



Online registration for Lakeside Lab's summer camps will open at 10:00am on Monday, March 2.

From frogs to butterflies to geology and ecology, Lakeside offers a variety of hands on, nature-based summer camps for pre K through middle school youth. The schedule is available on the Lakeside website at www.iowalakesidelab.org. Financial assistance is also available on first come, first serve basis through a simple application form also available on the Lakeside website.

As a biological field station with 147 acres of prairie, lakeshore and woodland habitats, Lakeside provides an ideal setting for outdoor learning and exploration.

Pending age level, camps meet half to all day to overnight for three to four consecutive days. Topics range from frogs to fish, to habitats, animal behavior and even puppetry! In Habitat Happenings Camp: Portraits of the Prairie students will combine outdoor investigations with puppetry as they explore Iowa's prairie heritage. The camp will culminate with a free puppet show open to the public under the tutelage of renowned professional puppeteers from Eulenspiegel Theatre.

Other new 2020 offerings include Uno Dos Tres/One Two Three, a bilingual nature explore camp for pre K learners. The Bees and the Breeze, designed for middle school students, combines pollination ecology studies with adventure sailing, and is offered in collaboration with the Okoboji Sailing Center. No prior sailing experience is necessary. Over the years Frog Camp always fills first and has a waiting list. This year the camp will be split into two age levels. Tadpole Camp will be offered for students entering second and third grades, and Frog Camp will be open to students entering fourth through sixth grades.



Thank You Seniors

Those who know me well, know that I have a passion for coaching the game of basketball; those who know me really well know that I truly cherish each day that I get to work with youngsters and help teach life lessons through the game of basketball. Every year, the end of the season is always one of the hardest nights/ weeks of the year. Michelle can attest that it's more than a night for me, as I normally mope around for about a week because the season is over and we don't get to be around the kids every day like we do during the summer and then from November thru February. It's so hard to say goodbye to a group of seniors who you've grown to know and love, and realize that you will never get to coach them again. This season that moment hit even closer to home as we not only say good bye to a very special senior group on the girls team, but also to my son Tyler and his group of seniors who I've helped coach through the years, starting with Kindergarten ball at the YMCA, through OYBAball through the 8th grade, and then through AAU basketball with Boji Select through last summer. This group of nine seniors, five on the girls' side and four on the guys' side has taught me so much more than I could ever teach them, and I am eternally grateful for every moment that I got to share with them.

You would be hard pressed to find a group of seniors who gave more to not only their basketball programs, but also their school and community. This group was always there when you needed them, whether it was volunteering at youth open gyms, helping keep score at youth tournaments, or volunteering behind the scenes, they constantly put the WE before the ME and cared more about others than they did themselves. This group also was an absolutely amazing group of leaders. They showed our younger players in both programs what it's like to be a servant leader, what it means to give more than you take, what it means to play FOR each other, not just with each other, and how to lead vocally and by example.

This group also gave everything they had to the game of basketball and spent countless hours in the gym working on their craft when no one was watching. Both teams have several athletes who never missed a summer workout in the weight room, while also attending every basketball workout, and also being the hardest workers at these basketball workouts. Sports can teach us so many life lessons, and sadly the one life lesson that both groups had to deal with this year is that no matter how hard you work, sometimes that goal that you set, which for both groups was to make it to a State Tournament, just doesn't happen. Both of these teams got extremely close to this goal, with the girls losing a Regional Final game to #2 Clear Lake; while the boys lost a District Final to West Lyon after knocking off #8 Western Christian. I was at a loss for words for our girls after we lost to Clear Lake, as this group did everything that was asked of them; they worked hard in the off-season, they became closer off the court, and they played FOR each other all season. I don't know why State wasn't in God's plan for either team, and I'm perfectly aware that there are a lot worse things that can happen than losing a post-season basketball game; but that doesn't take the sting away when you invest everything you have for a goal and come up just short of that goal.

What I want each of these seniors to remember is that just because you didn't reach that final goal, you made an impact in your community and you brought people together to come out and cheer for you. The crowds at the games in Milford, Hull, Algona and Sibley were simply amazing and humbling. These seniors and their teammates helped bring a community together and brought out Pioneer Pride that we all need to hang on to. Each group had to fight their own battles through the season. The girls bounced back after our only loss, a heartbreaking one-point game to Boyden-Hull, to run off 10 straight wins and win their second straight Siouxland Conference title. Instead of pointing fingers after that loss, they became even tighter as a group and even more focused. The boys fought through an injury to senior Jake Halbur, who missed almost the entire season after tearing his ACL in football, but worked his tail off to join the team on Senior Night and was a key contributor to their success at the end of the season. They also had to stick together through six losses by six points or less, including three on the last possession of the game. It was great to see this group stay together and keep working when most teams would have pointed fingers and cashed it in. Instead of complaining and feeling sorry for themselves, this group, who had an 8-8 record after several heart-breaking losses in a row, sucked it up, stuck together, and ended their season with a 6-2 mark in their last eight games.

Success is measured in so many dif-

ferent ways in sports and in life. These seniors were very successful on the scoreboard, with the girls posting a 22-2 record, finishing ranked #7 in the State and winning another conference championship. The boys also tasted success with a 14-10 record, the most wins since 2009, two post-season wins for the first time since 2009, and the programs first win over powerhouse Western Christian. The biggest success that these groups have can't be measured however with wins and losses; but on the impacts they made in their programs and the youngsters in the Okoboji Community. We always talked to these kids about "leaving your jersey in a better place", which means give more than you take and make things better for the groups that will come after you; and they fully bought into that and accomplished it at a high level, every day. I had a good friend tell me after coaching Shaelyn for the last time; don't cry because it's over, smile because it happened. Seniors Magan Christopherson, Carissa Doran, Camry Jones, Faith Pearson and Kallyn Stumbo; Tyler Adams, Jake Halbur, Jamison Helmers and Kyle Martin THANK YOU so much for all the memories that you have given this old coach, and for the many smiles that you have provided through the year. It was an amazing journey and I have loved every minute of it!

Driver's License Station Hours

Kris Rowley, Dickinson County Treasurer says, "The Dickinson County Driver's License Station will be open until 4:30pm,

starting Monday, March 2, 2020." The new hours of operation will be Monday through Friday from 9:00am - 1:00pm; and 2:00 - 4:30pm. Drive tests must be scheduled in advance by calling 712-336-6277.

The following licensing situations must be started at the Driver's License Station before 4:00pm as they take longer to

- All knowledge/computer testing
- Updating to a REAL ID license
- Moved into Iowa from another state or country and need an Iowa driver's license for the first time
- New driver getting your Iowa permit/driver's license for the first time
- Getting your Iowa Identification card for the first time Rowley adds, "October 1, 2020, is the date that the federal REAL ID Act will go into effect. You'll need either a REAL ID license, a REAL ID Identification Card or another acceptable identity document such as a U.S. Passport in order to fly on a commercial airline. REAL ID's are marked with a star at the top of the card."

REAL ID's will also be needed to enter nuclear power facilities and federal facilities requiring identification to enter.



Cornfields and family at the PLAC

Two films with Iowa Ag as their focus will highlight the Iowa Films Night presentation at the Pearson Lakes Art Center in Okoboji on Thursday, March 5, in the Lauridsen Theater.

A documentary feature undertaken by some three dozen students at Buena of Jerry Johnson, assistant



"Growing Magic, The Mickey Mouse Cornfield Story" not only documented the story of the farm family whose Mickey Mouse profile was seen by thousands flying over the midwest for Mickey's 60th birthday but examines the event that brought together seven small-town Iowa communities during the difficult time of the 1980's farm crisis. Former Arnolds Park Pastor R.D. Streeter was a key figure in the organization of the small towns.

and vanilla. Combine the flour, oats and baking soda; gradually add to the creamed mixture and mix well. Spread into a 15x10x1" baking pan coated with cooking

spray. Bake at 350° for 18 to 22 minutes, or until lightly browned. Cool on a wire rack for 10 minutes; spread with the remaining peanut butter. Gool to room temperature, then refrigerate for 30 minutes.

Lakes Area Farmers Market News

Located at Dickinson Co. Fairgrounds 15th Street & Peoria Avenue, Spirit Lake, IA 51360

Iowa ranks 5th in the nation in number of Farmers Markets per capita and has Farmers Markets in 228 communities around the state. Some of the oldest markets date back to 1845. The Dubuque market still operates in the same location since then. In 1975 a U.S. House Resolution defined a farmers market as "any place where at least 10 farmers congregate to sell their agricultural commodities directly to consumers".

Around 1989 farmers near Spirit Lake grouped together to form Lakes Area Farmers Market. The farmers Market has always been located on the Dickinson County Fairgrounds, even though the fairgrounds moved. Eventually limited crafts were added to provide variety. Some of the original vendors are still selling at the market today. 



events like athletic contests, and music festivals — except during the winter months in Iowa! Even Iowa Lakes Community College had to list a couple bands as "no shows" for its recent jazz festival during a recent snowfall. With all the prep that goes into school events, it's sad to see something like that happen. And, too often there is no way to simply postpone an event -- especially with several schools, other events, and many miles involved.

Last week, during the Western Iowa Tech, Lewis & Clark Jazz Festival it wasn't bad weather that shut Okoboji High School's award-winning jazz band out of the competition. OHS band director Ryan Middleton told us the band was "unable to go to Lewis & Clark festival because we had too many kids out sick."

Other than that, "It has been a great year so far," Middleton continued. "The OHS jazz band earned first place at the Morningside Jazz Festival with 15, 2A bands; the Southeast Polk Jazz Festival in Pleasant Hill, with seven 2A bands and the NWIBA District Jazz Festival in Le Mars, with 17, 2A bands. The first place finish at the district festival qualified the band for the Iowa Jazz Championships for the 26th consecutive year.

"We have a number of outstanding soloists in the band, including Martha Stein, John Alexander, Samuel Heikens, William Alexander, Rikka Heimdal, and Carley Wells. Upcoming performances for the OHS jazz band include the USD Coyote Jazz Festival on March 17, our Evening of Jazz Concert — with the middle school jazz band — on March 19 at Okoboji High School, Iowa Jazz Championships on April 7, in Ames, and our end of the year show, May 8th at Parks Marina."

Much like the recent competition at the SAMI Center, the WITCC festival involved both middle and high schools in vocal and instrumental competition. MVAOCOU claimed the first place in Class 2A vocal competition. Sibley-

Ocheyedan was second, and Okoboji placed third.

Spirit Lake not only garnered the first place slot in Class 3A vocal competition, but Faith Norris earned the Outstanding Soloist award. And with the OHS jazz band out of the running in Class 2A, West Lyon Jazz 1 took first place, followed by Sioux Center, and Sibley-Ocheyedan...

Just for the record, Okoboji's Vocal Pops Concert is slated for Thursday

night, at 7:30, in the OHS auditorium. Boji Voices will be heading to the Iowa Vocal Jazz Championships in Des Moines as one of the top jazz choirs in Class 2A. The competition is slated for Tuesday, March 24th ...

Not only should spring bring more warmth, but more music in the weeks and months ahead. This week will see Terry Klein performing Wednesday night at the

VFW in Spirit Lake, from 6-8:00. The Itty-Bitty-Boji Band plays next Wednesday... And Dave and Ryan will be back on stage at the Little Swan Lake Winery, Sunday afternoon, from 4-6:00...

As the stock market took a dive last week, even our blonde research director RD began thinking about famous companies — like AT&T, Culligan, and Steinway. And RD got off to a ring-a-ding start with Alexander Graham Bell's birth on this day in 1847. The inventor, scientist and engineer, was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, and is credited with inventing and patenting the first practical telephone, as well as cofounding AT&T (in 1885). The song *BEechwood 4-5789* is what RD selected to celebrate Bell's birthday. The Marvelettes had a hit with the song written by Marvin Gaye, William Stevenson, and George Gordy, in 1962. The song showed up again 20 years later when Karen and Richard Carpenter released it on the A&M label...

Motown's Temptations hit number one on the charts with My Girl, on this day in 1965. The song was co-written by Smokey Robinson, and became the group's signature song. The song's highest honor was being selected in 2018 for preservation in the National Recording Registry of the Library of Congress...

March 5, 1983, is the day Emmett J. Culligan was born in not-too-distant

Yankton, South Dakota. Culligan invented the water softener and developed the water softening company that bears his name. RD went back several years to find just the right song, with Cool Water, written in 1936 by Bob Nolan. It's a song about a man, a mule Dan, and a mirage in the desert. There are at least 80 recordings by groups as diverse as *The Sons of the Pioneers*, in 1941, as well as Marty Robbins (1959), Walter 'Amos McCoy' Brennan (1964) and Fleetwood Mac, in 1982...

March 5th is also the day in 1853 that the Steinway piano company was founded by Heinrich Steinway in New York. For over a century and a half it has been the keyboard of preference for a multitude of talented artists, ranging from Sergei Rachmaninoff, to Irving Berlin, to Diana Krall, who in 1999, selected two Berlin compositions for her studio album, Let's Face the Music and Dance. Besides the title track, Krall played a Steinway to accompany another well-known Berlin tune — *The Best Thing For You (Would Be Me.)...*

Friday is Middle Name Day, which RD tied to John Leslie 'Wes' Montgomery, the jazz guitarist born on March 6, 1923, in Indianapolis, Indiana. Montgomery was known professionally as "Wes." The nickname was a child's abbreviation of his middle name, Leslie. Wes won a Grammy Award in 1966 for the best instrumental jazz performance by a soloist on his LP, Goin' Out Of My Head. The track listing includes other hits that were popular at the time, including Chim Chim Cher-ee, and It Was a Very Good Year. That was the first album he recorded that sold nearly one million copies...

It was March 7, 1946, that It Might As Well Be Spring won the Oscar for Best Original Song at the 18th Academy Awards. ... Spring was written by Rodgers and Hammerstein for their musical State Fair. Rosemary Clooney, Frank Sinatra, and Nikki Parrott are just a few of the vocalists who released their own versions of the song, which saw nearly 400 recordings!

Sunday is Peanut Cluster Day, for which she selected The Peanut Vendor, written by Moises Simons. Together with Guantanamara, it might be the most famous piece of music created by a Cuban musician. Recorded more than 100 times, ... Vendor has been offered up by a variety of artists including Stan Kenton, Anita O'Day, and Clark Terry and Chico O'Farrill on their 1966 collaborative album Spanish Rice...

RD wants to remind you that Daylight Saving Time begins at 2:00, Sunday morning. Please don't blame her for an item we found in an out-of-town newspaper last week, explaining that you should set your clock ahead one hour on Saturday night, before you go to bed, so you will not be late for all appointments between now and next fall, when you should set the clock back one hour, again — that is unless your forgot to set your clock back last year and you've been an hour early every place you've been for the last five months...


ILCC Student Awarded Scholarship

The student senate raised \$700 for a custom K-9 ballistic vest for Max III, the German

Shepard of the Estherville Police Department, and presented a check to Officer Reineke on February 11.

"The Student Senate put hard work and dedication into making this goal of ours a reality," explained Connor Wilson, the Student Senate member who led the bulletproof vest fundraising project. "Canines add an element of confidence to officers at the scene of a crime. Trained canines help police apprehend more suspects, find more lost children, locate more bombs, and discover more drugs. Thank you to the community of Estherville and the faculty, staff, and students of Iowa Lakes Community

College for supporting our cause and helping us meet this goal." For the Red-Out, the students not only raised \$650 in just one night to support the American Heart Association, but they also raised awareness about heart disease and stroke. Heart disease claims more lives than the next four causes of death combined, including cancer. On average, an American dies of heart disease every 35 seconds.

Currently, student senate members are in the process of making dog and cat toys from old t-shirts donated by staff, students, faculty, and more. They will be selling these toys at the regional basketball games hosted at Iowa Lakes. All proceeds and leftover toys will go to local animal shelters.

Other upcoming community projects include inviting local TAG students to present their projects, Soles for Souls shoe drive, and visiting Windsor Manor.


