dogs not licensed by March 31st.

### **April Election**

The ballot is set for the April 7, 2020 election. If you need to have an absentee ballot, please make sure you fill out the form and provide photo ID to our office. We anticipate the ballots being mailed by March 16th and we will begin voting in the office by that date as well. If we get the ballots early we will start in-person absentee voting at that time. This will include the local elections, as well as the Presidential Primary. The following submitted papers to run for village offices.

Board of Trustees: (Vote for Three) Terri Knowles, John Schott, Lynn Shovan.

If you need to register to vote you can do it in person at the Village offices between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm Monday-Friday or you can go online to https://myvote. wi.gov/en-us/ and register and receive voting information including polling locations and sample ballots.

### **Household Hazardous Waste**

Sheboygan County has established three (potentially four) periodic collection sites for disposing of hazardous wastes. The majority of the program is funded with County tax dollars, so be prepared to show proof of residency. When those funds are depleted, the sites will be closed until funds are again available. The fees are: \$10 – Vehicles with hazardous waste only, \$30 – Vehicles with household size electronics only (for each 6 items), and \$30 – Vehicles with both hazardous waste and household size electronics (for each 6 electronic items). # Winter Rules began November 15

Winter parking regulations went into effect on November 15. As a reminder, here is the ordinance.

New This year!!! Parking is allowed overnight in the N. East Street parking lot overnight until 6 am. At that time your vehicle must be moved.

# PARKING REGULATIONS All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 2 am and 6 am, and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 6 am until 9 am commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

### **Snow Removal**

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period. Also, if you live at a corner intersection, remember you need to clear the sidewalk approaches to the streets.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

# **Snow Removal Warning**

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the prescribed time, the Village will shovel your walk and bill the property owner. Also, the entire width of the sidewalk must be shoveled. A path is not sufficient, and you will be in violation.

### **Prescription Drug Drop Off Box**

As you do your spring cleaning please make sure you safely dispose of your old prescription drugs. The collection box is located outside the police department. Please take your medications out of their containers and just drop the pills in the box. We do not accept liquids.

Drop off anytime Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 4:30 PM.



Within a short time she got to know and enjoy her interaction with the local residents who visit the post office, and says she learned to love it here.





# Lakeland, LTC assist with tax preparation

Lakeland University and Lakeshore Technical College (LTC) are partnering again this year to help collect tax refunds for area residents who need it the most.

Students in the accounting program from each institution will provide free tax preparation and electronic filing for low income tax filers. Lakeland started offering this service, which is available through the IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program (VITA), in 2005.

LTC students began participating in 2010. The program is designed to help low-to-moderate income people file their tax returns.

Clifton Larson Allen is sponsoring the VITA program this year.

The service is available through LTC at its Cleveland campus, 1290 North Ave., and through Lakeland at the Sheboygan Salvation Army, 710 Pennsylvania Ave. Reservations are required for the tax service \*

LTC's Cleveland campus: Tax prep is available on Tuesdays from 1-4 p.m. and 5:30-8:30 p.m. starting Feb. 4 and ending March 31.

To reserve a spot at LTC, call 920-693-1398. Phone calls for the LTC site are accepted starting on Jan. 27 between 9 a.m.-12 p.m. on Mondays and 12-3 p.m. on Wednesdays.\*

Sheboygan Salvation Army: Tax preparation will be open on Thursdays from 5-9 p.m. and Saturdays from 9:30 a.m.-2 p.m. starting Feb. 1 and ending April 9. To reserve a spot at the Salvation Army, call 920-565-1000 ext. 2290.

Phone calls are accepted between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. Monday through Friday. Reservations will be accepted beginning January 27.

Last year, students from the two institutions prepared and filed approximately 400 returns that helped local taxpayers collect close to \$1 million in refunds. People interested in taking advantage of this free service must have income under

\$56,000 a year.

Applicants must bring:\*

- A photo ID\*
- Social security cards for themselves, their spouse and dependents\*
- W-2 forms\*
- 1099 forms\*
- Rent certificate or 2019 property tax bill\*
  - A copy of their 2018 tax return.

Returns cannot be done for those taxpayers having income from outside Wisconsin sources, those having complex tax returns, those having rental income, those who are non-US residents and those who are married filing separately.

# Elkhart Lake Public Library to adopt fine free policy

The Elkhart Lake Public Library is proud to announce that the Library Board has adopted a fine free policy. As of March 1, 2020, the library will no longer charge fines for library items returned late. The Elkhart Lake Public Library joins two other Sheboygan County libraries, Sheboygan Falls Public Library and Kohler Public Library, that have been successfully fine free for many years.

Why fine free and why now? The public library fine free movement has been sweeping the nation. The American Library Association (ALA) passed a resolution in 2019 to urge public libraries to eliminate fines because fines can create barriers for people who need the service the most. The vulnerable populations often include people in low income situations, the elderly on fixed income, youth and minorities. Research has shown that the rate of return of library materials remain approximately the same whether fines are charged or not.

The Elkhart Lake Public Library has been moving towards the elimination of fines by expanding the grace period to all library materials, offering text and email reminders, lengthening the loan period of TV series DVDs, Audiobooks and new children's books. Over the last five years, we have reduced fines by almost 45%. Our budget has not been dependent on

the revenue from fines and we feel this is a good time to go ahead and eliminate all overdue fines. We have waived all accrued Elkhart Lake Public Library overdue fines. We are not able to waive fines charged by other libraries in the system. Charges for replacement costs and processing fees are still in force.

There is a concern that going fine free would stop people from returning books on time. Libraries that have adopted the practice, however, have not reported any issues with books being returned later than normal. With a fine free policy, patrons that don't return on time may be blocked from checking out additional materials until the late materials are returned. We will continue to bill for items that are never returned or for items that are returned damaged. Non-return of library materials is considered theft according to the Wisconsin statutes (Wis. Stat. 943.61) and sometimes we do request assistance from the Elkhart Lake Police Department.

Patrons with accounts in arrears due to lost or damaged books who would like to use the library, we would like to work with you. Please contact us.






