he orchestrated violence roiling an increasing number of American cities is cause for considerable concern. There are myriad explanations being offered by the media and pundits.

But the voices that are largely silent during this time of chaos are the very people who are a central factor in the lawlessness and violence that is spreading.

Our societal problems are being exponentially magnified by the decline in the quality of personnel who advance to commanding, decision-making roles in police departments and mayoral offices. This impotence and incompetence is also on full display among the elected officials serving in the House of Representatives and the Senate.

The profound lack of effectiveness of these self-important leaders in federal, state, and municipal

governments is now on display. This disappointing reality is the result of decades of decline in the abilities of people who are elected to serve the public but seem to spend far more time preening for cameras and promoting themselves to ever-higher levels in terms of title, compensation, and power.

Shoals Needs Big Census Jump

SHOALS – Statewide, Alabama has fallen to #31, a full 2 points behind the national average. Census figures remained relatively stagnant through June 4, with a few local exceptions.

Anderson added .6% to its total from last week in the town/city listing and moved up seven spots to #203. Lexington moved up four spots to #71, adding .5% to it's total. Liittlevile is up two spots to #104, adding .6%.

Conversely, Cherokee made no progress for the week, maintaining its 57.1% completion level and fell seven

group has been raising money for that project. Dred Scott lived in Florence from 1820-1830 and was involved in a controversial Supreme Court ruling in 1857, Dred Scott vs. Sanford, in which Scott unsuccessfully sued for his freedom and that of his wife and two daughters.

The May 25 death of George Floyd while in police custody in Minneapolis, Minnesota, has changed the group's position. Members now consider the Confederate monument unacceptable at the courthouse.

"We are no longer willing to live with it, in front of the space that is supposed to represent justice," she said. "That symbol is a symbol of anti-black racism. It's undeniable.

"I'd be willing to discuss it," said, Lauderdale County Commission Chairman Danny Pettus. "I don't mind talking and listening to anybody about this."

Preservation Act was passed in 2017 by the Alabama Legislature to protect architecturally significant buildings, memorial buildings, memorial streets, and

monuments. It includes a \$25,000 fine when any historic monument located on public property for more than 40 years is removed.

Bennett said Project Say Something is raising money to pay the fine.

The commission was scheduled to meet Monday, June 8.

Fountain Will Be Replaced

FLORENCE - The University of North Alabama Board of Trustees today voted to approve the restoration of the Harrison Fountain located at the Seminary St. at the Harrison Entrance of campus as part of its regularly scheduled quarterly meeting. A portion of the fountain collapsed December 18, It subsequently had to be dismantled.

"After that took place, it became clear very quickly that the fountain is a beloved element of the beautiful and historic UNA campus and would need to be fully restored to its original design in order to honor the late Laura M. Harrison, who was integral to that process," said President Ken Kitts. "The Harrison Fountain holds a special place in the hearts of our students, faculty, staff, alumni, and friends.'

The total cost for the work is anticipated to be \$967,000, with \$220,000 for the replacement of the fountain and \$747,000 for installation, hardscape, plumbing, and electrical replacement. The work will improve the entirety of Harrison Plaza. Project funding will be provided through reimbursement from the Alabama Department of Risk Management insurance fund and private donor funds.

The fountain will be replaced with materials more suitable to the north Alabama climate and will have a longer



NAMC's updated support person policy continues as follows:

· Inpatients will be limited to one well support person per day during specific hours.

• All visitors must be 16 years of age or older, will be screened upon entry and will be required to wear a mask at all times while in the facility. The support person must provide their own mask.

 Visitors who do not pass the screening at entry will be asked to reschedule their visit until they are symptom-free.

 Visitors are NOT allowed for high-risk, isolation, immunocompromised or respiratory patients who are under observation or test positive for COVID-19.

 Outpatient surgery and cath lab patients will be permitted one support person. The support person must remain in the patient's room while at the hospital.

 Obstetric Patients Support person will join the patient when admitted to the hospital and be allowed to stay overnight with the patient.

 Pediatric Patients Support person(s) will join the patient when admitted to the hospital and be allowed to stay overnight with the patient. (Pediatric patients age 10 and under are permitted two support persons.)

 Pre-Admission testing patients and outpatient procedure patients will be permitted one support person. The support person must remain in the lobby during the testing/ procedure.

Support Hours: Adult 10am-7:30pm: **Patients** Care Critical **Patients** 10am-noon.



There is almost total silence from the elected leadership in Washington of late. Few state and municipal figures, with the exception of Atlanta's mayor, Keisha Bottom, have dared to venture before a microphone during the past several months of the pandemic.

months of the pandemic.

And that silence has been magnified in the wake of the murder of George Floyd being carried out at the hands of

a uniformed police officer in broad daylight as phone cameras recorded every moment of the horror.

Few people in America have seen someone die right before their eyes. It is a thing that can change you—that moment when the life and spirit of someone you know and love, or even that of a complete stranger, leaves their body.

The videos showcasing the execution of Floyd put that moment on full display. A life was needlessly ended by an act of violence while powerless bystanders pleaded with police officers to act with decency and humanity.

The arrogance and cruelty demonstrated by an officer sworn to serve and protect the very people he was crushing sickened the nation and shocked our conscience.

Americans have been jolted awake and are focused now on the grave injustices that have become institutionalized. And many are increasingly frightened by a series of events that seem to be spiraling out of control

spiraling out of control.
Sadly, the voices of those who are motivated not by justice but rather the quest for destruction, chaos, and a collapse of our democratic system seem to be growing louder and more active than those of the huge numbers of Americans who desire constructive, systemic change in the way we are governed.

Bear in mind that some who are looting and creating mayhem are bands of opportunists and low-life thieves. But many others belong to organizations that are well-funded and have plans of action. Such groups, including Antifa, plan and direct acts that require logistics, funding, equipment, weapons, and the moving of tools of destruction to various cities in an attempt to foment unrest.

The breathtaking incompetence of the FBI and other federal agencies, coupled with a lack of resources and effective tools and tactics that should be within every police department, are today visible to all. This

inability to adequately protect businesses and law-abiding citizens from violence should enrage every American.

Antifa is just one of the more visible operators being blamed for this chaos. But the truth is that we have a much larger, deeper, and more chilling problem on our hands. There is no doubt in my mind that foreign intelligence services are orbiting in or around this issue and contributing to the violence.

They see an opportunity to further destabilize the United States. They want to roll back our influence. Unable to defeat us militarily, they want to strike at us economically and to chip away at our society, causing the population to lose confidence and trust in our system and structure of government.

We must not play into their hands. Pursuing justice in the wake of Floyd's murder is a noble aim. Creating systemic changes and identifying competent leaders who can improve our society is the right thing to do.

Allowing ourselves to devolve into chaos, violence, wanton destruction, and anarchy plays right into the hands of our nation's enemies. Americans are better than that.







Relax Relations with an Outreach

he senseless death of George Floyd in Minneapolis, Minnesota is a sweeping tragedy on so many levels. The knee-tothe-neck pressure was an unprovoked and unnecessary restraint by a member of law

enforcement against a handcuffed man on his stomach.

Such restraint is uncalled for in all but the most egregious of situations. However, none of those applied to this situation. Floyd's alleged crime of passing a counterfeit \$20 bill was not in the least severe. He was not an immediate threat to anyone, and he was not attempting to flee or resist arrest. All Floyd wanted to do was get his breath. The police officer on his neck and three others close by

denied him that right. We all have to feel for him and his family.

The stupidity is off the charts and is magnified a thousand times by the fact that it was a white on black incident. It is one of very few police interactions across the nation each year that involve death. However, this one had no rational thought or reasoning. Excessive force is not new, but our seeing this latest attrocity play out over eight minutes makes it NOW. This is another black eye for law enforcement, even though it casts a largely inaccurate and unfair light on actual police attitudes and overall race relations in America.

Tensions are running high in many urban areas, and emotions have been artificially

stoked by those seeking hightened chaos. I really appreciate how blessed we are in NW Alabama. Race relations

It changed my life. I focused my resolve to work in public policy to change destructive realities that were taking our distressed

For the past week, I sat bunkered at night in my Washington, D.C., apartment as the nation's capital was being transformed into a war zone.







COVID-19 BUSINESS **INTERRUPTION INSURANCE CLAIMS**

Business interruption insurance is one of the core coverages in a business owner's policy, offering businesses a lifeline in the event of a disaster.

Business interruption insurance, also called business income insurance, helps cover bills and payroll in the event of a disaster that forces the business to temporarily close.

Business interruption insurance can cover profits, fixed costs such as rent or mortgage payments, moving expenses to a

temporary location and other unforeseen expenses. Many policies contain civil authority coverages which means coverage is provided if a direct loss of revenue is caused when a government authority orders the closure of business, such as in the event of a curfew.

Whether a policy provides business interruption coverage for coronavirus shutdowns depends on the language of the policy and its exclusions.

Following viral outbreaks in the early 2000s, like SARS and MERS, the insurance industry added exclusions to their commercial property and business interruption insurance policies to preclude coverage for losses related to viral outbreaks.

Business Interruption coverage is designed to cover losses due to unforeseen circumstances out of the control of the business. This virus is a prime example of an event that may trigger this type of coverage.

However, insurance companies are denying coverage for this type of claim. Obviously, the insurance contract language of each policy governs the coverages, but in many cases the insurance companies are denying coverage despite that the policy actually provides coverage. We are actively pursuing these cases already with our clients who received a denial communication from their insurance companies.



Domestic terrorists roamed the streets, destroying privaté property, wanting to destroy our nation, pretending to be rioting to save it. They defaced the Lincoln Memorial and the World War II Memorial, and torched St. John's Episcopal Church, where presidents have prayed since 1816.

President Donald Trump touched the heart of the issue in remarks he made in the White House Rose Garden, saying, "America is founded on the rule of law. It is the foundation of our prosperity, our freedom, and our very way of life."

He then courageously ventured off the White House grounds, crossed Lafayette Square, and stood in front of St. John's Church. He held up a Bible and declared the greatness of our nation and his resolve to keep it

I do not believe any president has presented himself outside in public in this fashion since President Ronald Reagan was shot in 1981. Yet, the left-wing media mocked Trump.

No sane American—of any political persuasion—is not appalled at the horrible death of George Floyd at the hands of a policeman.

However, the answer to flouting of the law by anyone demands that we recommit ourselves to universal respect and execution of the law, not that we throw it in the trash.

In an announcement from my organization, UrbanCURE, that called for a national "Pastoral Prayer for America," I note:

George Floyd did not die as a black man, but as a human being under the protection of American laws. The mortal assault on him inflicted a deep wound on every American, not just American blacks. People who think it their duty

now to express sympathy to black folk must learn how to recognize that the grief is their own and not that of some 'other' looking for their generosity.

Regarding allegations of racism, I say: "I don't agree that our nation is racist. That mantra is the poison that entrenches resentment and division among us. The daily hunt for racism from top to bottom of our nation's institutions have institutionalized perception of racism in the post-civil rights era."

"They have systematically reduced the fundamentals of citizenship to race in the guise of diversity and inclusion—and these illusive lies have sown increasing distrust and painful social distance in conflict with our reality," I say. "Most Americans are cordial to their neighbors, work hand in hand across racial lines, and just want to be left alone."

Why this chaos today, 30 years after Los Angeles was torn up and my business destroyed?

I say it is because respect for the law and every human being comes only with humility, and that humility comes only when we see that law Is rooted in God and every person is created in his image.

But too much of our nation's reality has been controlled arrogance rather than humility: controlled arrogance that we don't need the God of our fathers and Founders. Those on the left have convinced too many that our answers lie in politics, their secular humanism, and moral relativism.

The result is the destruction of life and property that true law, adhered to by true believers, protects.
Only return to eternal

truths will save us.

Plasma donated from recovered COVID-19 patients, or those who had the virus but were asymptomatic, can be a critical tool to help those patients severely affected by the virus. LifeSouth has been testing potential convalescent plasma donors for COVID-19 antibodies since April, and hopes by testing all blood donors, more donors will be willing to donate. Since the first convalescent donation in April, LifeSouth has collected convalescent plasma from donors across their footprint in Florida, Georgia and Alabama. These units have been transfused to critically ill patients in local hospitals served by the community blood center.

Right now, LifeSouth is experiencing a critical need for all blood types, and assures it is safe to give blood. 



SIGNS OF THE PAST



COTTON AND TEXTILE MILLS (1822 to early 20th Century)

A cotton mill was established near this site in 1822. Although short-lived, it was the forerunner of other cotton and textile factories located in this area during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Cherry Cotton Mill began operations on nearby Sweetwater Avenue in 1893. The Gardiner-Warring Knitting Mill, later J. T. Flagg, occupied facilities a short distance from this site. in 1927. Other cotton industries in East Florence were the Ashcraft, later Florence Cotton Mill, established in 1899, and the Broadus Mill which operated briefly during the early 1900's.

Location: 34.8082°N, 87.6558°W 275 Sweetwater Ave, Florence

Cotton Mills were a major part of the Shoals economy during the 19th and early 20th centuries.

Spinning and weaving machines transformed the cotton into cloth. Mills were usually established next to streams; Sweetwater Creek runs near this historical marker.


