Governor Walz signs \$200 million COVID-19 package

Governor Tim Walz signed Ch. 70 S.F. 4334 into law on Tuesday, March 17, allocating \$200 million toward an emergency and long-term grant program to respond to the needs of health care and long-term care facilities during the COVID-19 (Coronavirus disease 2019, which originated in Wuhan, China) pandemic.

"Our health care facilities are Minnesota's first line of defense against COVID-19," Governor Walz said. "I am proud of this urgent, bipartisan action to support our state's health care infrastructure during this unprecedented public health event." "Protecting the health and safety of Minnesotans during the COVID-19 pandemic means investing in our state's health care infrastructure," said Lieutenant Governor Peggy Flanagan. "Our goal must be to slow the spread of COVID-19 and prevent our health care system from being overwhelmed, so that every patient gets the care that they need when they need it."

The bill appropriates \$50 million to the state's public health response contingency account and \$150 million to create a health care response fund which would be used to distribute grants. Any funds still in the account on February 1, 2021 will be returned

to the General Fund.

The Minnesota Department of Health announced Tuesday that the number of COVID-19 cases in Minnesota has risen to 60, including cases of community transmission with

no known travel link.

Governor Walz announced Monday the temporary closure of Minnesota restaurants and bars to dine-in customers as well as the closure of other places of public accommodation and amusement.

On Sunday, Governor Walz announced the temporary closure of Minnesota K-12 public schools to students in order for school administrators and teachers to make long-term plans for the continuity of education and essential services during the COVID-19 pandemic. This action includes provisions to provide care for the children of health care professionals, first responders, and emergency workers, and requires schools to continue providing meals to students in need. Last week, the Governor declared a peacetime emergency in Minnesota and endorsed community mitigation strategies to combat the spread of COVID-19.

This followed Friday's (March 13) announcement declaring a peacetime emergency to ensure the State of Minnesota is able respond to more rapidly to issues related to the COVID-19 pandemic as they arise.

Governor Walz is asking everyone to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Take the same precautions recommended for avoiding colds and flu:

• Stay home when you are sick

· Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water. Cover your cough.

If your employment has been affected by COVID-19, you can apply for unemployment benefits at www. uimn.org.

According to a Governor Walz press release, "staying home when sick is a fundamental 'stop the spread' tip. During an outbreak, we strongly encourage employees to not go to work when sick. Staying home when sick protects not only other


individual employees, but also the larger workforce of an organization and those you come into contact with at work. Think about backup plans for child care when school is closed or when parents, children, or a child care provider is sick. Think about necessary items to have at home, including prescription medicines (check your refill dates), and non-prescription medications, such as fever-reducing medications."

The Governor also signed:

Ch. 67 H.F. 2959, providing funding to the Rural Finance Authority, which offers low-interest loan programs to Minnesota farmers for a variety of farm improvement investments;

Ch. 68 H.F. 3633, replenishing the Disaster Assistance Contingency Account, which reimburses local communities across Minnesota following natural disasters;

Ch. 69 H.F. 3977, allowing the Minnesota Department of Transportation to apply for a federal Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act loan to complete the final expansion of Highway 14-the 12 miles of two-lane traffic between Nicollet and New Ulm.



The ancient Greeks had wish to live during interesting times. Well, I think they would be pleased as punch with the turbulence we are experiencing in every direction. 
