UNA's Pontius in Showcase

ARLINGTON, TX --Former University of North Alabama punter/placekicker, **Taylor Pontius** of Biloxi, MS., has been selected to play in the inaugural College Gridiron Showcase on January 31 at the University of Texas-Arlington's Maverick Stadium that will include players from all divisions of collegiate football.

Pontius was a first-team All-Gulf South Conference kicker in 2014 and twice earned GSC Special Teams Player of the Week. He was a second-team Daktronics All-Super Region 2 pick and second-team Beyond Sports Network All-Super Region 2 selection in addition to earning secondteam All-American acclaim from USA College Football.

from USA College Football. Pontius led UNA in scoring with 79 points in 2014, making 11 of 14 field goal attempts and 46 of 48 extra-point attempts. He made a school-record 54 yard field goal on the final play of the game to defeat Valdosta State 31-29.

During his two years at UNA, Pontius scored 105 total points. He will be the 37th different UNA football player to compete in a post-season all-star game. The last was **Nick Williams** who played in the 2013 NFLPA Collegiate Bowl.





smaller boats as it makes its way from Knoxville, Tennessee, to Paducah, Kentucky, making several stops along the way, including the Shoals area.

A community-wide river cleanup for the Shoals is set for May 9. A series of educational programs for students and adults will follow over the following three days. Volunteers are needed for the cleanup.

Janna Whitley, director of the Rogersville Area Chamber of Commerce, is helping coordinate the activities in the Shoals.

The upcoming journey will be Living Lands and Water's first trip down the Tennessee River. The nonprofit organization created in 1997 has removed more than 7.5 million pounds of debris from America's waterways. Along with almost 70,000 volunteers, it has helped clean 23 rivers in 20 states.

"We're looking forward to visiting the communities the

River," said Tammy Becker, programs manager for Living Lands and Waters. "We will be collecting debris at our cleanups along the way and storing it on our barge. As the pile of garbage grows, it will make a statement about how the Tennessee River and all of our rivers need more attention."

During an open house event May 10, area residents can tour the organization's barge and learn about its environmental protection efforts.

Valley Tennessee Authority is helping pay for the six-city tour of the river. Jim Hopson, public relations manager for TVA, said the event will help showcase the federal utility's work to protect the river and encourage Valley residents to take an active role in that effort.



Ask Dr. Webb

Dad has incurable cancer and we are considering hospice. No one in our family has dealt with someone dying. What do we need to do or know about before he actually dies, to make this whole event easier for everyone?

Here is a Checklist of things every family should consider when someone is diagnosed with a life-limiting disease, and obviously when considering hospice. Many have already done this even without having a terminal diagnosis! It makes for less anxiety for everyone, and more comfortable, dignified care-leaving families with better memories

1. Everyone in the family should understand no cure is possible and that he is considering hospice (unless he specifically doesn't want certain people told). However, occasionally some patients can't handle knowing they have a terminal diagnosis and families request we not tell them; each situation needs to be managed individually.

2. The family should discuss with him his preferences for care. A helpful tool for this discussion is The One Slide Project [engagewithgrace. org] - five questions about end-of-life care that everyone should talk about together.

3. Complete an Advance Directive (Living Will). This is a legal document which outlines his choices about: artificial hydration [intravenous fluids]; ventilator support; and CPR (CardioPulmonary Resuscitation), etc. You can obtain the form from our hospice, or on-line from https://www.everplans.com/articles/alabama-advance-directive-form.

4. Appoint a Healthcare Proxy or Durable (medical) Power of Attorney. This allows someone he trusts to make decisions about his treatment if he is unable to do so. This should also be the primary contact person for hospice or other health care workers.

5. Does he want to die at home? Under what circumstances would he prefer to die in hospital? For example, if the hospice was unable to keep him comfortable despite maximum drug therapy, he could be admitted under hospice to palliative care.

6. Make funeral arrangements. Does he want to be cremated? 7. Complete a property will. Are there specific items he wants given to certain people?

8. Anticipate there may be distant family members or well-meaning friends who want more done than what he wants. How will your family manage this?

9. Čhoose a hospice, sooner rather than later. The optimal time is three to six months before death, rather than when a patient becomes bed bound and dies in one to three weeks (see previous articles on hospice eligibility).

If you have decided on hospice, then our staff will help you work through this checklist.







Too Bad The Egos Aren't Underinflated

his Sunday's Super Bowl between New England and Seattle should be all about football and the history that each team can make if it wins. A Patriots win would put QB Tom Brady and coach Bill Belichick In A

in elite company with four Super Bowl wins in six appearances. The Seahawks would be the first back-to-back Super Bowl champions since the Brady-led Patriots in '04 and '05.

However, much of the discussion last week was about under-inflated footballs used by the Patriots in their 45-7 AFC championship game route of the Indianapolis Colts. Seriously?

Each team provides twelve of their own game balls for when they are on offense. The balls are inspected by game officials before each game and again at halftime of each game. The footballs are supposed to be inflated from 12.5-13.5 psi and must weigh 14-15 ounces. Eleven of the twelve Patriot footballs were apparently at least two pounds under the 12.5 psi minimum in the first half. Supposedly, twelve alternate balls were used in the second half because of those issues brought to the officials' attention during halftime.

The grip can be better with under-inflated footballs, especially in wet weather. However, under-inflation is a clear disadvantage for punters and placekickers who like firm balls. I have not played competitive football in over

The Baha'is of the Shoals would like to draw attention to a continuing and intensifying persecution of our Faith in Iran.

In the first nine months of 2014 more than 3.500 articles and video clips designed to foment hostility toward Iran's Baha'is were published in print and on the web, a figure 17 times the number published during a similar period in 2011. In addition, Baha'i businesses are increasingly being targeted for attacks with the objective of impoverishing the Baha'i community in that country. As an example, on October 25, 2014, 79 shops owned by Baha'is in the Iranian province of Kerman, were shut down by authorities. Similar actions have taken place in other parts of the country.

One of the most egregious violations of human rights is the prohibition of Faith. This flagrant discrimination will have far-reaching effects on the future of these young people and on the future of Iran. We pray for these young people in Iran and for their efforts to secure their God-given rights as human beings and citizens of that country.

Hey y'all, I have heated seats in my car! I didn't even know that existed until a few years ago. And now I have them warming my sitdown and my lumbar area. I have heated seats now, because I finally have a car this century that was made in this century. The other day I was driving home reveling in the warmth on my backside, when it dawned on me that I have spent many moments in my life chasing warmth for my backside.

In my growing up house, we didn't have central air and heat - didn't know it existed. In the summers in mv mountain house, we let the windows up to cool off. In the winters, there was a wall space heater in the kitchen and a standalone, probably 4' by 4' box heater in the corner of our small living room. First thing every winter morning I would jump out of bed in my socked feet and head to one of those heaters. Usually, I would go to the room where I heard my mama's voice. The first order of business was to warm the backside. The house was cold. We were awakened oldest to youngest. thirty years and before last week have held or thrown a football on maybe 100 occasions since that time. I purposely gauged the feel of three footballs sideby-side inflated at various levels between 13 psi, which is generally recommended, and 10.5 psi, the supposed weight of the under-inflated The difference is balls. noticable - even to me.

NFL playoff officials have all been active at the sport for several decades. They can smell an under-inflated football in their sleep. Several officials handle the footballs between every play. How could they not immediately notice a repetitive series of underinflated balls?

If a linebacker making an interception can recognize an under-inflated ball, an under-inflated ball, how can officials not immediately notice?

How would the Colts' footballs not feel tighter?

If one after another felt under-inflated, why was an official timeout not taken to look into the situation?

underinflating If creates THAT much of an advantage then why did the Pats score only 17 points in the first half (30 minutes) with under-inflated balls and 28 points in the first 20 minutes of the second half with properly inflated footballs?

How big of a deal is this really? Not much.



Everyone who's had a lost pet, including myself, knows that boulder-in-the-stomach feeling. One of our cats got out of the house when we had workmen there,

• A group of six San Diego veterinarians traveled to Best Friends Animal Society in Kanab, Utah, earlier this month to perform dental work on 32 dogs, 32 cats, one potbellied pig and one rabbit. Their goal? To help improve the pets' adoptability. "It is unrealistic for most potential adopters to take on a large health care investment when adopting a new pet," says board-certified dental specialist Brook A. Niemiec, DVM. "This makes shelter or sanctuary animals with dental disease significantly less adoptable, which means that these pets tend to have long shelter stays or require placement with rescue groups versus an adoptive family."

• Pointed cats, such as the Siamese, have light-colored bodies with darker shading on their heads, legs and tails. You probably knew that, but did you know that pointed cats are born white? If your pet has gone AWOL, don't wait around hoping for a "Lassie" return. The quicker you take action, the better your chances of finding your pet. Here's what to do.

As soon as you discover your pet is missing, put up large fluorescent-colored posters big enough that people driving by can see and read them. Use what missingpet expert Kat Albrecht calls the 5 + 55 rule: five words that people driving by at 55 miles per hour can read. For instance: REWARD LOST BLACK/WHITE CAT.

"Those are five words that a passerby driving on a major road can interpret, visualize, remember and convey to others," Albrecht says.

Check the website lostapet.org for

for your pet as they make their rounds. The mail carrier is another person who travels through your neighborhood daily and can watch for your pet.

Check the shelter right away. If there is more than one shelter in your area, check all of them — more than once. Leave a description of your pet and your contact information.

Search your yard and the surrounding area thoroughly. Cats, in particular, may hide underneath shrubbery or decks, or squeeze into spaces where you think they can't possibly fit. Dogs may simply be shut up inside a shed, garage or closet, waiting patiently to be released. Ask neighbors for permission to search their yards as well.

Leave out food and water to encourage your pet to return. The familiar smell — and hunger — may draw him out of hiding.

Pets are highly attuned to sound. Walk around the neighborhood calling them. Stand in the yard and make sounds



How To Stay Occupied During Those Long Winter Days & Nights

Uppon the arrival of winter, many people wonder about how to cope with dark skies and increased time spent indoors. Those who leave for work or school in the early morning and return in the evening may find they have little to no opportunity to see and enjoy the sun.

The transition to winter can be difficult. Certain biochemical changes take place in the body in reaction to less sunlight, and it helps to know about these changes should they prove problematic when winter hits full swing.

Many people experience seasonal affective disorder,

often referred to as SAD. SAD is marked by increased sleepiness, depression, anxiety, irritability, and lack of energy. Experts think that two specific chemicals in the brain, melatonin and serotonin, may play a significant role in SAD. These two chemicals help regulate a person's sleep-wake cycles, energy and mood. The short days and long hours of darkness in fall and winter may cause increased levels of melatonin and decreased levels of serotonin, creating the biological conditions for depression.

SAD also can inspire a craving for sugary foods or carbohydrates, which may be the body's natural way to stimulate more serotonin production or get an energy boost.

The following are some ways to feel more energized and upbeat despite the long hours of darkness.

• Spend as many hours as you can outside. When you wake up in the morning, open the curtains or blinds and soak up the sun's rays. This can help you get some vitamin D and will also suppress melatonin production, which could make you feel drowsy.

• Invest in a light therapy lamp. These lamps simulate the rays of the sun and can be particularly helpful for those who experience SAD from decreased sunlight. Follow the manufacturer's instructions to get the exposure you need. Light therapy can improve mood and decrease other SAD symptoms.

• Continue outdoor activities. Even when it is snowy or dark, life should still go on as normal. Try to maintain normal recreational schedules, making time for outdoor activities. Fresh air can be revitalizing, and studies have shown that exercise can help to combat depression. • Spend additional time with friends or family members. Routinely play host or hostess to friends and family. Hosting people in a social setting is good for the mind and can stave off feelings of cabin fever. • Host activities that take advantage of the darkness. Kids can play a rousing game of hide-and-seek in the yard while their parents light a fire in the hearth or in an outdoor fire pit and warm up with mugs of hot chocolate. Play games of laser tag or give children glow sticks so they can still

have fun outdoors.

Darker times are ahead, but people can make it through the winter months by planning activities that do not necessarily require sunlight.

Remembering **Childhood Days**

One of my dearest school's all-time greatest lifetime friends is Ernest Breland. Our lives have paralleled each other from childhood days to high school days to military days. We both came from humble beginnings, growing up in a housing project in Tuscumbia. We never knew we didn't have much but were proud of those days and nights playing football, cork ball, kick the can, 1-2-3- red light and so on.

I was excited and thrilled to see Ernest become one of Deshler High School and Florence State's all-time greatest athletes. During his career, he played for two Hall of Fame coaches: Buddy Moore at Deshler and Hal Self at Florence State. He played both offense and defense for the football Tigers in 1959 and 1960.

He was also a track star at Deshler for four years, specializing in the mile run. "Ernest was a tough football player", said Buddy Moore. "He was a leader on our team and when we faced tough situations, you could always count on him". After graduation, Breland signed a football scholarship with Florence State and became one of the

receivers.

He was named to the All-Alabama Collegiate Conference as a freshman, sophomore, junior and senior. His outstanding most accomplishment as Lion was catching a school record 11 passes in one game for 189 yards against Jacksonville State in 1965, a mark that stood for 32 years. Breland accomplished something during his career that probably could stand for a record—he never missed a single practice or game during his playing days.

He was a competitor. He loved to practice. He loved to play. And he did them both well. Breland also ran track and cross country for four years at Florence State. He served in the Alabama Army National Guard for 20 years, retiring with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.

Breland received the ultimate honor for his athletic achievements when he was inducted into the Colbert County Sports Hall of Fame in 2006. From growing up with Ernest in the housing projects as a kid, to graduating in the same class of 1961 at Deshler to serving 20 years with him in the National Guard, will always be some of my most cherished memories.



The issue of whether or Security Judge. Although this may sound wrong, there is a reason. Social Security has a very specific set of rules which define what constitutes "disability." What a doctor thinks disability

define disability. Social Security Ruling 96-6p states that the opinion of a treating doctor must be given 'controlling weight" if that opinion is supported by medically acceptable clinical and laboratory evidence and is not "inconsistent" with other evidence. "Controlling weight" means that the opinion of a treating doctor must be adopted and/or accepted by the judge. So the opinion of a treating doctor which says you can only lift 10 pounds and the doctor's

means may not be how Social Security rules

records support that limitation and there is no evidence to the contrary, then the judge must find that you can lift only 10 pounds.

The problem you face is that a nurse practitioner is not an acceptable treating source under Social Security law (20 CFR 404.1502, 416.902). Therefore, the judge is not obligated to adopt any limitations your nurse practitioner may say you have. However, if your doctor signed the form in addition to your nurse practitioner I would argue that the opinion is that of the doctor's. That said our judges are well aware

that it is often the nurse

practitioner who has actually spent significant time with he patient. Although they are not bound to give the opinion of your nurse practitioner "controlling" weight, they can choose to give a nurse practitioner's opinion significant weight and use their opinion as supporting your inability to work. Simply put, the opinion of your nurse practitioner will not be ignored but it may not win your case for you. You always want the doctor's agreement and signature for Social Security disability purposes.
