Health Screening Tool Unveiled to Help Track COVID-19 in Region

All residents in the Finger Lakes region are encouraged to sign up for ROC COVID, a health screening tool that could help prevent the further spread of COVID-19. Scientists and information technology staff from the University of Rochester Medical Center and Rochester Regional Health developed ROC COVID.

ROC COVID is an online survey tool consisting of questions that you answer daily, even if you have no symptoms. Questions include whether you have a fever, a cough, chills or other primary COVID-19 symptoms in addition to basic demographic information. As a participant, you will receive daily reminders to take the quick survey at ROC-COVID.org. A text version of the daily survey will be available in the near future.

Common Ground Health, a regional health planning organization, will securely house and analyze collected data. The data analysis will allow for an increased understanding of COVID-19, measure efforts to slow its progression, and help determine where to focus testing or adjust stay-at-home and physical distancing requirements.

Dr. Eric Bieber, President and CEO of Rochester Regional Health, said in a written statement, "One of the most important tools in the fight against any pandemic is timely access to data that allows for quick action to mitigate the spread and, ultimately, keep our communities healthy and safe. The ROC COVID health screening tool is another example of the region working together to harness the power of data to maintain vigilance in our shared response to the global COVID-19 pandemic."

If you are a University of Rochester Medical Center or Rochester Regional Health employee, you are asked not to participate in ROC COVID; however, you should continue to respond to your own internal surveys.

Covid-19 Testing Protocols Prioritize Front Line Workers

Livingston County Public Health Director Jennifer Rodriguez would like to remind residents of new protocols for COVID-19 testing that support statewide coordinated testing prioritization. As COVID-19 testing capacity increases across New York State, these protocols are meant to prioritize resources to meet the most urgent public health need.

COVID-19 testing will now be prioritized for individuals with or without symptoms who are employed as health care workers, first responders, or in any position within a nursing home, long-term care facility, or other congregate care setting, including but not limited to:

- · Correction, Parole and Probation Officers
- Direct Care Providers
- · Firefighters
- Health Care Practitioners, Professionals, Aides, & Support Staff (e.g. Physicians, Nurses, Public Health Personnel)
- · Medical Specialists
- · Nutritionists and Dietitians
- · Occupational, Physical, Recreational and Speech Therapists
- Paramedics and Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs)
- · Police Officers
- · Psychologists and Psychiatrists
- · Residential Care Program Managers

The Livingston County Department of Health (LCDOH) recently teamed up with Noyes Health to administer close to 200 COVID-19 tests among the front line health workers at the Livingston County Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation (CNR), the 266-bed nursing home owned by Livingston County.

"Extensive testing among CNR front line workers is a priority because this facility houses one of our most vulnerable populations in the face of this public health crisis," stated Rodriguez. "Our goal is to prevent the spread of COVID-19 at the CNR through early identification and isolation of any positive cases that may exist."

Rodriguez continued, "Thank you to Noyes Health for collaborating with us on this large-scale effort. Together, we are working to stop the spread of COVID-19 and save lives."

This diagnostic testing will determine whether an individual is currently infected with COVID-19. This testing does not include antibody testing.

Rodriguez stated, "It is important for us to focus attention on these front line workers who may have a higher risk of exposure to COVID-19 based on the nature of their work."

If you are an individual in one of the prioritized categories listed above, you should contact your primary care physician or the Livingston County Department of Health (if you do not have a primary care physician) at 585-243-7270 to be screened for eligibility. If eligible for COVID-19 testing, an appointment will be arranged for you at a local COVID-19 testing site.

Livingston County Campgrounds Open with Some Restrictions

The Livingston County Department of Health issued conditional permits to some private campgrounds on Friday, May 8, 2020 with restrictions that extend until Monday, June 8, 2020. The use of all campsites is allowed, including tent sites. The restrictions are as follows:

Prohibited campground uses at this time:

- Swimming pools and beaches
- Recreation halls
- Playgrounds / sport courts & equipment
- Pavilions
- Social gatherings of any size (not unique to campgrounds; this is the same regulation as what applies to non-camp residences per NYS Executive Order)
- Daytime visitation from guests not intended as occupants for original overnight use

Allowable campground uses and activities at this time:

- Campground operated food service on a takeout or delivery basis only for consumption at individual campsites.
- Toilet and bathhouse facilities subject to maintaining 6-feet separation from other camp ground users or use of a face mask when allowable. Facilities will be cleaned and disinfected twice daily.
- Laundry facilities and camp store subject to maintaining social distancing and face mask use.

In keeping with the intent of a phased reopening of the County, Livingston County will reevaluate which activities may be allowed for use as statewide directives are made. As part of the reopening process, all businesses are required to visit the website here and attest that you have read and understand the guidance required for your industry. Businesses will still be required to have:

• Face coverings for all employees and customers (where and when applicable) if in frequent contact with others.

- Social distance protocols and related actions for safety of employees, customers, and vendors.
- Proper procedures for a safe, clean and sanitized workplace. Frequent cleaning of customer touch points. Employee training to ensure employee, customer, and vendor safety.
- Changes in the physical space to limit access to areas where congregation can occur.
- Adjustments to workplace hours and shift design as necessary to reduce density in the work place.
- Policies that consider restricting non-essential travel for employees.
- A continuous health screening process for individuals to enter the workplace.
- Liability processes.
