



It was almost the end of June 2019 when I received a call in the late evening from the police department, requesting our help with a possible cruelty case. The details given were sketchy, but the police requested us to help remove the body of a dead dog from a carrier. There were other animals alive that needed help.

It did not take long to get in touch with two employees and we were on our way to the address given. During the ride to a cruelty complaint, I usually try to think of other things other than the possibility of what lies ahead. I am usually not successful in that attempt and consider all the horrible things that I may be about to see. This was no different, but there was no way to prepare for the cruelty I was about to witness.

When we arrived at the address, the police officers were waiting for us. The body of a dead dog was in a carrier by the side of the apartment. Another dog was inside the apartment and appeared to be in okay condition. A rabbit in a cage was outside beside the dead dog. Rabbits cannot tolerate heat and it was a typical hot, muggy June evening in Danville. The rabbit was dehydrated and emaciated.

Both the dog that was alive and the rabbit were seized, along with the body of the deceased dog. We petitioned the General District Court and received ownership of the surviving animals. Cruelty charges were pressed and prosecuted; judgment was given and justice was served.

The surviving dog, a Doberman, was adopted. The rabbit was not and stayed with us. He allowed volunteers to play with him, enjoyed toys and treats, and gained a lot of weight.

That particular cruelty case was the stuff of nightmares. We tried to make sure the rabbit had a good life, but we still realized he needed to be in a home where he could receive a lot of attention and a lot of time outside his cage. Other rabbits were adopted during his time at the shelter and that was a good thing; still, we wanted him to find a home.

Finally, something wonderful happened! A family that adopted another rabbit from us in December adopted him. He went to his new home this past Monday and reports are that newly-named Brownie is loving his new home, his new human brother and sister, and his new rabbit brother and sister.

The nightmare of that June night still is in our memory; however, we will concentrate on the fact that the Doberman and the rabbit were saved.





FREE DRIVE-THRU COVID-19 TESTING THIS **WEEK IN DANVILLE AND CHATHAM**

(DANVILLE, Virginia) - The Pittsylvania-Danville Health District will offer free drive-thru COVID-19 screening and testing on Friday, June 5 at O. T. Bonner Middle School, 300 Apollo Ave. in Danville, and Saturday, June 6 at Chatham Middle School, 11650 U.S. Highway 29 in Chatham. Both testing sites will operate from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., or as long as supplies last. One thousand tests will be available at each site.

(Access to Apollo Ave. and the Bonner Middle School site on Friday will be from Audubon Drive only, NOT from Piney Forest Road.)

"We are pleased to announce these community-wide testing events, and these test results will give us a good indicator of the prevalence of the disease in our community," said Scott Spillmann, M.D., M.P.H., director of the Pittsylvania-Danville Health District. "But test results are only part of the picture. And a negative test today is not a vaccine; it doesn't protect you from a possible exposure tomorrow. We know community transmission of COVID-19 has been widespread since late March, and we know the best protection for each of us comes from personal precautions, including wearing face coverings, practicing good hygiene and social distancing. That's how we protect ourselves and those around us."

These are drive-thru events. Testing is available to those age 10 years and older. All persons must remain in the vehicle, and no walk-ups will be tested. Those seeking tests should be seated near a window of the vehicle.

"Those with symptoms of respiratory illness are encouraged to come and be tested, but anyone who seeks a test will receive one," added Dr. Spillmann. "Everyone is welcome."

Tests are available on a first-come, first-served basis. No insurance is needed. No appointment is needed. This is a free service. This event is held in partnership with the City of Danville, Pittsylvania County and the Virginia Department of Health. Additional testing opportunities are being planned.

To protect yourself and healthcare workers, please wear a cloth face covering or mask. Please keep at least six feet of distance between yourself and other people at all times. Please tell the testing providers if you have any symptoms of COVID-19, including fever, deep cough or shortness of breath, or believe that you may have been exposed to someone with COVID-19.

To lower the risk of spreading respiratory infections, including COVID-19, the Virginia Department of Health encourages everyone to:

- Stay home as much as possible, especially if you are at higher risk of serious illness. If you must go out in public, wear a cloth face covering;
- Stay home when you are sick;
- Avoid contact with sick people;
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your coughing or sneezing; hands) when
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds: alcohol-based hand sanitizer if soap and water are not availuse an able:
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth;
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces;
- If you are experiencing symptoms, call your doctor;
- Practice social distancing. Maintain at least six feet of space between and other individuals when out in public; and vourself
- Avoid close contact with crowds of any size, and avoid any crowd of more than 10 people.

Emergency SNAP Benefits Will Be Released in June

Richmond, VA (June 1, 2020) - Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) participants will continue to receive emergency benefits during the month of June as part of the Virginia Department of Social Services' ongoing efforts to provide additional food assistance to households during the COVID-19 pandemic. The benefits will be automatically loaded to recipients' SNAP Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) cards on June 17.

Eligible households include SNAP participants who are not already receiving the maximum allotment as part of their regular monthly benefit. Households do not have to take any action, and will receive their usual June benefits on their normal issuance date.

The status of future emergency benefits beyond the month of June is unknown at this time, pending decisions by the United States Department of Agriculture Food and Nutrition Service.

SNAP participants with questions related to their benefits are encouraged to contact their local department of social services or visit CommonHelp at commonhelp. virginia.gov to access account information. Additional assistance is also available by contacting the Enterprise Customer Service Center at 1-855-635-4370.

The Value of Using Irrevocable Trusts in Medicaid Planning (Part 1 of 2)

People often wonder about the value of using irrevocable trusts in Medicaid planning. Certainly gifting of assets can be done outright, not involving an irrevocable trust. Outright gifts have the advantages of being simple to do with minimal costs involved, including the cost of preparing and recording deeds and the cost of preparing and filing a gift tax return. Many financial institutions have their own documents they use for changing ownership of assets so there are typically no out-of-pocket costs for the transferor. So why consider an irrevocable trust? In this month's article, we will talk about some of the benefits of utilizing irrevocable trusts.

First of all, why complicate things with a trust? Why not just keep the planning as simple and inexpensive as possible? The short answer here is that every situation is different and gift transaction costs are only part of what needs to be considered. Many important benefits that can result from gifting in trust are forfeited by outright gifting. These benefits are what give value to using irrevocable trusts in Medicaid planning.

Prior to state implementation of the federal Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 (DRA) in recent years (with the exception of California), federal Medicaid law contained a bias against trusts: Most transfers of assets to trusts had a 5-year lookback period, whereas there was a 3-year lookback period for non-trust transfers. This different standard induced many clients to elect outright gifting in preference to gifting in trust. The DRA leveled the playing field by imposing a 5-year lookback period for ALL transfers. Removal of the bias against trusts shifted the discussion of elder law attorneys with clients to the real benefits of gifting in trust versus gifting outright.

Key benefits of gifting in trust are:

- Asset protection from future creditors of beneficiaries
- Preservation of the Section 121 exclusion of capital gain upon sale of the settlors' principal residence (the settlor is the trustmaker)
- Preservation of step-up of basis upon death of the settlors
- Ability to select whether the settlors or the beneficiaries of the trust will be taxable as to trust income
- Ability to design who will receive the net distributable income generated in the trust
- Ability to make assets in the trust non-countable in regard to the beneficiaries' eligibility for means-based governmental benefits, such as Medicaid and Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Ability to specify certain terms and incentives for beneficiaries' use of trust assets
- Ability to decide (through the settlors' other estate planning documents) which beneficiaries will receive what share, if any, of remaining trust assets after the settlors die
- Ability to determine who will receive any trust assets after the deaths of the initial beneficiaries
- Possible avoidance of need to file a federal gift tax return due to asset transfer to the trust

We will briefly discuss each of these potential benefits listed here in sequence. Each of these potential benefits depends on the specific language selected in the design and drafting the trust. None of them is automatic or inherent in every trust. Thoughtful planning and careful drafting is necessary to take advantage of the benefits available, thus it is important to understand how and why each benefit comes about. This article is just an introduction to these topics, and is not intended as a specific do-it-yourself guide. It is highly recommended to consult with a Certified Elder Law Attorney before starting any Medicaid Planning/Asset Protection!

Asset Protection from Future Creditors of Beneficiaries

A central benefit of gifting in trust is to protect the gifted assets from the creditors and predators of the beneficiaries. This is accomplished by means of a spendthrift provision – special provisions in the trust that make trust assets not subject to attachment, foreclosure, garnishment, or a laundry list of undesirable actions by the creditors of the beneficiaries.

Preservation of Section 121 Exclusion of Capital Gain on Sale of Principal Residence

Section 121 of the Internal Revenue Code (Tax Code) creates an exclusion from capital gains tax of up to \$250,000 of capital gain in the taxpayer's principal residence when it is sold if the taxpayer owned and lived in it at least two of the past five years before the sale (only one of the past five years if the homeowner had to move to a nursing home). If there are two qualifying co-owners, they can each exclude \$250,000 of gain upon sale in such circumstances. This is a very valuable benefit that has been in the Tax Code since 1997. A trust can preserve this benefit if it is a "complete grantor trust" – a grantor trust as to both income and principal. On the other hand, a residence gifted outright to someone and then sold by the successor would need to qualify for the Section 121 exclusion based on the ownership of the donee to avoid capital gain in excess of the adjusted cost basis of the donor. Our senior population often has owned their home since the late 1940s, 1950s or 1960s, so a huge amount of appreciation in value has occurred since then.

Preservation of Step-Up of Basis

When an appreciated asset is included in a decedent's taxable estate for federal estate tax purposes, it receives step-up (or down) of basis to the date of death value under Section 1014 of the Tax Code. Normally gifted assets pass to gift donees

with "pass through basis"; that is, the donees receive the assets with the donor's adjusted cost basis, rather than the date of gift value of the assets. If, however, something pulls the assets back into the taxable estate of the donor upon the donor's death, the donee will own the asset at that point with the donor's date of death value as his or her basis, rather than the donor's original adjusted cost basis. For highly appreciated assets, such as the donor's home or stocks that he or she owned for a long time, obtaining step-up of basis can be a huge benefit for minimizing or eliminating capital gains tax when the donee later sells the assets. This benefit of step-up in basis can easily be forfeited by outright gifting. However, a provision in an irrevocable trust that pulls the property back into the taxable estate of the settlor upon the death of the settlor can preserve step-up of basis for benefit of the donee. With the amount of assets that can pass free of federal estate tax being well beyond the value of most Medicaid planning clients' estates, estate inclusion and step-up of basis is generally a great benefit to design into the trust, without any actual tax liability. A Limited Power of Appointment retained by the settlor can accomplish this. Other provisions can also cause taxable estate inclusion.

Ability to Select Whether Trust Income is Taxable to Settlors or Beneficiaries

This brings us to the topic of "grantor trusts." Grantor trusts are treated by the Tax Code as "owned" by the settlor (also called the grantor) for income tax purposes. As mentioned above, preservation of the Section 121 exclusion of capital gain upon the trustee's sale of the settlor's primary residence that was earlier funded into the trust requires that the trust be a "grantor trust" as to both income and principal. The creation and significance of grantor versus non-grantor trust status takes an entire seminar or article unto itself, so can only be touched upon lightly here. However, the choice of whether a trust will be a grantor or non-grantor trust and how that will be accomplished are key decisions! For example, it may be important that income generated in the trust not be taxed to the settlor. This requires non-grantor trust status, which necessitates that every trust provision that would cause grantor trust status be avoided in the drafting of the trust. In other examples, however, grantor trust status is important as a goal for tax reasons, or if the settlors are to receive income from the trust.

Ability to Design Who Will Receive Trust Income

Unlike an outright gift, by which the donor gives up the right to receive income generated by the transferred assets, an irrevocable trust can be designed so funding constitutes a completed gift for Medicaid purposes although the settlor reserves the right to receive income from the trust. This is an attractive option for some seniors, although it does result in an inherent downside for Medicaid planning purposes: Any income that the trustee has the power to distribute to the settlor will be counted for Medicaid eligibility purposes, even if the trustee decides not to actually distribute the income to settlor. Some seniors avoid trustee discretion by making distribution of all trust net income to them mandatory, rather than discretionary. In this case, the income would also be counted for Medicaid eligibility purposes as well. Others go the entirely opposite direction by prohibiting the trustee from distributing any income to the settlor, thereby ensuring that trust income will not be part of the settlor's cost of care budget when the settlor is on Medicaid. There are several factors to weigh in such decision-making, but the key point for this discussion is that use of an irrevocable trust in Medicaid planning gives the client these design choices, whereas an outright gift will simply not.

How to Make the Most of Your Telehealth Appointment

Dear Savvy Senior,

I manage a large doctor's clinic that treats hundreds of seniors each month. We are moving to more telehealth visits to help keep our patients safe at home during the coronavirus pandemic, but this new way of seeing a doctor is befuddling to many of our elder patients. Can you write a column educating patients on how to prepare for a telehealth appointment?

Regular Reader

Dear Reader,

I'd be happy to help! To help keep patients safe and at home during the coronavirus crisis more and more doctors and other health care providers are turning to telehealth (a.k.a. telemedicine) appointments, which are remote e-visits using a digital communication device like a smartphone, tablet or computer.

Although telehealth has been around for a few years now, recent updates to regulations and a surge in demand has made it the easiest way to get many different types of medical care. Most telehealth appointments today tend to be primary care or follow-up visits that can assess symptoms or check on people who have had a medical procedure. Telehealth also works well for some specialties like dermatology or mental health care (counseling/therapy) services.

So, what can patients expect from a telehealth visit, and how should they prepare?

The first step is to call your doctor's office to find out whether telemedicine visits are available and whether you will need to set up an account or install special software on your computer, phone or tablet.

Until recently, doctors were required to conduct telehealth visits through platforms such as Doxy, Thera-Link or MyChart that were compliant with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, or HIPAA. But some of those requirements have been relaxed in the current crisis, so many providers are using popular apps such as FaceTime, Skype and Zoom to conduct visits

Once you know what technology you will be using, get familiar with it. You don't want to spend the first 10 minutes of your visit trying to figure out how to unmute the audio For older patients that aren't familiar or comfortable with technology, ask a relative or friend with a smartphone, tablet or laptop to assist you.

Take the time to clarify the purpose of the televisit before it begins. Prioritize a written list of three or four issues you want to discuss with your doctor and make a list of the medicines you're taking, along with the dosages.

Also, have relevant medical devices or logs on hand, such as a penlight or smartphone flashlight for viewing a sore throat, a blood-pressure cuff and thermometer (or recent readings), blood-sugar logs if you're diabetic or a food log if you have gastrointestinal problems.

If you've received medical care at different places, such as an urgent care facility or another doctor's office, have your latest medical records with you during the telemedicine visit.

Wear loose clothing that will allow you to show your medical provider what is concerning you.

The length of the appointment may depend on the problem. A routine visit could be very quick, while others, such as a physical-therapy appointment, may last as long as a session at a clinic. Waiting rooms are sometimes replaced by virtual waiting rooms.

Before the visit ends, make sure you know the follow-up plan. Do you need to schedule an in-office visit, fill a prescription or get a referral to a specialist?

Right now, Medicare and Medicaid are covering the cost of telehealth visits (see medicare.gov/coverage/telehealth for details), and most private insurers are following suit.

If, however, you don't have a primary care physician or need urgent care, you can get help through virtual health care service like Doctor on Demand (doctorondemand.com) or TeleDoc (teladoc.com). These services currently do not accept original Medicare, but they may be covered by private insurers including some Medicare Advantage plans – be sure you check.


A REALLY EARLY GRADUATION

Rising Food Costs

Have your food expenses gone up recently? Even if your local grocery isn't spiking the prices, it's now costing more to get what we need.

Grocery delivery: Delivery prices are running to \$10 and more in most places. Usually those involve a personal shopper who selects your items from your list and delivers them to your door. Sometimes they'll call while shopping to inquire about alternative items. Typically the store will have a minimum purchase amount.

Pickup: Even if you go to the store to pick up your groceries, there's a fee, typically between \$5 and \$10. Granted, a store employee has gone around the store picking up the items you chose online, but it does add to the cost. Again, there's a minimum purchase amount.

There is another option: Meals on Wheels. If you're having trouble accessing food, Meals on Wheels has received new temporary guidance from the government, and the qualifications have changed. At this point if you're over age 60 and staying home to avoid the virus, or if you're under age 60, have a disability and live with someone who receives Meals on Wheels, you may qualify for help. One of the requirements is being at nutritional risk. If you can't get what you need from a store or can't afford the additional costs, you may qualify. If you're staying home to avoid the virus and can't afford food delivery, you may qualify.

It's worth asking about, surely. At this point Meals on Wheels groups across the country are receiving cash donations, grants and federal funding, and volunteers are flooding in. So if you ask for help, you won't be taking away from others who might also need it.

To find the Meals on Wheels in your area, call the senior center, Agency on Aging or look online for Meals on Wheels in your state.

In a 12 inch pizza pan; press sugar cookie dough into the bottom (leaving an inch around the sides). You may end up using a bit less than 11/2 tubes.


Bake sugar cookie dough for around 12-15 minutes or until lightly browned.

In a large mixing bowl; beat together cream cheese, sugar, powdered sugar, lemon juice and lemon zest.

Evenly spread over the top of the sugar cookie.

Add fruit toppings; I made a circular pattern and overlapped the strawberries and kiwis slightly for extra dimension. See pictures above.

Refrigerate for at least 2 hours before serving for best
