

### The Joy Gleghorn Nature Preserve at Wells Hill Park

### A local treasure that offers countless good reasons to get outside and enjoy the everyday gifts of nature.

Tucked away on a back road just a few miles south of Fayetteville, nestled in an undeveloped valley of Pea Ridge, is a park where you can get back to nature and enjoy a world that exists right outside the window. At the Joy Gleghorn Nature Preserve, you'll find rough-terrain trails that weave through age-old trees and lead to rocky inclines where spring-fed waterfalls offer a refreshing and stunning display of nature. You'll see velvety moss in all shades of green growing on rocks and the sides of trees. Walking on the trails, surrounded by the peaceful sounds of water gently trickling over rock outcroppings and birds chirping from nearby branches, it's easy to forget that this wonderland of nature is just outside Fayetteville City limits. Consisting of 126 acres of pristine woodland, with over 300 varieties of vegetation including a wide offering of unique

wildflowers, and three waterfalls, Wells Hill Park has been a local treasure for almost two centuries. The park is named after early pioneer Peyton Wells, who settled in the community in 1825. In the 1930s and '40s, several local families had summer cabins in the park. They discovered that under the canopy of a forest of deciduous trees along with numerous cool water springs, it was the perfect respite from the summer heat. The natural springs throughout the park also came to play an important role in Fayetteville's history. In the late 1800s, as the city began to grow, so did the need for an additional water source. In 1898, the city walled up over a dozen springs in the area and built an eight-inch pipeline to carry the water from the springs at 900 feet above sea level to a lower elevation north of Fayetteville's downtown square. The gravity-flow water system was one of the first in the United States. A group of engineers even traveled from New York City to see



the remarkable system in operation. From 1904 to 1956, the springs from Wells Hill, along with other natural spring sources, supplied 225,000 gallons of water to Fayetteville every day.

Since that time, the property encompassing Wells Hill Park has been through several transfers. In 2012, the City of Fayetteville sold the property to Mr. Charles Gleghorn, who then conveyed it to the Tennessee Parks and Greenways Foundation (TennGreen). TennGreen added a permanent conservation easement to preserve and protect the property. In honor of Mr. Gleghorn's late wife, the property was named the Joy Gleghorn Nature Preserve. Lincoln County now manages the area as its first County Park and Nature Preserve. Through available grants, the county will continue to improve and mark the trails. They also have plans for a new access drive, parking lot, and restroom facilities.

Today, a pavilion and several picnic tables welcome visitors to the park, with a grassy meadow perfect for the kids to run around and play a game of catch. A fairly flat walking trail follows alongside a rocky creek bed traversing it in several places. Throughout the park, you can still see the remnants of the structures built around the springs, including a large springhouse near the beginning of the trail. For those who want to hike to the waterfalls, continue following the trail along the creek bed. When the trail forks, if you go to the right it will lead to Rainy Falls. If you continue going straight there will be another fork. The left trail leads to Wildcat Falls, and if you stay on the main trail, you will see views of Dogwood Falls. Be sure to wear sturdy walking shoes, as the trails are rocky and slippery in places. On any given day, Wells Hill Park offers bountiful treasures of nature just waiting to be discovered. Whether it's gazing up at the yellow blossoms on Tennessee's state tree, the Tulip Poplar, watching a red-spotted purple butterfly known as the White Admiral or going on a treasure hunt for the endangered flowering plant Nodding Rattlesnake-root, a visit to Wells Hill Park offers an infinite number of reasons to get outside and enjoy the everyday gifts of nature.

### Not-for-Profit Business of the Year

The Fabulous Fifties Show brings down the house with music, laughter, and a whole lot of love.

A good hearty laugh, it relieves tension and stress and is really good medicine. Thanks to the long-running Fabulous Fifties Show, audiences have a whole lot to laugh about and the far-reaching benefits are bringing some good cheer to local cancer patients and the Fayetteville community as well. What began in 1986 with two performances has grown to nine performances over two weeks in early March. The purpose of the show is to raise funds for the Multi-County Cancer Support Network (MCCSN). MCCSN is a non-profit organization that reaches out to cancer patients in an eight-county region that includes Bedford, Coffee, Franklin, Grundy, Marion, Moore, Warren, and Lincoln, helping with expenses related to cancer treatments that are not covered by insurance. These expenses include things such as wigs, wheelchairs, gas money to get to medical appointments and much more. In Lincoln County alone, MCCSN has benefited approximately 150 cancer patients. Jane Wilcox, producer of the show has seen first hand how the money is helping those who suffer from the merciless disease. "There is such a great need. Many of these people don't know where their next dollar is coming from because they've spent

so much on their health care," Jane says. "We receive thank you letters throughout the year from people who are so grateful to be able to get these funds and it really touches our hearts."

The Fabulous Fifties Show adds value to the community in other ways as well. People come from near and far to catch one of the nine performances. Tour buses, church buses, and vans bring people from all across Tennessee as well as Alabama, Georgia, and Arkansas. Alumni from local schools schedule their class reunions around the show. And some families save the dates on their calendars and even plan their vacations to coincide with the show. These visitors fill restaurants, stay in motels, and shop locally giving the local economy a welcome boost in revenue.

The annual production showcases some of the outstanding talent found right here in Lincoln County. More than 80 people of all ages contribute their expertise and valuable time as writers, artists, performers, actors, band members, costume makers, and workers who do everything from running errands to selling tickets, t- shirts, and concessions. For




many, it is a family affair that includes multiple generations who carry on the Fabulous Fifties tradition year after year. Dedicated singers and band members start learning songs in November and begin practicing together twice a week in January. The 14-piece band of talented musicians includes members of the local band Friends with Strangers as well as a Fayetteville High School drummer and several college students. The backup singers, known as "Simply Fabulous," perform throughout the year at different events in support of the show. Every year Carl Gleghorn, local artist, architect, and owner-operator of Dragonfly Art Gallery, designs the logo and poster. The artwork is also incorporated into a t-shirt design. The t-shirts, which are sold at the shows and several local businesses, play a big part in the group's fundraising efforts as well. Gleghorn also designs the stunning backdrops, which are painted by local high school art teachers and their students.

The title of this year's show is Fun & Games. The original script, written by local playwright Josh Ogle, brings the focus of the non-profit group full circle. It tells the story of several characters who take a trip to Hollywood to participate in a game show, with hopes of winning money for the MCCSN. Helping local cancer patients is at the heart of the Fabulous Fifties Show and through the years, the group's labor of love is a shining light throughout the community.

There are a lot of things you can spend your money on, but a ticket to the Fabulous Fifties Show is money well-spent. The \$15 price of an adult ticket is money that recirculates throughout the community and into the hands of those that need it most. Attend once, and chances are, you will be marking your calendar for next year's show before you leave the parking lot.

### **Business of the Year**

Marvin's Family Restaurant serves up Southern hospitality, buffet style

Nothing warms the heart quite like down-home southern cooking and apparently, there are quite a few people in Fayetteville who will agree. Seven days a week, the parking lot of Marvin's Family Restaurant along Thornton Taylor Parkway is full. However, don't let that discourage you from finding a parking spot because when you walk into the spacious restaurant, you will see that there is still plenty of room. Marvin's is a gathering place. It's where friends and families come together to share a good southern home-cooked meal. It's also a place workers can grab a quick and hearty lunch that's affordable. Although the expansive room has a capacity of 275, booths situated along walls painted with murals help to create a cozy and welcoming atmosphere. The colorful murals feature country landscapes with old-time buildings that advertise local businesses around Fayetteville. With good food, a friendly and attentive staff, and a bottomless glass of sweet tea, it's easy to see why Marvin's Family Restaurant is a favorite among locals and visitors alike.

The restaurant offers a full menu, however, what it's known most for is its famous buffet. The aroma of fried chicken wafts through the air and if you weren't that hungry when you walked in, you will be by the time you are seated at your table. In addition to some of the best fried chicken around, the buffet, which changes daily, offers a variety of entrees such as catfish fillets, pork chops and salmon patties with side items that include pinto beans, sweet potatoes, turnip greens, corn, and mac and cheese—because no southern buffet is complete without the ultimate cheesy comfort food. Originally founded in 2009, local businessman Dan Holt purchased the restaurant five years ago. Holt attributes the success of the restaurant to his friendly and hard-working staff of 45. "The secret is obviously our employees. We've got really good people," Holt says. What is also evident is that this soft-spoken and genuine man deeply cares about the well being of his employees. "We have a lot of team members...who want to advance their career in the foodservice business. We want to give them the opportunity," he says. "We have a young man who started out as a dishwasher, worked his way into cooking as a fry cook, then a buffet cook, and today, he's running one of our restaurants." As far as the future for Marvin's, Holt adds, "We'd like to continue to grow to give our people more opportunities. I'm looking at two [employees] right now who are just great at this business." For Holt, one of the highlights of the year is the annual Christmas party, when he gets to show his staff how much he appreciates all they do. For the big event, he closes the restaurant and gives away prizes and armloads of gifts. Last year, one lucky employee took home a new car for Christmas. "We've really been blessed. I look around and I see people and think 'I'm so glad they're on our team," Holt says.

He also is filled with gratitude for the community of Fayetteville and the good people who support the restaurant. "It's not always easy. We're like everybody else, we have days where we mess up. We want to acknowledge the fact that we do have times when we need a little forgiveness too," Holt says.

Marvin's Family Restaurant is located at 4130 Thornton Taylor Parkway in Fayetteville. 

### **PET LAWS**

The ordinance regarding pet laws within City Limits of Fayetteville states that dogs must be confined or controlled by a leash and all pets should be given rabies shots and must wear tags indicating they have had these shots. If, for any reason, an animal needs to be picked up off of the street, one can call the Animal Control Office number, (931) 433-3726. Rabies clinics are sponsored by the Health Department during the spring of each year and are announced in the newspaper and on the local radio stations. Rabies shots are given by any of the veterinarians in the City throughout the year.

### **VOTING LAWS**

Newcomers to the City and County may register to vote after living in the state of Tennessee as soon as they become residents. Tennessee is the only state that has no durational requirement for becoming a resident. The Election Commissioner's Office is located at 208 E Davidson Drive. Anyone who is 18 years of age or who will be 18 on the day of the next election, can register to vote. The books for voter registration are closed 30 days before an election. The hours of the Election Commission Office are 8:00 A.M. until 4:00 P.M. Monday through Friday. Any registered voter can vote early.

### 116<sup>th</sup> Annual Lincoln County Fair

September 19-26, 2020

Lincoln County has a rich agricultural heritage. With forty Century Farms in the county, the oldest established in 1818, agriculture has been a way of life for generations of families. The Lincoln County Fair is a celebration that honors agricultural producers, past, present, and future. Throughout the seven-day event, there are livestock shows, horse races, carnival rides, pageantry, and much more. At last year's fair, there were even dinosaur races!

The Darrell Hale Agriculture Building and Creative Living Building features exhibits by local 4H and FFA students, farmers, and gardeners who have worked hard all year to grow, sew and create works that showcase their talent and skills. Competitors vie for blue ribbons and other awards in a wide array of categories from creative writing, cartooning and computer technology to field crops, sewing, and canning.

At the Farmer for a Day display, children ages 8 and under can learn what it's like to be farmer, and where some of their food comes from. Children can collect eggs, milk "Daisy" the cow and gather produce, sell their crops and spend the proceeds on a well-deserved snack. The Lincoln County Fair is the only harness race track in Tennessee and it is sanctioned by the United States Trotting Association, the governing body of harness racing. People travel great distances for the chance to see these graceful horses run the half-mile track. This form of horse racing dates back to 1889. In a harness race, a Standardbred horse harnessed to a two-wheeled cart called a sulky carries a driver (not to be mistaken for a jockey). Together, they travel at speeds averaging 25–30 miles per hour. The beauty of these horses in full stride is a sight to behold, one that will have you coming back to the fair year after year.

The grandstand events begin on Saturday night September 19th, with a concert by a major touring music act and close on the following Saturday, September 26th with the loud roars and bangs of the demolition derby. The midway provides hours of fun for the whole family. Try your luck at the game booths or take a ride on one of the carnival attractions that are just your speed. A rainbow of sweet treats such as cotton candy and caramel apples are sure to satisfy your sweet tooth. For something more substantial there are plenty of opportunities to feast at the fair.





# HISTORY REIMAGINED

Honoring Lincoln County's past with a place in the present

Although centuries have passed since soldiers walked the ground and pitched their tents along the banks of the Elk River at Camp Blount, the Camp Blount Historic Site will ensure that an important part of Lincoln County's history is not forgotten.

Located two miles south of downtown Fayetteville, Camp Blount once served as the location of the training encampment in 1813-14, and a rallying point for soldiers like Sam Houston and David Crockett. It is where General Andrew Jackson mustered troops during the Creek Indian War in 1813 as part of the War of 1812, and again for a march to New Orleans to be a part of the Battle of New Orleans. The latter was the final defeat of the British forces and the end to Great Britain's goal to colonize America.

For General Andrew Jackson, Camp Blount played a pivotal role in his rise to becoming the 7th President of the United States. The turnout of volunteers for these battles resulted in one of the state's earliest references to Tennessee as the Volunteer State.

In 2016, the 40-acre Camp Blount property was officially purchased by the Tennessee Historical Commission with the City of Fayetteville as the caretaker. Exciting new developments of the site are well underway which include an entrance sign, construction of a parking area and the unveiling of "Tennessee's First Volunteer," an eight-foot-tall bronze statue set on a base of limestone gathered from the original Stone River Bridge. Other plans for the site include:

• Volunteer Plaza - a circular stone plaza with raised borders constructed from locally sourced limestone. The area will serve as a seating and meditation area with the volunteer statue as the centerpiece.

- Greer Cabin a historic log cabin belonging to Joseph Greer is presently undergoing renovations with plans to relocate the structure to the Camp Blount site. Greer served at the Battle of Kings Mountain in 1780. He became known as the "Kings Mountain Messenger" when he delivered the news of the American victory in the 1780 Battle of King's Mountain to the Continental Congress in Philadelphia.
- Restrooms and a Visitor's Center

The developments taking place at Camp Blount are part of a master plan that when complete, will contribute to Fayetteville's draw as a destination for tourism. Future generations will also learn the vital role it played in the history of our nation.

There are several ways you can support the ongoing efforts at the Camp Blount Historic Site. Memberships are available at \$10 per year for individuals, \$20 per year for families, and \$100 for a lifetime membership. Applications are available at the Register of Deeds office at the Lincoln County Courthouse. T-shirts are also available for purchase, and donations are always welcome.

The Camp Blount Historic Site is located at 1202 Huntsville Hwy, Fayetteville, TN adjacent to the River Oak Shopping Center. For more historical information about the site and news on current developments visit the website at campblount.com or follow the Facebook page @campblount.

# All Roads Lead to Bayetteville

Explore Fayetteville and the surrounding area through the trails, tours, and pathways that tell a different kind of story.

Fayetteville's new Greenway Project will soon allow visitors and locals to take a scenic stroll that begins downtown, passes through Stone Bridge Park, crosses a pedestrian bridge over the Elk River, and ends at the Camp Blount Historic Site and Memorial Plaza. The project consists of three phases. The first phase is now complete and connects the downtown square with Stone Bridge Park via a walkway and bridge over Tanyard Creek. Phase Two, which is currently underway, will connect Stone Bridge Park to the Camp Blount Historic Site. The greenway offers a unique glimpse into Fayetteville's storied past, following along the same ground where soldiers once gathered, built their campfires, and carried out the plans that shaped Lincoln County.

**Stone Bridge Park** tells the story of a bridge that once spanned the Elk River and served as a vital connector of the northern and southern portions of the county. The bridge in the park is a miniature replica of the historic Stone Bridge. The scaled version has three arches, instead of six, and is a detailed representation of the original, even down to the sag on top. Today, a beautiful walkway winds through the park. The quarter-mile loop passes over the replica Stone Bridge, past a historic cabin, and offers serene views of a cascading waterfall and ducks floating in peaceful channel waters. The path is handicap accessible and perfect for baby strollers as well.

#### GeoTours

A geotour is a real-world outdoor treasure hunting adventure where explorers (geocachers) search for a series of hidden objects (caches) utilizing GPS coordinates. The caches hold a logbook, a pen, and sometimes a variety of fun objects left by previous visitors. The logbook is filled with the dates and signatures of fellow treasure hunters, some who have added a short message revealing where they are visiting from or other exciting details about their travels.

There are two geotours near Fayetteville, the Jack Geotour consisting of 66 geocaches spread across nine counties and the Discover South Central Tennessee Geotour consisting of 87



geocaches across 14 counties. Each geotour has a downloadable passport where players can log codewords to win trackable geocoins. These tours take visitors to places they may not ordinarily come across, such as city parks, rivers, historical landmarks, restaurants, and other businesses along the beautiful backroads of Tennessee.

#### Following is a quick rundown of how it works.

- Create a free geocaching account and download the official Geocaching® app on your phone or other devices.
- Use the app to navigate to a geocache nearby.
- Once you find the geocache, sign, and date the logbook. Place the geocache back where you found it and continue to the next one.

A geocaching adventure can be as short or long as you want it to be. It's a great way to discover new places, travel along scenic backroads, and visit local businesses that you never knew existed. The chances are high that there is a geocache hidden near you now.

#### The Jack Trail

Lincoln County is quite famous when it comes to whiskey making. It's the birthplace of the charcoal filtering method known as the Lincoln County Process, a mellowing process unique to Tennessee whiskey. A short drive will take you to several distilleries where you can learn about the art and craft of making fine whiskey. What's more, the scenic drive to these distilleries is breathtaking. Start your whiskey tour at Southern Pride Distillery located on a beautiful farm outside of Fayetteville. The distillery produces its premium distilled spirits using an old family recipe with locally grown corn that is milled on-site. Next, head to Prichard's Distillery located in nearby in Kelso, Tennessee. The distillery is in an old schoolhouse where the basketball hoops still hang on the wall. Their quality rums and whiskeys are distilled in copper pots and stored in 15-gallon to 53-gallon charred white oak barrels to allow for the best possible flavor. From there, take the short drive to Lynchburg to the oldest registered distillery in the United States, Jack Daniel Distillery. Make time for the 1.5 hour Angel's Share





Distillery Tour and sample some limited-edition single barrel whiskeys. Continue to Tullahoma to the Cascade Hollow Distillery. Since 1870, the distillery has been faithful to the recipe George A. Dickel created. Today it is crafted just as it was then — Handmade the Hard Way. Take a one-hour tour through the fully operational distillery and barrelhouse and witness the process of whiskey making from start to finish. The newest distillery in the area is the Nearest Green Distillery at Sand Creek Farms in Shelbyville. Nathan "Nearest" Green, fondly known as Uncle Nearest, was the slave who taught Jack Daniel the craft of distilling. He is the first African American master distiller on record in the United States and left a legacy that marks a new chapter in the story of Tennessee whiskey.

#### **Tennessee Music Pathways**

What does Marvin Gaye, a preacher's son, and Fayetteville, Tennessee have in common? A song. Ed Townsend, born in Fayetteville in 1929, sang in his father's African Methodist Episcopal Church choir as a child. Throughout his lifetime, Townsend composed more than 200 songs, one of which was Marvin Gaye's classic, "Let's Get It On." The story of Ed Townsend will soon be commemorated with a permanent marker in Fayetteville as part of the Department of Tourism's Tennessee Music Pathways initiative. The Pathways, a 1200-mile state-wide system, leads travelers to sights that have played a significant role in the story of Tennessee's musical pioneers and legends. Statues, murals, festivals, birthplaces, gravesites, hometowns, high schools, and churches are a few of the locations where markers will be placed.

Tennessee is rich with stories such as Townsend's. With more musicians per capita than anywhere in the world, music is a vein of gold that runs through all 95 counties in the state—from front porches, along backroads, through small towns to big stages. Tennessee Music Pathways is a story of the people and places that make up the soundtrack of America. As you can see, there are dozens of ways to get to know the area and learn your way around. So, take some time to explore. Who knows what treasures you might find.

Located next to the Kiwanis Baseball Field, Kid's Park is an enclosed space that offers many different type of outdoor equipment for children to enjoy. This park became available due to numerous contributions from the community, along with a state recreation grant. This park has pavilions and benches throughout the perimeter of the park to help parents keep a good view on their children.

## **Kiwanis Park**

The Kiwanis Park is nestled in the sub-divisions of Fayetteville, right behind Ralph Askins Elementary School. This area provides easier access for children to play after school, and has a wide area away from any major roads. The park offers wide spaces and event pavilions, with access to public restrooms.

## **Kiwanis Recreation Field**

There are two baseball fields at this facility. One is a Little League field and below it is the Pee Wee field. Around and below the field is a asphalt, lighted, walking track that circles them and kids park. There are restrooms located at the facility. There is also a batting cage and skateboard park beside the lil league field.

## **Municipal Swimming Pool**

The pool opens May 23. It is open everyday from 1 P.M. until 6 P.M. except for Saturday, which is 11 A.M. until 6 P.M. Admission is \$5 per person, while kids 3 and under get in free. Multi-visit punch cards can be purchased at the pool for a cost of \$40 that will last for 11 visits. Pool parties can be booked by calling the pool at (931) 433-1612.

## S.J. King Park

Located across from Kid's Park, King's Park features wide open spaces and great views of the adjacent Elk River. The park includes several pavilions, along with a ball field that is open to the public.



## TN Promise & tnAchieves Clearing obstacles and leading the way to a brighter future

TN Promise provides every graduating high school senior in the state the opportunity to attend a local community or technical college tuition-free with mentor support. Students apply during their senior year, attend two mandatory meetings and complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to remain eligible for the scholarship. More than 67,000 students from the Class of 2020 applied for the scholarship.

TN Promise is one initiative of Gov. Haslam's Drive to 55 Alliance — a mission to get 55 percent of Tennesseans equipped with a college degree or certificate by the year 2025. According to predictions, that goal will be reached well ahead of the deadline. Since the program's launch in 2014, TN Promise has accepted more than 170,000 students and placed more than 33,000 students into college with assistance from the scholarship. Data from the first year of the program indicates that TN Promise students are graduating at a rate almost three times their peers at the same institutions. Program administrators believe eliminating the financial barrier, coupled with support from a mentor, is the reason students are graduating at significantly higher rates. Most of the TN Promise applicants will be the first in their family to go to college. Understanding that many obstacles can exist for first-generation college students, each applicant is assigned a volunteer mentor. Volunteer mentors provide the guidance and encouragement students often need to be successful. tnAchieves mentors support students as they navigate the college-going process and provide the nudges many need to earn a college credential. tnAchieves has begun its effort to recruit 9,000 volunteer mentors to meet its goal of providing every TN Promise applicant from the Class of 2020 with a local support system. The time commitment is small, only about one hour per month, but the impact is significant. New volunteers are needed every year. The organization provides a one-hour training session, a handbook, and weekly communication to ensure the mentor is fully equipped to serve his/her students.

## Workforce Training Close to home

TCAT Shelbyville's Lincoln County campus officially opened on January 6, 2020, in the former Ninth Grade Academy, now Lincoln Central Academy, building. The programs for this trimester are Dual Enrollment Information Technology/Infrastructure Management (Cybersecurity) and two nursing prerequisite classes (Anatomy & Physiology and Math for Meds) at the Lincoln Central Academy building, Industrial Maintenance at the Don Sundquist Center at the Motlow Fayetteville campus, and Dual Enrollment Machine Tool Technology at Lincoln County High School.

This campus is a continuing work in progress, although the building is a great structure. The support and advice of the campus advisory committee which consists of industry partners, community partners, and high school representatives has been very valuable. Another help in this area has been Fayetteville Public Utilities. Lincoln County Schools have provided some much-needed furniture like tables and chairs and desks for some of the TCAT rooms that are currently in use. Brad Luna, Lincoln County Schools Technology Supervisor, set up the phone and is continuing to help with technology. Dr. Heath, Lincoln County Director of Schools, also had the TCAT part of the building painted by the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department inmate work program over the Winter Break to match the rest of the building's clean paint. Mr. Rob, from the Lincoln County Schools custodial department, touched it up and finished the trim. It looks so fresh! The maintenance crew has recently been replacing the lights with LED lights in the entire building. Commissioner Roger Martinez with Jerry Damson Honda generously donated a microwave for the student break area, which is in the cafeteria. The community has really come together to assist this fabulous endeavor to even better serve the people in Fayetteville/Lincoln County.

TCAT Shelbyville Lincoln County campus is continuing to have conversations and planning sessions about future programs with the three school systems, local industries, and others. As of now, the plans for Fall of 2020 are to offer Farming Operations Technology and adult Information Technology/Infrastructure Management in addition to the current programs. Also, Industrial Maintenance will relocate to the Lincoln Central Academy building. Additionally, TCAT Shelbyville is working with the Chamber of Commerce on applying for a grant that would enable them to offer a supplemental class/workshop for people who want to have their own successful businesses. It includes proven methods and strategies and real planning for future and current entrepreneurs. It would be offered in Bedford, Franklin, Lincoln, and Marshall counties. It is an exciting prospect!



The College had its origins in the plea of Victoria Martin for access to education afforded only to males in Giles County in the 1850's. She died at the age of 21 having not realized her dream. However, her dream would remain in the heart of her father, Thomas Martin. Upon his death in 1870, and with a large sum from his estate, Martin Female College was established. The trustees of Pulaski Methodist Church were the college's first stewards and classes were held in the church basement while construction on the first college building was completed.




The College and communities throughout the 18 counties that surround it have walked hand in hand over the decades to realize the potential of this special part of God's creation. Today Martin Methodist College stands as a vibrant, growing, and transformative community of learners.
