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

2. Fans will be able to renew their 2020 North Alabama football season tickets by putting down just \$20. The option for weekly payments will be available, or the remaining balance will be split between two equal payments on July 15 and Aúgust 15.

3. UNA has extended the renewal deadline for North Alabama football season tickets to July 1, instead of June 15.

Food/Shelter **Funds for Non** -Profits

FLORENCE-Local non-profit organizations can apply for emergency

food and shelter funds from a total of \$28,212 for Phase 37 and \$40,222 for the CARES Act funding being made available for Lauderdale County and a total of \$18,076 for Phase 37 and \$25,772 for the CARES Act funding being made available for Colbert County in 2020 from funds provided by Congress for food and shelter programs in high-need areas.

The program is administered nationally by a half dozen organizations involved in helping meet such needs. A local board administers the Colbert-Lauderdale program.

To be considered, local applicants must be non-profit; have an accounting system and annual audit; practice nondiscrimination; have demonstrated capability to deliver emergency food and/or shelter programs, and have a volunteer Board of Directors.

"Medicare Minute - Scams!!"

As we mentioned in this article a few weeks ago, scammers and con artists thrive when unrest happens in our country. The following tips are taken directly from Medicare.gov and, hopefully, will help you avoid being scammed:

Unfortunately, scammers are using the COVID-19 pandemic to try to steal you Medicare Number, personal information, and money. And they are using robocalls, social media posts, and emails to do it. Remember, if anyone reaches out to get you Medicare Number or personal information in exchange for something, you can bet it is a scam. Be on the lookout, so you can stop scams before they happen.

Here are recent Coronavirus scams to watch for:

- Robocalls offering you respiratory masks they will never send
- Social media posts fraudulently seeking donations for nonexistent charities, or claiming to give you stimulus funds if you enter your bank account number
- Fake testing kits, cures, "immunity" pills, and offers for protective equipment

Con artists may try to get your Medicare Number or personal information so they can steal your identity and commit Medicare fraud. Medicare fraud results in higher health care costs and taxes for

Protect yourself from Medicare fraud. Guard you Medicare card like it is a credit card. Remember:

- Medicare will never contact you for your Medicare Number or other personal information unless you have given them permission in advance.
- Medicare will never call you to sell you anything.
- You may get calls from people promising you things if you give them a Medicare Number. Do not do it.
- Medicare will never visit you at home.
- Medicare cannot enroll you over the phone unless you call first.
- Protect you Medicare Number and your Social Security Number. • Use a calendar to record all your doctor's appointments and any test you get.

Don't

- Give your Medicare card, Medicare Number, Social Security card, or Social Security Number to anyone except your doctor or people you know should have it.
- Accept offers of money or gifts for free medical care.
- Allow anyone, except your doctor or other Medicare providers, to review your medical records or recommend services.'

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

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South Korean Model

Editor;

We can learn from South Korea. Their excellent education system prompted Alabama officials to travel last fall on a teacher recruiting mission.

South Korea this year tackled COVID-19 through one of the largest and best-organized epidemic control programs in the world. The key was free rapid availability of testing under its health care system and high-tech tracking that kept deaths to a few hundred.

Last month voters re-elected President Moon's party in a landslide. He is now tackling another deadly global crisis – climate change. The world's seventh-largest source of planet-heating carbon dioxide is on course to become the first East Asian

country to produce nearly 20% of its energy needs from renewables by 2030 - and reach net-zero emissions by 2050.

South Korea is the biggest emitter yet to endorse the kind of industrial planning and social safety net expansion rarely seen outside of wartime. The new climate measures in South Korea might help reverse the increasing use of coal in Asia that threatens to propel global warming

The plan is to end public financing of domestic and overseas coal projects, retrain workers for green jobs, make large-scale investments in wind and solar energy, undertake research, and consider a carbon tax (perhaps modeling the fee and dividend legislation being considered by our Congress).

"The Senators and before Representative mentioned, and Members of the several State Legislatures, and all executive and judicial Officers, both of the United States and of the several States, shall be bound by Oath ... to support this Constitution" (Article 6, Clause 3). All elected leaders and all military personnel swear an oath to preserve the Constitution from all enemies foreign and domestic.



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

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
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4TH AMENDMENT

The 4th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America was designed by our founding fathers to protect the people from their government. Our 4th Amendment specifically provides "the right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable search and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized."

The United State Supreme Court recently decided a case directly on

the 4th Amendment. The facts were that a police officer in Kansas ran a license plate and saw that the owner of the vehicle had a suspended license. The officer pulled the vehicle over, searched the vehicle and found contraband. The driver argued that anyone could have been driving that truck, not necessarily the registered owner.

The Kansas Supreme Court agreed and ruled that the deputy did not have a reasonable suspicion because his reason for stopping the vehicle driver amounted to "only a hunch". The United States Supreme Court reversed the Kansas Supreme Court and ruled that an officer may initiate a "brief traffic stop when he has 'a particularized and objective basis for suspecting the particular person stopped of criminal activity."

The Court ruled that all officers, anywhere in this country, before stopping a vehicle must be able to state a particular objective reason. To search a person or their vehicle, the officer must either obtain consent or a warrant based on specific probable cause.

A well trained officer can always find a reason to pull someone over. The courts will look to see if that reason is just a "hunch" or if that reason was objective. The courts look for evidence that there was probable cause for the traffic stop versus a police officer just "having a feeling".

Always remember that our country was founded during an age of rebellion and innocence when it was thought possible to create a government strong enough to protect us from foreign enemies but not strong enough to threaten our individual liberties. This case walks the line.
