Governor Wolf Confirms Budget for 2020-21, Calls for Increasing Minimum Wage without **Increasing Taxes**

dress on Tuesday, February 4th and outlined his address as he continues to call for a raise in the proposed \$36 Billion dollar spending proposal to the General Assembly. The Governor stated he is not calling for any increase in taxes.

He outlined his plan to broaden the base of the state's tax on corporate profits which would cover more companies in exchange for a 10 percent cut in the tax rate, to 8.99 for calendar year 2021. The corporate net income tax would then continue to be annually reduced until it reaches 5.00 percent in the year 2025. The Governor is asserting this will net the state a projected \$239.5 million in the 2020-21 fiscal year.

The Governor's call for an increase in mini-

Governor Wolf gave his 2020-21 Budget Ad- mum wage was front and center in his budget state's minimum wage from the current \$7.25 per hour to \$12 effective July 1, 2020. His justification is that if Pennsylvania's low-wage workers received this salary boost, it will provide the economy with a \$133.3 million in new sales and income tax dollars.

> Workforce development continues to be an important issue in Harrisburg as Governor Wolf announced he will seek another additional \$14 million for workforce development programs. This includes \$12 million for a competitive grant program designed to break down barriers to employment, such as a lack of access to childcare, transportation and job training.

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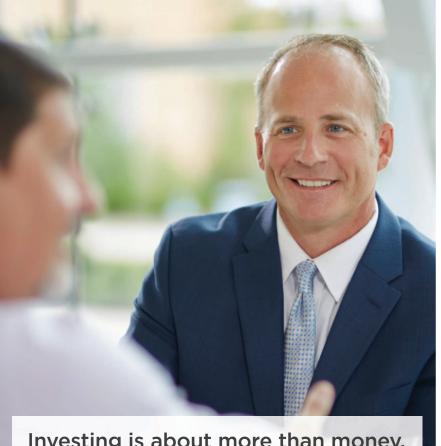
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EFFECTIVELY COMMUNICATING BENEFITS TO EMPLOYEES
