

He was in a coma for four days before finally opening his eyes, however he never completely regained his functioning capacity. He was full-time care with Margo at his side for the next 15 years, but he never lost his beautiful smile, with eves full of life and a soul full of scripture and prayers. Rodney was a very faithful man. He was a hard worker from sunup until sundown and was a positive thinker, always encouraging others. Quite often, if he saw a polite young family in a restaurant, he never hesitated to go over and tell them what a nice family they were. He loved people, was very social and was an honest, humble soul. He was always the last in line and never wanted anyone to feel less than he. Rodney participated and volunteered throughout his lifetime as Boy Scout troop leader, Chamber of Commerce ambassador, Faith leader, Kiwanis, Up-With-People, volunteer fireman, Kinship, Sunday School teacher and lifetime choir member, just to name a few.

He was a very loving and devoted family man. His life centered around his faith and his family; his children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, cousins and siblings.





ILCC Offers Summer 2020 Virtual Courses

Iowa Lakes Community College offers online Virtual Courses for the Summer 2020 term. With the Summer 2020 Virtual

Courses being entirely on-**IOWA LAKES** line, students have increased convenience and flexibility

without the location or time limitations of a traditional class-

Iowa Lakes instructors will be using Zoom for the live virtual sessions on scheduled days and times. Recordings of live sessions will be available so students can view the class sessions at a later time if they are not able to attend the live meeting.

"Iowa Lakes Community College is excited for the opportunity to provide students with Summer 2020 Virtual Courses. These classes are entirely online but provide students the opportunity to either attend live virtual class sessions or watch recordings of them," explained Scott Stokes, Executive Dean on the Iowa Lakes Estherville Campus. "The decision to offer courses in this format was based on student feedback, indicating strong benefits from having a live class session available. The ultimate goal is to provide students a high-quality education in a format that allows success."

The full 8-week summer session and the first 4-week summer session start on May 18. The second 4-week summer session begins on June 23.

Classes available virtually for Summer 2020 include science, business, math, music, language, speech, and psychology courses. Specific courses offered online for the Summer 2020 term are listed at www.iowalakes.edu/summer2020.

Some courses, like Aviation, still plan to meet with face to face lectures and lab courses carefully following safety measures. A backup plan is in place if, for any reason, in-person classes cannot occur safely.





Spencer Hospital Resumes Limited Elective Surgeries

Spencer Hospital Surgery Center will resume same day surgical procedures on a limited basis Monday, May 11.

"The hospital and its medical staff have developed a plan which takes measured steps to reopen elective procedures," explained hospital president Bill Bumgarner. "We're anxious to meet the health needs of our patients, yet with a first priority to focus on patient and healthcare provider safety during the COVID-19 public health emergency."

Safety protocols will include, but are not limited to, the

· All patients considered for elective surgery will be carefully prescreened. In addition to a traditional physical and health history assessment, each patient will be screened for COVID-19

· Upon entering Spencer Hospital or any of the clinics for a scheduled procedure, patients will be asked to wear cloth masks and will be screened again for COVID-19 symptoms.

· All care team members will wear surgical masks and protective eye wear or face shields, as well as other necessary personal protective equipment (PPE) as needed when caring for a patient.

· Current temporary visitor restrictions remain in place. For surgery procedures, one parent or guardian may accompany a patient under the age of 18. Patients 18 and older will be asked to have someone transport them to the hospital and be prepared to transport the patient home afterwards, yet not accompany them into the facility. All surgical patients are encouraged to have a contact person whom the care team can keep informed regarding the patient's procedure and contact when the patient is ready to be released and transported home.

In addition to the patient safety measures, Spencer Hospital remains prepared to cease elective procedures if a surge of COVID-19 cases develops in the area, supply chain limitations impact critical supply inventory or hospital employees must be reassigned to higher priority care assignments.

"The Spencer medical community looks forward to increased service access in a responsible way," Bumgarner said. "Since the outset of the pandemic, the hospital has continued to provide essential healthcare services. As some elective procedures are resumed, an emphasis will continue to keep precautions in place to protect patients. This includes continuing to limit the number of people who enter our healthcare facilities and using additional

protective measures as recommended by disease control experts." He added: "Until an effective vaccine is developed, the community can support all healthcare workers by being mindful of social distancing and other preventative measures. By joining to together to limit the spread of the coronavirus, Spencer Hospital will be able to most effectively ensure optimal care to patients who may require care due to the virus.'

Top 5 Advantages of Virtual Doctor Visits The spread of COVID-19 has caused exposed to sick patients that may spread e

healthcare providers to care for patients in different ways. Family medicine providers at Lakes Regional Healthcare (LRH) have cared for patients in their cars, assessed them over the phone, and held video appointments through a secure program called Doxy. Providers have found the virtual video visits have many advantages for patients, including:

1. Limited Spread of Infection

People visit the doctor for many reasons. Although there are many appointments for check-ups and what's known as "well visits," most people visit the doctor because they have an illness or injury. LRH strives to limit potential exposure during the COVID pandemic by keeping patients outside the building until they can be brought directly into an exam room. When there isn't a pandemic, there may be unavoidable times when patients come into contact with others. LRH family medicine physician Andrew Mueting, DO said, "When people sit in the waiting room, sick patients expose others to viruses and bacteria and may inadvertently get them sick. During a virtual visit, you can meet with the provider without being

exposed to sick patients that may spread their infection to you."

2. Greater Access

Virtual visits allow you to see your provider regardless of your location. Whether you're at home, at work, or even out of town, as long as you have an internet connection and smartphone, computer, or tablet, you can virtually visit your provider and receive the care you need.

3. More Efficient Use of Time

Driving to and from a doctor's appointment and sitting in the waiting room and then even waiting in the exam room is no fun. It's easy for a 30-minute in-person appointment to take at least 60 minutes of your time. Virtual visits don't require you to travel or wait, resulting in the vast majority of your time being spent with your provider, while taking up less of your personal time overall. In fact, studies have found that 95% of time in a virtual visit is spent directly with the provider. This compares to less than 20% of the time spent directly with the provider for an in-person visit.

4. Scheduling Flexibility

It's common for people to require time off from work to see their healthcare provider. With virtual visits, the amount of time you spend in total for the appointment is less and may be accomplished over a break and not require time off work.

5. Improved Satisfaction

A recent study by Massachusetts General Hospital found that 62% of virtual visit patients said the quality was just as good as in-person visits, and 21% said it was even better. Dr. Mueting said, "Research has shown that virtual visit patients are often more relaxed and transparent in what they tell providers. This may be because they aren't stressed from traveling and waiting, but whatever the cause, it helps us as providers to know everything that's going on with the patient and to know what the best care would be for them."

FSA Reminds Producers of Ongoing Disaster Assistance Program Signup Payments Have Started for Producers Impacted by Drought, Excess Moisture

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has started making payments through the Wildfire and Hurricane Indemnity Program – Plus (WHIP+) to agricultural producers who suffered eligible losses because of drought or excess moisture in 2018 and 2019. Signup for these causes of loss opened March 23, and producers who suffered losses from drought (in counties designated D3 or above), excess moisture, hurricanes, floods, tornadoes, typhoons, volcanic activity, snowstorms or wildfires can still apply for assistance through WHIP+.

"To date, FSA has received more than 33,000 WHIP+ applications," said Richard Fordyce, Administrator of USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA). "We want to remind producers that we are still accepting applications for WHIP+, and we encourage producers to call our offices for next steps on how to apply."

To be eligible for WHIP+, producers must have suffered losses of certain crops, trees, bushes or vines in counties with a Presidential Emergency Disaster Declaration or a Secretarial Disaster Designation (primary counties only) for qualifying natural disaster events that occurred in calendar years 2018 or 2019. Also, losses located in a county not designated by the Secretary as a primary county may be eligible if a producer provides documentation showing that the loss was due to a qualifying natural disaster event.

For losses due to drought, a producer is eligible if any area of the county in which the loss occurred was rated D3, or extreme drought, or higher on the U.S. Drought Monitor during calendar years 2018 or 2019. Producers who suffered losses should contact their FSA county office.

In addition to the recently added eligible losses of drought and excess moisture, FSA will implement a WHIP+ provision for crop quality loss that resulted in price deductions or penalties when marketing crops damaged by eligible disaster events. To ensure an effective program for all impacted farmers, the Agency is currently gathering information on the extent of quality loss from producers and stakeholder organizations.


USDA Service Centers, including FSA county offices, are open for business by phone only, and field work will continue with appropriate social distancing. While program delivery staff will continue to come into the office, they will be working with producers by phone and using online tools whenever possible. All Service Center visitors wishing to conduct business with the FSA, Natural Resources Conservation Service or any other Service Center agency are required to call their Service Center to schedule phone appointment. 





Later, Guthrie requested the park be named in memory of his daughter, Florence Fuller Guthrie, who died in 1913. The earliest newspaper mention of use of the park was in 1927 when a family had a gathering there.

An open pole structure was built in 1968 and became a shelter house. It was here that thousands of persons ate their picnic lunch through the years. In 2009 the building was enclosed. While the structure has served the community well, community members believe it is time to update the facility.

"It's been used for years for family reunions, a bike or tractor ride, a town celebration or a birthday party. Convenience and food safety are now on our minds as we embark on this project," said Florence Park Committee Member Susan Reiser.

After the quasquicentennial in 2017, the Milford Commercial Club discussed possible uses for the proceeds. The idea for an expanded and updated Florence Park Shelter House was born. The club tucked away the proceeds totalling just over \$46,000 to be used, someday, for the shelter house renovation.

The idea sat dormant for two years before community members revisited the idea of expanding the Florence Park Shelter House to a year-round facility late last summer.

Five people were named to the Florence Park Shelter House Committee including Milford Mayor Steve Anderson, City Clerk LeAnn Reinsbach, Jason Simpson of the Park Board, Chris Hinshaw of the Milford City Council and Susan Reiser representing the Milford Commercial Club. After several meetings, the group came to terms of the project.

The project calls for a 30 by 35 foot addition onto the south end of the existing Florence Park Shelter House. This will include a kitchenette with a safety three-divided sink, heating and cooling and restrooms, for convenience, so persons using the facility will not have to walk to the north end of the property to use the restrooms. Cost of the project is estimated at \$110,000.

Fundraising was done in January and February. Grant applications were sent. Personal calls on local businesses were completed. To date, \$116,913 of the \$110,000 estimated cost has been raised for this project.

Funding will be derived from the Milford Commercial Club totalling \$46,463.85, the City of Milford has earmarked \$25,000. the Milford Parks Board is adding \$15,000,\$10,000 from a Youth in Philanthropy grant, \$5,000 from each of Milford's banks including the Farmer's Savings Bank, Northwest Bank and United Community Bank, \$2,000 from Waste Management, \$1,500 from a Black Hills Energy grant, \$750 from Sam Wedeking in memory of Roy Wintz, \$500 from the Campus Women's Club and \$500 from the Milford American Legion.

Patterson Construction, of Milford, was hired to complete the renovation. Wedeking Construction, of Spirit Lake, will handle the grading and sewer work. Electrical work will be by Pederson Electric, of Milford. Matt Loerts, a Milford Park Department employee, will act as supervisor for the project.

"The Milford Commercial Club started fundraising for the shelter house in 2017. Finally after three years and all the generous donations/grants, the future dreams of the Florence Park Shelter addition have come to fruition. As part of the addition, both heating and cooling will be installed which will be great for those renting the shelter house in the near future," said Milford City Administrator LeAnn Reinsbach.

'The improved shelter will continue to make Florence Park a focal point for the City of Milford. The expansion of the shelter at Florence Park will allow the community to expand uses of the property donated many years ago. The improvements will also provide a better facility for private rentals all in one facility. This is another project to show our community can do anything it sets out to get accomplished," said Mayor Steve Anderson.

Committee member Jason Simpson believes the addition will be an asset to the city.

"Florence Park has become Milford's family friendly park. The Park Board has put a lot of focus in updating the playground equipment, adding a nice restroom facility and barbecue grills. It also has a memorial for veterans and is a great space for reunions, graduations and Milford's summer celebration. With the addition of the kitchenette and indoor bathrooms, it becomes a year-round facility which will be a huge asset to the City of Milford," Simpson explained.

In any construction project there are always unforeseen costs. Funds will be needed for additional picnic tables, kitchen items, etc. Residents who would like to contribute to the project may do so by sending their checks to the City of Milford with Florence Park Renovation in the memo.

Terms of the contract call for completion by Sat., July 18. Dedication of the new addition was scheduled for Pioneer Days Weekend. However, with that event now cancelled, some other type of dedication event will be held. Watch for details.

Meals On Wheels Experiences an Increase In Meal Requests as a Growing Number of Area Seniors Face the Impact of Covid-19

Stay-at-home orders designed to keep high-risk residents safe amid the pandemic have created a rapid increase in the number of seniors who rely on home-delivered meals as their primary source of food. This, coupled with supply chain and work force disruptions, makes delivering large quantities of meals to a growing number of seniors more expensive and challenging for Meals on Wheels programs than ever before.

Meals on Wheels America is the leadership organization supporting the more than 5,000 community-based programs across the country that are dedicated to addressing senior isolation and hunger. This network serves virtually every community in America and, along with more than two million staff and volunteers, delivers the nutritious meals, friendly visits, and safety checks that enable America's seniors to live nourished lives with independence and dignity. By providing funding, leadership, education, research, and advocacy support, Meals on Wheels America empowers its local member programs to strengthen their communities, one senior at a time.

A new survey conducted by Meals on Wheels America finds that nearly all local Meals on Wheels programs are experiencing increased demand since concerns over COVID-19 and social distancing measures began taking hold. The survey was conducted between April 22-28, 2020 amongst Meals on Wheels America's Membership, which is representative of the national senior nutrition provider network of 5,000+ individual community-based programs. The survey has a +/- 4% margin of error.

Nationally, programs reported substantive shifts in their operations in April, compared to the week prior to March 1:

- 89 percent of programs have seen an increase in meal requests; of those, 79 percent report the number of new requests for meals has at least doubled
- 17 percent of West Coast programs are seeing 900 percent more new requests for meals
- Programs are serving 56 percent more meals and 22 percent more seniors per week 29 percent of rural programs have increased the number of seniors served by 50 percent
- Waiting lists for meals, which existed before the COVID-19 crisis, have grown by 26
- percent Aside from funding, 63 percent of programs report that acquiring safety supplies (gloves, masks, etc.) is the biggest challenge

"There is no debate that older Americans have borne the brunt of this pandemic, and if we only examine infection, hospitalization and death rates, we vastly underestimate the true impact," said Ellie Hollander, President and CEO, Meals on Wheels America. "This survey data offers critical insights into the level of support necessary now and beyond the pandemic, to ensure we meet the needs of our most vulnerable populations.'

As the spread of the virus continues and discussions over how and when to end stay-at-home orders ensue, Meals on Wheels America expects demand to grow even more.

"Sheltering at home is keeping seniors safe, but we must also strengthen and protect the support systems that enable them to do that, such as nutrition services and programs that reduce isolation," said Hollander. "We can't do one without the other."

Angela Kofoot, Executive Director of the local Meals on Wheels program, thanks the large team of people making wellness calls to our local homebound seniors and the large number of new drivers that they have recruited (their usual drivers typically fall into the vulnerable category) and their willingness to react to changes to our processes as new requirements were continuously given to us. She also went on to predict that their usual deliveries of 6,000 meals per year will be significantly increased in 2020. January through April meals served were already up 50% over 2019. 

USDA Offers Farm Loans for Farmers Facing COVID-19 Related Challenges

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) reminds producers that FSA offers farm ownership and farm operating loans to agricultural producers who may not find success obtaining loans from their traditional financial institutions because of COVID-19. Farmers who cannot obtain commercial credit from a bank can apply for FSA direct or

"Farming and ranching is a capital-intensive business and FSA is committed to helping producers maintain their agricultural operations during this time of crisis," said Amanda De Jong, FSA State Executive Director in Iowa. "FSA loans are designed to assist beginning and historically underserved farmers and ranchers, as well as those who have suffered financial setbacks from natural disasters or economic downturns. Producers may find that an FSA loan is the best option for them if they cannot qualify for a loan with their traditional financial institutions or other financial institutions because of COVID-19."

USDA offers a variety of loans to meet different production needs. Direct loans are made to applicants by FSA. Guaranteed loans are made by lending institutions who arrange for FSA to guarantee the loan. FSA can guarantee up to 95 percent of the loss of principal and interest on a loan. The FSA guarantee allows lenders to make agricultural credit available to producers who do not meet the lender's normal underwriting criteria.

The direct and guaranteed loan program offers two types of loans: farm ownership loans and farm operating loans.

Farm ownership loan funds may be used to purchase or enlarge a farm or ranch; purchase easements or rights of way needed in the farm's operation; build or improve buildings such as a dwelling or barn; promote soil and water conservation and development; and pay closing costs.

Farm operating loan funds may be used to purchase livestock, poultry, farm equipment, fertilizer, and other materials necessary to operate a farm. Operating loan funds can also be used for family living expenses; refinancing debts under certain conditions; paying salaries for hired farm laborers; installing or improving water systems for home, livestock or irrigation use; and other similar improvements.

Repayment terms for direct operating loans are scheduled from one to seven years. Financing for direct farm ownership loans cannot exceed 40 years. Interest rates for direct loans are set periodically according to the government's cost of borrowing. Guaranteed loan terms and interest rates are set by the lender.



Verdian Fire Protective Gear

Based in Spencer, Veridian Fire Protective Gear manufactures protective clothing for fire fighters and emergency first responders internationally. By having the right equipment available combined with skilled staff, the Veridian team was able to adjust their production model to make a different highly needed item for Spencer Hospital and other healthcare organizations - medical isolation gowns.

"The current need nationally and locally for medical Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is substantial," commented Veridian president Bill Van Lent. "As with many products used in the U.S., most production is done overseas. Due to the Veridian's specialized fire PPE expertise, we have cut-n-sew equipment and skilled operators capable of meeting this urgent need. We have temporarily suspended our primary production in support of this effort.'

Spencer Hospital placed Veridian's first order for cloth gowns. Since then, the State of Iowa has also placed a large order.

"Veridian is pleased to be able to assist the local community and the State of Iowa," Van Lent said. "Veridian's ability to quickly transition to a completely different type of manufacturing process is a testament to the exceptional skill and determination of our Spencer area team members. This kind of dedication and effort is why Veridian chooses to maintain and grow our business in Iowa."

Lakes Marketing and Print - In **Collaboration with Others**

Lakes Marketing and Print located in Spirit Lake produces multi-channel marketing for clients, including Spencer Hospital, which has worked with the company on a number of projects and has ordered materials such as posters and direct mail postcards. Yet, upon identifying the need for hospitals and other healthcare entities to have greater access to personal protective equipment during the COVID-19 crisis, they devised a plan to help.

"Upon seeing the need for PPE, we created a consortium in northwest Iowa to produce face shields," shared Rick Ayres, owner of Lakes Marketing and Print. Rick was joined by Chris and Brad Shanahan of the Mail House in Sioux City; Shawn Stone, Professor of Physics and Computer Science at Buena Vista University; Adam Perry, band

director in Sioux Rapids; Chad Tischer at Iowa Lakes Community College, and a couple others who wish to remain anonymous.

Ayres explained: "Together we are running 26 3D printers making the plastic head band for the face shields. Lakes Marketing and Print is supplying the clear vinyl shields which have been router cut on a CNC machine, the elastic straps and rubber band closures, and doing all the fulfillment. We have a route driver from the Mail House who drives from Sioux City through all the communities and picks up the head bands on Monday and Thursday and drops them at Lakes Marketing and Print for fulfillment. Everyone has stepped up in a big way, running 3D printers 24/7, buying additional 3D printers, supplies for shields, elastic, and keeping it running as smooth as possible. To date we've shipped around 3,000 to facilities in northwest Iowa."

Being in the creative field, Ayres is no stranger to trying new product lines; however, this production shift was even a bit of a surprise to him. "Five weeks ago, this wasn't even on my radar," he commented. "Now, together with all these other great people, we're making a difference for people needing face shields

Ayres said in addition to the mask shields for healthcare, it's also been rewarding to work with area restaurants,



Spencer-based Century Farms Distillery usually makes whiskey and vodka under their labels, Prairie States Whiskey and Open Gate Vodka. They also operate a tasting room, mixing up fun concoctions using their products, and during the COVID-19 re-

strictions, have even offered drinks to go. With the COVID-19 crisis, another product they've added to their alcohol line-up for sale and also to give away is hand sanitizer.

"Because of our distiller's license, we are able to process the alcohol needed to make hand sanitizer," explained Amanda Bare, who co-owns and operates Century Farms Distillery with her husband Ryan.

"We are following the World Health Organization's recommended formulation, which is 80% ethyl alcohol, glycerin, hydrogen peroxide and water," she said. 'We have been able to modify our bottling equipment to fill bottles of hand sanitizer rather than whiskey and vodka."

The Bares have teamed up with local brewery, West O, to distribute four ounce bottles of the distillery's hand sanitizer free of charge. They also have larger quantities available for sale, including the 80 gallon drum that Spencer Hospital purchased.

"We are very glad that we can help out with a definite need," Bare said. "We still continue to receive calls daily from people looking for hand sanitizer, and we'll continue to make it as long as there

She added: "Thank you to everyone at Spencer Hospital! We are incredibly proud to be part of this wonderful community and truly appreciate the fantastic support we have received."
