



I wish to thank our governor and the other officials who are working tirelessly to help protect New Yorkers from the Coronavirus. We should cooperate with our officials and our fellow New Yorkers to prevent the further spread of this deadly disease.

On the other hand, I wish to express my disgust with the pay raises which the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, members of the New York State Senate and the New York State Assembly have received in the past couple of years and will continue to receive in 2021.

The following information is from an article in the "Rochester "Democrat and Chronicle".

The New York State Compensation Committee suggested an increase in the governor's salary in 2019 from \$179,000 to \$200,000 with another increase to \$225,000 in 2020 and another to \$250,000 in 2021. The Lieutenant Governor will receive a pay increase from \$151,000 to \$220,000 in 2021.

This same state committee also suggested an increase in the salaries of members of the New York State Senate and New York State Assembly from \$79,500 to \$110,000 in 2020 and again another increase to \$130,000 in 2021 with similar increases for New York State Commissioners.

Our governor is now the highest paid governor in the United States

These pay raises amount to about 40% while the rest of New Yorkers struggle to maintain the same standard of living.

At this time in our country's history with the Coronavirus pandemic, many New Yorkers are struggling financially. Thousands have been laid off from their jobs and many companies have closed and even gone out of business.

Many retired citizens are living on fixed incomes with possibly a one or two percent increase in Social Security each year.

Many workers are paid the minimum wage which has only increased about eight times in the past sixty years while wages has increased about fifteen times in the same period of time.

Why New Yorkers wish to be first in America in progressive policies is beyond me. We should desire to be first in fiscal restraint.

Washington is not the only place which has a gigantic swamp. Albany also has a large one as well which needs to be drained and filled with the fresh water of newly elected officials.







Now is Not the Time to Let our Guard Down, Says Livingston County Administrator amid COVID-19 Pandemic

As we continue to closely track the rise and fall of numbers associated with COVID-19, County Administrator Ian M. Coyle would like to send a message to the residents of Livingston County. He states, "We must not let our guard down as this public health emergency continues to evolve."





Here are some ways in which residents and businesses can help slow the spread of COVID-19:




- · Call your doctor if you are feeling sick or showing symptoms
