






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very old man lay dying in his bed. In death's doorway, he suddenly smelled the aroma of his favorite chocolate chip cookie wafting up the stairs.

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

Ingredients

- 8 bacon strips
- 2 pounds beef top round steak (3/4 inch thick)
 2 cups sliced fresh mushrooms
 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) diced
- tomatões, undrained
- 1/2 cup chopped onion 1 to 2 teaspoons dried tarragon
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 2 tablespoons water
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream Minced fresh parsley, optional

Directions

- 1. In a large cast-iron or ovenproof skillet, cook bacon over medium heat until crisp. Remove to paper towels to drain, reserving 1/4 cup drippings. Crumble bacon and set aside.
- 2. Trim beef; cut into serving-size pieces. Brown on both sides in drippings. Top meat with mushrooms, tomatoes and onion. Sprinkle with tarragon and bacon. Cover and bake at 325°, until meat is tender, 1-1/4 to 1-3/4 hours, basting twice.
- 3. Remove meat to a serving platter; keep warm. Combine cornstarch and water until smooth; add to skillet. Bring to a boil; cook and stir until thickened, 2 minutes. Reduce heat; stir in cream. Simmer, uncovered, until heated through, 3-4 minutes. Return meat to skillet and turn to coat with sauce. If desired, sprinkle with parsley.

MEDITERRANEAN CHICKEN

Ingredients

- 4 boneless skinless chicken breast halves (6 ounces each)
- 1/4 teaspoon sált

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NE CKILLE UPPER

- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 pint grape tomatoes
- 16 pitted ripe olives, sliced
- 3 tablespoons capers, drained **Directions**

1. Sprinkle chicken with salt and pepper. In a large ovenproof skillet, cook chicken in oil over

medium heat until golden brown, 2-3 minutes on each side. Add the tomatoes, olives and capers.

2. Bake, uncovered, at 475° until a thermometer reads 170°,10-14 minutes.



BLEND OF THE BAYOU

Ingredients

- 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, cubed
- 4 tablespoons butter, divided
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 celery ribs, chopped
- 1 large green pepper, chopped
- 1 pound cooked medium shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 2 cans (6 ounces each) crab meat, drained, flaked and cartilage removed
- 1 can (10-3/4 ounces) condensed cream of mushroom soup, undiluted 3/4 cup cooked rice
- 1 jar (4-1/2 ounces) sliced mushrooms, drained
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt
- 3/4 teaspoon hot pepper sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 3/4 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1/2 cup crushed butter-flavored crackers (about 12 crackers)



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Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a small saucepan, cook and stir cream cheese and 2 tablespoons butter over low heat until melted and smooth.

In a large cast-iron or other ovenproof skillet, saute onion, celery and green pepper in remaining butter until tender. Stir in shrimp, crab, soup, rice, mushrooms, garlic salt, pepper sauce, cayenne and cream cheese mixture.

3. Combine cheddar cheese and cracker crumbs; sprinkle over top. Bake, uncovered, until bubbly, 25-30 minutes.

SKILLET HAM & RICE

Ingredients

- 1 teaspoon olive oil
- 1 medium onion, chopped 1 cup sliced fresh mushrooms
- 1 cup cubed fully cooked ham
- 1/8 teaspoon pépper
- 1/2 cup reduced-sodium chicken broth
- 1/4 cup water
- 3/4 cup uncooked instant rice
- 2 green onions, sliced 1/4 cup shredded Parmesan cheese

Directions

 In a large nonstick skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat; saute onion and mushrooms until tender. Stir in ham, pepper, broth and water; bring to a boil. Stir in rice. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, until rice is tender, about 5 minutes.

2. Fluff with a fork. Top with green onions and cheese.

SAUSAGE STROGANOFF

Ingredients

- 8 ounces uncooked wide egg noodles
- 1 pound bulk pork sausage 8 ounces sliced fresh
- mushrooms
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour





- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika
- 1-1/2 cups beef broth
- 1 cup sour cream
- Chopped fresh parsley

Directions

1. Cook noodles according to package directions. Set aside.

In a large skillet, cook sausage, mushrooms, onion and garlic over medium heat until sausage is no longer pink and vegetables are tender, 5-7 minutes. Stir in flour, salt and paprika until blended; gradually stir in broth. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly; cook and stir 1-2 minutes or until thickened. Turn off heat. Stir in sour cream. Serve with noodles and sprinkle with parsley.

PORK CHOP SUPPER

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 4 pork loin chops ½" thick
- 3 medium red potatoes, cut into small wedges
- 3 medium carrots, cut into ½" slices, or 2 cups fresh baby carrots
- 1 medium onion, cut into wedges
- 1 can (10-3/4 ounces) condensed cream of mushroom soup, undiluted
- 1/4 cup water
- Optional: cracked black pepper and chopped fresh parsley

Directions

 In a large cast-iron or other heavy skillet, heat butter over medium heat. Brown pork chops on both sides; remove from pan, reserving drippings.

2. In same pan, saute vegetables in drippings until lightly browned. Whisk together soup and water; stir into vegetables. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, just until vegetables are tender, 15-20 minutes.

3. Add chops; cook, covered, until a thermometer inserted in pork reads 145°. Remove from heat; let stand 5 minutes. If desired, sprinkle with pepper and parsley.



If you are recently moved to this area, you may feel clueless about how to maintain your yard or what to plant. The **Dale County Extension Office** is at 202 South Hwy 123 in Ozark, near the AGPlex. It is a great free resource for questions, advice, helpful guidance, and on-site visits as well as offering printed bulletins on almost any topic you can think of related to horticulture and farming. If they don't have the information you need, they know who does. They are open from 9 to 5 Monday through Friday and you can call them at (334) 774-2329. Extension Offices are also located in Dothan at (334) 794-4108, Coffee County at (334) 894-5596, and Pike County (334) 566-0985. Every County in Alabama has their own Extension Office, give them a call and go visit them. They are there to serve us all.

According to the Extension's SOW app now is the time to plant asparagus, beets, broccoli, carrots, cauliflower, celery, collards, kohlrabi, lettuce, mustard, onions, sweet peas, radishes, spinach, turnips and white potatoes. Our next Claybank

Master Gardener meeting will be held at 11 AM on Thursday March 19th at Hoppergrass Restaurant, 129 East Ave., across from Milky Moo's in Ozark. There will be a presentation on blueberries and blackberries




by one of our experienced and knowledgeable local growers. Come buy your lunch if you wish, and enjoy the company of some knowledgeable, downto-earth and friendly folks.







