John A. Rhode Sr. "Jack" February 29, 2020

John "Jack" A. Rhode Sr., of Titusville, FL and East Avon and Conesus Lake, NY, passed away on February 29, 2020, at the age of 91. Jack was born in Rush, NY, on November 28, 1928, to the late William George Rhode and Adeline Lillian Cooligan.

Jack served in the U.S. Army and was stationed in Germany during the Korean War. He later worked as a heavy equipment operator in the underground utility field as a member of the International Union of Operating Engineers in the Local 832 for 41 years. Jack also held his commercial pilot license and enjoyed owning and flying his own airplanes. Jack loved flying so much that he bought property and developed his own private landing strip behind his house in South Lima, NY. This landing strip is identified on a 1968 New York State map as the "Rhode Airport." It was not unusual to find Jack flying for pleasure, bird chasing, or flying the jump plane for parachutists. He even decided to fly his plane to work one day in Henrietta, NY, causing a ruckus in the surrounding neighborhood. That stunt earned him few paragraphs in the local newspaper!

Jack spent the last couple of years at Addington Place, an assisted living facility in Titusville, Florida. Many thanks go out to the employees who cooked him delicious meals, entertained him, and ensured his needs were met 24/7. Jack enjoyed visiting with the residents at Addington Place and was known as the "thumbs up" guy when they all greeted him with "Hi, Jack!" Explore and Learn about Contributions of Women to the History of Livingston County




