According to a June 3, 2020 press statement from Governor Cuomo, "Restaurants in the seven regions that have already entered phase two - the Capital Region, Central New York, the Finger Lakes, the Mohawk Valley, the North Country, the Southern Tier and Western New York - can reopen for outdoor dining beginning tomorrow, June 4th. Outdoor tables must be spaced six feet apart, all staff must wear face coverings and customers must also wear face coverings when not seated."

Dear "Speakout,"

Independence Day aka Fourth of July 2020 is fast approaching. This special day comes and goes so fast in our busy lives as we take our freedoms for granted and view it as a day off from work during which we enjoy picnics and camping - which are not bad. However, we need to reflect on the birth of our country because we would not be living in the "Land of The Free" today if it were not for the things that occurred on this special day.

The first thing we should ask ourselves is why did we decide to separate from England and begin a brand new country. So many of our modern public school textbooks have been edited and revised with the hope of eliminating much of our true history. It is my hope to explain what really happened back then.

The pilgrims who came to America on the Mayflower in 1620 were seeking religious freedom and a right to express themselves freely, separate from a king's rule, as we do today.

Think of how it was for the Pilgrims to be told by the king when, where and how to attend church, worship their God, bear arms, have freedom of speech and press and operate as free citizens.

Many years later, the British Parliament enacted the Stamp Act in 1765 to gain revenue from the American colonies by exacting a stamp duty on newspapers and legal commercial documents. Our forefathers objected and the act was repealed in 1766. One result of the Stamp Act was to bring us closer to the Revolution

In late 1774, Colonial leaders adopted the Suffolk Resolves in resistance to the alterations made to the Massachusetts colonial government by the British parliament following the Boston Tea Party. The colonial assembly responded by forming a Patriot provisional government known as the Massachusetts Provincial Congress and calling for local militias to train for possible hostilities. The Colonial government exercised effective control of the colony outside of British-controlled Boston. In response, the British government, in February 1775, declared Massachusetts to be in a state of rebellion.

A few years later on April 19, 1775, the British under the leadership of Lieutenant Colonel Francis Smith and 700 British regulars were given secret orders to capture and destroy Colonial military supplies reportedly stored by the Massachusetts militia at Concord. Through effective intelligence gathering, Patriot leaders had received word weeks before the expedition that their supplies might be at risk and had moved most of them to other locations. On the night before the battle, warning of the British expedition had been rapidly sent from Boston to militias in the area by several riders, including Paul Revere and Samuel Prescott, with information about British plans. The initial mode of the Army's arrival by water was signaled from the Old North Church in Boston to Charlestown using lanterns to communicate "one if by land, two if by sea". The leader of the militiamen in Lexington was Captain John Parker.

The two elements met at Lexington just as the sun was rising on April 19th and the American Revolutionary War began. Eight militiamen were killed and the British suffered one casualty.

Think of how your lives would be today if you didn't have the right to vote, worship as you please, have your opinions expressed in your government, and have many of the freedoms we today take so often for granted. Maybe then we will learn to appreciate what our founding fathers did for us and appreciate to a greater extent Independence Day this year.

I hope to submit another article on Independence Day soon.



State Launches Contact Tracing Program

New York State recently created the NYS Contact Tracing Program, an initiative to help slow the spread of COVID-19.

If you test positive for COVID-19, a contact tracer will reach out and connect you with the support and resources you may need to quarantine. The contact tracer also works with you to identify anyone you have been in contact with over the past 14 days to trace the spread of the virus. These individuals will then hear from a contact tracer via phone and text. If they are determined to be close contacts, then they are asked to stay home to help stop the spread of COVID-19. Quarantine support and resources are arranged for these individuals, if necessary.

Any information you share with the NYS Contact Tracing Program is strictly confidential and treated as a private medical record. A contact tracer will never ask you for Social Security Numbers, bank or credit card numbers, or any other financial information.

If a contact tracer is calling you, the caller ID will most likely say "NYS Contact Tracing" (518-387-9993). The Governor's office is strongly encouraging you to answer these phone calls in order to help protect your loved ones and community.

New York Forward Loan Fund Accepting Pre-Applications

The NY Forward Loan Fund (NYFLF), recently announced by Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, is now accepting pre-applications. The \$100 million fund is a new economic recovery loan program aimed at supporting New York State small businesses, nonprofits and small landlords as they reopen after the COVID-19 outbreak and NYS on PAUSE.

The NYFLF targets the state's small businesses with 20 or fewer full-time equivalent (FTE) employees (90% of all businesses), nonprofits and small landlords that have seen a loss of rental income. The NYFLF is specifically timed to support businesses and organizations as they proceed to reopen and have upfront expenses to comply with guidelines (e.g., inventory, marketing, refitting for new social distancing guidelines) under the New York Forward Plan.

Priority will be given to industries that have been reopened. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis as regions and industries reopen, and seek to target:

- Small businesses and nonprofits employing 20 or fewer full-time equivalent (FTE) employees;
- Small businesses that have gross revenues of less than \$3 million per year;
- Nonprofits that provide direct services and have an annual operating budget of less than \$3 million per year; and
- Businesses that have not received a loan from either SBA Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) or SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) for COVID-19 in 2020.

The program is not a first-come, first-served loan program. Program information can be found on ESD's website (https://esd.ny.gov/nyforwardloans-info), as well as on the pre-application page (https://nyloanfund.com). All applications will be accepted online.

Protect Yourself and Your Pets from Rabies

Rabies is a viral disease present in saliva and nervous tissue of an infected animal that attacks the central nervous system of humans, which includes the brain and spinal cord. Rabies is transmitted from infected animals to humans; all mammals can get rabies. People can contract rabies by coming in contact with a rabid animal through a bite. Exposure may also occur if saliva from a rabid animal enters an open cut or mucous membrane, which includes your eyes, nose or mouth. It is almost always fatal once symptoms appear.

Livingston County has had confirmed rabies in raccoons, bats, cats, foxes, skunks, woodchucks and even cows in the past. With warm weather approaching, the potential for contact with wildlife increases. The Livingston County Department of Health urges residents to be aware of the danger of rabies and follow these guidelines to protect themselves against rabies:

- If you are bitten by an animal, immediately wash the wound with soap and water, seek medical attention and report the incident to the Livingston County Department of Health.
- Avoid contact with any wild animal. Be suspicious of wild animals that are unusually tame or aggressive, especially those that attack your pets. Do not attract raccoons, stray dogs, stray cats or other wild animals to your yard by feeding them.
- Avoid contact with any stray animals. Call the Livingston County Health Department regarding any contact with an animal that may be rabid.
- Teach children not to touch any animal they do not know and to tell an adult immediately if they are bitten by an animal.
- By law, all dogs, cats and ferrets must be vaccinated against rabies. Make sure horses and valuable livestock are also up-to-date on rabies vaccinations.
- Keep family pets indoors at night. Don't leave them outside unattended or let them roam free.
- Wear gloves when handling pets after any involvement with suspected rabid wild animals. Pet owners should keep a pair of thick gloves handy for just such situations. Bathe pets after wildlife encounters using rubber gloves.
- If a bat is found in your home or cabin, do not let it go. Isolate it in a single room and contact the Livingston County Department of Health to discuss the potential for exposure. In some cases the bat can be tested for rabies. Immediately report any possible contact with bats, especially contact with sleeping persons, unattended children, or individuals with impairments.

Scheduled COVID-19 testing will no longer be available at Noyes Health Services in Geneseo.

As before, patients will remain in their vehicles while getting tested to help prevent the spread of COVID-19.

The diagnostic testing will determine whether an individual is currently infected with COVID-19. This testing does not include antibody testing.

If you have COVID-19 symptoms – fever, cough, or trouble breathing – call your primary care physician. **If you do not have a healthcare provider, please call LCDOH at 585-243-7270 to see if you meet the COVID-19 testing criteria**

Your provider will order the test by faxing a requisition to (585) 335-4282. You will then call Noyes Memorial Hospital at 585-335-6001 to set up an appointment for curbside testing at Noyes Memorial Hospital, 111 Clara Barton Street. Noyes will contact you shortly before your appointment to complete registration.

Livingston County Plans for Sales Tax and State Aid Losses Position Freezing, Furloughs and Cost Cuts Round out Response Measures

In response to both realized and expected losses of revenues from major impact areas like sales tax and state aid, Livingston County government has tightened its belt.

As COVID-19-related business impacts abound, the County is on pace to experience a significant loss in sales tax revenues. "Our largest revenue center is sales tax. Reports indicate we will be far off from our budget projections given the economic calamity statewide," stated County Administrator Ian M. Coyle. Losses of 10-25% are expected with corresponding dollar totals in the \$3.5 - \$8 MM range.

Additionally, Governor Andrew Cuomo is signaling his intent to cut State Aid, another major revenue center for the County, by up to 20%. "This number, if fully materialized, is around \$4-5 MM," stated Coyle.

The County, with excellent bond ratings and a healthy fund balance, is in a better position than many to withstand the pressures but difficult decisions have been made, with many more, draconian-level cuts pending State Aid discussions.

"We have furloughed employees and processed around \$2MM in budget cuts to the 2020 adopted budget. These efforts, coupled with some surpluses in departments and one-time revenue uses will allow us some breathing room in the months ahead as we look to start work on the 2021 budget," commented Coyle. "We are prepared for some of this in that we have reserves, we have a contingency account and we have healthy fund balances. All the years of effort of this Board and these Department Heads to buy into a system of planning ahead and fiscal prudence are on full display right now as we weather this fiscal crisis."

The fiscal crisis, coupled with unemployment rates not seen since the Great Depression, will make the 2021 budget process the most difficult one on record for the County.

"Absent Federal support and/or the holding off of projected State Aid cuts, I see a large budget gap and I do not see a scenario where all county programs and services can be maintained. We cannot tax our way out of a hole that big," said Coyle.



Livingston County Warns of COVID-19 Scams

Livingston County would like to notify residents of several COVID-19-related fraud alerts recently issued by federal and state departments.

United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS): Scammers are offering fake CO-VID-19 tests to Medicare recipients in exchange for their personal information. They then use this personal information as part of a broader identity theft scam to drain the bank accounts of their victims.

PROTECT YOURSELF:

- Beneficiaries should be cautious of unsolicited requests for their Medicare or Medicaid numbers.
- Be suspicious of any unexpected calls or visitors offering COVID-19 tests or supplies. If your personal information is compromised, it may be used in other fraud schemes.
- Ignore offers or advertisements for COVID-19 testing or treatments on social media sites.
- A physician or other trusted healthcare provider should assess your condition and approve any requests for COVID-19 testing.

New York State Office of Aging: Scammers are offering grants for home repairs. Older adults are receiving postcards addressed to "resident" offering to help secure grants for home repairs.

PROTECT YOURSELF:

- Do not answer your telephone if you do not recognize the caller or number.
- Never share personal information over the telephone, like your Medicare number, Social Security number or banking information.
- Never pay a fee to a company that says it will help you get a grant.
- Block or unfriend anyone who offers unsolicited grant information on social media. Even if you are "friends" with that person – they may have been hacked.
- Only use local contractors with validated references to do work in your home.

Livingston County Encourages Residents to Participate in ROC COVID

All Livingston County residents are encouraged to sign up for ROC COVID, a health screening tool that could help prevent the further spread of COVID-19 throughout the region. Currently, there are close to 19,000 participants from 11 counties, according to the ROC COVID dashboard.

Scientists and information technology staff from the University of Rochester Medical Center and Rochester Regional Health developed ROC COVID. It is an online survey tool consisting of questions that you answer daily, even if you have no symptoms. Questions include whether you have a fever, a cough, chills or other primary COVID-19 symptoms in addition to basic demographic information.

As a participant, you will receive daily reminders to take the quick survey at ROCCOVID.org.

Common Ground Health, a regional health planning organization, will securely house and analyze collected data. The data analysis will allow for an increased understanding of COVID-19, measure efforts to slow its progression, and help determine where to focus testing or adjust stay-at-home and physical distancing requirements.

If you are a University of Rochester Medical Center or Rochester Regional Health employee, you are asked not to participate in ROC COVID; however, you should continue to respond to your own internal surveys.
