MONTGOMERY- The Alabama Department of Environmental Management wants the public to know that your drinking water is safe. So, there's no need to hoard cases of bottled water during the coronavirus crisis.

'With so many things Alabamians have to worry about – their jobs, social distancing, the welfare of loved ones, gathering food and other necessities - the safety of their drinking water shouldn't be one of them,' said Lance LeFleur, ADÉM's director. "The water they get from their tap, whether it's from a large municipal system or a small rural utility is 100% safe due to the proven safety requirements they are required to follow and that ADEM enforces. People don't need to fear the coronavirus as far as their water is concerned.

LeFleur points out that the disinfectants the water systems add as standard operating procedures kill viruses including COVID-19. Likewise, standard operations of municipal wastewater systems kill any viruses before the treated water is discharged into Alabama's rivers and streams.

State Athletic Director Dr. Kent Wyatt. The induction ceremony details are not set at this time. The Gulf South Conference is now in its 51st year.

Willingham becomes UNA's ninth inductee in the GSC Hall of Fame, giving the Lions more inductees than any current or former league member. The Florence native was a three-year starter on UNA baseball teams from 1998-2000 and earned All-American and Academic All-America® honors for the Lions, becoming one of the most recognized student-athletes in school history.

During his three seasons at UNA Willingham tied or broke 14 school records. He was a two-time All-Gulf South Conference, two-time Academic All-GSC, two-time ABCA All-South Central Region, and two-time ABCA All-American selection.

During his career he led UNA to a combined 119-40-1 record that included the 1999 Gulf South Conference Championship, the 1999 NCAA Division II South Central Regional Championship and a trip to the 1999 Division II College World Series. He was selected as UNA's Male Athlete of the Year for 1999-2000.

Willingham 11 years in the Major Leagues, playing in 1,147 major league games.

On July 27, 2009, Willingham became the 13th player in MLB history to hit two grand slams in the same game and the 7th to accomplish this feat in back to back innings.

Willingham received an American League Silver Slugger Award and was named as the Minnesota Most Valuable Twins Player in 2012. He played with the Kansas City Royals in the 2014 World Series.

He and his wife Ginger also started a charitable foundation, The Josh Willingham Foundation, with the primary purpose of providing support, education, clothing and other assistance to at-risk children. He continues to raise money for the UNA athletic program.



Disconnects Suspended

FLORENCE-In an effort to help customers who are currently impacted by the COVID-19, Florence Utilities will suspend disconnections for non-payment of utility services and not applying late payment fees to accounts through April 15. Florence Utilities will bill normally and process payments. Even though services will not be disconnected for nonpayment, customers are still responsible for their bill. Customers can contact the Collections Department at 256-760-6525 to get specific information on individual circumstances and can arrange for extensions and payment options.

File ASAP w/ **CARES Act**

MONTGOMERY - The Alabama Department of Labor is encouraging employees who believe they may qualify for programs under the CARES Act to file a claim. These employees will also need to certify weekly to continue to let us know that they remain unemployed.

ADOL does not yet have technical guidance or a start date regarding the CARES Act programs. However, benefits may be paid retroactively from the time the employee separated from his or

her job or otherwise became eligible under the federal CARES Act rather than from the time of submission or approval.







The under-preparedness

late response by the government to this pandemic should convince the administration to respond urgently to the overwhelming scientific evidence of climate change. Its consequences - heat waves, floods, and extreme storms, will be far more devasting and longer-lasting than pandemics.

The US is way behind in adopting practical ways to reduce carbon emissions, such as the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act (HR763). It would drive down America's carbon emissions by 90% by 2050. The reduction will save lives because of less pollution, generate millions of jobs, and provide monthly dividends for American families.

Rather than mitigating climate change by shifting from fossil

fuels, the Trump administration has consistently made the situation worse by quashing and weakening protect our regulatións^{*} that environment. Using the coronavirus as an excuse, the Environmental Protection Agency is stealthily suspending enforcement of bedrock clean air and water laws. This leaves the fossil fuel, chemical, and agribusiness industries to police themselves. Polluters can ignore environmental laws if they can claim the violations were linked to the pandemic.

It is not too late to address the impact of climate change. But we need leaders and concerned citizens to step up. The question is whether we will take responsibility for the planet our grandchildren inherit. Adoption of HR763 is a good start.



My wife and daughter were in a wreck. It was not their fault. My daughter is okay but my wife is going to have to have surgery and will miss even more work. I have health insurance so her medical bills are being paid. But without her income, we are beginning to get behind on our bills. To make matters worse, the guy who caused the wreck didn't have insurance.

Trying to save money, my wife and I had gone to an insurance website and spoke with a representative. When we asked what uninsured motorist coverage was, she told us that as long as we had health insurance we wouldn't need uninsured motorist coverage. My friend is an insurance agent and he explained to me that if I

had uninsured motorist coverage, it would pay for my wife being out of work and help with our bills. Is this correct? Is there anything I can do?

Taylor, Killen

Taylor, this is a growing problem that we are seeing more and more often. I don't know if it is because the number of people buying insurance online is growing or their insurance agents are not explaining the importance of uninsured or underinsured motorist coverage. As you may remember, several years ago the State of Alabama passed a law requiring all drivers to have liability insurance or be subject to a fine. However, there are still thousands of people driving on our roads with no insurance. I see it every day.

This is where the importance of having uninsured motorist insurance comes into play. When you purchase car insurance, you purchase liability coverage and, hopefully, uninsured or underinsured motorist coverage. Liability insurance pays for an injured person's damages if you cause an accident. Uninsured motorist coverage pays you or your family if you are injured in an accident.

Let's say that you are in a wreck. The wreck is not your fault. You are injured and undergo surgery. You miss work for 6 months. Now you find out that the person who caused the wreck has no insurance. Thankfully, however, when you purchased your automobile insurance coverage you also purchased \$100/300 in uninsured or underinsured motorist coverage. This means that you have up to \$100,000.00 dollars available to you to help pay medical expenses, lost wages, pain and suffering, stress and worry, etc. Furthermore, because the accident was not your fault, the insurance company who has your insurance cannot cancel your policy or raise your rates even though you make a claim.

Because you did not purchase uninsured motorist coverage, there is really nothing that can be done to help offset your losses. I will tell you this; Alabama law requires that if you waive your right to buy uninsured motorist insurance, it must be in writing. So, if you or your wife did not sign a document stating that you were not purchasing uninsured/underinsured motorist insurance then the coverage may be available to help



joy arrives so you are ready to go from day one. You will learn and practice how to correctly use the car seat, including how to adjust the harness for when you baby arrives. And then do it again once your baby arrives to ensure the child is properly fitted.

Going the DIY route. Here are some helpful tips to remember:

- All car seats (and all kids under 13) should be correctly buckled in the back seat.
- Once you install the seat you should not be able to move it more than one inch in either direction at the belt path. You can do this by using the seat belt or the LATCH system. Always using the top tether for forward-facing seats. Learn more about top tether car seats.
- The harness straps must be snug and the chest clip should be at armpit level. No heavy coats or blankets under the straps either and make sure the straps are not twisted.

So we had a Corona scare in our household. Our son, Garrett, who is an actor who lives in New York City came home on Friday, March 13. We were actually supposed to go to see him on that very day. But the day before, my husband's employer said to the employees that if they travel personally into a hot spot, they would have to receive permission to come back to work. So that morning we decided not to go. At lunchtime we talked with Garrett, he said, "I am symptom free, and the first moment that it looks like New York is going to shut down, am going to take that 15 minute taxi ride and get on the first plane to Ălabama!"

Well, that afternoon Broadway went black. Remarkable! And by evening Garrett's show,

"Bayano", in which he had the lead, (which was why we were going to NY) was cancelled. 9:00 Thursday night, March 12, mine and my husband's phones beeped simultaneously. We read, "Can anyone come and pick me and Bonita (his fiancée) up tomorrow night in Nashville?" I looked at my husband and mouthed, "They. Are. Coming." Due to delays, we had them by 1am, Saturday.

We had a wonderful weekend, which started with a Family Pandemic Protocol meeting following our breakfast at Big Bad Breakfast. *Use paper towels in our bathrooms rather than cloth *Everything gets one use - no reuses *Wear gloves when you go out *Wash your hands before you leave the house and when you re-enter *Keep wipes in your purse or car and wipe down surfaces, such

I had appointed myself the Pandemic Protocol Director, and I was getting my family prepared. Monday, March 16

came, and in the afternoon Garrett started feeling poorly. While I was at work, his fiancée took him to get tested. She texted me while they were at the hospital. "Okay," I thought. "Okay. We gon' to be okay." We quarantined him. He apologized. And his girlfriend, who I am still getting to know, and I sanitized my house from top to bottom light switches, bedding, bathrooms, everythang! (I know her better now she's definitely a keeper!) We worked together like a well-oiled machine. During this day of piddling and prayer, I simply came to thankfulness. I was thankful that Garrett was with us. If he had been alone and sick in New York City or if even if I had made it to him, he and I would not have had the comfort and familiarity of our home and hometown and the security that brings. Piddling and prayer. I told Garrett and Bonita that I was thankful that they were home. Thankful. No fear.

fever. Early morning Wednesday, it went away. Wednesday mid-morning, my husband had a low grade fever. More serious now. Quarantined him. Thankful prayer. We were living in this alone. I didn't want to be the first ones. Truly, I didn't want others to know of that possibility without test results. All quarantined.

Those three days of waiting were forever. EVENING, Thursday March 19: Test Result-**NEGATIVE** COVID19 detected." Garrett and I sang praises for 40 minutes on our patio, ending with "We Are Standing on Holy Ground". Now, three and a half weeks later, I believe if the result had been different, we would still be on holy ground. He is always with me and my family. His plan is always the right plan. It could still happen in the future, but not scared. Thankful.






