Livingston County Operations Amid COVID-19 Crisis

On Friday, March 20, 2020, Livingston County officials announced additional building and operational restrictions aimed at curbing the spread of COVID-19, or the coronavirus, in the County. Livingston County encourages residents to practice social distancing and limit public engagement as much as possible.

The County workforce will still be taking calls, responding to requests, checking emails, processing mail and other work and generally going about their essential business tasks but with significantly reduced staff on-site and in buildings that are now closed to the public.

Livingston County's first responders, including Emergency Medical Services and the Sheriff's Office, are still out in full force with the ability to respond to emergencies.

Child Care Scholarships Available for Essential Workers in Livingston County during COVID-19 Crisis

The Child Care Council (CCC) recently announced that –while New York State is on PAUSE – income-eligible essential workers in Livingston County can apply for CARES Child Care Scholarships. Funding for these scholarships is provided through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act.

To qualify for a scholarship, families of eligible workers must have an adjusted gross income at or below 300 percent of the federal poverty level, or \$78,600 for a family of four. An eligible worker using a licensed or registered child care provider will receive a scholarship for the cost of care as long as funding is available.

To determine eligibility, parents should first email CCC at CARES@childcarecouncil.com to express interest in a CARES Child Care Scholarship. CCC staff will then reach out to applicants within one to two business days to gather information on essential worker status and identify an eligible child care provider. Once essential workers are deemed eligible through this process, then CCC will enroll them in the scholarship program and ensure that the child care providers are paid.



Governor Unveils Strategy for Reopening New York State Economy

Over the weekend, Governor Cuomo unveiled a broad strategy for the phased, region-based reopening the New York State economy in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Highlights of the plan include:

- · Upstate regions would likely reopen first, followed by downstate regions. Reopening would be dependent on COVID-19-related hospitalizations declining for 14 days per CDC guidelines as well as results of antibody testing and positive tests for the virus.
- · Phase One would start sometime after May 15, 2020. Construction and manufacturing businesses that operate with "low risk" of spreading COVID-19 would reopen, followed by a two-week assessment period.
- Phase Two would include the reopening of other businesses, depending on how essential the businesses are and how "risky" their operations are in terms of spreading COVID-19. School reopening would be assessed in this phase.

Governor Cuomo recently appointed Bob Duffy, the Greater Rochester Chamber of Commerce President and CEO, as special advisor to coordinate the reopening strategy for the Finger Lakes region.

Livingston County Administrator Ian M. Coyle stated, "We look forward to working closely with state officials, public health experts, and regional business leaders to assess the best path forward for reopening the Finger Lakes economy. The reopening will not be a one-size-fits-all, and I appreciate the recognition from the Governor's Office that certain areas and business sectors are more apt to open back up earlier than others."

"As we begin these discussions, it is important to remember that – as a community – we must remain vigilant and not let up in our fight against this virus. We must continue to adhere to social distancing and sanitation protocols in order to slow the spread of COVID-19," continued Coyle.

"We want to make sure that older adults who are staying home as recommended and have urgent needs for food or basic items – because they do not have the support or means to get these items – have a place to call to learn about resources to assist them. The OFA appreciates all of the community members who are reaching out to their older family members and neighbors to make sure they are okay and do not have to go out to public places," said OFA Director Sue Carlock.

The resource line is staffed Monday-Friday, 8AM to 4PM. Voice messages left outside of normal business hours will be returned. Callers are asked to be patient as there may be a high volume of calls.
