



help. What can we do?

Thomas McCutcheon

Ask the Attorney is sponsored by local attorneys, McCutcheon & Hamner, PC, as a service to the residents of NW Alabama.

My son was arrested for possession of marijuana with possible intent to distribute. He had 15.2 ounces. He stayed in jail for one week because he couldn't make his bond. Finally we got enough money to pay the bondman and he went back before the judge and the judge wouldn't appoint him a lawyer. My son is on disability and can't afford a lawyer and he needs

Renee, Athens, AL

He absolutely needs a lawyer. The difference between simple possession, which is a misdemeanor (minor crimes punishable by no more than one year in county jail) and a distribution charge which is felony (serious crimes punishable by prison time and loss of civil rights including the loss of the right to vote, serve on juries, and all sorts of other

impediments to living a normal life) is huge. I don't do criminal work but sat second chair in a

case like this. Second chair means I worked for a more experienced attorney who tried the case while I watched. In that case, I believe to this day that the defendant claimed the marijuana so his son wouldn't get in trouble. The defendant was charged with intent to distribute but the jury (partly through the efforts of this very talented lawyer) rendered a verdict for personal use possession and the judge fined the man \$250.00. Had he been found guilty of a felony the consequences would have been severe.

In all criminal cases, including paternity cases and civil and criminal nonsupport cases which may result in the jailing of the defendant, in any court of this state created by authority of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, when a defendant is entitled to counsel as provided by law, the court must determine whether or not the defendant is able financially to obtain the assistance of counsel.

Alabama Code §15-12-5 is the law about how a court decides whether someone is indigent (unable to afford an attorney). The court will require an affidavit of substantial hardship that lists in detail the financial resources available to the defendant and the court may order an investigation and report in determining whether someone is entitled to an appointed attorney.

Judges really don't like people trying to represent themselves. It is usually very awkward to watch and most people just can't manage the court system on their own. I can't tell you why the judge is not appointing an attorney but if your son truly cannot afford one, I suspect one will eventually be provided.

UNA Prominent In Final NCAA Division II Football Statistics

INDIANAPOLIS -The University of North Alabama is ranked prominently in the final NCAA Division II football statistics, finishing with ten category rankings in the Top 20 nationally. UNA went 9-2 in 2014, winning a share of the Gulf South Conference Championship and earning a berth in the Division II Football playoffs.

ÚNA averaged 35.9 points and 440.2 yards per game, while allowing just 18.2 points and 346 yards per game. The Lion offense ranked

among the national leaders in six categories, while the UNA defense was in the Top 20 in four.

The Lions ranked sixth nationally in fewest passes had intercepted (7), seventh in team passing efficiency (164.33), ninth in completion percentage (65.6), 10th in red zone offense (88.5), 12th in third down conversions (48.3) and 18th in passing yards per completion (14.66)

The UNA defense ranks 13th in passing efficiency defense (101.26), 18th in fewest passing yards allowed per game (174.2), 18th in scoring defense (18.2) and 20th in passes intercepted (16).

UNA junior quarterback Luke Wingo of Tuscaloosa, Ala., ranked among the Division II national leaders in four categories as he was fifth in completion percentage (67.6), fifth in yards per pass attempt (9.63), ninth in passing efficiency (162.0) and 19th in passing yards per completion (14.23). For the season, Wingo completed 161 of 238 passes for 2,291 yards and 14 touchdowns while throwing just seven interceptions.





Ask Dr. Webb

There are a number of myths about palliative care [PC] and hospice. Here are the most common—and the truth about them!



1. My doctors have given up on me and I will receive no more treatment. Unfortunately, many people believe this, partially because a doctor may say "There's nothing more I can do". What he's really saying is he has no "cure" for the problem. A referral for PC or hospice then indicates a shift from trying inappropriate "curative" treatments to more realistic "comfort" focused therapies which will actually often help someone live longer!

2. It's only for people with cancer. It's easy to forget there are many diseases just as bad or worse than cancer. Anyone with a "Life Limiting" Disease" [LLD] can benefit from PC and hospice. Life limiting means the disease would eventually cause death unless something else happens first, and includes conditions like: Alzheimer's, Congestive Heart Failure, emphysema, Lou Gehrig's Disease, Strokes.

3. It's only for old people. There are many younger folks—as in under age 65-with a LLD who have benefited tremendously from PC/ Hospice.

4. It means I'm close to death. Although hospice requires a certification that the patient will die within six months if the disease runs its usual course, PC is available to anyone with a chronic or LLD. Many people live longer precisely because they receive PC/hospice: by improving comfort, patients eat better, socialize and enjoy life more, allowing them to live months longer than expected.

5. They dope you up & you sleep until you die. The main reason both doctors and patients may have this delusion is that we all too frequently receive referrals so late that the only option remaining is palliative sedation: using continuous morphine and other drugs to induce a state of sleep so that suffering can be relieved, allowing them to die peacefully, with dignity, and which also leaves the family with a

much better closing image.6. If I get morphine, I will stop breathing. Only if it is given in very large doses by injection, will someone stop breathing. The dosages used in our programs are usually small and only enough to control pain, shortness of breath, and general suffering. Studies confirm that there is no relationship between the dose given in PC/hospice programs and causing someone to die prematurely.



INSPIRED by a recent viral Facebook post. The post contained a link that, when clicked, showed a map of your location the past few months on a minute by minute basis. If you've ever seen this, you know how eerie it feels that

"Google" knows so much about you. But take a chill pill. The truth is far more interesting.

It is important to understand that the location Fisher link I described above does not

work unless you meet both these requirements: 1) Have a Google account (you have to have one if you own an android phone) and, 2) are logged on to your Google account on your desktop

computer or phone (smart phone users are always logged on). Those who do not have a Google account (or are not logged in to their account) would see nothing when they click the link in that Facebook post. iPhone users have a similar feature built into their phones. That data can only be

seen by you. Here's why this is not scary: ALL cell phone providers know your exact location at all times through cell tower triangulation and GPS. They (or, more accurately, their computers) have to know where you are in order to

deliver data and voice to your phone. Those companies simply make that data available to you if you wish to see it.

Location data is great when you are out of town and looking for a decent Italian restaurant. Just pull up a map, search for "Italian restaurant" and the map will show the restaurants close to your vicinity. Look up "weather" and your phone knows exactly where you are so can deliver the right forecast. Just recently, after returning from a trip to Florida, I could not find where I parked my car

at the Nashville airport. After touring the parking lot for a half hour, it finally dawned on me that I could use Google location history to see exactly where I was the previous Friday. Sure enough, Google had pinpointed my parking spot.

So, both Google and Apple know where you are at all times. Is that scary? I don't think so. After all, "privacy" has become a quaint, archaic notion now. If you are going to participate in the Digital Era, you will leave evidence of your whereabouts all over the place. Fortunately, most of that data can only be accessed by you, by people you choose to share with, and by people with a court order. Or by people who hack into your account as a few Hollywood stars found out recently.

If having all this location

data collected by your phone makes you nervous, iPhone users can turn it off by tapping Settings > Privacy > Location Services. Android users should access Settings>Location>Location Settings. Uncheck stuff and you will become invisible By all means turn this stuff off if it makes you feel better. But do so knowing that your phone will be less useful.


Buy the Right Ground Meat

Cheaper Auto Financing

I will share a tip to save on the financing. Go and talk to your bank's loan person, get a number for them and program it into your cell phone. Go to a credit union, talk to the loan person and do the same. Possibly get a third name and number. Now once you have the price of the car nailed down and the papers signed, it will be time to talk financing.

Every time the finance person says, "This is the best deal I can get you," call one of your people and get a counter offer. I have placed four to five calls and shaved 3% of the interest rate. The finance man at the dealer just keeps reaching deeper in his file cabinet for better and better deals. 

· Find time for friends and family. Many people need no reason to socialize, but those that do can now cite boosting brain function as a great reason to get together with family friends. Routine and socialization can keep a brain sharp by reducing its levels of cortisol, a potentially destructive brought hormone on Researchers stress. hv also believe that routine interaction with other people stimulates structures in the brain's frontal lobe that are likely responsible for planning, decision making and response control.

• Squeeze in a nap every so often. Naps can have a reenergizing effect on men and women, but a study from German researchers also found that naps also can improve memory. In the study, researchers divided partícipants into three groups: people who would stay awake for 60 minutes;

any people know maintain healthy weights people who would sleep that a combination and reduce their risk for for six minutes; and people for six minutes; and people who would sleep for 30 to 45 minutes. A study from researchers at Chicago's Rush University Medical Center found that people who eat fish once per week have a 60 percent lower risk of developing Alzheimer's disease than those who do not include fish in their weekly diets. Researchers credit this lower risk to DHA, an omega-3 fatty acid that is found in both the brain and in fish such as salmon and tuna.





Don't make the mistake of putting life's emergencies on a credit card. You'll end up paying on them for months or even years to come. An emergency fund gives you the peace of mind that comes with knowing you can handle whatever life throws at you.

USE THE DEBT

SNOWBALL List all of your debts, except your house, from smallest payoff balance to largest. Make the minimum payment on every debt except the smallest and put every extra dollar you can find toward the smallest debt until it is paid.

If you can find a way to generate extra income, do it! Take on a part-time job for a while or have a big yard sale and get rid of that stuff you never use, wear or didn't want in the first place! Then focus on paying off the next smallest debt, then the next, then the next, rolling the money over each time.

HAVE PLASTIC SURGERY Cut up all of your credit cards. We call this a plasectomy. Everyone says they pay off their credit cards each month, but the truth is virtually no one does.

Carnegie Melon



conducted a study that showed when McDonald's began accepting credit cards, the average purchase increased by 47%. People are more reluctant to spend money when they see tens and twenties leaving their wallets and going into someone else's. You really feel it when you have to lay out cash. Get rid of the credit cards!

INVEST FOR THE FUTURE

When you're debt-free and have a fully funded emergency fund, you're ready to start planning for the future. Invest 15% of your income in a 401(k), Roth IRA and other tax-advantaged retirement plans. Why not more? Because the extra money you'll save can go toward saving for college (if you have kids) or paying off your home early.

Do these things sound like a dream? Well, I can tell you from experience that some dreams do come true. If you're willing to be disciplined and focused, live on a budget, and have a plan for your money, the sky is the limit. Make 2015 the year you begin to live like no one else, so later you really can live like no one else!



unjust causes or cowardly refusing to seriously resist them, a pregnant mother *imprisoned in Sudan with* her 18-month-old American son set a standard for saintly courage."

"When a Sudanese court told Meriam she must renounce her Catholic faith and convert to Islam or be hung by the neck until dead, she gave a non-negotiable answer: No."

"Meriam was born in Sudan to a Christian mother and a Muslim father who abandoned the family when Meriam was six. Her mother raised her a Christian. In December 2011 in a Catholic church in Khartoum, Meriam married U.S. citizen Daniel Wani. A Catholic priest witnessed

their

marriage; the Archdiocese of Khartoum certified it. Daniel had

Ibrahim emigrated from Sudan to

New Hampshire in 1998 and was naturalized in 2005." "In November 2012, eleven

months after she and Daniel were married, Meriam gave birth to their first child, Martin. By law, because he was the son of a U.S. citizen, Martin was a U.S. citizen. *In February, Sudan threw* Meriam and Martin in the Omdurman Women's Prison. Meriam was then five months pregnant with her and Daniel's second child.'

So, what do I honor? A woman who refused to surrender her faith, her God. A woman who cared for her American son while chained and gave birth to another child while imprisoned. A woman who knows firsthand the blessing of liberty and freedom and was willing to "give the last full measure of devotion" for what she held most dear.

To the 85 polled by the Associated Press I tell you this simple truth — you do not speak for me. Chances are there are many who feel the same.

The multibillion-dollar pet industry keeps coming up with ways to make our lives with animals better. Some are toys, some are veterinary products, some are home and pet-care items. I see them throughout the year as I travel to trade shows and veterinary conferences, and I try them out myself when possible or get my colleagues' input. Here are 11 new products that I think are winners.

* KittyKaddy Double Diner and Torus Ceramic Diner. As I age — I just turned 60 and feel stiffer — it becomes harder to bend over. That's when devices like this, which let you fill and clean pet food and water bowls without bending over, catch your eye. A long, detachable handle allows you to pick up the bowls easily. ***** Zen Clipper. Most nail clippers either crush part of the nail when cutting or make it too easy to cut too close and hit a blood

vessel or nerve. Ouch! The Zen Clipper slices the nail 360 degrees at once while preventing you from trimming too much. **Tidy Cats LightWeight.** Do you feel

like you get a workout every time you pick up a container of cat litter? The folks who originated cat litter 50 years ago have developed a new litter that is lighter and more absorbent. Now my 89-year-old mother-in-law, Valdie, feels like Popeye as she carries a jug in each hand. **Muffin's Halo.** I have a blind 14-year-

old golden retriever, Shakira, who looks a little funny running around Almost Heaven Ranch in angel wings and a halo, but the halo protects her face and eyes the same way a face guard does on a football helmet. Now I don't have to worry that she'll hurt

herself running into things.

Ultra Fel-O-Vax. Cats are small and vaccine volumes seem big, especially as they're being injected. Ultra Fel-O-Vax has only half the volume of normal vaccines, making for a more comfortable vaccine



· Frank and Louie had two faces but only nine lives, and he lost his last one on Dec. 4, reports Kim Ring for the Telegram & Gazette in Worcester, Massachusetts. The unusual cat, owned by Martha Stevens, held a Guinness World Record for being the oldest of his kind. Most Janus cats - socalled after the two-headed Roman god of beginnings and passages - die shortly after birth, but Stevens tube-fed him until he learned to eat on his own. Frank and Louie had two noses, two mouths and two functioning eyes, plus a blind center eye, but only one brain.

· Is your dog overweight? He might not have the right bacteria in his gut. A report published in November in the Journal of Veterinary Internal Medicine found that the beagles in the study who gained weight had less diversity of bacteria in their guts than the dogs who ate restricted

amounts of food to maintain optimal body condition. The lean dogs also had different types of microbes. It may be that too much of certain types of bacteria can lead to body chemistry changes that cause obesity, but more research is necessary before that can be confirmed.


