"Sirs, What Must I Do to Be Saved?"

How would you answer the question, what must I do to be

A jailer in the city of Philippi asked Paul and Silas this question, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" (Acts 16:30) The question itself reveals that the jailer understood that something would be required of him to be saved. What did Paul and Silas tell him to do? "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved, you and your household." (Acts 16:31) If you stop with this verse you will find that this is what many people today are being told over and over again, "just believe in Jesus Christ... this is all you must do" But, the answer to the jailer's question is not found in this verse alone. The jailer and his family needed to learn about Jesus Christ to believe in Him, so verse 32 says "Then they (Paul & Silas sdc) spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house." (Romans 10:17) Now, what was the jailer's response to the word of the Lord? "And he took them the same hour of the night and washed their stripes. And immediately he and all his family were baptized." (Acts 16:33) Now what the failer and his family did to be saved is exactly what Jesus told His disciples to go into the world and preach "He who believes and is baptized will be saved, but he who does not believe will be condemned." (Mark 16:15-16) The jailer and his family believed in Jesus Christ and that same hour of the night they were baptized. On the day of Pentecost, (Acts 2) the Jews who were convicted that they had crucified the Messiah asked the apostles the same question "Men and brethren, what shall we do?" Here is what Peter said "...Repent and let ever one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." (Acts 2:37-38) Repentance is a change of will, a turning from sin. Clearly to be saved we must believe in Jesus, turn from sin and be baptized for the remission of our sins. (See also Romans 10:9-10 for the importance of our confession of Jesus.) Was this your answer to the question? If not, why not? We need to follow God's plan to be saved and not the plans of men. (See also these Biblical accounts of conversion: 8:12-13, 9:1-20, 10:1-48, 16:14-16, 18:8, 22:1-16.)







There is a presumption that child support should be modified if the difference between what you are paying now and the amount that you would pay under the guidelines is more than 10%.

A judge can modify the amount of child support even when there is not a 10% change and a judge can refuse to modify the child support even when there is more than a 10% change

The child support guidelines are virtually mandatory. If your ex-wife insists that you pay child support pursuant to the guidelines, her lawyer can present a material change in circumstances to the court to warrant a modification, and the guideline amount is substantially more than what you are currently paying, then it's pretty certain the guidelines will be applied to your case.

Remember that in every modification of child support, the healthcare needs of the child shall be addressed either through health insurance coverage, cash medical support, or other means. Normally, health insurance covering the children should be required if it is available to either parent through his or her employment or pursuant to any other group plan that would cover the child.

You can look at the child support guidelines online and get an approximate amount of what you would pay if the guidelines were applied to your case. Buckle up and drive safely.

I became associated with Coach West when he was at Coffee High School the same time I was broadcasting their games.

When I began to hear and learn about the tough road to success he had traveled during his career, I was tremendously impressed with his experiences. West started for four years in varsity football, baseball, basketball and track at Haleyville High School. Schools such as Alabama, Ole Miss, Southern Mississippi and Florida State became interested in the youngster as a junior in high school.

Then tragedy struck. Because of an accident, both arms and both legs were broken and he also sustained a back injury. His condition was so severe, doctors told him he probably would never walk again. Actually, the legacy of Merle West took its beginning during this time. After a six month stay in the hospital, sheer determination and dedication saw West return to school for his senior season.



• Don't overdo it with nitrogen. Fertilizing with too much nitrogen is a common mistake, as too much nitrogen can be harmful, decreasing root growth and increasing a lawn's susceptibility to disease. A slow-release fertilizer may be an option, as such fertilizers break down nutrients over a longer period of time, which also allows homeowners to extend the intervals between fertilizing sessions. But a lawn can get nitrogen from other sources as well. Such sources include grass clippings or raked leaves left on the lawn after being shredded by a mulching mower. Consider using granules instead of spray. Spraying a lawn with fertilizer might seem like the easiest and quickest way to fertilize, but spraying is typically best left to the professionals. That's because novices often struggle to evenly apply the fertilizer when spraying, and many do not account for the wind when spraying fertilizer. A traditional spreader that fertilizes a lawn with granules makes it easier nonprofessionals for to apply the fertilizer accurately and evenly. America. The other narrative is woven by small town boosters. They point to new demographic data showing 30-49 year olds returning to small towns. They talk with passion about new businesses and housing shortages. The challenge is that

neither narrative is wholly accurate. The truth is far more complex. The fatalists are caught in a crisis mind frame, and they are wrong. Rural America will not return to a vast buffalo commons anytime soon. Meanwhile, the boosters lead with great local successes while brushing over underlying trends.

To build a vibrant small town future in America, we must understand clearly what challenges we face and where emerging opportunities exist.

Many small towns are losing population, yet young families moving in often cannot find housing. Much small town infrastructure is in decline. However, contractors, plumbers and electricians have more work than they can handle often with new construction. Small town grocery stores are under pressure, but community-led efforts to retain grocery stores have seen dramatic success.

America's small town reality is complex. Some places thrive while others struggle. In every small town there is a mix of success and challenge. Understanding these dynamics is the only path to a vibrant future.

The government does not have the authority, by the First Amendment of the Constitution of the United States of America, to create a law that silences





me from proclaiming my religion or praying to my God in a public place or public property of which I pay my taxes to support. It is an illegal interpretation of the law by the Supreme Court to limit my right of religious expression, whether at work or school or public ball game or any other venue in which I may choose to do so; there is no Constitutional limit to my freedoms of religion or freedom of speech. So long as my speech or religious expressions do not insight public outrage or violence, or create a non-peaceful assembly of the people, it is still my right to express myself.

I would die for the right of the Christian, the atheist, the Muslim, or any other religious faith or non-faith based religion to freely express their belief in public. It is my responsibility to teach my children my belief and introduce them to my God as every other American has the right and responsibility to do. I do not have the right to suppress another citizen from their right of expression, and neither does our government.

George Washington said of the Constitution, "it's only keepers, the people." The government officials that try to limit or take away our freedoms are supposed to be kept in check by the people. When we allow our government to steal those rights away we lose our freedoms. Our Constitution says that Congress is the law maker, not the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court is supposed to define the law and weigh the law against the Constitution; not make new laws to govern the people. That power belongs to the Congress.

I encourage you to write or call your congressional representative and make a strong voice for our freedom of speech and religious expression. It is imperative that we maintain the freedoms for which we declared Independence from British rule in 1776.



and penalize them for some mythical level of unfairness that they have supposedly created and bear the responsibility to correct.

A person who truly loves this country would not routinely assume the position of lead antagonist on heavily divisive issues.

# Border collies rule at agility contest

 A border collie named Tex finished first at the second-annual Westminster Kennel Club agility trial, winning over a field of 330 dogs. A husky mix named Roo successfully defended his 2014 title as the highest-scoring mixed-breed dog in the competition. Scoring highest in their height categories were Pink, a papillon, 8-inch division; Keebler, a Pembroke Welsh corgi, 12-inch division; Smart, a border collie, 16-inch division; the aforementioned Tex in the 20-inch division; and Ffynch, a border collie, 24-inch division. The canine competitors comprised 74 breeds and varieties, plus 15 mixed breeds.

 New Jersey legislators and Gov. Chris Christie have enacted a "pet store disclosure" law that requires pet stores to provide breeder and inspection report information about puppies for sale. Described as the toughest in the country, the legislation also prohibits pet stores from selling puppies purchased from breeders found by the U.S. Department of Agriculture to have "severe violations" of care standards. The measure's sponsor, state Sen. Jim Holzapfel, says providing the information allows consumers to research breeders and make an informed decision before buying. Wrong visiting hours?
