





Board Seeks Withdrawal

MUSCLE SHOALS-The Northwest Alabama Regional Airport Authority last week asked the Seaport Airlines to withdraw its service from the airport. The request came after a unanimous vote during Tuesday's board meeting. The Oregon-based

The Oregon-based airline began offering four daily flights to the Nashville International Airport in January through the Essential Air Services Program for \$1.7 million in annual subsidies. Boardings have been decreasing monthly. In July just 37 passengers flew from the Shoals to Nashville. That original Seaport flight schedule has been reduced to one flight per day. SeaPort has agreed to the request.

The passenger and flight reduction is partly because of a nationwide pilot shortage resulting in too many late and canceled flights. The shortage is also affecting other regional airlines and other communities.

Airport Director, **Barry Griffith**, said a new carrier is being sought and SeaPort has been asked to continue providing reasonable service until a suitable carrier is found. The process could take 90 days.

What do doctors want for themselves when it's time to die?

A recent interview on NPR, "Knowing How Doctors Die Can Change Endof-Life Discussions", discussed the finding that 88% of doctors, if they had a terminal illness, do not want CPR or aggressive treatments—the opposite of how they usually treat their patients!

Dr. Ken Murray described this in 2011 [How Doctors Die]; and it was confirmed with a survey of physician attitudes by Dr. V.J. Periyakoil at Stanford University: a) doctors don't practice what they preach, b) their attitudes regarding advance directives for their patients haven't changed in 25 years, and c) they reject CPR for themselves. Why?

Dr. Periyakoil explains it's not just because they want to make more money or are insensitive to patients wishes; rather, they are taught to prolong life at whatever cost within a system that pays them for 'doing more', but doesn't reward talking to patients.

You would think that 'communication' should be an essential component of doctor education; unfortunately, they aren't trained so that what they say is easily understood. And, doctors admit they are uncomfortable when having end-of-life [EOL] discussions.

Other reasons for this communication 'disconnect' include: marketing has convinced the public (and doctors) that tests identify things the doctor may miss (even though no other treatment would be done), and so patients expect 'tests'; and physicians fear being sued if they 'miss something' (it's estimated that 35% of all tests are done for this reason).

Medicare will start paying physicians in 2016 if they talk with patients about EOL issues. Hopefully, this will improve a patient's quality of life with fewer futile interventions. But, families/patients still need to be assertive about asking if a test or drug would really be beneficial—and what would the doctor do in their shoes!

of the search process was comparable to that of UNA's recent presidential search.

Social media was full of displeasure, citing politics, shortsightedness, the good ol' boy network, and sexism for the board's decision not to offer the position to current Assistant Director, Alison Stanfield.

been tearing up your computers these past couple of weeks. Thank you! When Windows 10 first came out on July 29, I (and many of you, apparently) just had to have it. Although I had "reserved" my

copy, it had not yet been sent to my computer. So, I got impatient, went to Microsoft's website and found the tool that allowed me to "force" the upgrade from

Windows 8.1 to 10. I had a couple of hiccups but nothing I couldn't handle, but many of you have not been so lucky. We've seen issues with CD ROMs not working, completely blank screens and lots of issues with computers running

multiple displays.

If you despise Windows 8 as much as I do, by all means go ahead and upgrade as Windows 7 users seem to bear the brunt of upgrade issues. Aside from that, there is no compelling reason to upgrade just vet.

The upgrade will be 100% free until July 2016 so let the rest of us iron out the kinks before upgrading. I strongly advise that you NOT go to Microsoft's website and "force" the upgrade as I did. Those of you who clicked on the little "reserve my copy" and have yet to receive your upgrade

need to be patient. Microsoft will only release the upgrade to your computer when Microsoft knows your particular system is ready. The software drivers for your graphics card, sound, CD ROM and other stuff had to be redesigned for Windows 10. If you haven't gotten your upgrade yet, it's because the drivers aren't ready yet. So take a chill pill. You'll get your upgrade soon enough. Boy, I wish I had a hundred

dollars for all the business users who have screwed up their vital systems by upgrading. Oh, wait, I do!

I certainly appreciate the extra cash but, seriously, those of you who cannot afford to experience down time on your computer ought not upgrade until you consult with a pro. Án upgrade is a serious undertaking for "mission critical" computers. Business users need to formulate a plan with a professional geek to ensure that you can continue to operate if the upgrade goes south.

For those who are reading this a little too late, there is an easy way to go back in time. Down in the lower left corner of Windows 10 is your "Start" button. Beside that is a search box. Simply type in "recovery" in that box and launch Recovery Options. A large box will be displayed with various options for recovering your system. One of those reads, "Go back to Windows 8.1

(or 7)." Click that and your system will revert back to the previous operating system with all your stuff infact.

Remember this: You only have 30 days to revert your system back to the previous operating system. After that, Windows 10 becomes permanent.


Dear Michael,







In automobile accident cases, you must understand that insurance companies first of all do not want to pay any claim. Secondly, insurance companies can not pay a claim

unless the claim is fully documented.

When a person without a lawyer tries to handle their own claim, the insurance company will run them in circles trying to get documentation until finally they either accept a low ball offer or hire us.

Here's a common misunderstanding and that is when a person injured in an automobile accident that was the other drivers fault expects the other driver's insurance to pay for their medical care. The other insurance company will not do it. Please understand that they do not want you to get medical care. They do not want you to get an MRI that shows that you now have a herniated disc and need surgery. They will not pay for you to have physical therapy so that you can get better at their expense. They do not want to pay your claim and if they have to pay your claim, they want to pay as little as possible. Obviously, the worse you are hurt the more they have to pay. People who get little or no medical care get little or no money. The insurance company for obvious reasons and to a large degree jurors will not accept that some people have to live with injuries because they can not afford medical care.

Without a doctor relating the injury to the accident "as more probable than not" in some cases a jury can not even consider a particular type of injury such as a herniated disc. If the insurance company can keep you from going to the doctor then the claim has no value. There are solutions to these problems and a good

personal injury firm can help you find them. I'm not talking about a personal injury mill, but a good personal injury lawyer that will take the time to explore your options and help you get the treatment (and documentation) that you need. One strategy that we have used successfully is to use the open enrollment period of the Affordable Care Act and pay for someone's insurance for 90 days so that they can get the diagnostic tests and treatment that they need. At that point we have the documentation we need to make the insurance company pay the claim and we have a client who received the medical treatment that they needed.

University of Alabama Lions The North produced several have baseball baseball professional players in their long and successful history. However, none has set the bar as high as Josh Willingham. Willingham Willingham. signed with the Lions out of Mars Hill Bible School and immediately begin his journey that would lead to a successful Major League career.

Willingham was a threeyear letterman at UNA, a two-time All-American and Academic All-American from 1998-2000. In 2000, he became, at the time, just one of eight UNA student athletes in school history to be both an All-American and Academic All-American honoree.

Willingham was destined to be a star baseball player on the big stage. During his three-year career at UNA, he had a .424 batting average and his five career grand slams were a school record at the time. He was selected as UNA's Male Athlete of the Year for 1999-2000. One of his greatest collegiate accomplishments was being a key part of the Lions 1999 team that advanced to the Division II College World Series.

Major League baseball scouts had no problem recognizing Willingham's talents and potential. His 11-year Major League career included five seasons with the Florida Marlins, two with the Washington Nationals, one with the Oakland A's, two-and-a-half with the Minnesota Twins and the last half of the 2014 season with the Kansas City Royals.

Willingham played in 1,147 major league games, collecting 988 hits, 632 RBI's and 195 home runs. His biggest statistical season came in 2012 when he hit a career-high 35 home runs and had 110 RBI's with Minnesota. That season, he was awarded the American League Silver Slugger Award in the outfield and was named the Twins team Most Valuable Player.

In 2014, Willingham realized every baseball player's dream when he participated in the World Series with the Kansas City Royals. nation was at war in Korea and that I would probably be sent there. As it turned out, I did not go to Korea during the war there. Rather, I did three tours in Vietnam later on. The Army that I served for over twenty years, ten as a non-commissioned officer and ten as a commissioned officer, was always either fighting communism or training for war against training communist nations, primarily Russia. When led a tank platoon in Germany we studied the Russian battle tank. I knew where to hit the T-34 tank to put its cannon out of action. Now Russia is preparing for war while President Obama

is disarming our military. I would not have believed back then that in a few decades our national government would be under the control of Communists and others whose apparent aim is to destroy our Republic. I would not have believed that the God-given freedoms that our forefathers fought and sacrificed to secure and many others in later wars gave their lives to defend, would be taken away. The worst part is that it is not by foreign nations, but by the three branches of our own government ignoring the Constitution.

My parents have long been deceased. They would have labeled as insane anyone who predicted that homosexuality would be celebrated with the blessing of our government. When I retired from the Army in 1972, no one could have convinced me that there would be a day when the military would designate and months days to

celebrate homosexuality and other sexual perversions and that anyone who expressed disagreement homosexual with the marriage lifestyle and would be punished. Neither would I have believed that Christian chaplains would be punished for speaking of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Twenty years ago, I would not have believed that our federal Department of Education would approve indoctrinating elementary schoolchildren into the homosexual lifestyle and encourage them to change their sexual orientation, while severely restricting their diets in school lunches to protect their health. I don't know whether it is too late for our nation, but being the Christian soldier that I am, I must keep fighting.

HOT DOG

WHAT SHOULD YOU DO IF YOU SEE A DOG IN A CAR ON A HOT DAY? EXPERTS WEIGH IN

T's 69 degrees and cloudy at the beach, with a humidity level of 83 percent and no breeze. You see a dog locked in a truck with the sunroof open but all the windows rolled up. There's no sunshade blocking the windshield, and the dog doesn't appear to have water. He's barking frantically.

Several news stories recently have reported on people breaking into cars to rescue dogs locked in, only to be arrested for their good deed. In response, at least one state, Tennessee, has legalized the act, making it an extension of the state's Good Samaritan law — but only if the rescuer takes certain steps beforehand, such as searching for the owner and notifying law enforcement. parking the vehicle in the shade with all windows open, covering the windshield with a sunscreen or the cargo area with an awning and crating the dog with a full water dish and a running crate fan. If that's the situation and the dog is calm and not in distress, you likely have less cause for concern. Use common sense. If it's a

summer evening, after sunset and dogs are in cars with windows open and the owners are standing right there, the dog's not at risk. (Yes, I have seen someone raise concerns in just that situation.) If the dog doesn't have a shady spot in the car and is panting heavily, drooling, seems disoriented or shows other signs of distress, take action. That can range from going inside a coffee shop or grocery store and having the owner paged to calling the police or animal control. "Some people may be embarrassed to call law enforcement, but you want to get someone on the way who can do something," says Temma Martin of Salt Lake City, a spokesperson for Best Friends Animal Society. "If it takes them 10 minutes to get there, that 10 minutes could be as long as the pet has in the car on a hot day." Schomburg says Newport Beach officers respond to all calls. "If it's December and it's cold and rainy, we still respond. We don't ever want to make a judgment like, 'Oh, I think it's OK today."

A rule of thumb is that if it's warmer than 70 degrees, it's too hot to leave your dog in the car. Short-nosed dogs are especially at risk. Beneath the cat's paw: feline toepaw-graphy

paws, but only four of them touch the ground when a cat is walking. The fifth toe, known as a dewclaw, is the feline equivalent of the thumb. While it's not opposable, the dewclaw does help the cat grasp things and climb trees. The toe anatomy makes it easy for cats to go up trees, but not so easy to come back down. The back paws have four toes but no dewclaws. Some cats have extra toes and are known as polydactyls, meaning "many fingers."

• A little anxiety tends to help us perform better in stressful situations, but too much can make us fail. Turns out the same is true for our dogs, according to a recent study published in Animal Cognition. Highly excitable dogs respond best to a neutral tone of voice, while mellow pets perform their best when urged on in an upbeat tone of voice. Service dogs, who must work in the face of distractions, usually stay cool in stressful situations, more so than pets who aren't as highly trained. Try adjusting your tone of voice to match your dog's temperament, and see if it affects how he responds to your commands. • A new species has been added to the canine family tree, raising the number of living canid species from 35 to 36. Although they share a strong resemblance, DNA evidence shows that the golden jackals of East Africa and Eurasia are two different species, according to a July 30 report in the journal Current Biology. "This represents the first discovery of a 'new' canid species in Africa in over 150 years," says Klaus-Peter Koepfli of the Smithsonian Conservation Biology Institute in Washington, D.C. The previously unrecognized species has been named the African golden wolf. - Dr. Marty Becker, Mikkel Becker and Kim Campbell Thornton

How do you know when a dog is at risk, and what should you do?

Factors to consider include whether the car is in the shade, the color of the car (dark-colored cars get hotter faster), whether windows are rolled down, if there's a breeze and the age and breed of the dog or cat, says Valerie Schomburg, animal control supervisor for Newport Beach, California, police department. Older animals or those with heavy coats or short snouts are more susceptible to heat.

"Brachycephalic breeds like Pugs have a hard time breathing anyway," she says. "If you put an older pug in a black car with the windows rolled up, he's going to be at a disadvantage."

Look to see if the owner has made an effort to protect the pet from the heat, such as



Be prepared to give information as to the condition of the dog and the description and location of the car. If you can, stay there to flag down the responder so he or she knows where to go.

Unless the dog is barely alive, it's best not to try to remove him yourself. He could bite you or run away or the owner could have you charged with breaking into the car. Once animal control or police show up, give a statement and leave. Don't get into a screaming match with the owner if he or she shows up. Let law enforcement handle it.

"Between pet owners making good decisions and witnesses making good decisions, lives can be saved," Martin says.






