Eating out

Finally we can start eating out— even if we are one of the limited number of customers allowed. Hurrah, but if we're still a bit apprehensive there are other choices that perhaps we've already been doing— let's review them:

For some folks having to actually cook and prepare a meal comes as a shock and probably a self-examination like "how do I start?", "what should I make?", etc. Well, from observing the shelves at the grocery store it seems to me that a good majority are preparing oven-ready, frozen or boxed meals. Probably not a bad idea for those who need that kind of assistance but there is really nothing to replace "eating out" since that provides so many endless possibilities and variety from a simple sandwich, to pizza, family restaurants or a traditional Wisconsin Supper Club.

But since these options and choices are available on a limited basis don't despair— all is not lost.

For when you don't cook at home you do have a choice of a "Drive-In" or a "Drive-thru".

A "Drive-In" (I think the only one in our area is Chester's at Plymouth). You sit in your car, a car-hop takes your order and brings back your meal. Easy enough, huh?

A "Drive-Thru" is McDonalds, Culvers, etc. You place your order at a speaker, then drive up to a window where you pay and pick up your food.

You have to move your car but you can find a place in their parking lot or take your food and eat someplace else (like "at home").

Then there are regular restaurants who offer a "take out" and perhaps have set up a make-shift "drive-thru" area if you're lucky or else you'll have to actually go into the restaurant and pick up your order—not the worst thing to do.

Maybe best of all is a "Home Delivery"—many restaurants now provide that—you just need a menu to make your choice and I suggest if you go this route be sure and ask if there is a minimum order or a delivery charge. One of my neighbors says she orders from a restaurant she likes and there is no delivery charge other than a 20% tip (sounds like a charge to me).

We're still doing the majority of our meals at home—my husband has always been the cook (and not bad, I might add) and since he likes to do it I certainly don't want to discourage it!

We still have to periodically visit a grocery store to stock up. But husband Richard likes to shop too (bless his little heart). He puts on his disposable gloves, covers his handsome face with a face mask and trudges in to shop. With this disguise to say he would like to say "stick 'em up" sometime since every customer looks like they want to hold up the store.

Werner Homes grows local connections

Renewing family ties

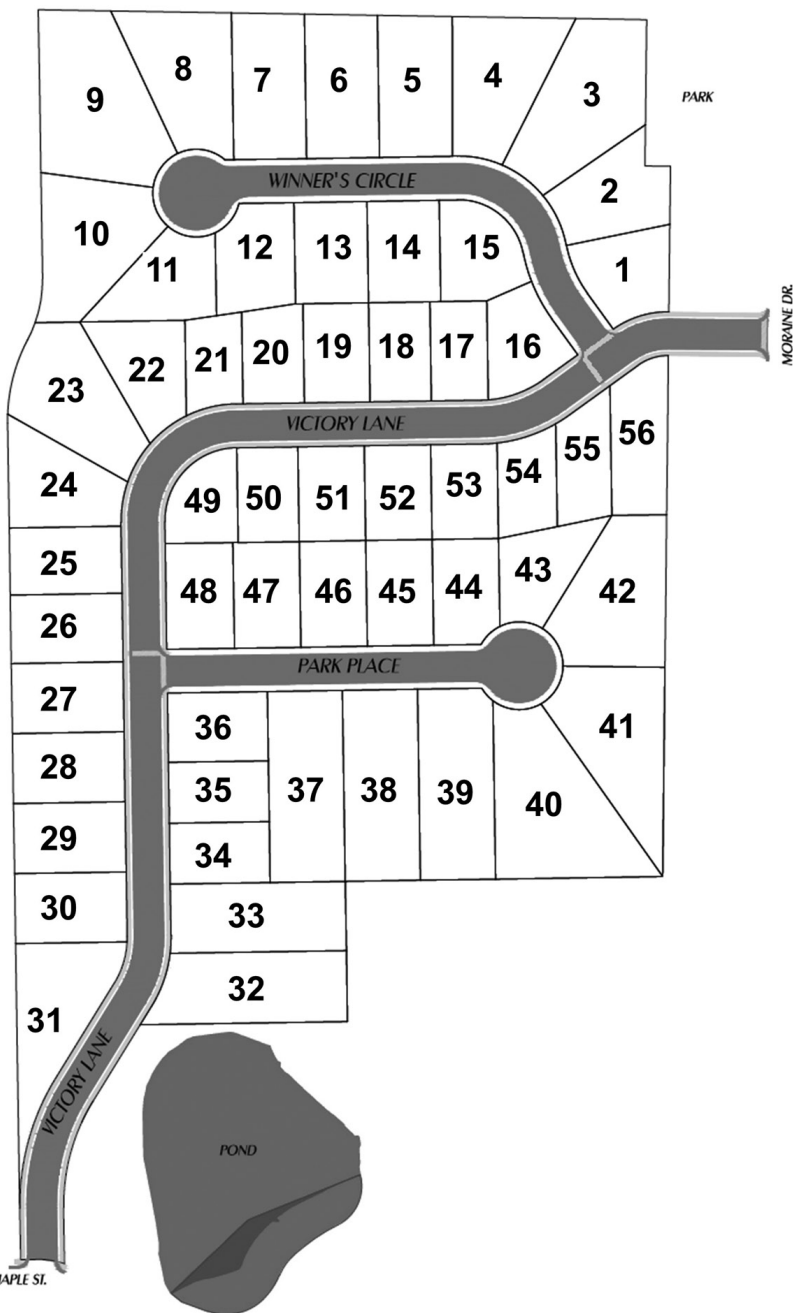
The Werner family has not only historical ties to Elkhart Lake, but is also at the heart of the community's newest residential development.

Bob Werner recalls being connected to Elkhart Lake from the days of his youth.

His family was a partner in the development of Point Elkhart, and owned a condo there. "I fell in love with Elkhart Lake, and remember going to Road America when I was 16. Elkhart Lake was a big part of our

nights and weekends and I got to know the community.

Later on, the Werner family bought Thielmann's Market on Rhine Street. "My brother was running the market and I can recall delivering brats to Road America for the races," he said.

Today, the Werner connections in Elkhart Lake have come full circle with Werner Homes taking the lead role in developing Victory Park, a 56-lot residential development located northeast of Elkhart Lake's downtown.

"We have been working on getting this project off the ground for the past four years," Werner said. The groundbreaking for the new subdivision took place May 26. "The roads are being cut in, and we are looking to start building homes in Victory Park in September," Werner said. "We already sold four lots, even though the properties were only on the market for a week."

Werner commended the Village of Elkhart Lake for their work in helping to bring the project from dream to reality.

Beyond that, Werner Homes feels the amenities offered in Elkhart Lake are conducive to great homebuilding opportunities. "Elkhart Lake is a hidden gem in our county. In 2014, the business was booming and in need of more space.

for more than six years.

The newest of the three structures, now the Precision warehouse, was in good enough shape to pass with a thorough cleaning.

The building that became the Precision Floors showroom required a complete transformation inside and out. One of the premier flooring showrooms in Eastern Wisconsin, the facility held its grand opening in 2015.

The addition of a Domino's Pizza franchise was added in 2016.

A third piece of the property revitalization featured a collaborative effort between Precision Floors and Susan Radke, the owner of Seranya Studios Art Boutique. Today, that space houses the Seranya Studios and the Hub Studio Cafe.

Love for installing remains

Despite all the twists and turns of growing the business, Zurn's greatest love re-

mains with the art of installation.

"It was always my dream to get into the retail portion of the business. I remain passionate about flooring, and I love the installation side of the business to this day. 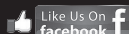

Since its inception in 1965, Big Brothers Big Sisters Sheboygan County has provided mentoring and support services to more than 20,000 kids in this area.

But, they haven't done it without a lot of help from their friends, particularly those big friends, big brothers and big sisters who make the program possible by lending a few hours a month from their busy schedules to serve as a friend and mentor to children age five through high school graduation.

The Sheboygan County agency is Wisconsin's oldest, with the Big Brothers and Big Sisters merging under one entity in 1982.

A new member of the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce in 2020, BBBS Sheboygan County is part of a larger national organization that was founded in 1904 by a New York judge who saw the needs of children passing through the legal system.

Remaining focused

"Throughout the years, the mission of Big Brothers Big Sisters has remained incredibly focused," BBBS Sheboygan County Chief Executive Officer Denise Wittstock said. "We continue to pair kids facing challenges with a trusted caring adult to build a friendship and cultivate all the guidance and mentoring that comes with that relationship."

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Sheboygan County supports kids age five through high school graduation, with approximately a 50-50 split between serving matches for girls and boys.

About half of the children are children of color, with more than 80 percent living in circumstances where they either receive free or reduced lunch at school, or have other food insecurity issues.

About 17 percent of the children served have incarcerated parents.

Two models of service

Big Brothers Big Sisters continues to serve kids through two different programs.

The traditional model is a community-based program, where a child and an adult spend time together doing activities in the community. "These are normal things friends would do together like gardening, going to movies, having an ice cream, or doing yard work," Wittstock said.

The parent of the child and the Big Brothers Big Sisters organization are the other two important partners in that relationship.

About 15 years ago, BBBS added a second program.

A bit more structured, this model is school-based, with a focus on mentoring for students in elementary and middle school settings. Kids are referred for this program option by teachers or school staff.

The referrals come from school personnel who believe that a mentoring presence could be helpful. Again, parents are critical in this effort to help children transition into the secondary education platform or to a community-based program.

With 240+ affiliates around the United States, Big Brothers Big Sisters is the largest single mentoring organization in the country. "Our programs have been proven as a foundational model for the juvenile justice system and for juvenile delinquency programs in offering help for the positive development of young people," Wittstock added.

Positive outcomes

From Wittstock's perspective the results from the nationwide federation have shown an overwhelming positive impact.

First, the participants have demonstrated a high-level increase in social acceptance and social competence. "The data shows that they have improved self esteem when they can become part of a peer group. This helps them build healthy relationships with others in their age groups," Wittstock shared.

Second, the participants have shown they are less likely to make poor choices when it comes to risky behaviors such as gang participation, substance abuse, truancy and violence. Having a trusted, reliable adult friend or mentor helps improve this type of decision making.

Finally, the program has helped students elevate their expectations about life in high school and beyond. "This allows them to see opportunities despite their circumstances. About 80 percent of the students have shown an increase in expectations.

"Our team, our professional staff, links arms with caring adults and caring parents/guardians to foster this improved self esteem. It helps kids on a path to their true potential," Wittstock said.

Staggering statistics

Sheboygan County isn't immune from the challenges facing families and young people.

When poverty is defined as an income of \$26,200 or less for a family of four, that places 6 percent of the households, or 4,000 kids in that category.

"This translates into kids living in unstable housing, facing barriers to access for education and health care and varying degrees of neglect and abuse," Wittstock added.

"And, there is no stereotypical snapshot of the child or family that partners with BBBS. Families look very different than they have in the past. We have many kids in our program, referred for a wide range of reasons."

Organization has a big problem Wittstock maintains that BBBS has what is known as a "BIG" problem—or maybe better stated as a "BIG" challenge.

As an organization with two bigs in



its name, Big Brothers Big Sisters simply needs a lot more "biggs"—caring people who will fill the role of Big Brother or Big Sister.

"We need BIGS. That's one program 'supply' we can't buy!" Wittstock pointed out.

"A lot of people we talk to tell us they aren't sure if they 'qualify' to serve as a mentor to a young person," Wittstock noted. "The answer is simple. If you are a good human being, you are life qualified." By spending time with their younger "match," the Big Brother or Sister is often teaching simple life skills by being themselves.

"By doing normal things with them, you can change the trajectory of life for a young person and have a big impact on your own life at the same time," Wittstock said.

"There are no financial expectations, and the activities you take part in can simple be showing them the things you do normally," she added.

Big Brothers Big Sisters Sheboygan County is always searching for new "BIGS." And, the new recruits don't have to walk their pathway of mentoring alone. They benefit from having a trained professional staff from BBBS partner with them for the duration.

"It all boils down to this. There is a need. It's not hard to make a friend. And you are going to be amazed at the benefits you'll see in your own life," Wittstock said.

fellow students and staff, and especially graduation. I feel for our staff members who missed having the daily contact on-site with the students—one of the primary reasons people go into education and/or choose to work in the school setting. It would be easy to outline all that “we’re missing” and focus on the negatives, but instead I want to highlight the positives I have seen displayed and modeled by the actions of so many. Trying times can bring out the best or the worst in people. I can say from my firsthand experiences as it relates to our District, our community and supporting our “ELGS family,” I have seen only the best.

There have been so many positives. While our school building has been closed, the LEARNING has continued. As an essential service, the “mandates” allowed us to do what was necessary to facilitate our students’ instruction; run our food service and Child Care; and keep our daily operations functioning. But with the dedication, commitment and support of our staff, students, families, and community, we accomplished so much more. There were, and continue to be, many challenges along the way, but the success stories about perseverance, resilience, growth, hope and encouragement far outweigh the obstacles.

Teachers: Within 48 hours, teachers were able to change the way they delivered instruction to meet the needs of doing it virtually. While this didn’t happen without “bumps” along the way, staff continued to adjust, adapt and put in much time and energy to not only deliver instruction, but to be there to offer support and encouragement to not only their students, but to their parents—who in many cases, became their partner and co-teacher in educating the students. From all the contacts made between home and school, the relationships that were built will have long-lasting effects. Students will look back and remember not only what they “lost” this year, but hopefully also what they gained—such as reading “bedtime” stories to their teachers, creating “obstacle courses” for physical education, making recipes for their family to try out their culinary skills, enjoying a day off of instruction due to “Sunshine” instead of “Snow,” participating in the “Great Art Challenge,” viewing the weekly “informational, yet highly entertaining videos” created by Mr. Faris and Mr. Fischer, and so much more.

Students and Parents/Guardians: Although this was “not what either signed up for,” they rose to the challenge and put forth their best effort. Students, overall,

in spite of the disappointments of what they were missing, were able to refocus their energy on learning in a new manner. They displayed creativity, adaptability and an amazing amount of resiliency. Also they honed their problem-solving and communication skills—which not only helped them continue their learning process but are skills which will benefit them throughout their lives. Parents became “co-teachers” for their children. While always a part of their students’ educational process, learning virtually brought this involvement to a new level. With all that our parents had already on their plates, they took on this new responsibility and gave it their best. We could not have asked for more. Thank you, parents!

ELGS Staff Members: In addition to the teachers putting in long hours to meet both the students’ needs and parents’ schedules, the administration, supervisory and support staff continue to do their jobs and more. For example, instructional aides supported students with their lessons, along with delivering materials/meals and helping the office/maintenance staff with various projects; cleaning/maintenance staff are busy cleaning, painting and completing projects so the schools are ready for the students’ return; office staff continue to keep the school’s processes organized and communication flowing; and our IT staff ensure all are “connected.” While many people were quarantined at home, these staff members were often at school—doing what was needed to help the students learn, have our facilities ready and provide support for our families. We also want to acknowledge and thank the families of our staff, for their willingness to share their spouse/parent/significant other with us during these trying and challenging times. We know that wasn’t always easy to do.

Food Service and Child Care: There was no “break” in service for these staff members. Bridget and Lanette continue to provide a full meal for 17 families (approx. 120 main meal entrees), along with supplemental items such as fruit, milk, veggies, snacks, etc., for each day of the week. In addition, a gift card was provided weekly to buy other necessities—diapers, cleaning supplies, etc.

Diane and her staff, Holly and Lynn, continue to keep the Child Care facility open so parents who needed to work due to being an “essential” service, have a place for their children to go. This service is also

available to our other District families as more are returning to work. If interested, don’t hesitate to contact Diane Schwaller.

I cannot begin to express the pride and gratitude I feel for our staff for all they have done and given to not only educate our students, but by their actions also demonstrate how much they care. We often say we have a “family feel.” During this time, the actions taken by so many spoke much more loudly than these words alone.

Community: However, the “family feel” of helping each other when in need, went far beyond the walls of the school. Our ability to be there to help our families would not have been possible without the added support from the community. I don’t know where to even begin to recognize and thank all the donations of goods, food, gift cards, supplies, meals and financial assistance that was received. While education is important, we knew for some families, it would be difficult to focus on helping their children learn when they had other worries on their mind, such as feeding their families, getting basic supplies, paying their utilities, etc.

But that’s where you, as community members, stepped up. Your generosity knew no bounds. Also the “geographic” range of our donors had no limits. Donations came in from around the country. Many of you have not only given once, but continue to give! As of May 25, approximately \$67,000 has been either donated to the District directly or channeled through the Education Foundation to provide assistance to those families in need with meals, food boxes, and gift cards to purchase other necessary items. Businesses and organizations are also offering help via hosting “fundraisers” or providing financial assistance for utility bill payment via ElkhartCares. Our restaurants, who

are facing challenges of their own to keep their operations going, are sharing with us food items and tasty entrees to supplement the meals we are providing to our families. While there were 12 families when we began this “wrap around” support program in March, we are currently assisting approximately 40 families (23 more in addition to the 17 receiving meals). We have additional volunteers who help us in many ways, such as delivering meals, creating messages to be shared, posting “encouraging” signage, etc. At this time, our plans are to continue the “meal” service through June 22, but to keep the bi-weekly delivery of “food boxes” provided by the Sheboygan County Food Share continuing throughout the summer. These “food box deliveries” will be supplemented with additional food items, cleaning/hygiene products and gift cards, as long as we are able to fund doing so with the donations that have been provided.

In summary, when this all began, as a District, we had two primary intentions:

Provide the best educational experience to our students as possible, and

Give our families any support, assistance and encouragement that was needed/necessary.

Due to the efforts of ALL, which went well beyond the ELG School District boundaries, we were able to make our intentions reality. This “family feel,” with the willingness of so many joining together to bring hope and needed assistance to not only to our students, but also to their families, are the “positives” on which I believe we all should focus on right now. I have always stated ELG is a special community – caring and supportive. Thanks for once again proving me correct. Take care...Stay Well.

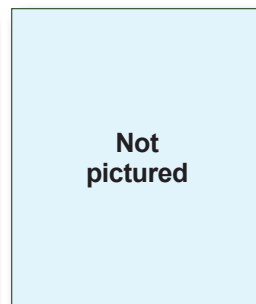

Glacial Lakes Conservancy Hosts Online Auction

Many of you may know that our local land trust is Glacial Lakes Conservancy (GLC). "Sheboygan Area Land Conservancy" was founded in 1996 to preserve and protect natural areas, shore land, and open farmland spaces. Renamed in 2004, GLC's area of responsibility now spans five counties: Sheboygan, Manitowoc, Fond du Lac, Kewaunee, and Calumet counties. The nonprofit land trust offers land conservation options, organizational support, and technical guidance to landowners within these five counties. GLC owns four properties: William F. Christel Woods and Wetlands Preserve, Grasshopper Hill Preserve, Charles & Winifred Spring West Twin River Preserve, and Willow Creek Preserve, and also holds 25 conservation easements (five of these are located within the Village of Elkhart Lake). Today GLC oversees 1700 preserved acres in the local area.



By all counts, it is a fledgling organization with a membership of 270 donors and two staff members. GLC looks to expand this in the future by getting YOU involved!

With this COVID 19 crisis, GLC has had to adjust their format for fundraising and for hosting events. Their spring Annual Meeting/Dinner, usually held at The Osthoff, will now be replaced with a virtual online auction on **June 24 - June 28, 2020**. Local residents can support GLC by donating an auction item (or opportunity) or assisting in raising funds by signing up to bid on items via the auction link on their website, glaciallakes.org. The virtual fundraiser event will be accessible for attendees to browse items, artwork, and events for sale in early June. There are some lovely handmade, home grown, and one-of-a-kind items already being donated to GLC; don't miss a chance to participate! 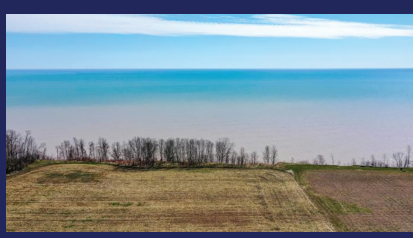

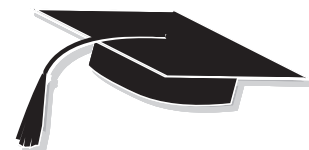

Elkhart Lake Village update

Please Keep Elkhart Lake Safe-COVID-19 Update

On May 18, 2020, the Village Board approved the guidelines set by Sheboygan County and the WEDC. Some helpful websites include:

The Board set capacity limits at all Village Parks, including the resident beach. As of May 18th, the playground equipment will remain closed as will the restroom facilities at all facilities. In regards to the basketball court at June Vollrath Park, they will remain open for shooting and family unit games, if social distancing begins to be a problem on the courts the Board will close the courts again. The capacity for the resident beach will be 60 people, Village Square Park 50 people, Lions Park 100 people, and June Vollrath Park 100 people. These capacities are to ensure social distancing can occur. Signs will be posted at the parks this week about the capacity and reminding people to social distance. These items will all be reviewed again on June 1, 2020. The restrooms need to remain closed at this time, as the WEDC guidelines state restrooms need to be sanitized every two hours, which at this point is not possible. These closures will be reviewed on June 1st.

The Village has put hand sanitizer dispensers in the Village Square Park and the downtown area. The Village is working on getting additional sanitizing stations available for Lion's Park and June Vollrath Park.

The Village is selling resident beach passes. Please drop the appropriate fee with your name, address, phone number in the police dropbox. If you have question, please call 920-876-2122.

The Village Square parking lot will be closed to accommodate tables for the local businesses to expand their outdoor seating. The lot will be closed for parking through June 15th and then re-evaluated at the Village Board meeting that evening.

As always we ask that you remain at home if you are not feeling well, practice social distancing, wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands, cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.

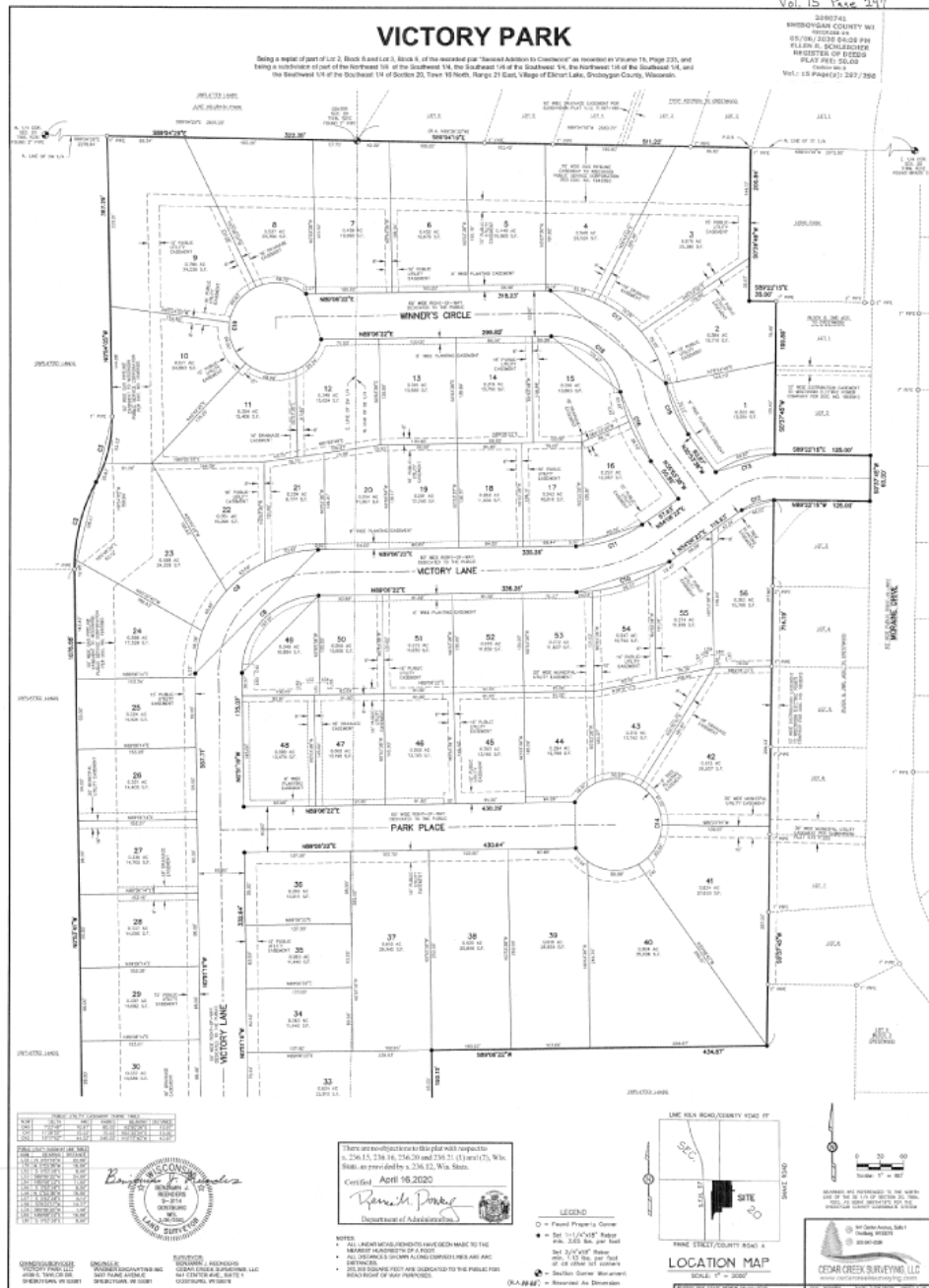

Beach Pass Information

The Village is reminding people that the Village beach is for residents of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Joint School District only, per Village Ordinance. A new pass is needed this year. The police will be monitoring beach use more frequently. The prices of the passes are \$5 for residents and \$30 for school district residents, which are good for an even and odd year (this is the first year of the beach pass). The price of replacement passes is \$25 for Village residents and \$50 for school district residents. We are encouraging rental properties to have their guests use Fireman's Park. This is the public access to the lake that should be used for guests. Beach passes are now available. Some of the other regulations include, but are not limited to:

fee (\$7.00 per spayed or neutered dog and \$14.00 per dog if not spayed or neutered), plus a \$5.00 late fee.

Village Ordinance - 8.32 Animal Feces

Any person owning or having control of any animal shall clean up the feces of such animal immediately and dispose of it in a sanitary manner when the animal has defecated on the property of another or on public property. Please be aware, the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and street (parkway), the street, lake street walkway, and all parks and parking lots are public property!!

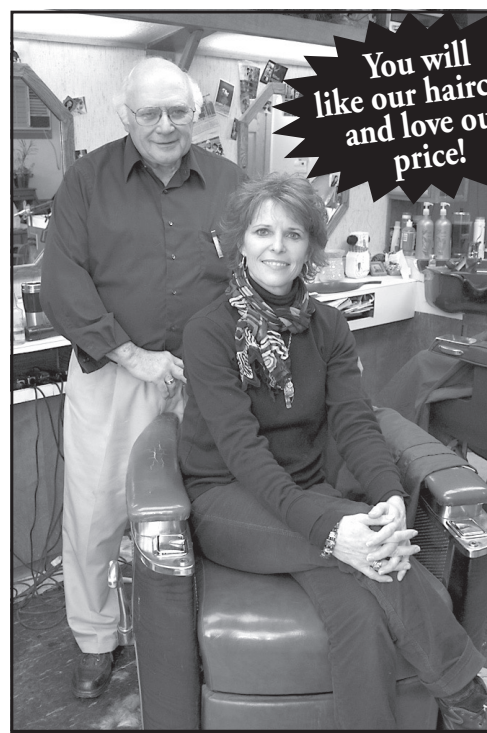

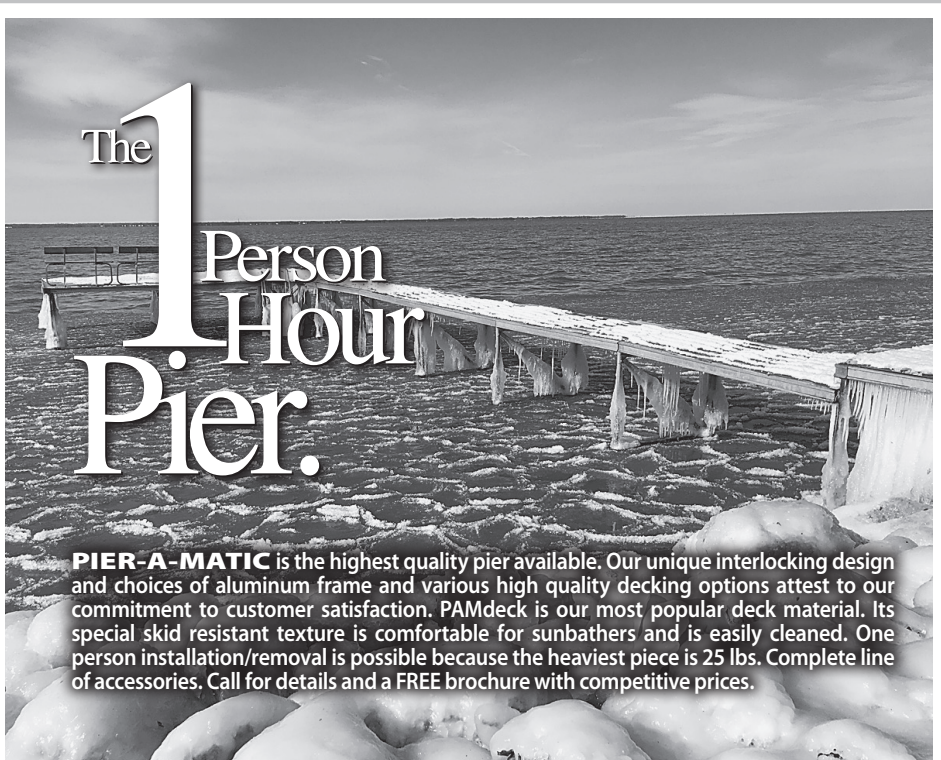

Designed to fit a student's life schedule, iFlex allows students to take courses online, face-to-face, or flex between the two. It gives students maximum flexibility in course delivery and scheduling. Students will be able to attend courses with a schedule that meets their needs, rather than the other way around.

"Prior to COVID-19, the college was planning for the expansion of flexible course delivery offerings, and COVID-19 is giving us good reason to finalize plans to roll these out on a larger scale for fall," said Vice President of Instruction James Lemerond. "After transitioning 691 courses from in-person to online learning in two weeks last month, we are confident we can

be ready for the fall so more students can benefit from the flexible advantages these delivery options offer."

But as a technical college, there are some courses LTC cannot offer online. Examples include criminal justice-law enforcement, emergency medical technician (EMT), nursing, mechatronics technician apprenticeship, CNC technician/machine tool operation, electro-mechanical, and welding. These programs will continued to be offered in-person, on campus, due to assessment requirements following guidance provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Wisconsin Department of Health Services.

Providing all students with the resources they need to be successful, whether they are on campus or in their homes, is also a top priority for the college. For students in need of technology, such as a laptop or hotspot, they may contact the college for assistance. The college will continue loaning equipment so students are able to create a classroom in their homes. In addition, each student will have access to virtual services such as advising, counseling, tutoring, and other support services.
