Your social media timeline is likely filled with all sorts of images of kids playing with siblings at

home, undertaking e-learning, picking up practical skills they can use throughout their lives by helping out around the house, and in the yard. There's also the underbelly of this whole situation you rarely see until it's too late. Child abuse and neglect is likely on the rise in the face of this pandemic, as families are put under more financial and emotional stress. Children are no longer in the public eye-they are not at schools or daycare, or in other locations where caring individuals would be able to spot signs of abuse. One group of volunteers in Berrien County is working hard to ensure that abuse and neglect do not go unnoticed. It is a sad fact of life that nearly 700,000 children experience abuse or neglect each year. Instead of playing with neighbors and making happy family memories, they end up attending court hearings, adjusting to new foster homes and transitioning to new schools. That's a heavy burden for any child to carry. The good news is that with a court-appointed special advocate (CASA) volunteer dedicated to their case, the most vulnerable children in Michigan's Great Southwest have someone by their side, speaking up for their best interests. Now, the local organization, Berrien County's Court Appointed Special Advocate Program, is hopeful that you will consider becoming a volunteer advocating for local foster children. There are more than 300 children in the foster care system in Southwest Michigan. Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA's) are community members who volunteer with CASA of Southwest Michigan. They work with children in the child welfare system who have already experienced abuse or neglect. They meet with children in person at least monthly (often weekly), and provide information to judges that helps them make the most well-informed decisions about each child. These visits provide an opportunity for CASA/ GAL volunteers to check in on children's safety and wellbeing. But right now, meeting in person with the children they advocate for is impossible. That means it is harder for them to gauge what is going on in children's lives, and their needs. These volunteers are working with program staff



COVID-19 Impact Survey findings:

- 81% of respondents said they have laid off some, or all, of their employees;
- 75% of respondents said liquidity and cashflow will be the biggest challenge to restarting;
- 70% of respondents said they fear they will be unable to retain or re-attract customers after they can open;
- 54% of respondents said they will need access to funds to pay employees, vendors, and other expenses; and
- 50% of respondents said they have less than six months before they will be forced to close permanently.

These are stark results from members of our very own community and their responses are more than anecdotal. Experts agree: Southwest Michigan cannot afford to continue down a path of complete closure without risking long-term economic damage to our area.

With that in mind, our Chamber has advocated for a more measured approach that ceases implementing restrictions predicated on the "essential vs. non-essential" argument and instead begins implementing guidelines based on which work activities are "safe vs. unsafe." Businesses within our region are eager to prove they can operate safely while still implementing safe social distancing practices and we are confident they can resume earning a livelihood while simultaneously protecting the lives of their fellow Michiganders.

Thankfully, public discourse has also shifted in this direction and elected leaders

have begun laying out their plans for safely restarting Michigan's economy.

The Michigan Senate's proposal, referred to as Open Michigan Safely, relies on measurable data points to serve as indicators of decreased risk and is structured in five phases. Each one outlines conditions in the state and suggests safe business operations and levels of citizen activity based on those conditions. Under their plan, some businesses would open immediately, and others would phase in based on how fast the number of coronavirus cases decline.

Republicans in the House of Representatives offered their own plan, which would re-open certain sections of Michigan sooner than others based on risk. Under their regional approach, counties would fall within three tiers based on risk and certain restrictions would be lifted at each level. A newly created "transition task force" would then decide which counties are eligible for limited reopening based on data such as rate of spread, positive tests, hospital admission rates, reported deaths, immunity rates based on antibody tests and the ability of businesses to implement safe workplace practices.

Governor Whitmer has since expressed a similar desire to return low-risk sectors of our economy back to work by May 1. We hope she will hold true to this commitment and will work with legislative leaders, healthcare experts, and business organizations, like ours, towards the common goal of safely placing Michigan back on the pathway to prosperity.

No hay que alarmarse por el coronavirus en la Comunidad: CDC

Ante el pánico colectivo que se está creando en torno al virus COVID-19, los expertos explican que "aunque hay cierta preocupación,

pero los extremos e histeria colectiva no están justificadas".

Por eso, he querido transmitir dosis de tranquilidad y calma ante esta situación, indicando que se ha establecido el protocolo correspondiente e incluso que, tanto CDC como los científicos diariamente trabajan arduamente y tienen reuniones con representantes del Departamento de Salud. 

#### The Veterans Voice – VA Healthcare Part 1



One of the most frequently asked questions, and most frequently misunderstood benefits, is the VA Healthcare Benefits Program.

veterans who came to our office in years past were turned away because they were told they made too much money to enroll into the Veterans Health Administration (VHA). Veterans who were enrolled on or before January 16, 2003 and used the VHA for their healthcare annually were grandfathered into remaining within VHA healthcare and there was no means test to enroll. After that date, veterans wanting to enroll, unless they met other exceptions to the annual income limits (for 2020 it is \$40,975 for a single person or \$46,860 for a married couple) were denied enrollment into the VHA. Many of those same veterans reading this now should see if they are eligible because the VHA has undergone many changes in recent years. For example, anyone who served overseas in the Republic of Vietnam during the Vietnam War from January 9, 1962 through May 7, 1975 or served stateside at Camp Lejeune in North Carolina for 30 consecutive (not accumulative) days from August 1, 1953 through December 31, 1987 are eligible to enroll and stay in the VHA no matter how much individual or joint income they make within a year. If you have a service-connected disability of 10% or higher or are in receipt of a non-serviceconnected Pension you are eligible to enroll. Please visit www.va.gov/health-care/eligibility for a comprehensive list of other exceptions

the that might now make you eligible to enroll and how the VHA Priority Groups work. The VHA healthcare is non-traditional in the way it works. It is not traditional health insurance in the way you use a local doctor. You need to use VHA doctors at VHA facilities. Having said that, there is an exception for every exception within the VHA in particular as well as the Department of Veterans Affairs in general. Time and space do not permit an elaborate discussion on the topic, however, one fairly recent exception is the new Mission Act (see www.missionact.va.gov for more information). Basically, veterans in Berrien County use VHA healthcare facilities in Michigan, Indiana or Illinois. Usually, whichever state you pick you need to remain within that state's VHA system. In next week's article, we'll elaborate more on the services the VHA offers for veterans and the transportation systems to get veterans to their medical appointments. I use VHA healthcare, falling under one of the exceptions previously mentioned, and use the Edward Hines Jr. VA Hospital in Illinois. An excellent book for veterans to read is, "Best Care Anywhere: Why VA Health Care Would Work Better For Everyone" which is obtainable in many formats from Amazon.com.





to find creative ways to continue to meet with children such as video conferencing, sending mail, phone calls and even playing online video games together. Jamie Brooks, CASA of Southwest Michigan Executive Director, says, "Many don't realize that when a child is placed in foster care they enter a complicated and confusing time in their lives, a time filled with almost constant change. Our exceptional volunteers walk beside them, learn everything about them and make sure they are receiving the supports they need to thrive." Brooks says, "They provide this vital information, along with their recommendations, to the court so that court can make the most informed decisions for that child. We expect the number of foster children to rise due to the COVID-19 virus as homebound children in abusive situations are particularly vulnerable. We're there for them." So, recruiting is underway, and according to Brooks, "We need volunteers now more than ever, and are encouraging all community members to join with us either by volunteering or by helping us ensure children are safe during this time of national crisis. We will be offering virtual CASA training to begin very soon and volunteers will be able to begin advocating as soon as it is safe to do so." While some across the landscape are experimenting with baking a cake on an outdoor grill or taking a run at making artisanal bread in the oven during the current Stay Home Stay Safe orders, some elders among us aren't so lucky and sometimes wonder where their next meal will come from now that their usual resources are closed. In fact, the spread of the COVID-19 virus has created unique challenges for area seniors. Many of the vital local systems older adults have relied on for food and consistent nourishment have been put on temporary pause, leaving many seniors with limited options. Recently, the State of Michigan purchased 10,000 Quarantine Boxes, also known as "Q Boxes," for the Area Agency on Aging network of Michigan to help provide relief for seniors in need of shelf-stable food. Three hundred of those boxes have been designated for seniors in Berrien, Cass, and Van Buren Counties. Thanks to a coordinated effort between Region IV Area Agency on Aging and United Way of Southwest Michigan, the distri-

bution of the boxes is on target for the week of May 4, 2020. The boxes contain thirty-three well-balanced, high protein, food items and can provide 22 adult meals. Each box contains breakfast, lunch, and dinner recipe options for the contents in the box. They will be available for seniors (60+) in need of shelf-stable food in Berrien, Cass and Van Buren. Area Agency on Aging CEO Lynn Kellogg tells us, "These boxes of shelf stable food are not only a great gift for our community but will also alleviate some of the worry that many may feel at this time." She adds, "Partnering with United Way of Southwest Michigan for this effort was a logical choice given their proven commitment to the senior population, as well as their ability to tap into a vast network of volunteers and organizers." If you are a senior, or know a senior, who would be helped by a Q-Box, United Way of Southwest Michigan began accepting calls this week on Thursday, April 23rd to sign up for one. 
