## CAULIFLOWER CASSEROLE <br> Ingredients

- 1 large head cauliflower, cut into small florets
( 1.5 lb. florets)
- Olive oil spray
- 1 teaspoon coarse kosher salt (not fine salt)
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- $1 / 2$ cup sour cream (I used low-fat, feel free to use full-fat)
- 2 tablespoons whole milk (or cream)
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1 teaspoon minced garlic
- Pinch cayenne pepper
- 1 cup shredded sharp cheddar, divided


## Garnish:

- 2 tablespoons bacon bits
- 2 tablespoons thinly sliced scallions, green parts


## Directions

1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees $F$. Line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper.
2. Arrange the cauliflower florets on the baking sheet. Liberally spray with olive oil and season with kosher salt and black pepper. Roast the cauliflower until tender-crisp, about 12 minutes.
3. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, mix the sour cream, milk, Dijon, garlic, cayenne and $1 / 2$ cup cheddar.
4. When cauliflower is done, add it to the sour cream sauce and mix to combine.
5. Transfer the mixture to a greased 1.5 -quart baking dish. Top with the remaining shredded cheddar. Return to the oven and bake just until cheese is melted, about 10 minutes.
6. Sprinkle the cauliflower casserole with the bacon bits and the scallions and serve.

## CORN CASSEROLE

## Ingredients

- 1 (15 1/4-ounce) can whole kernel corn, drained
- 1 (14 3/4-ounce) can cream-style corn
- 1 ( 8 -ounce) package corn muffin mix (recommended: Jiffy)
- 1 cup sour cream
- $1 / 2$ stick butter, melted
- 1 to $11 / 2$ cups shredded Cheddar



## Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degree In a large bowl, stir together the 2 cans of corn, corn muffin mix, sour cream, and melted butter. Pour into a greased 9 by 13-inch casserole dish. Bake for 45 minutes, or
 until golden brown. Remove from oven and top with Cheddar. Return to oven for 5 to 10 minutes, or until cheese is melted. Let stand for at least 5 minutes and then serve warm.

## BROCCOLI CASSEROLE

## Ingredients

- 2 (10 oz) packages cooked and drained frozen chopped broccoli
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 cup grated sharp cheddar cheese

- 1 (10 $3 / 4 \mathrm{oz}$ ) can condensed cream of mushroom soup
- 2 lightly beaten eggs
- 2 cups crushed buttery crackers
- 2 tablespoons melted butter


## Directions

Preheat oven to $350^{\circ}$ F. Spray a 13 by 9 inch baking dish with vegetable oil cooking spray. In a large mixing bowl, combine broccoli, mayo, cheese, soup and eggs. Mix well with a metal spoon. Place the mixture in the prepared baking dish. Top with the crushed crackers and pour the melted butter evenly over the crackers. Bake for 35 minutes or until set and browned.

## EGGPLANT CASSEROLE

## Ingredients

- oil spray for pan
- 1 large eggplant (1 $1 / 4$ lb), unpeeled
- 1/4 teaspoon Diamond Crystal kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- $1 / 4$ teaspoon garlic
powder
- 1/2 cup marinara sauce

- 1 cup shredded part-skim Mozzarella, divided (4 oz)
- 1 tablespoon grated Parmesan cheese DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 500 degrees F. Line a large, rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper. Spray the parchment with oil spray.
2. Slice the eggplant into $1 / 4$-inch thick slices. Arrange the slices on the prepared baking sheet. Spray with oil. Season with kosher salt, black pepper and garlic powder. Roast 15 minutes.
3. Remove the baking sheet from the oven. Turn the eggplant slices to the other side. Spray again with oil. Return to the oven and roast until browned and tender, 10-15 more minutes.
4. Remove the baking sheet from the oven.

Reduce the oven temperature to 425 degrees $F$.
5. Arrange half of the roasted eggplant slices in the bottom of a greased 1-quart casserole dish. Spread half the marinara sauce on top and sprinkle with half of the mozzarella, as shown in the video.
6. Arrange the remaining eggplant slices on top. Spread the remaining marinara sauce on top.
Sprinkle with the remaining mozzarella and with the Parmesan.
7. Bake the eggplant casserole until golden and bubbly, about 15 minutes. Allow to cool 10 minutes before serving.

## TOMATO CASSEROLE

## Ingredients

- 2 Tbsp olive oil
- 2 sweet onions, sliced paper thin
- salt and pepper
- $31 / 2$ c Ritz cracker crumbs
- 2 can(s) (28 oz) each diced tomatoes, undrained
- $21 / 2$ c mayonnaise

- $11 / 2$ c grated extra sharp cheese
- $11 / 2$ c shaved Parmesan cheese
- 2 Tbsp basil, dried


## Directions

1. Preheat oven to 375F.
2. Grease a $9 \times 13$ inch baking dish with olive oil or butter.
3. Heat 2 tablespoons olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat and add onions. Cook stirring occasionally until soft and translucent, 4 to 5 minutes.
4. Add salt and freshly ground pepper to taste.
5. Remove from heat and set aside.
6. Crush Ritz crackers in the sleeve or in a food processor. Reserve $1 / 2$ cup crumbs for the topping.
7. Place half of the remaining crumbs in the bottom of the baking dish.
8. Pour 1 can diced tomatoes with juice over the

Ritz cracker crumbs.
9. Layer half of the sauteed onions on top of the tomatoes.
10. Add remaining tomatoes and onions.
11. Sprinkle remaining half of the cracker crumbs over the tomato-onion mixture.
12. In a bowl combine the mayonnaise, cheddar cheese, Parmesan cheese and basil.
13. Spread the mayonnaise mixture over the top and sprinkle on the reserved $1 / 2$ cup cracker crumbs.
14. Bake for about 50 minutes or until mixture begins to brown and is slightly bubbling around the edge.

## SWEET ONION CASSEROLE

## Ingredients

- 5 large sweet onions, halved and sliced
- $1 / 2$ cup butter
- $1 / 2$ cup crushed butterflavored crackers (about 12 crackers)
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese


## Directions

1. In a large skillet, saute onions in butter until tender. Place half of onions in a greased 2-qt. baking dish; sprinkle with half of the cracker crumbs and cheese. Repeat layers.
2. Bake, uncovered, at $350^{\circ}$ for $25-30$ minutes or until golden brown and bubbly.

## MIXED VEGETABLE CASSEROLE Ingredients

- 2 (15 ounce) cans mixed vegetables, drained
- 1 small onion, diced
- 1 (10.75 ounce) can condensed cream of chicken soup
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 cup shredded white Cheddar cheese
- 36 buttery round crackers, crushed



## Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees $F(175$ degrees $C$ ).
2. In a medium bowl combine the mixed vegetables, onion, soup, mayonnaise and cheese. Mix well and spread mixture into a $9 \times 13$ inch baking dish. Top with the cracker crumbs.
3. Bake about 30 minutes, or until browned and bubbly.

## Hello Gardeners!

Composting. What is it? It is using your leftover and discarded kitchen scraps and yard trash to make into healthy soil. Before you
 say, "Ewww, disgusting, smelly, and BUGS!" allow me to share the good news about composting. None of those descriptions are true except for one. Bugs. It can be as simple as a bin with red wriggler worms in the corner of your kitchen, or a small corner in your backyard, or a huge pile near your back forty. It is nature's perfect way to turn leaf litter, twigs, grass clippings, and veggie scraps, into rich, clean smelling soil. There is so much good you can do for your yard and garden and even potted plants using "compost tea", a rich liquid source of nutrients that are free for the taking from a compost pile. And you can RECYCLE much of your trash, except for plastics, glass and metal containers.

Bugs? Yes, bless their tiny hearts! From microorganisms, to small insects, to earthworms, they have one job, to digest the debris and turn it into rich, FREE soil.

June is a good month to start a compost pile, because a working compost pile needs heat,
moisture and air to break down the elements into rich soil. You can start with a bag of composted manure from the garden department of most big box or hardware stores. It will have the microorganisms already in it to begin the job. Add any of the following discarded waste and scraps; vegetable clippings (NOT meat or bones except in a bin with wriggler worms) eggshells, crushed coffee grounds tea bags dryer lint cardboard tubes from toilet paper, paper towels and wrapping paper, shredded paper, leaves, twigs and grass
 clippings,mix in with "leaf mold" (decaying leaves under shrubs and trees)
In June and the summer months, it will take two weeks or less to break down these items into soil provided you keep it moist (not soggy wet), stirred up for air to get in, and heated from some sunshine. In the late fall and winter, it will take longer, but the great thing is, a working compost pile generates energy and heat, all on its own.

## BUNKER MENTALITY

When the novel corona virus swept through the United States, architect Joseph Badame had cause to say "I told you so!" He didn't know what calamity was coming, but Badame prepared for nearly everything: he designed and built an 8,500 square-foot, partly-underground house on 3 acres in Medford, N.J., surrounded by an electric fence, plus enough outbuildings and food to accommodate 120 friends and family for a full year. He even thought to stock 4,200 rolls of toilet paper, and buried tanks to hold gasoline, kerosene, diesel fuel, and heating oil. He installed a coal-fired furnace supplied by "tons" of coal stacked outside. What does he think now, with COVID-19 killing thousands per day? "This is much more severe than I even planned for," says Badame, now 77, "when you combine the trigger of the corona virus and then the reaction to it." But his decades of preparation and million-dollar stockpile of supplies aren't helping: he lost the house to foreclosure in 2017, and now lives with a friend.
