

Dear "Speak Out,"

As usual I plan to keep the content of this article in a positive manner in respect to the Mount Morris Shopper and to those who read my message.

Sunday, May 10th is "Mother's Day" in 2020. I would like to wish all mothers a wonderful Mother's Day on this your special day.

Anna Jarvis is most often credited with founding Mother's Day in the United States. Designated as the second Sunday in May by President Woodrow Wilson in 1914, aspects of this holiday have since spread overseas, sometimes mingling with local traditions.

I would encourage everyone who still has a mother to take time to honor her this year. If you are living in your mother's home, spend time with her. If you are on your own and are concerned about spreading the virus to your mother, that is understandable.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the budget hearing of the qualified voters of the Keshequa Central School District, Livingston, Allegany, and Wyoming Counties, New York has been adjourned by Executive Order of the Governor of the State of New York and will be available to view on our website June 2, 2020.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE, that the annual vote of the District has been adjourned by Executive Order of the Governor of the State of New York and will be held on Tuesday, June 9, 2020, **BY ABSENTEE BALLOTS ONLY,** which vote will be taken on the appropriation of the necessary funds to meet the estimated expenditures in the budget for the fiscal year 2020-2021. In addition, a vote shall be taken on the following:

- The election of one board member to the Board of Education. This is for the term currently held by Jill Burley. This seat will be a four-year term.
- Resolved that the Board of Education of the Dalton-Nunda Central School District is hereby authorized to undertake the acquisition of one 64-passenger school bus with luggage compartment at an estimated maximum cost of \$118,000, one 64-passenger school bus at an estimated maximum cost of \$115,000 and one 24-passenger wheelchair accessible school bus at an estimated maximum cost of \$72,000, all at an estimated maximum aggregate cost of \$305,000, less trade-in value, if any, and to appropriate and expend from the existing bus purchase reserve fund \$70,000 for such costs, and that the balance of such costs, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be raised by the levy of a tax to be collected in annual installments; and, in anticipation of such tax, debt obligations of the school district as may be necessary not to exceed \$235,000 shall be issued, or the school district may enter into an installment purchase contract if the Board of Education determines that it is in the best interest of the school district to finance the purchase in that method.
- Resolved, that the Board of Education of the Dalton-Nunda Central School District is hereby authorized to establish a student ex-officio school board member.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE: that all candidates for office of member of the Board of Education shall be nominated by petition. Each petition shall be directed to the Clerk of the District and shall state their name and residence of the candidate. Take Steps to Prevent Recreational Water Illnesses

Memorial Day is around the corner and many of us are looking forward to the beginning of the summer swimming season. Swimming is a fun physical activity with many health benefits.

However, swimmers should be reminded that when sharing the water, they also share the germs in it with every person who enters the water.

Recreational water illnesses (RWIs) are illnesses spread by swallowing, breathing in the vapors from, or having contact with contaminated water in swimming pools, hot tubs, water parks, spas, interactive fountains, ponds, lakes, rivers, or oceans. Outbreaks of recreational water illnesses continue to occur in the United States each year. Germs on and in swimmers' bodies end up in the water and can make other people sick. Although healthy swimmers can get sick from RWIs, the young, elderly, pregnant women and those with weakened immune systems are especially at risk. The following are specific actions you can take to protect yourself and others:

- 1. Do not swim when you have diarrhea.
- 2. Do not swallow pool water or get pool water in your mouth.
- 3. Shower before swimming (children especially).
- 4. Wash your hands after using the toilet or changing diapers.
- 5. Take children on bathroom breaks or change diapers often.
- 6. Change children's diapers in a bathroom, not at poolside.



Rabies Positive Raccoon in the Town of Geneseo, Livingston County



According to Livingston County Public Health Director, Jennifer Rodriguez, the New York State Health Department laboratory has confirmed that a raccoon in the Town of Geneseo tested positive for rabies on May 5, 2020. Rabies is a deadly virus that attacks the central nervous system in mammals. It is most often found in raccoons, skunks, and bats in Livingston County. All mammals, including unvaccinated dogs, cats, and farm animals are at risk for getting rabies. There is no way to tell if an animal is rabid just by looking at it. Wild or feral animals should always be avoided.

Signs of rabies in wildlife can include:

- inability to walk
 appearance of "drunkenness"
- unwillingness to drink water or eatdrooling
- aggressive behavior
 any significant change in temperament

All potential rabies exposures should be reported to the Livingston County Department of Health.

Below are important steps you can follow to prevent rabies.

- Stay away from unfamiliar animals, either wild or domestic, even if they appear friendly.
- Thoroughly wash any wound from an animal with soap and water and seek immediate medical attention.
- Avoid wild and feral animals, especially if the animal is showing any sign of rabies.
- Be a responsible pet owner by keeping your pet's vaccinations current. Getting your pet vaccinated can help stop the spread of rabies from wild animals to humans.

New York State Law requires that all dogs, cats and ferrets have current rabies vaccinations beginning at 4 months of age. An unvaccinated pet that comes into contact with a rabid animal must be kept in strict confinement for six months or be euthanized. Free rabies clinics are offered for dogs, cats, and ferrets every year in Livingston County. Please contact the Livingston County Department of Health for clinic dates. Pre-registration is available on the Environmental Health website listed below.

It is important to be aware of the facts and use caution to protect both your family and your pets.
