Dear "Speakout,"

Sunday, June 14th is National Flag Day in 2020.

We should be very, very proud when we see our flag waving in the breeze. It is a symbol of the freedom that we so often take for granted. It is not just an ornament to decorate our yards and cemeteries. It is a reminder of all the men and women who died so we can enjoy our freedoms.

One of my cousins was wounded on the beach at Iwo Jima during World War II so that our flag could be raised on Mount Suribachi. I am quite sure that he knew the sacrifice that he and his fellow Marines were making to raise that flag.

We should be honored that our Pledge of Allegiance was written by a local citizen, Francis Julius Bellamy, who was born in Mount Morris. His words so eloquently sum up what our flag should mean to each of us:

"I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

As we reflect on the recent riots in America, we should study our Pledge of Allegiance more closely.

Francis Scott Key was inspired when he watched our flag being bombarded at the Battle of Fort McHenry during the War of 1812: "Oh, say can you see by the dawn's early light What so proudly we hailed at the twilight's last gleaming? Whose broad stripes and bright stars through the perilous fight, O'er the ramparts we watched were so gallantly streaming? And the rocket's red glare, the bombs bursting in air, Gave proof through the night that our flag was still there. Oh, say does that star-spangled banner yet wave O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave?"

Our flag is composed of thirteen horizontal stripes including seven red and six white. The blue portion is called the union and holds 50 white stars which represent all our states within the union.

The flag of the United States of America should always be flown at the top of a flag pole and any other flag is to be flown underneath it.

Attempting to make a statement by flying any other flag above the flag of the United States of America is extremely disrespectful to our flag and dishonoring to those who served in the military of our country.

Have a wonderful Flag Day and remember what we really celebrate on this day in America.

We all (or, at least most of us) saw how quickly assumptions and mis-characterizations can spark heated discussions and a jump to violent conclusions. I am hopeful this Completely Peaceful Event reminds us all how important it is to speak (or post) with intention and compassion; to normalize the idea of changing our minds in light of new information; and to do all we can to have rational, factual discussions with one another

--as humans, as neighbors, and as friends.

I am proud to call Mount Morris my home and I hope you are, too.



Board of Supervisors Calls on Governor to Reopen Livingston County Economy

On June 8, 2020, the Livingston County Board of Supervisors sent a letter to Governor Cuomo imploring him to immediately advance Livingston County to Phase 3 of the reopening process, as all health metrics are currently being met.

Livingston County Board of Supervisors Chairman David L. LeFeber stated, "We found out that Phase 3 guidelines were issued today. That's good news. Now, we need Phase 3 to be greenlighted today as well. There is no excuse not to open up. The two week timeframe is now immaterial. All the trends and health metrics warrant Livingston County opening up more of our shuttered businesses to customers, traffic, business income and sales tax."

Per Governor Cuomo's phased-in approach to the gradual lifting of the State's "NY Pause" Executive Orders, the earliest he intends to open to Phase 3 is Friday, June 12, 2020. However, that is not guaranteed.

"It is likely that Phase 3 will be triggered on Friday," continued LeFeber. "That's to be expected. But, let's be honest and let's have public health benchmarks guide the decision-making and nothing else. There is no need to wait. Open now."

The Board's letter to Governor Cuomo also demands that Phase 4 guidelines – for arts, entertainment, recreation, and education – be issued this week so that businesses can plan ahead.

LeFeber stated, "We are proud of our Livingston County business owners for enduring the hardships brought about by these unprecedented times. They have been extremely patient over the last several months, and now, they are eager to get back to work in a safe and sensible manner. Reopening our businesses will help the local economy thrive once again."

"Our businesses are eager and anxious to continue the reopening process and, after this extensive layoff, they remain ready to further promote this recovery effort and fully reopen Livingston County," concluded LeFeber.

Men's Health Week

Each June, the week before Father's Day is celebrated as "Men's Health Week." The Livingston County Department of Health wants you to have the facts about men's health.

Men are less likely than women to see a physician regularly and are more likely to be disconnected from the healthcare system. They are often extremely reluctant to admit that there might be anything wrong until a problem is too severe to ignore.

"Men often make their health a low priority. But many causes of illness are easily preventable. It's a fact that simple awareness of preventable health problems, early detection, and treatment of disease can make a big difference in quality of life. Early detection by such routine exams as prostate screenings, blood pressure checks, cholesterol testing, colorectal cancer screenings – even such simple tests like those for blood sugar – can play an important role in staying healthy," states Jennifer Rodriguez, Public Health Director.

This reluctance is a factor that can lead to the growing health disparities between men and women. The difference in life expectancies between the genders is now more than five years. Men have higher rates of heart disease and cancer, and higher rates of chronic problems such as high blood pressure and dangerously high cholesterol levels. These are problems that are often treatable if they are caught early. In addition, there are problems such as prostate and testicular cancers that are unique to men.

Men need to see their healthcare providers to assess their personal risks for various problems. Men should take the occasion of "Men's Health Week" as a perfect opportunity to make an appointment with their doctor or other health care provider.
